**THE EAST BIRMINGHAM TOWN PLANNING
SCHEME AMENDMENT SCHEME.**

Notice is hereby given, in pursuance of subsection (4) of section 54 of the Housing, Town Planning, &c. Act, 1909, that the Local Government Board intend to approve the above-mentioned scheme, and have caused a draft Order for approving the scheme to be prepared and to be transmitted to the Town Council of the City of Birmingham for deposit for the purposes of inspection, and that any person or authority interested and deciding to object to the scheme being approved should within twenty-one days from the date of the publication of this notice, make his or their objection in the manner prescribed by Article XX of the Town Planning Procedure Regulations (Preparation of Schemes by Local Authorities), 1914, that is to say:—

The objection shall be made to and be brought before the Board by means of a letter, or other representation in writing, which shall be addressed and posted, or shall be otherwise given, sent, or delivered to the Board at their office. The letter or representation shall indicate clearly the scheme to which the objection is taken, and shall state fully in what respects the person or authority objecting claims or claim to be in-

terested in the scheme and the grounds on which the objection is made.

**ORDER OF THE BOARD OF
AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES.**

(DATED 5TH APRIL 1918.)

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1914, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

*Application of the Sheep (Double Dipping)
Order of 1914.*

1.—(1) The provisions of the Sheep (Double Dipping) Order of 1914 (hereinafter referred to as "the principal Order") are hereby applied to the Area described in the Schedule hereto.

(2) In its application to such Area the principal Order shall be read and have effect as if paragraph (3) of article 2 of that Order were omitted.

(3) While this Order remains in operation sheep in the area described in the Schedule hereto shall be exempt from the provisions of Article 3 of the Sheep Dipping (Scotland and North of England) Order of 1915 so far as they relate to dippings within the prescribed dipping periods.

Period Prescribed as Double Dipping Period.

2. The dates between which all sheep in the Area described in the Schedule hereto are to be dipped within the Area by the owner or person in charge of the sheep under and in accordance with Part II. of the principal Order, are hereby fixed to be the fourteenth day of August and the first day of October.

Commencement.

3. This Order shall come into operation on the twelfth day of April, nineteen hundred and eighteen.
