The Discourse ontinues, that a Body of 3 or 4000 Men will be fent from Milan in the Spring, to reinforce the Spanish Army in Catalonia.

Vinice, Febr. 5. The Great Convoy that is prepring here to carry a new supply of all fort of Sores to the Venetian Fleet, will fail about the middle of this month, if not hindred by the Weather. We have no fresh News from the Levant :

And all is at prefent quiet in Dalmatia, but the Turks make Preparations there, which look as if they had thoughts of engaging in another Attempt upon Cyclut.

Vienna, Febr. 9. Prince Engene of Saway went from hence two days ago in his return to Piedmont, and it's faid he is to command at the Siege of Creal. The young Prince of Transstvania is Treated at this Court with much Kindness; He will shortly return home in Company of General Variani, who commands the Emperors Forces in twee parts. The Advices from the Frontiers fay, that the Turks have drawn together fo great a part of their Forces for the Expedition against Scio, that they will not be in a condition in Hungary to do more than act defensively the next Summer. On our fide the Preparations are greater than they were the last year, & they talk of opening the Campagne with the Siege of Temeswaer, which is the only Fortress the Turks are now Masters of Hazary. The News of the defeat of 500 Turks near Temeswaer is confirmed, with this addition, That there was taken among the Pritoners the Bills of the Arnautes; and that this Advan-tige was obtained by the Radziens commanded by Colonel Antonio.

Francfort, Febr. 18. The Imperial Commissaries are providing Magazines at Hailbron, and fuch other Places as are judged most convenient, for the lavice of the next Campagne. The Weather continues very cold in these parts, beyond what has been known for feveral years.

Hamburgh, Febr. 19. The last Letters from Po-Lind tell us, that the Dyet had not yet cholen their Mareichal or Speaker, and that there were fuch Divisions among the Deputies, that there was very little ground to hope for any good fuccess of this Meeting. The Taitars were preparing a great Convoy at Jass in Moldavia for the relief of the Garison of Caminice.

Paris, Febr. 18. This week was published here a Supplement to the late Edict about the Poll Tax. which subjects several forts of People to the payment of it, as the Servants of all Gentlemen Tradefinen, and Husbandmen, Day Labourers. Shepherds, &c. who were not comprehended under the first Regulations for raising this Tax The Ambailador of Venice has complained to this Court, that divers French Vesselshave been lately fent from Marf. Les to Smirna with Ammunition for the use of the Turks. The Mareichal de Gatinat is gone to the Frontiers of Piedmont to haften the Preparations for the next Campagne, upon the Advices that come from thence of the Enemies defign to beliege Cazal early in the Spring. We have an account from Flanders, that some Spanish Soldiers had got into the Town of Namur in difguise, and set fire to the great Magazine of Hay and Straw there.
