Vienna, February 12. Prince Lewis of Baden is come to his House at Slakwert in Bohemia, where he will stay a few days, and then continue his Journey hither. The Marquis de Parella, Lieutenant-General of the Duke of Savoy's Forces, is arrived here from Piedmont, and has had several Conferences with the Imperial Ministers about the Affairs of the War. A great many Recruit Horses are come hither from Bokemia, and other Parts, which will be sent to Hungary for the Service of the Imperial Troops; The Foot Officers ere to have their Companies compleat by the beginning of April. General Veterani is going about his particular Affairs to Insprucke, and intends to be back in a Fortnight or three Weeks. Hamburgh, Febr. 22. The Letters from W.w-faw of the 5th Instant say, the Diet had not yet made choice of their Mareschal or Speaker, and 'twas feared it would break up without doing any thing. Paris, Fibruary 21. The French King has appointed a Review of the Troops of the Houshold to be at Compiegne about the end of the next month, but 'tis not yet declared who is to Command the French Army in Flanders the next Campagne. They are fitting 8 or 10 Frigats from 30 to 40 Guns each at Rechefore, and 5 or 6 in other Ports. The 6 Ships defigned for the East-Indies will fail about the middle of the next month. Monfieur Amelot, the French Ambatlador in Suifferland, is come hither to look after his private Affairs. They take little notice at this Court of the complaint that has been made by the Venetian Ambassador about their furnishing the Turks with Ammunition; and are now going to fend them a farther Supply from Toulon and Marfielles.

Bruffels, February 23. The Preparations are continued for fending 3000 men from hence to Catalonia, under the Command of the Count de Thian. They write from Haynaule, that the Deputies of the States of that Province had been at the French Court, to represent their inability to pay the heavy Taxes that are laid upon them, but that they were fent away without being heard. The French have fent a confiderable quantity of Hay from Maheuge towards the Meuse, to renew the Magazine that was lately burnt at Namur. Some days ago, a Spanish Party marched from Aeth towards St. Guiflan, and in the Night burnt a confiderable quantity of Hay which the Enemy had laid up there; I his place was demolished some time fince, but the French built a Redoubt near it, where they keep a Garison of 3 or 400 men, to secure the Communication between Mons and Conde. The French have begun to Levy the Poll-Tax in their new Conquests.
