PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by an Order in Council, dated the twenty-eighth day of November, nineteen hundred and fourteen, His Majesty was pleased to make regulations (called the "Defence of the Realm Regulations") under the Defence of the Realm Consolidation Act, 1914, for securing the public safety and the defence of the realm:

And whereas the said Act has been amended by the Defence of the Realm (Amendment) Act, 1915, the Defence of the Realm (Amendment) (No. 2) Act, 1915, and the Munitions of War Act, 1915, and other enactments:

And whereas the said regulations have been amended by various subsequent Orders in Council:

And whereas it is expedient further to amend the said regulations in manner hereinafter appearing:

Now, therefore, His Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, that the following amendments be made in the said regulations:—

1. In Regulation 2E after the word "manufacture" there shall be inserted the word "use."

2. In Regulation 13A after the words "any offence as a prostitute" there shall be inserted the words "or of an offence under Regulation 40D."

3. In Regulation 31 the words "military equipment" and the words "or components thereof" shall be omitted, and after the words "explosive substance" there shall be inserted the words "or bring into Ireland any military equipment or component parts of ammunition."

4. After Regulation 40C the following regulation shall be inserted:—

"40D. No woman who is suffering from venereal disease in a communicable form shall have sexual intercourse with any member of His Majesty's forces or solicit or invite any member of His Majesty's forces to have sexual intercourse with her.

"If any woman acts in contravention of this regulation she shall be guilty of a summary offence against these regulations.

"A woman charged with an offence under this regulation shall if she so requires be remanded for a period (not less than a week) for the purpose of such medical examination

as may be requisite for ascertaining whether she is suffering from such a disease as aforesaid.

"The defendant shall be informed of her right to be remanded as aforesaid and that she may be examined by her own Doctor or by the Medical Officer of the Prison.

"In this regulation the expression 'venereal disease' means 'syphilis, gonorrhœa, or soft chancre.'

5. In Regulation 42 after the word "attempts" there shall be inserted the words "or does any act calculated or likely" and after the words "His Majesty's forces" there shall be inserted the words "or any of the forces of any of His Majesty's Allies".

6. After Regulation 45E the following regulation shall be inserted:—

"45F. For facilitating the enforcement by His Majesty's Allies of discipline amongst such of their naval or military forces as may for the time being be within the United Kingdom the following provisions shall have effect:—

"(1) It is hereby declared that, subject to any general or special agreement, the naval and military authorities and courts of an Ally may exercise in relation to the members of any naval or military force of that Ally who may for the time being be in the United Kingdom all such powers as are conferred on them by the law of that Ally.

"(2) The Admiralty or Army Council may make orders authorising the arrest and custody of members of any force of an Ally alleged to have been guilty of offences, and, subject to any such agreement as aforesaid, the handing over of such persons to the proper naval or military authority of the Ally whether within or outside the United Kingdom for the purpose of being dealt with (whether within or without the United Kingdom) by the naval or military authorities or courts of the Ally according to the law of the Ally.

"(3) A competent naval or military authority may on the application of the proper naval or military authority of an Ally issue an order requiring any person not being a member of any naval or military force of that Ally, subject to the payment or tender of the reasonable expenses of his attendance, to attend as a witness and give evidence or to produce documents before a naval or military court of the Ally in the United Kingdom or before any person duly authorised to take evidence in the United Kingdom in connection with any proceedings before a naval or military court of the Ally, and if any person fails without reasonable excuse to comply with any of the provisions of the order he shall be guilty of an offence against these regulations.

"(4) Where a person not being a member of a naval or military force of an Ally is guilty of any contempt towards a naval or military court of that Ally in the United Kingdom by using insulting or threatening language, or by causing any interruption or disturbance in its proceedings, or by printing observations or using words calculated to influence members of or witnesses before such court, or to bring it into disrepute, he shall be guilty of an offence against these regulations.

"(5) Where a person not being a member of a naval or military force of an Ally when examined in the United Kingdom before any naval or military court of that Ally, or before any person duly authorised to take evidence in connection with any proceedings before such a court, wilfully gives false evidence he shall be guilty of an offence against these regulations, but nothing in this provision shall prejudice any liability under the Perjury Act, 1911, or in Scotland or Ireland at common law.

"(6) It shall be lawful for a member of a naval or military court of an Ally, or any person duly authorised to take evidence in connection with any proceedings before such court, to administer oaths to witnesses.

"(7) If any person not being a member of a naval or military force of an Ally procures or persuades a member of such force to desert or absent himself without leave, or knowingly aids or assists a member of such force about to desert or absent himself without leave, or knowingly conceals a deserter or absentee without leave from such force, or aids or assists him in concealing himself, or aids or assists in his rescue, that person shall be guilty of an offence against these regulations, and for the purposes of this provision shall be deemed to have had knowledge unless he proves that he had not knowledge.

"(8) If a person not being a member of a naval or military force of an Ally—

(a) buys, exchanges, takes in pawn, or detains; or

(b) solicits or entices a member of such force to sell, exchange, pawn or give away; or

(c) assists or acts for a member of such force in selling, pawning, or making away with

any arms, ammunition, equipment or clothing of any member of such force or any stores belonging to or in charge of any such force, that person shall be guilty of an offence against these regulations, unless he proves either that he acted in ignorance of the same being the arms, ammunition, equipment or clothing of a member of such force or being such stores as aforesaid, or that the same was sold by the order or with the consent of the proper naval or military authority of that Ally.

"(9) Any sentence passed in the United Kingdom on a member of a naval or military force of an Ally by a naval or military court of an Ally in accordance with the laws of the Ally may be executed according to the tenour thereof within the United Kingdom, and if the sentence involves the detention of any person in custody that person whilst in custody in pursuance of the sentence shall be deemed to be in legal custody, and any sentence passed on such a man by such a court shall be deemed to be in accordance with the law and to be within the jurisdiction of the court and the court shall be deemed to have been properly constituted.

"(10) For the purposes of the foregoing provisions the expression 'proper naval or military authority' includes such members of their naval or military forces as the Government of the Allied State appoint for the purposes as aforesaid and different members may be appointed for different purposes."

On the 5th October, 1917, an accident occurred at the National Shell Filling Factory. A large shell exploded in the Melt House, killing two men and filling the place with thick smoke. Regardless of the great danger to which they were exposed, the men, whose names are given above, seized extinguishers, and, rushing through the smoke, played them on the fire, and, with the help of other men, the fire was put out. The KING has been graciously pleased to approve of the posthumous award of the Albert Medal in gold for gallantry in saving life at sea to

Lieutenant-Commander (acting Commander) Tom Kenneth Triggs, R.N., and of the Albert Medal for gallantry in saving life at sea to

Able Seaman William Becker, O.N. J. 5841.

The account of the services, in respect of which these medals have been conferred, is as follows:—

On the 6th December, 1917, the French steamer "Mont Blanc," with a cargo of high explosives, and the Norwegian steamer "Imo," were in collision in Halifax Harbour. Fire broke out on the "Mont Blanc" immediately after the collision, and the flames very quickly rose to a height of over 100 feet. The crew abandoned their ship and pulled towards the shore.

The Captain of H.M.S. "Highflyer," which was about a mile away, at once sent off a boat to see if anything could be done to prevent loss of life, and Commander Triggs, volunteering for this duty, immediately got into the ship's whaler and pulled to the scene. A tug and the steamboat of H.M.C.S. "Niobe" were seen going there at the same time.

Commander Triggs boarded the tug, and finding it was impossible to do anything for the "Mont Blanc," decided to endeavour to get the "Imo" away, giving directions accordingly to the tug. He returned to the whaler, and was pulling towards the bows of the "Imo," which was about 300 yards from the "Mont Blanc," to pass a line from her to the tug, when a tremendous explosion occurred.

Of the seven people in the whaler, one, Able Seaman Becker, was rescued alive on the Dartmouth shore, whither he had swum; the remainder perished.

It is clear that after communication with the tug, Commander Triggs and the rest of the boat's crew were fully aware of the desperate nature of the work they were engaged in, and that by their devotion to duty they sacrificed their lives in the endeavour to save the lives of others.

The KING has further been graciously pleased to approve of the award of the Albert Medal for gallantry in saving life at sea to

Leading Seaman Thomas N. Davis, O.N. J.18334 (Dev.), and
Able Seaman Robert Stones, O.N. J.29998 (Dev.).

The account of the services in respect of which these medals have been conferred, is as follows:—

On the 6th December, 1917, the French steamer "Mont Blanc," with a cargo of high explosives, and the Norwegian steamer "Imo," were in collision in Halifax Harbour. Fire broke out on the "Mont Blanc" immediately after the collision, and the flames very quickly rose to a height of over 100 feet. The crew abandoned their

ship and pulled to the shore. A few minutes later a tremendous explosion took place, and the tug "Musquash" was seen to be on fire forward. The fire was increasing, and there appeared to be a great danger of her getting adrift, and being carried down on to another vessel. As the "Musquash" had a gun and ammunition on board there was danger of a further explosion and consequent loss of life.

The Captain of H.M.S. "Highflyer" hailed a private tug and asked her to take the "Musquash" in tow, but as they were unwilling to board the "Musquash" to get her in tow, the tug was brought alongside H.M.S. "Highflyer." Leading Seaman Davis and Able Seaman Stones immediately volunteered, and having been transferred by the tug to the burning "Musquash," which had by this time broken adrift, they secured a line from her stern, by means of which she was towed into midstream. The line then parted, and Davis and Stones passed another line from the "Musquash" to the pumping lighter "Lee," which had now arrived. They then both went forward to the burning part, and succeeded in getting to the ammunition, which was by this time badly scorched, pulled it away from the flames and threw it overboard. They then broke open the door of the galley, which was on fire inside, to enable the "Lee" to play her hoses into it. They repeated the same thing with the cabin.

By their work they made it possible to subdue the fire and save further damage and loss of life. At any moment whilst they were on board the "Musquash" the ammunition might have exploded.

THE WAR TIME BOOTS (MANUFACTURE AND SALE) ORDER, 1917.

Whereas it appears to the Army Council that certain regulations should be made respecting

the manufacture and sale of boots and shoes for other than Naval and Military purposes;

And whereas by Regulation 2J of the Defence of the Realm Regulations it is provided that the Board of Trade shall have the like powers as are given to the Food Controller under Regulations 2B, 2F to 2J inclusive and 7 as respects any article of commerce not being an article of food where it appears to the Board necessary or expedient to exercise any of those powers for the purpose of encouraging, maintaining or regulating the supply of any such article which is required by the public, or by any section of the public;

And whereas such powers include the power to make arrangements with any Government Department for the exercise by that Department of the powers of the Board of Trade;

And whereas it appears to the Board of Trade necessary and expedient for the purpose of encouraging, maintaining and regulating the supply of boots and shoes which may be required by the public, or by any section of the public, that certain regulations should be made respecting the manufacture and sale of boots and shoes for other than Naval and Military purposes;

And whereas the Board of Trade have made arrangements with the Army Council for the exercise by the Council on behalf of the Board of Trade of the powers of the Board of Trade under the said Regulations with respect to boots and shoes;

Now, therefore, in pursuance of the powers conferred upon them by the Defence of the Realm Regulations and of every other power enabling them in that behalf, the Army Council do hereby order as follows:—

1. It shall be the duty of all manufacturers of boots or shoes to comply strictly with any directions that may be given from time to time by or on behalf of the Director of Raw Materials with a view to the production of War Time Boots or Shoes, notwithstanding any agreements that may have been entered into by such manufacturers prior to the date of any such directions.

2. No manufacturer of boots or shoes shall manufacture, or cause to be manufactured, any War Time Boots or Shoes otherwise than from such class of material, and to such specification as may be approved by or on behalf of the Director of Raw Materials.

3. It shall be the duty of all manufacturers of boots or shoes engaged in the manufacture of War Time Boots or Shoes to cause to be stamped upon the inside of the Upper of each boot or shoe the registered identification number of the manufacturer thereof, and upon the sole of each boot or shoe the price approved by or on behalf of the Director of Raw Materials as the retail sale price in the case of each description of boots or shoes respectively, together with the words "War Time."

4. It shall be the duty of all manufacturers of boots or shoes to give priority over all other work, except work under or in connection with any Government contract or order to any order for War Time Boots and Shoes.

5. No manufacturer of boots or shoes shall sell any War Time Boots or Shoes at any price other than the price approved by or on behalf of the Director of Raw Materials as the wholesale sale price in the case of each description of

boots or shoes, provided that discounts of 5 per cent. for cash payment within thirty days, or 6½ per cent. for cash payment within seven days, may be allowed.

6. It shall be the duty of all manufacturers of boots or shoes engaged in the manufacture of War Time Boots or Shoes to keep or cause to be kept full and accurate accounts showing the cost of manufacture of all such War Time Boots or Shoes made by them, and such accounts shall at all times be available for inspection by or on behalf of the Director of Raw Materials. The said Manufacturers shall furnish upon the first working day of every month a return in such form as may be prescribed by or on behalf of the Director of Raw Materials showing the quantities and descriptions of leathers obtained and put into manufacture for the manufacture of War Time Boots or Shoes, the quantities and descriptions of War Time Boots or Shoes manufactured and sold during the preceding month and the quantities and descriptions of the said leathers, boots and shoes remaining in stock.

7. It shall be the duty of all manufacturers of boots or shoes engaged in the manufacture of War Time Boots or Shoes in the event of the rejection of any such War Time Boots or Shoes by any factor, merchant or retail dealer to retain the boots or shoes so rejected for inspection by or on behalf of the Director of Raw Materials, and for sale upon such terms as he may cause to be approved.

8. No person shall sell or cause to be sold retail any War Time Boots or Shoes at any price other than the price approved in each case as the retail sale price by or on behalf of the Director of Raw Materials and borne upon the sole of the said boots or shoes.

9. No person shall maliciously alter or deface the words "War Time" or the retail sale price borne upon the sole of any such boots or shoes as aforesaid.

10. No person shall stamp or cause to be stamped the words "War Time" upon boots or shoes manufactured or sold otherwise than in accordance with the provisions hereof.

11. No War Time Boots or Shoes shall be sold by any manufacturer to any factor or merchant or by any manufacturer, factor or merchant to any retail dealer otherwise than upon the terms that all disputes arising in connection with any such sale, shall be referred to the Director of Raw Materials or to such persons as he may cause to be appointed whose decision shall be final.

12. For the purpose of this Order the expression "War Time Boots or Shoes" shall mean any boots or shoes manufactured from classes of material supplied or approved by or on behalf of the Director of Raw Materials, manufactured to such specification as he may approve or direct and sold upon such terms as may have been approved by him or on his behalf.

13. It shall be the duty of any Manufacturer of Boots or Shoes who shall obtain any Leather for the manufacture of "War Time" Boots or Shoes to use such Leather for the purpose of such manufacture and not otherwise.

If after this notice any person having control of any such material, without the consent of the Army Council, after the 1st day of April, 1918, sells, removes or secretes it or deals with it in any way contrary to any condition imposed in any licence, permit or order that may have been granted or made in respect thereof, he shall be guilty of an offence against the Defence of the Realm Regulations.

ARMY COUNCIL ORDER.

Whereas under Regulation 5A of the Defence of the Realm Regulations which is set out at the foot of this Order, the Army Council have

power to take over the control and maintenance of any highway:

Now, therefore, the Army Council, being of opinion that, for the purpose of securing the public safety and the Defence of the Realm, it is necessary that the powers conferred by the said Regulation shall be exercised in respect of

the Highways hereinafter described—that is to say:—

(1) So much of each of the two following roads, viz., the road from Salisbury City boundary to Portsmouth and the branch road leading to Southampton as is situate within the County of Wiltshire.

(2) The road between Salisbury City boundary and Warminster Urban District boundary excluding the section of the road in the borough of Wilton.

(3) So much of each of the two following roads, viz., the road from Salisbury City boundary to Andover and the branch road leading to Stockbridge as is situate within the County of Wiltshire.

(4) The road between Calne Borough boundary and the entrance to No. 2 Aerodrome at Yatesbury (known as the Bath Road).

in the exercise of their powers under the said Regulation and of all other powers enabling them in that behalf do hereby order and declare that from and after the date of this Order and until further notice the control and maintenance of the roads specified above shall be taken over by them, and the provisions of the said Regulation shall apply accordingly.

REGULATION 5A.

"5A. The Admiralty, Army Council or Minister of Munitions may by order if they or he consider it necessary to do so for the purpose of securing the public safety or defence of the realm take over the control and maintenance of any highway, but nothing in this regulation shall relieve any authority or person who, but for this regulation, would have been responsible for the maintenance of such highway from liability for the payment of the cost of such maintenance, and that cost may be recovered by the Admiralty, Army Council or Minister of Munitions from any such authority or person:

"Provided that the amount so recoverable shall not exceed the amount which at the cost of labour and materials ruling during the period in respect of which the amount is claimed such authority or person would have had to expend in order to maintain the highway in a condition fit to carry the ordinary traffic using the highway previous to the War, nor, in the case where the person responsible is a person other than a local authority, shall it exceed the cost of such works of maintenance as such person could have been required to execute if the road had not been taken over and the traffic on the highway had remained such as it was previous to the War.

"In default of agreement as to the amount to be recovered in case that amount shall be determined by the Road Stone Committee, whose decision shall be final.

"For the purpose of sub-sections (2) (3) and (4) of section eleven of the Local Government Act, 1888, any sums contributed under this Regulation by an authority shall be treated as costs of maintenance and repair of the highway incurred by the authority.

"For the purpose of this Regulation the word 'highway' shall have the same meaning as in the Highways Act, 1835, but shall include 'county bridge.'"

Suspension of Order of 1914.

The operation of the Potatoes (Corky Scab) Order of 1914 is hereby suspended until such date as the Board of Agriculture and Fisheries shall by Order direct; provided that such suspension shall not—

(i) affect the previous operation of the Order hereby suspended or anything duly done or suffered under that Order; or

(ii) affect any right, privilege, obligation, or liability acquired, accrued, or incurred under that Order; or

(iii) affect any penalty incurred in respect or any offence committed against that Order; or

(iv) affect any investigation, legal proceeding, or remedy in respect of any such right, privilege, obligation, liability, or penalty as aforesaid;

and any such investigation, legal proceeding, or remedy may be instituted, continued, or enforced, and any such penalty may be imposed, as if this Order had not been made.

LONDON COUNTY COUNCIL (MONEY).

(Regulating expenditure on capital account and loans by London County Council, 1st April, 1918, to 31st March, 1919, and following six months; Particulars of expenditure; Loans by London County Council to other bodies and persons; Incorporation of provisions of London County Council (Finance Consolidation) Act, 1912, and London County Council (Money) Act, 1914.)

THE London County Council (in this Notice called "the Council") intend to apply to Parliament in the present Session for leave to bring in a Bill for the following purposes (namely):—

To regulate the expenditure on capital account and the lending of money by the Council during the financial year ending the 31st March, 1919, and during the six months ending the 30th September, 1919.

To define the purposes for which and the extent to which the Council may during the said periods respectively expend money on capital account in accordance with the provisions of the London County Council (Finance Consolidation) Act, 1912 (hereinafter called "the principal Act").

(a) The London Fire Brigade.

(b) The Housing of the Working Classes Acts.

(c) The purposes mentioned in section 144 of the Metropolis Management Act, 1855, and section 72 of the Metropolis Management Amendment Act, 1862, and in various Improvement Acts; improvements and works sanctioned by Parliament for which no pro-

vision is elsewhere made, including provision for rehousing persons of the working classes displaced; contributions to local improvements; expenditure connected with sundry completed improvements.

(d) The purchase of property, compensation, works and incidental expenses (including the rehousing of persons of the working classes displaced) in connection with the following improvements and works, that is to say:—

New street (Holborn to Strand) authorized by the London County Council (Improvements) Act, 1899, and the London County Council (General Powers) Act, 1910.

Widenings of Stanstead-road, Catford-hill, Catford-road, Dalston-lane and Graham-road authorized by the London County Council (Tramways and Improvements) Act, 1911.

Widenings of High-street, Wandsworth, and East-hill, Wandsworth, authorized by the London County Council (Tramways and Improvements) Act, 1913.

Widenings of High-street, Eltham, and Eltham-road authorized by the London County Council (Tramways and Improvements) Act, 1914.

(h) Pumping stations, machinery, sewers and other purposes of main drainage.

(i) The construction, reconstruction and equipment of tramways; the provision of buildings, power stations, machinery and rolling stock; the purchase of lands and other purposes in connection with Acts relating to tramways.

(j) The exercise of any powers which may be conferred upon the Council by any Act or Acts which may be passed by Parliament in the present Session.

(k) Generally all other subjects in respect of which capital expenditure may be necessary.

To define the bodies and persons to whom and the extent to which the Council may during the said periods respectively lend money in accordance with the principal Act.

To incorporate or apply all or any of the provisions of the principal Act and of the London County Council (Money) Act, 1914.

To vary and extinguish all rights and privileges which would interfere with the objects of the intended Act or any of them and to confer other rights and privileges.
