PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS the Local Government Board, after giving to the Incumbent and the Churchwardens of the Parish of St. Mary, Chelmsford, in the County of Essex, 10 days' previous Notice of their intention in that behalf, did, under the provisions of the Burial Act, 1853, as amended by the Burial Act, 1900, on the 3rd day of January, 1918, make a Representation to His Majesty in Council that, for the protection of the public health, the opening of any new Burial Ground in the Civil Parish of Chelmsford, in the County of Essex, save with the previous approval of the Local Government Board, should be prohibited, and that Burials should be discontinued therein as herein-after directed:

And whereas by an Order in Council of the 16th day of January, 1918, Notice of such Representation was given, and it was ordered that the same should be taken into consideration by the Privy Council on the 27th day of February, 1918, and such Order has been published in the London Gazette, and copies thereof have been affixed, as required by the said first-mentioned Act:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, in exercise of the powers in that behalf conferred upon Him by the said Act, is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, as it is hereby ordered, that no new Burial Ground shall be opened in the said Civil Parish save with the previous approval of the Local Government Board, and that Burials shall be discontinued therein as follows, viz.:—

CHELMSFORD.—Forthwith and entirely in the Churchyard of St. Mary, Chelmsford, otherwise known as Rectory Lane Cemetery, in the County of Essex; Provided that—

(a) In any vault or walled grave now existing in the said Burial Ground burial may be allowed, subject to the condition that every coffin buried in such vault or grave be separately enclosed by stonework or brickwork properly cemented.

(b) In any earthen grave now existing in the said Burial Ground the burial may be allowed of the body of any member of the family of the person or persons heretofore buried in such grave, subject to the condition that no part of the coffin containing the body shall be at a depth less than 3 feet below the level of the surface of the ground adjoining the grave.

(c) In the said Burial Ground, in any grave space in which no interment has heretofore taken place, the burial may be allowed

of the body of any person for whom, or of any member of a family for which, such grave space has been reserved and appropriated as a burial place, with the exclusive right of burial therein, subject to the condi-

tion that no part of the coffin containing the body shall be at a depth less than 3 feet below the level of the surface of the ground adjoining the grave.

II.

PRINTING CARRIED OUT DIRECTLY BY THE REGISTRATION OFFICER, AND OTHER OUT OF POCKET EXPENDITURE.

(2) The actual expenditure supported as far as possible by vouchers, and certified by a statutory declaration by the Registration Officer to the effect that it was necessarily and properly incurred. First-class railway expenses and subsistence allowance at the rate of £1 a night when the Registration Officer or his Deputy are necessarily absent from their homes on account of their registration duties will be allowed.

Whereas His Majesty was pleased by His Royal Warrant dated 4th day of June, 1917, to establish a Commission called the Royal Commission on Paper, and was thereby pleased to assign certain duties to the said Royal Commission respecting paper and paper-making materials:

And whereas His Majesty was pleased by His Royal Warrant dated 8th day of March, 1918, to dissolve the said Royal Commission:

And whereas the Board of Trade have, in exercise of the powers conferred upon them by Regulations 2f to 2jj, made certain Orders as respects paper and paper-making materials, and particularly Orders known as the Paper Restriction Order No. 5, 1917, the Paper Restriction (Posters and Circulars) Order, 1918, and the Paper Restriction Order, 1918, which said Orders contain references to the said Royal Commission and give authority to the said Commission to exercise certain powers and duties on behalf of the Board of Trade as respects paper:

And whereas the Board of Trade have on the dissolution of the said Royal Commission

appointed an officer to be called the Controller of Paper, and have assigned to him certain duties respecting paper and paper-making materials:

Now, therefore, the Board of Trade, in exercise of the powers conferred upon them by Regulations 2F to 2JJ of the Defence of the Realm Regulations, hereby order as follows:—

1. The words "The Controller of Paper" shall be substituted for the words "The Royal Commission on Paper" wherever they occur in any of the above recited Orders or in any other Orders made by the Board of Trade.

2. The Controller of Paper for the time being may exercise all the powers heretofore conferred by the Board of Trade on the Royal Commission on Paper.

3. Where any Order respecting paper or paper-making materials heretofore made gives power to the Board of Trade to grant licenses dispensing with any of the provisions of such Order such license may be granted on behalf of the Board of Trade by the Controller of Paper, unless the Board otherwise direct.

4. This Order may be cited as The Controller of Paper Order, 1918.

ORDER OF THE MINISTER OF MUNITIONS, DATED 8TH MARCH, 1918, UNDER REGULATION 2A (2) OF THE DEFENCE OF THE REALM REGULATIONS, CONSTITUTING THE COUNTY BOROUGH OF BIRKENHEAD A SPECIAL AREA FOR THE PURPOSES OF THAT SUB-SECTION.

The Minister of Munitions, being of opinion that as respects the area specified in the Schedule annexed hereto in which the work of manufacturing, producing, repairing, storing or transporting war material is being carried

on the ejection from their dwellings of workmen employed in that work is calculated to impede, delay or restrict that work, in pursuance of the powers conferred upon him by the Defence of the Realm Regulations, hereby orders and declares that the area specified in the Schedule annexed hereto is a Special Area for the purpose of sub-section 2 of Regulation 2A of the Defence of the Realm Regulations.

BISMUTH ORES, BISMUTH METAL AND PRODUCTS THEREFROM.

1. In exercise of the powers conferred upon him by Regulation 30A of the Defence of the Realm Regulations, the Minister of Munitions hereby orders that the war material to which that Regulation applies shall include war material of the following classes and descriptions, namely:—

All Bismuth-bearing ores and Bismuth metal and alloys and salts derived or produced therefrom.

2. In exercise of the powers conferred on him by the Defence of the Realm Regulations and all other powers thereunto enabling him, the Minister of Munitions hereby orders as follows:—

(1) Every person holding any stock of any of the material specified in Clause 1 of this Order shall within fourteen days from the date hereof furnish full particulars of any such stock to the Controller of Non-Ferrous Materials Supply, Ministry of Munitions, 8, Northumberland Avenue, London, W.C. 2 (hereinafter referred to as the Controller).

(2) Every owner, lessee or licensee of a mine or mines producing Bismuth-bearing ores situate in the United Kingdom shall, within fourteen days from the date hereof and once in every month thereafter, make to the Controller, on and in accordance with the form prescribed by the Controller, a return showing particulars of his monthly output and deliveries of Bismuth ore, concentrates and stocks on hand at the end of each month.

(3) Every merchant, importer or broker who receives consignments from outside the United Kingdom of Bismuth ores shall, within fourteen days from the date hereof and once in every month thereafter, make to the Controller on and in accordance with the form prescribed by the Controller, a return showing all shipments afloat and all parcels landed or in warehouse during the month preceding the day of the return.

(4) Every person who treats any ore to which this Order applies or manufactures any material or article therefrom shall, within fourteen days from the date hereof and once in every month thereafter, make to the Controller on and in accordance with the form prescribed by the Controller, a return showing stock in hand, receipts and consumption of such ore and stock in hand, out-

put and deliveries of manufactures from such ore.

(5) Every person who in any manufacture uses Bismuth metal or any alloy thereof shall, on the 1st day of April, 1918, and thereafter on the first day of every calendar month, make to the Controller a return on and in accordance with the form prescribed by the Controller, showing the quantity of Bismuth metal or any alloy thereof received by him from the producer, the quantity consumed by him in such manufacture during the preceding month, and the stock in hand at the end of the said month.

(6) Notwithstanding the above, no return is required from any person whose total stock in hand and not intended to be used in connection with the manufacture or alloy of steel or other metal has not during the period for which a return would but for this exception have been required exceeded in the case of

Bismuth salts ...	56 lbs.
Bismuth metal or alloy thereof ...	14 lbs.

3. Every return made by any person for the purpose of this Order shall be signed by such person, or, if the return is made on behalf of a firm or company, shall be signed by a partner, director, manager or other responsible official, and every statement contained therein shall be true and accurate.

4. Applications for permits under this Order should be made to the Controller of Non-Ferrous Materials Supply, M.S./P. Ministry of Munitions, 8, Northumberland Avenue, W.C. 2.

5. This Order may be cited as the Bismuth Order, 1918.

The Minister of Munitions gives notice, that he hereby until further notice permits any person to purchase Bismuth metal and Bismuth salts not exceeding in any one calendar month in the case of Bismuth metal a total quantity of 10 lbs. and in the case of Bismuth salts a total quantity of 56 lbs., provided that the same are purchased and in fact used for pharmaceutical or medical purposes only, and further permits a sale to any person purchasing as hereinbefore authorised.

tion of Shellac by such person for any purpose during the year 1917; provided that no such return is required from any person unless he has at some time since January 1st, 1917, had in his possession or under his control an amount of Shellac exceeding an aggregate of $7\frac{1}{2}$ cwts. net weight.

2. No person shall as from the date hereof until further notice purchase or, except for the purpose of carrying out a contract in writing existing prior to such date for the purchase of Shellac, take delivery of any Shellac whether situate in or outside the United Kingdom, except under and in accordance with the terms of a license issued under the authority of the Minister of Munitions, or sell, or except for the purpose of carrying out a contract in writing for the sale of Shellac existing at the date thereof, deliver any such Shellac to any person other than the holder of such a license and in accordance with the terms thereof, provided that no such license shall be required by any person for the purchase of Shellac in quantities not exceeding an aggregate of $7\frac{1}{2}$ cwts. net weight during any one calendar month or for the sale or delivery of such maximum quantity on any such purchase.

1. In Clause 1, the words "To or" shall be inserted after the word "shipment."
2. In Clause 2, the words "To or" shall be inserted after the word "shipment."

Civil Service Commission, March 12, 1918.

The Civil Service Commissioners hereby give notice that with the approval of the Lords Commissioners of H.M. Treasury the following Regulation is substituted for the existing Regulation Number 8 in the Regulations respecting Boy Clerks registered for temporary employment in Public Departments dated 15th September, 1916, and published in the London Gazette of that date, as amended by notice published in the London Gazette dated 16th October, 1917:—

8. Boy Clerks will usually be engaged and paid by the week of 39 hours, viz.:—7 hours a day on Mondays, Tuesdays, Wednesdays, Thursdays, and Fridays, and 4 hours on Saturdays; and they will be paid 17s. per week during the first year of their service. After a year of approved service, an increase of pay to 18s. a week may be allowed; after two years of approved service, an increase of pay to 19s. a week may be allowed.

In any case of absence without pay a Boy Clerk's increment shall be postponed one day for every day of such absence—absence without pay equally with the interval between two successive engagements not being reckoned as service for any purpose contemplated by the Regulations.

Boy Clerks may also be engaged and paid by the hour at the rate of 4½d. per hour during their first year of service; and at the rate of 5d. per hour thereafter. Any Boy Clerks who may be required to attend for more than 7½ hours on Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday, Thursday, or Friday, or more than 4½ hours on Saturday, will be paid at the rate of 6d. per hour for the overtime attendance in excess of the normal attendance for such day. But in no case must overtime attendance exceed 6 hours in any one week. They may also be paid by the piece at such rates as may be fixed by the Civil Service Commissioners, with the approval of the Lords Commissioners of the Treasury.

SHREWSBURY.

And whereas it is proposed that a Provisional Order should be issued in compliance with the said Application;

Maxwell, Esquire, LL.D., Barrister-at-Law, one of the Inspectors of the said Board, will attend at the Guildhall, Shrewsbury, on Thursday, the twenty-first day of March, 1918, at ten o'clock in the forenoon, to hold a Local Inquiry into the subject-matter of the said Application and the proposed Provisional Order.

**SPECIAL INSTRUCTIONS TO
MERCHANT VESSELS.**

Former Notice.—No. 235 of 1918; hereby cancelled.

(1) Information respecting War Instructions for Merchant Vessels.

Notice is hereby given that, under the Defence of the Realm Regulation (Consolidation) Regulations, 1914, the following Order has been made by the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty and is now in force:—

The Orders contained in Admiralty War Instructions for British Merchant Ships or in any instructions or advice, confidential or otherwise, issued or given to Masters of vessels by British or Allied Naval Officers, or by other duly authorised Officers or Officials, as to routes to be taken and other precautions to be observed to avoid capture or destruction by the enemy, are to be observed even when they are in conflict with the provisions of the Regulations for preventing Collisions at Sea and every vessel observing such regulations, instructions or advice shall be deemed to be taking measures to meet "special circumstances" within the meaning of Article 27 of the Regulations for preventing Collisions at Sea.

(2) Caution as to obeying Orders received from H.M. Ships, &c.

The attention of all Masters or other persons in command or charge of vessels is directed to the duty of obeying promptly and strictly all orders, whether by way of signal or otherwise, given by any Officer in Command of any of His Majesty's Ships or by any Naval or Military Officer engaged in the defence of the coast. Cases have been reported to the Admiralty in which British Merchant vessels have wilfully disregarded the Orders given by Patrol Boats, &c., and it is therefore considered necessary to remind all persons concerned of the penalties provided for such acts of disobedience.

Where vessels neglect to obey Orders so given the person in charge is liable to prosecution under the Defence of the Realm (Consolidation) Regulations, 1914, and upon conviction to be fined £100 or imprisoned for six months or, where the disobedience was of an aggravated kind, to suffer both penalties.

It should also be noted that failure to obey orders may necessitate the seizure and detention of the vessel, when found in any port of the United Kingdom subsequently to the time at which the act of disobedience was committed.

(3) Use of Mine Protection Gear by Vessels.

Notice is given that under the Defence of the Realm Regulations, the following Regulation has been made by the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty with a view to protecting vessels navigating within certain areas from the risk of damage by mine, and is now in force:—

No British vessel equipped as directed by the Admiralty or Shipping Controller with the "Otter" protective gear shall, while navigating within the 60-fathom line off the United

Kingdom or in any waters less than 60 fathoms deep where mines have been reported or may with reasonable probability be encountered, or in less than 80 fathoms in the Mediterranean Sea, neglect to have such protective gear properly adjusted and actually running outboard and adequately manned to secure the efficient working of the apparatus; and the Master or other person in command or charge of any British vessel who neglects to see that such apparatus is so adjusted, running, manned and worked shall be guilty of an offence against the Defence of the Realm Regulations.

(4) Procedure for Visit and Search of Vessels by H.M. Ships.

In view of the danger of H.M. Ships closing vessels, apparently Neutral, British or Allied traders, but which are in reality German raiding cruisers, it is necessary to adopt a special Boarding procedure as a measure of precaution.

When it is desired to put into force the special Boarding procedure it will be as follows:—

A red pendant of a specially large size will be hoisted by the man-of-war exercising the right of visit and search. The hoisting of this pendant will be accompanied by the firing of a rocket. This will signify that the merchant ship is to close the boat lowered by the man-of-war, whether the man-of-war remains in the vicinity of the boat or not.

(5) Regulations with regard to Vessels' Lights.

Notice is hereby given that, under the Defence of the Realm (Consolidation) Regulations, 1914, the following Orders have been made by the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty and are now in force:—

In areas in which submarines or raiders may be met vessels are to be carefully darkened from sunset to sunrise and are to proceed without navigation lights. These lights must be so arranged that they can be instantly shown to avoid collision and extinguished as soon as the danger of collision is past. Navigation lights when specially ordered to be shown must be dimmed to a visibility of less than two miles—(Admiralty War Instructions for British Merchant Vessels).

1. *Masthead Lights.*—No Masthead Light of a brilliancy exceeding $2\frac{1}{2}$ candle power is to be exhibited. Lights are to be shaded with plain opal glass and the reflectors are to be removed from the lanterns. Masthead Lights are never to be used unless the Master considers it absolutely necessary. The use of Masthead Lights is to be discontinued until provision has been made for their being dimmed in accordance with this Order.

2. *Side Lights.*—No Side Light of a brilliancy exceeding 8-candle power shall be exhibited.

In clear weather, and when specially ordered, 5-candle power lamps are to be exhibited.

Plain coloured glass is to be fitted to the lanterns, but where already placed dioptric lenses may be continued in use until the plain glasses can be fitted.

Oil Side Lamps are only to be exhibited if electric lights are not available.

Reflectors are to be removed from the lanterns.

3. *Stern Lights*.—No Stern Light is to be exhibited except to avoid danger of collision, and such light is to be extinguished as soon as the danger is past.

Such light shall be electric of $2\frac{1}{2}$ -candle power shaded with a plain opal glass and is to be controlled from the bridge.

In ships fitted with dimmers bulbs of a higher candle power may be used, but lights are not to be shown of a brilliancy exceeding that quoted in this Order, except in special circumstances, such as imminent danger of collision, thick weather or while navigating in and entering or leaving harbours, &c.; such ships are to be supplied with bulbs of the prescribed candle power, which are to be inserted and used in the lamps should the dimmers fail from any cause.

In vessels where electric light is not installed, an oil lamp or electric torch of equivalent brilliancy may be substituted.

Vessels in Convoy which on occasion necessarily have to exhibit a Stern Light are to have such lights screened so as to show not more than three points from right astern on each quarter.

This Order applies—subject to any directions that may be given in any particular circumstances by the Commanding Officer of the Convoy or Senior Naval Officer present—to all British Merchant Vessels, and if

(a) the owner of any British Merchant Vessel, or where such owner is a Company, the Managing Director or other responsible person, fails to provide such vessel with the lights hereby prescribed and/or the means of shading the same; or if

(b) the Master or other person in command of charge of such vessel so provided fails to comply with any of the directions in this Order stated or referred to; then such Owner, Managing Director or other responsible person, and such Master or other person in command or charge shall respectively be guilty of an offence against the Defence of the Realm Regulations.

1. *Anchor Lights*.—No electrically-lit lanterns are to be employed as anchor lights. The normal brilliancy of all other anchor lanterns is to be reduced by 50 per cent.

All anchor lanterns are to be fitted with overhead screens, so arranged as to cut off the light at an angle of between 20 and 25 degrees above the horizontal.

NOTE.—Specimen screens can be viewed at the Board of Trade Surveyor's Offices at Leith, North Shields, Hull, London, Plymouth, Cardiff, Liverpool, Glasgow and Dublin.

2. *Other Lights*.—No light, either aloft, on deck or below, except those authorised by the Admiralty Confidential Instructions, and such as may be necessary for authorised signalling purposes, are to be permitted to be visible from outboard. This applies to vessels whether under way or at anchor.

3. The above Order applies to vessels of every description, other than H.M. ships and the vessels mentioned in the succeeding paragraph, in the waters of the United Kingdom.

4. Vessels carrying volatile oil or spirits in bulk are, notwithstanding the above orders, to exhibit (in lieu of oil lamps) electrically-lit lanterns not exceeding in brilliancy 50 per cent. of the brilliancy of the normal oil lamps.

Note.

This Notice is a revision of the former Notice quoted above.

Caution.

Sections (1), (3) and (5) of this Admiralty Notice to Mariners are issued under the provisions of the Defence of the Realm (Consolidation) Regulations, 1914, and failure to comply strictly with the directions contained in them will constitute an offence against those Regulations.

Any person found guilty of such an offence is liable to severe penalties both of imprisonment and fine.

Any person aiding or abetting the commission of such an offence is himself guilty of an offence against the Regulations.

Attention is also drawn to the fact that any infringement of the directions contained in sections (1), (3) and (5) of this Admiralty Notice to Mariners is liable to result in the detention of the ship or vessel.
