

great, and it was only owing to the unceasing exertions of the personnel of this line that the heavy traffic was successfully dealt with, in spite of inadequate rolling stock and frequent interruptions due to damage to the permanent way caused by floods.

The operations threw a heavy amount of work on the Posts and Telegraph Department, for the successful coping with which I desire to express my gratitude and thanks. I also wish to thank the Red Cross Society and those who contributed to sending comforts to the

troops, for their gifts, which were most acceptable to the recipients.

I am greatly indebted to the advice and assistance I have received from the Honourable Lieutenant-Colonel Sir George Roos-Keppel, G.C.I.E., K.C.S.I., Chief Commissioner, North-West Frontier Province, and to the manner in which the Political Officers attached to the North and South Waziristan Field Forces carried out their duties.
