

General Meeting of the said Company, held on the 11th day of July, 1917, and subsequently duly confirmed at an Extraordinary General Meeting of the said Company, held on the 31st day of July, 1917, whereby it was resolved that the provisions of the Company's memorandum should be altered, the alteration being the substitution of a new clause defining the objects of the Company for the clause then defining the same and extending such objects.

The said new clause, which is divided into 34 sub-headings, confers various express powers upon the Company, many (if not all) of which are believed to have been, directly or indirectly, authorized by the said previous clause; the principal powers so conferred being powers to carry on in any part of the world the trades or businesses of Ironmasters, Iron-founders, Iron and Steel Manufacturers, Steel Converters, Colliery Proprietors, Miners, Smelters, Coke Manufacturers, Metallurgists, Mechanical Engineers, Machine Makers, Tinplate Makers and Iron, Steel, Coal and Coke Merchants, and to acquire and work Mines and Minerals in any part of the world, to carry on the working, preparation and selling of Minerals of all kinds, the business of Manufacturers of Chemicals and Manures, Distillers and Dye Makers, the manufacture and selling of Coke, Coal Tar and other residual products obtained in the manufacture of Gas, the making of Gas works and supplying Gas, the manufacture of and dealing in Bricks, Tiles and Earthenware of all kinds, the business of Sanitary Engineers, and of Paviers and Manufacturers and Dealers in Artificial Stone and Patent Fuel, and any other business, manufacturing or otherwise, capable of being conveniently carried on in connection with the above or calculated to enhance the value of any property of the Company, and also various ancillary powers necessary or convenient for carrying on any of the said businesses, and in particular powers to lend and borrow money, and to establish benefits for employees of the Company, and support charitable, benevolent or public objects, and to sell the undertaking of the Company.

A print of the proposed new memorandum submitted to the said Meetings, and containing the new clauses, will be sent on request to any creditor, secured or unsecured, or any Member of the Company, and such print of the memorandum of association may be inspected at the offices of the Company, situate at Farnley, near Leeds, in the county of York, and also at the offices of Messrs. And notice is further given, that the said petition is directed to be heard before Mr. Justice Peterson, at the Royal Courts of Justice, Strand, London, on Tuesday, the 23rd day of April, 1918; and any person interested in the said Company, whether as creditor or otherwise, desirous of opposing the making of an Order for the confirmation of the said alteration under the above Acts may appear at the time of hearing, by himself or by his Counsel, for the purpose; and he is required to give two clear days' previous notice in writing of his intention so to appear, with the grounds of his objection, to the undersigned, the Solicitors of the said Company.

In the Matter of the Trading with the Enemy Amendment Act, 1916, and in the Matter of W. KREMLING & CO.

WHEREAS by an Order of the Board of Trade, dated the 2nd day of November, 1916, and made under section 1, sub-sections (1) and (2), of the Trading with the Enemy Amendment Act, 1916, it was ordered and required that the business carried on in the United Kingdom by the above named W.
