Whereas it is provided by Section 2 of the Customs (Exportation Prohibition) Act, 1914, that any Proclamation or Order in Council made under Section 8 of the Customs and Inland Revenue Act, 1879, as amended by the Act now in recital, may, whilst a state of war exists, be varied or added to by an Order made by the Lords of the Council on the recommendation of the Board of Trade:

And whereas it is provided by Section 2 of the Customs (Exportation Restriction) Act, 1914, that any Proclamation made under Section 1 of the Exportation of Arms Act, 1900, may, whether the Proclamation was made before or after the passing of the Act now in recital, be varied or added to, whilst a state of war exists, by an Order made by the Lords of the Council on the recommendation of the Board of Trade:

And whereas by a Proclamation, dated the 10th day of May, 1917, and made under Section 8 of the Customs and Inland Revenue Act, 1879, and Section 1 of the Exportation of Arms

Act, 1900, and Section 1 of the Customs (Exportation Prohibition) Act, 1914, the exportation from the United Kingdom of certain articles to certain or all destinations was prohibited:

And whereas by subsequent Orders of Council the said Proclamation was amended and added to in certain particulars:

And whereas there was this day read at the Board a recommendation from the Board of Trade to the following effect:—

That the Proclamation, dated the 10th day of May, 1917, as amended and added to by subsequent Orders of Council, should be further amended by making the following amendments in and additions to the Schedule to the same:—

### STAGE CARRIAGES.

Additional Order dated 8th April, 1918, made by the Secretary of State in pursuance of the Metropolitan Public Carriage Act, 1869 (32 & 33 Vict., cap. 115).

In pursuance of Section 8 of the Metropolitan Public Carriage Act, 1869, I hereby prescribe as follows:—

1. Notwithstanding anything contained in Paragraph 18 of the Order made by me and dated the 1st May, 1917, a licence to act as driver or as conductor of a tramcar, or upon the special recommendation of a proprietor a licence to act either as driver or as conductor of a tramcar may be granted by the Commissioner of Police of the Metropolis to a discharged Soldier or Sailor who is physically fit for the work, provided that the applicant is not less than 19 years of age.

2. This Order shall be read as part of the said Order of the 1st May, 1917.

3. This Order shall come into force on the 12th April, 1918, and shall continue in force until the termination of the present War.

### ORDER OF THE LOCAL GOVERNMENT BOARD.

Prevention of Plague: Destruction of Rats.

#### COUNTY OF EAST SUFFOLK.

To the County Council of the Administrative County of East Suffolk;—

To the Councils of the several Municipal Boroughs and other Urban Districts, and of the several Rural Districts in the said Administrative County;—

And to all others whom it may concern.

Whereas in relation to the Administrative County of East Suffolk it is expedient that the Regulations hereinafter set forth should be made by Us, the Local Government Board, with a view to preventing the spread of Plague, and the County Council of the Administrative County of East Suffolk have consented to execute and enforce such Regulations:

Now therefore We do, by this Our Order, and in the exercise of the powers conferred on Us by the Public Health Act, 1875, the Public Health Act, 1896, and the Public Health (Prevention and Treatment of Disease) Act, 1913, and every other power enabling Us in that behalf, make the following Regulations, and also Declare and Direct as follows:—

ARTICLE I.—In these Regulations:—

The expression "County Council" means the County Council of the Administrative County of East Suffolk;

The expression "the County" means the Administrative County of East Suffolk;

The expression "District" means a Municipal Borough or other Urban District or a Rural District in the County;

The expression "Local Authority" means the Council of a District;

The expression "the Regulations of 1910" means Our Order dated the 10th day of November, 1910, making Regulations with respect to the destruction of rats and to other measures for the prevention of Plague and providing for the enforcement and execution of the Regulations by Local Authorities as therein defined.

ARTICLE II.—If the County Council are satisfied that any Local Authority have failed to take the measures which they are required by the Regulations of 1910 to take in connexion with rats within a reasonable time after notice in that behalf has been given to that Authority by the County Council, the County Council shall—

(a) report the matter to Us, and

(b) themselves take measures for the destruction of all rats in the District of such Authority and for preventing the entrance of rats into buildings and other premises in the District.

ARTICLE III.—For the purposes of these Regulations the County Council may appoint additional officers or servants if they deem it necessary to do so, and may delegate to any of their officers or servants any powers under these Regulations.

ARTICLE IV.—The expenses incurred by the County Council in the execution and enforcement of these Regulations shall be expenses for special county purposes chargeable on the parts of the County comprising the District or Districts in relation to which the expenses are incurred.

ARTICLE V.—If a difference arises between the County Council and the Local Authority of any District as to whether the Local Authority have failed to take the requisite measures or otherwise in relation to any subject matter of, or to anything done under, these Regulations, the difference may, on the application of the County Council or the Local Authority, be referred to Us for determination, and We may determine the difference otherwise than as arbitrators, and Our determination shall be final and conclusive.

ARTICLE VI.—These Regulations may be cited as "The East Suffolk (Prevention of Plague) Regulations, 1918," and shall come into operation on the date hereof.

## ORDER OF THE LOCAL GOVERNMENT BOARD.

Prevention, &c., of Cerebro-Spinal Fever:  
Provision of Serum.

### ENGLAND AND WALES.

To the Council of every County and of every County Borough in England and Wales;

And to all others whom it may concern.

Whereas by virtue of the provisions of Section 130 of the Public Health Act, 1875, of Section 2 of the Public Health (Prevention and Treatment of Disease) Act, 1913, and of other enactments in that behalf, We, the Local Government Board, are empowered to make Regulations with a view to the treatment of persons suffering from the infectious disease known as Cerebro-Spinal Fever, and for preventing the spread of the disease, and to declare the authorities by whom the Regulations shall be executed and enforced:

Now therefore, in the exercise of the powers conferred on Us by the Public Health Act, 1875, the Public Health (London) Act, 1891, the Public Health Act, 1896, and the Public Health (Prevention and Treatment of Disease) Act, 1913, and of every other power enabling Us in that behalf, We hereby make the following Regulations, and also Declare and Direct as follows:—

ARTICLE I.—The Council of any Administrative County and of any County Borough may provide or arrange (1) for the provision of serum for the treatment of cases or suspected cases of cerebro-spinal fever occurring among the inhabitants of the County or Borough, as the case may be, together with the necessary apparatus for the use of the serum, and (2) for the examination of any person who is suspected to be suffering from the disease or who has been in contact with a person suffering or suspected to be suffering from the disease.

ARTICLE II.—The expenses incurred under these Regulations shall in the case of a County Council be defrayed as expenses for general county purposes, and in the case of a County Borough Council as part of the expenses incurred by the Council in the execution of the Public Health Acts.

ARTICLE III.—These Regulations shall come into operation on the date of this Order, and shall then and thereafter apply and have effect throughout England and Wales.

ARTICLE IV.—These Regulations may be cited as "The Public Health (Cerebro-Spinal Fever) Regulations, 1918."

Each passenger shall immediately upon demand, and in case no demand shall have been made, before leaving the car, pay to the Conductor or other duly authorised officer of the Corporation the fare legally demandable for his journey and accept a ticket therefor, or if the carriage is provided with a money box for the receipt of fares, each passenger shall immediately on entering the carriage, or when required, deposit in the money box the fare legally payable for the journey. Any passenger leaving a car except in the case of a passenger holding a transfer ticket changing cars at the recognised transfer point shall be deemed to have completed his journey.

2. The above Bye-law shall be in substitution for Bye-law No. 9 of the Corporation's Bye-laws and Regulations dated the 4th day of September, 1901, and shall come into force on the 14th day of June, 1918.

3. There shall be placed and kept placed in a conspicuous position inside of each carriage in use on the tramways a printed copy of these Bye-laws.

#### ISLE OF MAN HARBOURS ACTS, 1872 to 1911.

THE following Resolution of the Court of Tynwald, of the Isle of Man, was, on the 30th March, 1918, approved by the Committee of His Majesty's Privy Council for Trade:—

At a TYNWALD COURT, holden at Douglas, the 29th day of January, 1918.

The Court having, on the requisition of His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor, considered the advisability of appointing, under the provisions contained in the Isle of Man Harbours Acts, 1872 to 1911 (Acts of the Imperial Parliament), the payment of a duty on passengers carried by vessels entering or leaving the harbours of Douglas, Ramsey, Peel, Laxey, Port St. Mary, and Port Erin, at which harbours improvements have been made for which it is considered reasonable to charge such duty,

Resolved,—That, subject to the approval of the Committee of His Majesty's Privy Council for Trade, from and after the expiration of one calendar month after the publication of this resolution in the London Gazette, the following duty shall be payable by the owner, or owners, or master of each vessel entering or leaving any of the said harbours, that is to say:—

For every passenger, whether carried for hire or not, embarked on or disembarked from vessels hold-

ing a Board of Trade certificate for the conveyance of passengers at any of the said harbours on Sunday between the hours of eight o'clock in the forenoon and five o'clock in the afternoon, the sum of One Shilling.

For every passenger, whether carried for hire or not, embarked on or disembarked from any vessel holding a Board of Trade certificate for the conveyance of passengers, during any other hours on Sunday than as aforesaid, or on any other day, at any of the said harbours, the sum of Two Pence.

Provided always, that vessels driven into any of the said harbours through stress of weather on Sunday between such hours of eight and five o'clock as before mentioned, and vessels arriving in any of the said harbours between such hours on Sunday, which, in the opinion of the harbour-master, but for delay occasioned by stress of weather, fog, or accident, would have arrived therein prior to eight o'clock in the forenoon shall be subject only to the duty of Two Pence for each passenger embarked or disembarked during such hours.

Provided also, that in respect of passengers under the age of twelve years there shall be payable one-half only of the duties before prescribed.

Provided also, that such duties shall not be payable in respect of ferry or pleasure boats used or plying in or about any of the said harbours, or any of the bays of Douglas, Ramsey, Peel, Laxey, Port St. Mary, and Port Erin and licensed by the Isle of Man Harbour Commissioners.

And, with respect to all other times than on Sundays between the hours of eight and five as before mentioned, the following provisions shall take effect, that is to say:—

(a) As to vessels carrying passengers between any one of the said harbours and any place being at a distance of not more than ten nautical miles from such harbour (such distance being calculated on the length of the voyage), the duty payable in respect of each passenger shall be only three-fourths of the duty to which such vessel may be liable as above.

(b) As to any vessels carrying passengers on any single voyage or trip which begins and ends at any one of the said harbours, the said duty shall be payable in respect of disembarkation only.

(c) As to any voyage between any two of the said harbours, the said duty shall be payable at each place in respect of disembarkation only.

(d) In any case of a voyage usually termed a voyage or trip round the Island, the same shall, as to passengers who make the whole voyage, be considered as a single voyage or trip, notwithstanding that stoppages may be made and passengers permitted to land or embark during the course of the voyage at any place other than that at which the trip commences and ends.

Resolved,—That, on the foregoing Resolution commencing and taking effect the Resolution of this Court dated the 23rd day of January, 1912, appointing a duty on passengers at Douglas, Ramsey, Laxey, Port St. Mary, and Peel, shall be and stand revoked.
