PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

W HEREAS under the Representation of the People Act, 1918 (hereinafter referred to as "the Act"), various matters are to be prescribed by His Majesty by Order in Council:

And whereas in particular provision is made by the Act as follows:—

"His Majesty may by Order in Council prescribe the forms to be used for registration purposes and any fees to be taken in connection therewith, and alter the rules contained in the First Schedule to this Act for the purpose of carrying this Act into full effect (s. 13 (2)).

"The statement of any person, made in the prescribed form and verified in the prescribed manner, that he would have had the necessary qualification in any constituency but for the service which brings him within the provisions of this section, shall for all purposes of this section be sufficient if there is no evidence to the contrary." (s. 5 (2)).

Now, therefore, His Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

1. The forms specified in the Schedule to this Order, or forms to the like effect, shall be used in the cases to which they are expressed to be applicable and shall for the purposes of the Act be deemed to be the prescribed forms.

2. In particular the forms of statement as therein specified under heading V. ("Forms of statement to be made under s. 5 (2) of the Act"), or forms to the like effect, shall be deemed to be the prescribed forms of statement that a person would have had the necessary qualification but for the service which brings him within the provisions of the said section, and shall be verified by being countersigned by an officer or other person in the manner shown on the forms.

This Order shall not apply to Scotland or Ireland.

INSTRUCTIONS FOR FILLING UP THIS FORM.

- (1) You will enter as a resident any person who is ordinarily living in the house, whether he is actually present there on a given date or not.
- (2) Generally speaking, the person to be entered as occupier is the person who pays rent in respect of the premises or land, where the premises or land are let, and where the pre-

mises or land are not let, the owner if in occupation.

(3) A person who inhabits a dwelling house or rooms (without payment of rent), by virtue of any office, service or employment, is to be treated as an occupier, so long as his employer does not himself inhabit the house or rooms.

(4) Lodgers are only to be treated as occupiers where the lodgings are let to them un-

furnished.

(5) Where land or premises are occupied by a partnership, or otherwise by persons as joint tenants, all the members of the partnership and all the joint tenants should be entered, with a statement that they occupy as members of a partnership or otherwise as joint tenants.

(6) A person qualified under more than one heading should be entered under each of those

WHEREAS His Majesty has been pleased, in exercise of the power in that behalf cenferred on Him by Section one, sub-section one, of the Trading with the Enemy (Extensien of Powers) Act, 1915, by divers Proclamations, and in particular by a Proclamation dated the 23rd day of May, 1916, and amended on the 16th day of January, 1918, entitled "The Trading with the Enemy (Statutory List) Proclamation," to prohibit all persons or bodies of persons, incorporated or unincorporated, resident, carrying on business, or being in the United Kingdom from trading with any of the persons or bodies of persons mentioned in the List contained in the last mentioned Proclamation, such List being therein referred to as the Statutory List:

And whereas by Section one, sub-section two, of the said Act, it is provided that any List of persons and bodies of persons, incorporated or unincorporated, with whom such trading is prohibited by a Proclamation under the said Act may be varied or added to by an Order made by the Lords of the Council on the recommendation of a Secretary of State:

And whereas the Statutory List contained in the last mentioned Proclamation has been varied and added to by subsequent Orders of Council:

And whereas there was this day read at the Board a recommendation from the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs to the effect that the Statutory List should be further varied and added to as set forth in the Schedule hereto.

Now, therefore, Their Lordships, having taken the said recommendation into consideration, are pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered,

That the Statutory List be varied and added to as set forth in the Schedule hereto.

Note (1).—All persons or firms resident, carrying on business or being in the United Kingdom are prohibited from having, with any person or firm mentioned in this List, or in any List issued under the Trading with the Enemy (Statutory List) Proclamation, any dealings other than such as are expressly authorised by paragraph 5 of the Proclamation. A List (The Consolidated List, No. 46A) consolidating all previous Lists, was published on the 1st February, 1918, which, together with List No. 47 of 15th February, 1918, List No. 48 of 1st March, 1918, and the List herewith annexed, contain all the names which up to this date are included in the Statutory List.

Additions to and variations in these Lists will be published at intervals approximately of two weeks.

The Lists are published in the London Gazette and reproduced in the Board of Trade Journal, and separate copies of all Lists may be obtained at a small cost from the Superin-tendent of Publications, His Majesty's Stationery Office, Imperial House, Kingsway,

Note (2).—Where a person or firm mentioned in the List has more than one address in the country, or group of countries under which the name of the person or firm appears, all dealings in that country, or in any country in the group, with such person or firm are prohibited, even in cases where one only of the addresses or one only of the countries is specifically mentioned.

Note (3).—Trading is prohibited under the Trading with the Enemy Proclamations of 25th June and 10th November, 1915, with any person or firm of enemy nationality resident or carrying on business in China, Siam, Persia, Morocco, Liberia or Portuguese East Africa. Persons or firms in the United Kingdom are therefore prohibited from trading with any person or firm of enemy nationality in any of those countries, even though such person or firm is not mentioned by name in the Statutory

Note (4).—In order to minimise as far as possible any inconvenience which may be

caused to British traders by the dislocation of export trade owing to the inclusion in the Statutory List of a former connection, the Foreign Trade Department is collecting and classifying the names of non-enemy firms who may be able to act as substitutes for firms mentioned in the Statutory List. A considerable amount of information is already available at the Foreign Trade Department, and it is in many cases possible to suggest the names of satisfactory substitutes for individual firms on the Lists without the necessity of referring the matter abroad. The Department is, however, prepared on application to enquire of His Majesty's Representatives abroad for the names of suitable substitutes. When the applicant wishes this done by telegraph he is required to undertake to pay the cost of telegraphic correspondence. It would greatly facilitate the work of the Foreign Trade Department if applicants in making enquiries would specify the particular trade or trades for which substitutes are required. General enquiries for new connections abroad should be addressed to the Comptroller-General, Department of Overseas Trade (Development and Intelligence), 73, Basinghall Street, London, E.C. 2.

NOTE (5).—The Statutory List for each country is telegraphed, on the day of issue, to His Majesty's Representative in that country, who is instructed to notify accordingly British Consular Officers, to whom persons abroad should apply for information as to names on the List. Persons and firms in the United Kingdom with agencies or branches abroad would, however, be well advised to furnish such agencies or branches with issues of the List as they The names on the Lists for all countries in Central or South America are also notified to His Majesty's Ambassador at Washington, who transmits them to H.M. Consul-General at New York and to other centres in the United States likely to be interested.

NOTE (6).—It is not unusual for firms in Holland and the Netherland East Indies to be registered under names commencing with descriptive terms such as "Handel Maatschappy" (Trading Company) or "Naamlooze Venootschap" (Limited Liability Company). In such cases it has been found more convenient to publish the firm under its proper name fol-lowed by the general descriptive term "Handel Maatschappy" or "Naamlooze Venootschap" (N.V.) as in the case of an English company. For instance, Handel Maatschappy van den Berg & Company, and Naamlooze Venootschap de Komeet v/h Dumonceau Frères will be found under "Berg" and "Komeet" respectively, and not under "Handel" or "Naamlooze." looze.

THE PAPER-MAKING MATERIALS (HOME PRODUCED) ORDER, 1918, DATED THE 13TH DAY OF MARCH, 1918, MADE BY THE BOARD OF TRADE, UNDER REGULATIONS 2F, 2G, and 2JJ OF THE DEFENCE OF THE REALM REGULATIONS.

The Board of Trade deeming it expedient to exercise the powers vested in them by Regulations 2F, 2G, and 2JJ of the Defence of the Realm Regulations as respects paper-making materials, hereby order as follows:—

- 1. On and after 1st April, 1918, no person shall buy or offer to buy any material produced or collected in the United Kingdom for the purpose of using or disposing of it for the manufacture of paper, cardboard, millboard, or other similar goods, except under and in accordance with the terms of a permit granted by the Controller of Paper.
- 2. On and after 1st April, 1918, no person shall sell, or offer for sale, any material produced or collected in the United Kingdom with intent that it may be used for the manufacture of paper, cardboard, millboard, or other similar goods, except to the holder of and in accordance with the terms of such a permit as aforesaid.
- 3. Every dealer in paper-making material produced or collected in the United Kingdom, hereinafter referred to as "a dealer," shall supply during the year ending 31st March, 1919, to those customers to whom he supplied such material during the six months from 1st September, 1917, to 28th February, 1918, if required by them, with twice the amount of each of the same class of such materials as he supplied to such customers during the said six months provided that:—
 - (a) The dealer has been granted a permit to buy material;
 - (b) Reasonable notice has been given by the customer of his requirements;
 - (c) The dealer's supplies of material are sufficient to meet such requirements;
 - (d) If the dealer's supplies are not sufficient to meet all requirements of which he shall have had notice, he shall distribute his available stock between the customers from whom he has received notice pro rata to the amounts supplied to them during the said six months, or as the Controller of Paper may direct;
 - (e) Any balance of stock that remains after supplying such customers with the amounts to which they are entitled under this paragraph shall be disposed of as the Controller of Paper may direct.

- (f) The Controller of Paper may in writing excuse the fulfilment by a dealer of any requirement, or any part thereof, if in his opinion the execution thereof is impossible or unreasonable.
- 4. The notice referred to in the last preceding paragraph shall refer to the customer's requirements during each six monthly period ending 30th September, 1918, and 31st March, 1919. In default of such notice he shall not be entitled to receive supplies. Any question as to the sufficiency or reasonableness of such notice shall be determined by the Controller of Paper. Such notice shall not, unless by consent of the parties, be withdrawn.
- 5. From and after the date of this Order no dealer, without the consent of the Controller of Paper, shall sell for the manufacture of any of the articles mentioned in paragraphs 1 and 2 hereof any material produced or collected in the United Kingdom at a price exceeding the average price charged by him to the same customer for the same class of material during the said period of six months referred to in the last paragraph, and if the sale is to a customer who was not supplied by such dealer during the said period, the price shall not exceed the highest average price charged by such dealer to any customer of his during the same period.
- 6. The provisions of paragraphs 1 to 5 inclusive shall not apply to wood, straw, or raw vegetable fibre unless and until the said paragraphs are applied thereto by notice given by the Controller of Paper, nor shall the said paragraphs apply to sales or purchases not exceeding 2 cwt. at one time if such sales or purchases are not part of a transaction or series of transactions involving the sale or purchase of a greater quantity. Such notice may alter or modify the dates and period referred to in paragraphs 3 and 4 hereof as the Controller of Paper may deem expedient.
- 7.
