that the Differences among the Deputies of the Dyet continuing to fuch a height that they could agree about the Choice of their Mareichal or Speaker, and the time of its continuance, according to the ancient Statutes of the Kingdom, expring the 19th of the last month, the Dyet broke up the same day, and the Deputies were returning home. That Captain Killigrew having with him a Squadron of 7 English Men of War, had on the 27th of January detacthed 3 of them to cruise in the Channel of Maslea, and 3 about Cape Passaro, while he remained with his single Ship near the Fare of Messar, That quickly after Captain Killigrew fell in with two French Men of War, one of 64 and the other of 50 Guns, and engaged them both for

and the other of 50 Guns, and engaged them both for the space of 4 hours, when upon the report of the Guns one of the detached English Men of War came into his assistance, who so well seconded Cap: Killigrew, that the French betook themselves to a running Fight, and in a short time the Ship of 50 Gunssurrendred and soon after sunk, and the other, having all her Masts shot by the board, yielded also, and was carried to Messing; There were on board the two French Men of War above 700 Men, of which almost one halt were killed and wounded; Capt. Kidigrem was likewise killed in the Fight, and about 50 of his Men killed and wounded. killed and wounded.
