there be occasion.

War aw, Jan. 29. The Dict of this Kingdom was opened on the 12th instant, but the Deputies that compose it were no sooner come together but a great dispute arose among thems, by reason, the Sicur Grissin, who was Marcschal of the last Diet held at Gradno, took upon him, aecording to Custom, to exercise that Function till a new Marcschal was chosen, which the Deputies of Lithuania warmly opposed, because he was not deputed by any of the Pulatinates to assist on their part at the present Diet; others supported him in his Pretention, and the Heats grew so high, that several sabres were drawn on both sides, and the Assembly broke up in much disorder; Since which they have met again several times, but with no better success, notwithstanding the Cardinal Radziowski, and some other Persons of the principal Quality, have laboured very earnessly to adjust this matter; and because this misunderstanding between the Deputies of the Diet, seems to be somented on account of the difference that happened some time since between the Prince Sapiba, General of Lithuania, and the Bishop of Vilna, the King of Poland does particularly endeavour to compose the same, and has effected so much, that the Popes Nuncio, (who had very zealously taken part with the Bish p of Vilna) and the said General, were on Thursday latt brought together, and reconciled in his Majesty's presence, which probably will be solven and the Bishop. The Tartars make preparations at Jassis in Moldavia for the Relief of Caminice, and our Treops are very watchful to prevent their design.
