## A PROCLAMATION

UNDER THE MUNITIONS OF WAR ACTS, 1915 TO 1917.

GEORGE R.I.

**W**HEREAS by section three of the Munitions of War Act, 1915, as amended by the Munitions of War (Amendment) Act, 1916, it is provided that the differences to which Part I of the first-mentioned Act applies are differences as to rates of wages, hours of work, or otherwise as to terms or conditions of or affecting munitions work, and also any differences as to rates of wages, hours of work, or otherwise as to terms or conditions of or affecting employment on any other work of any description, if that Part of that Act is applied to such a difference by His Majesty by Proclamation, on the ground that in the opinion of His Majesty the existence or continuance of the difference is directly or indirectly prejudicial to the manufacture, transport, or supply of Munitions of War; and it is also provided that the said Part of the said Act may be so applied to such a difference at any time, whether a lock-out or strike is in existence in connection with the difference to which

it is applied or not; Provided that if in the case of any industry the Minister of Munitions is satisfied that effective means exist to secure the settlement without stoppage of any difference arising on work other than on munitions work, no Proclamation shall be made under the said section with respect to any such difference:

And whereas a difference within the meaning of the said section exists between employers and persons employed as enginemen and boiler tenters in Cotton Mills in and in the immediate vicinity of the Towns and Districts of Blackburn, Darwen, and Great Harwood, as to rates of wages, hours of work, and otherwise as to terms and conditions of or affecting employment on the work carried on by such enginemen and boiler tenters:

And whereas the Minister of Labour has investigated the matter and the Minister of Munitions, having considered the results of the investigation made by the Minister of Labour and his representations to the Minister of Munitions, is not satisfied that effective means exist to secure the settlement of the said difference without stoppage, being a difference arising on work other than munitions work:

And whereas in Our opinion the existence or continuance of the said difference is directly

and indirectly prejudicial to the manufacture, transport, or supply of Munitions of War:

Now, therefore, We, by and with the advice of Our Privy Council, are pleased to proclaim, direct, and ordain, that Part I of the Munitions of War Act, 1915, shall apply to the said difference.

Given at Our Court at *Buckingham Palace*, this twenty-seventh day of *February*, in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and eighteen, and in the Eighth year of Our Reign.

PRESENT.

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

**W**HEREAS by an Order in Council, dated the twenty-eighth day of November, nineteen hundred and fourteen, His Majesty was pleased to make regulations (called the "Defence of the Realm Regulations") under the Defence of the Realm Consolidation Act, 1914, for securing the public safety and the defence of the realm:

And whereas the said Act has been amended by the Defence of the Realm (Amendment) Act, 1915, the Defence of the Realm (Amendment) (No. 2) Act, 1915, and the Munitions of War Act, 1915, and other enactments:

And whereas the said regulations have been amended by various subsequent Orders in Council:

And whereas it is expedient further to amend the said regulations in manner herein-after appearing:

Now, therefore, His Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, that the following amendments be made in the said regulations:—

1. In Regulation 8E for the words "Minister of Munitions" there shall be substituted the words "Director-General of National Service," for the word "Minister" there shall be substituted the words "Director-General."

2. After Regulation 8E there shall be inserted the following regulation:—

"8EE. For the purpose of enabling His Majesty's Stationery Office to obtain stores and other articles, and the execution of printing and other work, required for the service of His Majesty and the various Government Departments, the Treasury may by order apply, with the necessary adaptations, to the Controller of His Majesty's Stationery Office the provisions of Regulations 2B, 2BB, 7, 8, 8A, 15C, 29A and 34A, conferring powers on the Admiralty, Army Council, and Minister of Munitions, and the regulations so applied and adapted shall have effect as if they formed part of these regulations."

3. In the second paragraph of Regulation 27A after the words "belonging to" there shall be inserted the words "or of any document which has in confidence been communicated by."

4. At the end of Regulation 66 the following paragraph shall be inserted:—

"Where a regulation or provision of a regulation has been amended by the substitution of one Government Department or authority for another as the authority to exercise any power under the regulation or provision the amendment shall not affect any order made, licence or other instrument issued, or action taken in pursuance of the power by the original authority, but any such order, licence or instrument shall until revoked or amended continue in force as if it had been made or issued by the substituted authority, and as if for references in the order, licence or instrument to the original authority there were substituted references to the substituted authority."

PRESENT.

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

**W**HEREAS His Majesty has been pleased to approve a change in the constitution of the Army Council, and to create, by Letters Patent dated 19th February, 1918, the Office of Permanent British Military Representative, British Section, Supreme War Council of the Allied Governments:

And whereas it is expedient to assign certain duties to the Permanent British Military Representative:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, is pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

1. The Secretary of State is to be responsible to His Majesty and Parliament for all the business of the Army Council.

All business, other than business which the Secretary of State specially reserves to himself, is to be transacted in the following principal divisions:—

(a) The Chief of the Imperial General Staff, the Adjutant-General, the Quartermaster-General, the Master-General of the Ordnance, and the Deputy Chief of the Imperial General Staff, shall be responsible to the Secretary of State for the administration of so much of the business relating to the organization, disposition, personnel, armament, and maintenance of the Army as shall be assigned to them, or each of them, from time to time by the Secretary of State.

(b) The Permanent British Military Representative, British Section, Supreme War Council of the Allied Governments, shall be responsible to the Secretary of State for the performance of such duties as may, from time to time, be assigned to him by the Secretary of State.

(c) The Civil Member of the Army Council shall be responsible to the Secretary of State for the administration of business affecting the Territorial Force Associations, the Volunteer Force, and War Department lands, and for so much of the other business of the Army Council as may be assigned to him, from time to time, by the Secretary of State.

(d) The Finance Member of the Army Council shall be responsible to the Secretary

of State for the finance of the Army, and for so much of the other business of the Army Council as may be assigned to him, from time to time, by the Secretary of State.

(e) The Director-General of Movements and Railways shall be responsible to the Secretary of State for so much of the business relating to the transport by rail or inland waterways at home or abroad of the personnel and materiel of the Army as may be assigned to him, from time to time, by the Secretary of State.

(f) The Surveyor-General of Supply shall be responsible to the Secretary of State for so much of the business relating to the commercial administration of Army Supplies as is not under the control of the Ministry of Munitions, and as may be assigned to him, from time to time, by the Secretary of State.

2. The Secretary of the War Office will act as Secretary of the Army Council, and will be charged with the interior economy of the War Office, and the preparation of all official communications of the Council, and with such other duties as the Secretary of State may, from time to time, assign to him.

3. During the period of the War the Military Members of the Army Council shall have precedence amongst themselves according to their Army Seniority.

4. This Order in Council shall be substituted for the Order in Council dated the 20th day of April, 1917.

#### PRESENT.

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

**W**HEREAS it is enacted by the Suspensory Act, 1914, that notwithstanding anything in the Government of Ireland Act, 1914, no steps shall be taken to put that Act into operation until the expiration of twelve months from the date of the passing of that Act, or, if at the expiration of those twelve months the present War has not ended, until such later date (not being later than the end of the present War) as may be fixed by His Majesty by Order in Council; and that the provisions of that Act shall have effect accordingly:

And whereas by Order in Council dated the 14th day of September, 1915, His Majesty was pleased to order that no steps should be taken to put the Government of Ireland Act, 1914, into operation until the expiration of eighteen months from the date of the passing of that Act, unless the present War had previously ended, nor, if at the expiration of those eighteen months the present War had not ended, until such later date, not being later than the end of the present War, as might hereafter be fixed by Order in Council:

And whereas His Majesty was pleased, by Order in Council dated the 29th day of February, 1916, to extend by six months the time mentioned in the said Order of the 14th day of September, 1915, and by Order in Council dated the 7th day of September, 1916, to extend that time by a further period of six months, and by Order in Council dated the 13th day of March, 1917, to extend that time by a further period of six months, and by Order

in Council dated the 22nd day of August, 1917, to extend that time by a further period of six months:

And whereas it is expedient to extend further the time mentioned in the said Orders:

Now, therefore, His Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, that:—

No steps shall be taken to put the Government of Ireland Act, 1914, into operation until the expiration of a period of six months after the termination of the eighteen months and four periods of six months mentioned in the recited Orders, unless the present War has previously ended, nor, if at the expiration of that period the present War has not ended, until such later date, not being later than the end of the present War, as may hereafter be fixed by Order in Council.

#### PRESENT.

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

**W**HEREAS by the Summer Time Act, 1916, as amended by the Time (Ireland) Act, 1916, it is provided that during the prescribed period in each year in which the former Act is in force the time for general purposes is to be one hour in advance of Greenwich Mean Time; and it is further provided that His Majesty may, in any year subsequent to the year 1916, by Order in Council made during the continuance of the present War, declare the former Act to be in force during that year, and in such case the prescribed period for that year shall be such period as may be fixed by Order in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to declare, and it is hereby declared, that the Summer Time Act, 1916, as so amended as aforesaid, shall be in force during the year 1918, and the prescribed period in that year shall be from two o'clock in the morning Greenwich Mean Time on Sunday the 24th day of March until two o'clock in the morning Greenwich Mean Time on Monday the 30th day of September.

By the Lords of His Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council.

**W**HEREAS His Majesty has been pleased, in exercise of the power in that behalf conferred on Him by Section one, sub-section one, of the Trading with the Enemy (Extension of Powers) Act, 1915, by divers Proclamations, and in particular by a Proclamation dated the 23rd day of May, 1916, and amended on the 16th day of January, 1918, entitled "The Trading with the Enemy (Statutory List) Proclamation," to prohibit all persons or bodies of persons, incorporated or unincorporated, resident, carrying on business, or being in the United Kingdom from trading with any of the

persons or bodies of persons mentioned in the List contained in the last mentioned Proclamation, such List being therein referred to as the Statutory List:

And whereas by Section one, sub-section two, of the said Act, it is provided that any List of persons and bodies of persons, incorporated or unincorporated, with whom such trading is prohibited by a Proclamation under the said Act may be varied or added to by an Order made by the Lords of the Council on the recommendation of a Secretary of State:

And whereas the Statutory List contained in the last mentioned Proclamation, has been varied and added to by subsequent Orders of Council:

And whereas there was this day read at the Board a recommendation from the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs to the effect that the Statutory List should be further varied and added to as set forth in the Schedule hereto.

Now, therefore, Their Lordships, having taken the said recommendation into consideration, are pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered,

That the Statutory List be varied and added to as set forth in the Schedule hereto.

Whereof the Right Honourable Arthur James Balfour, one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, the Controller of the Foreign Trade Department, and all other persons whom it may concern, are to take notice and govern themselves accordingly.

NOTE (1).—All persons or firms resident, carrying on business or being in the United Kingdom are prohibited from having, with any person or firm mentioned in this List, or in any List issued under the Trading with the Enemy (Statutory List) Proclamation, any dealings other than such as are expressly authorised by paragraph 5 of the Proclamation. A List (The Consolidated List, No. 46A) consolidating all previous Lists, was published on the 1st February, 1918, which together with List No. 47 of 15th February, 1918, and the List herewith annexed, contains all the names which up to this date are included in the Statutory List.

Additions to and variations in these Lists will be published at intervals approximately of two weeks.

The Lists are published in the London Gazette and reproduced in the Board of Trade Journal, and separate copies of all Lists may be obtained at a small cost from the Superintendent of Publications, His Majesty's Stationery Office, Imperial House, Kingsway, W.C.

†NOTE (2).—Where a person or firm mentioned in the List has more than one address in the country, or group of countries under which the name of the person or firm appears, all dealings in that country, or in any country in the group, with such person or firm are prohibited, even in cases where one only of the addresses or one only of the countries is specifically mentioned.

\*NOTE (3).—Trading is prohibited under the Trading with the Enemy Proclamations of 25th June and 10th November, 1915, with any person or firm of enemy nationality resident or carrying on business in China, Siam, Persia, Morocco, Liberia or Portuguese East Africa. Persons or firms in the United Kingdom are therefore prohibited from trading with any person or firm of enemy nationality in any of those countries, even though such person or firm is not mentioned by name in the Statutory List.

NOTE (4).—In order to minimise as far as possible any inconvenience which may be caused to British traders by the dislocation of export trade owing to the inclusion in the Statutory List of a former connection, the Foreign Trade Department is collecting and classifying the names of non-enemy firms who may be able to act as substitutes for firms mentioned in the Statutory List. A considerable amount of information is already available at the Foreign Trade Department, and it is in many cases possible to suggest the names of satisfactory substitutes for individual firms on the Lists, without the necessity of referring the matter abroad. The Department is, however, prepared on application to enquire of His Majesty's Representatives abroad for the names of suitable substitutes. When the applicant wishes this done by telegraph he is required to undertake to pay the cost of telegraphic correspondence. It would greatly facilitate the work of the Foreign Trade Department if applicants in making enquiries would specify the particular trade or trades for which substitutes are required. *General enquiries for new connections abroad should be addressed to The Comptroller-General, Depart-*

*ment of Overseas Trade (Development and Intelligence)*, 73, Basinghall Street, London, E.C. 2.

NOTE (5).—The Statutory List for each country is telegraphed, on the day of issue, to His Majesty's Representative in that country, who is instructed to notify accordingly British Consular Officers, to whom persons abroad should apply for information as to names on the List. Persons and firms in the United Kingdom with agencies or branches abroad would, however, be well advised to furnish such agencies or branches with issues of the List as they appear. The names on the Lists for all countries in Central or South America are also notified to His Majesty's Ambassador at Washington, who transmits them to H.M. Consul-General at New York and to other centres in the United States likely to be interested.

NOTE (6).—It is not unusual for firms in Holland and the Netherland East Indies to be registered under names commencing with descriptive terms such as "Handel Maatschappij" (Trading Company) or "Naamlooze Venootschap" (Limited Liability Company). In such cases it has been found more convenient to publish the firm under its proper name, followed by the general descriptive term "Handel Maatschappij" or "Naamlooze Venootschap" (N.V.), as in the case of an English company. For instance, Handel Maatschappij van den Berg & Company, and Naamlooze Venootschap de Komeet v/h Dumonceau Frères will be found under "Berg" and "Komeet" respectively, and not under "Handel" or "Naamlooze."

The following Statute made by the Governing Body of New College, Oxford, on the 16th day of January, 1918, and sealed on the 14th day of February, 1918, has been submitted for the approval of His Majesty in Council, and Notice of its having been so submitted is published in accordance with the provisions of "The Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1877."

Statute to alter and amend the Statutes framed by the Commissioners appointed under the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1877 (40 and 41 Vict., cap. 48) and approved by the Queen in Council on the 3rd day of May, 1882, in relation to New College, in the University of Oxford, in the matter of "Election of Fellows by Competition," such amended Statute being duly made at a General Meeting of the Governing Body of the said College, specially summoned for this purpose, held on the 16th day of January, 1918, and passed by the unanimous votes of those present and voting.

For Statute III, Clause 19, substitute the following:—

"19. The remaining Ordinary Fellowships shall be filled up by competition, but so that not more than two Fellowships shall be so filled up in any one year. Half of them shall be open to all persons who shall have been educated for at least two years in the School of the College of Saint Mary of Winchester, otherwise called Winchester College, or have been for at least eight Terms members of New College, and shall

be called Winchester Fellowships; half of them shall be open to all persons who shall have passed all the examinations required by the University for the Degree of Bachelor of Arts, and shall be called Open Fellowships. No person shall be eligible to a Fellowship under this Clause who shall hold any benefice, property, pension, or office which if acquired after his election would have disqualified him from continuing to be a Fellow. Every Fellow elected under this Clause shall (subject to the proviso hereinafter contained) before being admitted an Actual Fellow give an undertaking to the satisfaction of the Warden and Fellows that he will devote a substantial portion of his time to such a course of higher study either in preparation for professional life or otherwise as the Warden and Fellows may in his case approve: Provided that such undertaking shall not be required to be given by any Fellow who at the time when he would otherwise be admissible as an Actual Fellow shall be engaged in educational work in the College, but such Fellow shall, if after being admitted an Actual Fellow he ceases to be so engaged, be required to give such undertaking. Any Fellow who fails to give, or, having given, fails, in the judgment of the Warden and Fellows, to perform such undertaking shall vacate his Fellowship."

# CARGOES EX ENEMY VESSELS IN PORTUGUESE HARBOURS

With reference to the notification on this subject which was published in the London Gazette of the 5th instant, and former notifications therein mentioned, His Majesty's Minister at Lisbon reports that a further Decree, dated 1st February, 1918, has been issued by the Portuguese Government to the effect that goods on which Banks have advanced credits, or of which the vendors are unpaid, will be delivered to claimants on presentation to the Portuguese Authorities of a certificate from the Legation at Lisbon concerned in conformity with Art. II. of the Portuguese Decree of the 13th July, 1917, and undertaking on the part of its Government responsibility with regard to the settlement of all accounts with the owners of the goods. All claims must be made within sixty days of the date of the Decree.

It is understood that the terms of this Decree cover the cases of liens on enemy-owned goods and unpaid vendors of goods sold to enemy firms.

He collided with the man who had thrown it, but persisted in his attempt, and was in the act of throwing the bomb when it exploded, and he was mortally wounded.

Lieutenant Badenoch's prompt and courageous action undoubtedly saved the man who threw the bomb from death or severe injury.

THE MOTOR SPIRIT DELIVERY ORDER, DATED THIS 26TH DAY OF FEBRUARY, 1918, MADE BY THE BOARD OF TRADE PURSUANT TO REGULATIONS 2F, 2G AND 2JJ OF THE DEFENCE OF THE REALM REGULATIONS.

The Board of Trade, deeming it expedient to make further exercise of their powers under the Regulations 2F, 2G and 2JJ of the Defence of the Realm Regulations as regard motor spirit, hereby order as follows:—

(1) From and after the 1st day of March, 1918, no person shall deliver to a licensed dealer any motor spirit for the purpose of re-sale without receiving from such licensed dealer at the time of delivery customers' vouchers or dealers' vouchers representing the same number of gallons as are then delivered to such licensed dealer.

(2) From and after the 1st day of March, 1918, no licensed dealer in motor spirit shall take delivery of any motor spirit from any person for the purpose of re-sale without delivering to such person customers' vouchers or dealers' vouchers representing the same number of gallons as are then delivered to him.

(3) All persons who receive customers' or dealers' vouchers under paragraphs 1 and 2 of this Order or otherwise shall hold and dispose of such vouchers in such manner as shall be directed by the Petrol Control Department of the Board of Trade or by any person duly authorised by them, and shall make such returns and give such information relating to the said vouchers as the Board of Trade or the Petrol Control Department may require.

(4) The Petrol Control Department may by licence in writing exempt any person from the operation of this Order or any part thereof for such times and subject to such considerations as may be specified in such licence.

(5) In this Order:—

The expression "motor spirit" includes any liquid substance used or capable of being used for supplying motive power to motor vehicles, but does not include a mineral oil capable of being used in a lamp unless taxed as motor spirit under the provisions of the Finance (1909-10) Act, 1910, or bought or sold for use in a motor vehicle.

The expression "licensed dealer" means a person licensed to deal in motor spirit.

The expression "customer's voucher" means a voucher detached from a motor spirit licence issued by the Petrol Control Depart-

ment of the Board of Trade pursuant to Section 15 of the Finance Act, 1916.

The expression "dealer's voucher" means a voucher issued by the Petrol Control Department of the Board of Trade for the purpose of enabling a licensed dealer to obtain a supply of motor spirit for the purpose of re-sale.

THE PAPER RESTRICTION ORDER, 1918, DATED THE 27TH DAY OF FEBRUARY, 1918, MADE BY THE BOARD OF TRADE UNDER REGULATIONS 2F AND 2J OF THE DEFENCE OF THE REALM REGULATIONS.

The Board of Trade, deeming it expedient to make a further exercise of the powers conferred upon them by Regulations 2F and 2J of the Defence of the Realm Regulations as respects paper, hereby order as follows:—

1. All importers and manufacturers of and dealers in wrapping and packing paper, strawboard, millboard, wood pulp board, cardboard, pasteboard boxes and cartons made of paper, or of any of the materials aforesaid, shall, if required, supply during the year ending 28th February, 1919, to those persons to whom they supplied any such goods during the year ending 28th February, 1918, two-thirds of the weight of such goods as they supplied to them during the previous 12 months.

2. All importers and manufacturers of and dealers in any description of paper other than those mentioned in paragraph 1 and in paper making materials shall, if required, supply during the year ending 28th February, 1919, to those persons to whom they supplied during the year ending 28th February, 1918, any description of paper, other than as aforesaid, or any product or products of paper making material, whether such material was imported into or produced in the United Kingdom, one-half of the weight of paper, or of the product or products of such materials as they supplied to them during the previous 12 months.

3. Where during the year ending 28th February, 1918, a person was by reason of a priority certificate or certificates supplied with a greater amount of the goods mentioned in paragraphs 1 and 2 of this Order than he would otherwise have been entitled to obtain under the regulations issued by the Royal Commission on Paper and then in force, such greater amount shall be excluded in calculating the amount which he is entitled to demand under the provisions of paragraphs 1 and 2 of this Order.

4. Where a person requires to be supplied with any of the goods referred to in paragraphs 1 and 2 of this Order he shall give reasonable notice of his requirements to the importer, manufacturers or dealer from whom he is entitled to claim supplies. Such notice shall refer to his requirements during each four monthly period ending 30th June and 30th October, 1918, and 28th February, 1919. In default of such notice he shall not be entitled to receive such supplies. Any question as to the sufficiency or reasonableness of such notice

shall be determined by the Royal Commission on Paper. Such notice shall not, unless by consent, be withdrawn.

5. If any question arises between a person who is bound to give and a person who is entitled to receive supplies under paragraphs 1 and 2 of this Order as to the price at which the goods are to be supplied, such questions shall in default of agreement be determined by the Royal Commission on Paper, whose decision shall be final.

6. If by reason of fulfilling orders in respect of which priority certificates have been issued under the Paper Restriction Order No. 5, 1917, any person is unable to supply all other persons who are entitled to require supplies from him with their requirements in full, he shall divide the balance of his stock or output remaining, after the fulfilment of orders in respect of which priority certificates have been granted, pro rata among such other persons, unless the Royal Commission on Paper otherwise direct.

7. If in the opinion of the Royal Commission on Paper the fulfilment of any requirement made under paragraphs 1 or 2 of this Order is impossible or unreasonable, having regard to any restrictions in force or to circumstances arising out of the present war, or to any other sufficient reason, they may in writing excuse the fulfilment of any such requirement or any part thereof.

8. All persons shall obey the instructions of the Royal Commission on Paper relating to the manufacture, purchase, sale (including the fixing of maximum prices), distribution, supply, transport or storage of paper, and all articles mentioned in paragraphs 1 and 2 hereof.

9. Infringements of this Order are summary offences under the Defence of the Realm Regulations.

10. This Order may be cited as the Paper Restriction Order, 1918.

Third Grade.—£85 per ton, delivered at nearest railway station to appointed destination.

3. All Contracts previously entered into for the purchase of re-scutched Tow are hereby cancelled as at this date, as regards re-scutched Tow not yet delivered.

4. If after this notice and Order any person having control of any re-scutched Tow referred to hereunder sells, removes or secretes such re-scutched Tow, except upon the terms provided in this Order, he will be guilty of an offence against the Defence of the Realm Regulations.

#### IMPORTED WIRE NAILS ORDER, 1918.

3. Nothing in this Order shall be deemed to apply to any stocks of Wire Nails of the description aforesaid of less than 5 tons in quantity.

All persons engaged in the purchase, sale or manufacture of any articles or material wholly or partly composed of Russian or Italian Hemp are hereby required to furnish such particulars as to their business as may be required by or on behalf of the Flax Control Board, verified in such manner as may be directed by them or on their behalf.

3. Particulars may be obtained and permits issued hereunder by the Flax Control Board, and by the Scottish and Irish Sub-Committees of the Flax Control Board on their behalf.

4. It shall be the duty of all persons engaged in the production of any article or material wholly or partly composed of Russian or Italian Hemp to comply strictly with any directions or requirements that may be given or made hereunder by or on behalf of the Flax Control Board for the purposes thereof, and failure to comply with the provisions hereof, or any direction or requirement given or made hereunder shall be an offence against the said Regulations.

5. This Order may be cited as the Hemp (Restriction of Consumption) Order, 1918.

RESPECTING OPEN COMPETITIVE EXAMINATIONS FOR THE SITUATION OF FEMALE LEARNER IN THE DEPARTMENT OF THE POSTMASTER-GENERAL IN EDINBURGH, DUBLIN, AND CERTAIN OTHER TOWNS.

*These Regulations are liable to alteration from time to time.*

1. The limits of age for this situation are 14 and 16. If an examination begins in one of the first four months of any year, Candidates must be of the prescribed age on the 1st day of January in that year. If an examination begins in one of the second four months of any year, Candidates must be of the prescribed age on the 1st day of May in that year. If an examination begins in one of the last four months of any year, Candidates must be of the prescribed age on the 1st day of September in that year.

2. Candidates will be required to satisfy the Civil Service Commissioners—

That they are duly qualified in respect of health and character.

That they are natural-born or naturalised British subjects. A candidate who was not born or whose father was not born within the British Dominions or whose mother was at any time before marriage of enemy nationality will not be eligible for admission to examination unless she has obtained the special permission of the Civil Service Commissioners to compete.

3. At each Examination the number of Candidates to be selected will be such as the Postmaster-General may from time to time fix.

4. The Examination will be in the following subjects, viz.:—

1. English.
2. History.
3. Geography.
4. Arithmetic.

*Candidates must satisfy the Civil Service Commissioners in Handwriting and in the Examination as a whole.*

5. No Candidate will be admitted to examination who does not, at such time as may



be fixed by the Civil Service Commissioners, produce an undertaking, signed by her parent or guardian, that she will, if successful, reside within a suitable distance from the Post Office, either with her parents or guardians, or with relations or friends approved by such parents or guardians.

6. Candidates must be at least 5 feet in height.

7. Persons holding situations in the Civil Service must obtain the permission of the authorities of their Department to attend the Examination, before the commencement of the competition.

8. Persons who have entered upon or completed a course of education or training for the occupation of teacher, on account of which grants are payable from the Exchequer, will not be qualified to receive appointments until the consent of the Board of Education in England, the Committee of Council on Education for Scotland, or the Commissioners of National Education, Ireland, as the case may be, given in conformity with rules sanctioned by the Lords of the Treasury, has been notified to the Civil Service Commissioners.

9. Application for permission to attend an Examination must be made at such time and in such manner as may be fixed by the Civil Service Commissioners.

10. A fee of 4s. will be required from every Candidate attending an Examination.

*\*\*\*These Regulations are liable to alteration from time to time.*

1. The limits of age for this situation are 18 and 30. If an Examination begins in one of the first four months of any year Candidates must be of the prescribed age on the 1st day of January in that year. In an Examination begins in one of the second four months of any year Candidates must be of the prescribed age on the 1st day of May in that year. If an Examination begins in one of the last four months of any year Candidates must be of the prescribed age on the 1st day of September in that year.

In reckoning age for competition, persons who have served for two consecutive years in any Civil situation to which they were admitted with the certificate of the Civil Service Commissioners, may deduct from their actual age any time not exceeding five years which they may have spent in such service.

Persons transferred to situations in the Post Office from a Telephone Company or Municipal Telephone Undertaking, on the absorption of such Company or Undertaking by the Post Office, may reckon, as if it were service in a situation to which they were admitted with the Certificate of the Civil Service Commissioners, their continuous service in the Post Office, as well as so much of their previous continuous
