WHEREAS by the Isle of Man (War Legislation) Act, 1914, His Majesty has power to extend to the Isle of Man any Act which, in the opinion of His Majesty, was passed for the purpose of meeting any emergency created by the present War, subject to adaptations for the purpose of making the Act applicable to the Isle of Man:

Now, therefore, His Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, that the National Registration (Amendment) Act, 1918, shall extend to the Isle of Man, subject to the following adaptations:—

In Section 1 after the words "National Registration," there shall be read the words "(Isle of Man)."

In the second Paragraph of Section 2 (1), in the third Paragraph of Section 3 (1), and in Section 4 (1) and (2), for the words "Commencement of this Act" there shall be substituted the words "Order in Council extending this Act to the Isle of Man."

In the first Paragraph of Section 2 (1), and in Section 3 (2), for the words "Commencement of this Act," there shall be substituted the words "Date of the Order in Council extending this Act to the Isle of Man."

In Section 2 (2) for the word "thirteen" there shall be substituted the word "fourteen."

In Section 4 (2) for the words "United Kingdom;" wherever the same occur, there shall be substituted the words "Isle of Man."

In Section 5 (1) for the words "fifteenth day of February" there shall be substituted the words "fifth day of April."

In Section 5 (2), and in Section 6 (4), for the words "under the Summary Jurisdiction Acts" there shall be substituted the words "before a High Bailiff or two Justices of the Peace."

For Section 7, the following provision shall be substituted:—

"Any Order of His Majesty in Council made under Section 7 of the National Registration (Amendment) Act, 1918, shall, as from the date of such Order becoming operative, apply to the Isle of Man, as if made under this Act, so long as such Order remains in force."

In Section 10 (1) for the words "Director-General of National Service," there shall be substituted the words "Lieutenant-Governor."

In Section 10 (2) for the word "thirteen" there shall be substituted the word "fourteen."

In Section 12 (1) after the words "National Registration (Amendment)," and "National Registration," respectively, there shall be read the words "(Isle of Man)."

For section 12 (3) the following provision shall be substituted:—

"(2) This Act shall come into operation on the twenty-first day after the date of the Order in Council extending the same to the Isle of Man."

And whereas by Order in Council dated the 17th day of December, 1914, His Majesty was pleased to order that the Defence of the Realm Consolidation Act, 1914, and the Defence of the Realm (Consolidation) Regulations, 1914, should extend to the Isle of Man, subject to the adaptations therein contained:

And whereas the said Act and Regulations have been amended by certain other Acts and Regulations, which said Acts and Regulations have been extended to the Isle of Man by various subsequent Orders in Council, subject to the adaptations therein contained:

And whereas the said Regulations have been further amended by a certain Order in Council made on the 10th day of January, 1917, and it is desirable to extend certain provisions of such Order in Council to the Isle of Man:

Now, therefore, His Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, that Sub-section (2) of Regulation 2F, contained in the said Order in Council of the 10th day of January, 1917, shall extend to the Isle of Man subject to the following adaptation:—

For the words "Food Controller" or "Controller," wherever the same occur, there shall be substituted the words "Lieutenant Governor."

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by an Order in Council, dated the 10th January, 1910, and known generally as the Civil Service (Consolidating) Order in Council, 1910, and hereinafter referred to as the "Principal Order," it is provided that, with certain provisions and exceptions, the qualifications of all such persons as may seek or be proposed for appointment to any situation or employment in any of His Majesty's Civil Establishments shall, before they are so appointed, be tested by or under the directions of the Civil Service Commissioners; and that no person (save as excepted thereby) shall be appointed to any such Establishment until a Certificate of his qualification shall have been issued by the Civil Service Commissioners declaring that he has satisfied them, among other things, that he is free from any physical defect or disease which would be likely to interfere with the proper discharge of his duties:

And whereas it is expedient that the said requirement should be modified with respect to persons whose health has been impaired by
