PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the 33rd and 34th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 39, and of the Acts therein mentioned, that is to say, the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 113, the Act of the 4th and 5th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 39, and the Act of the 31st and 32nd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 114, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme, bearing date the 14th day of February, 1918, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

“We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 33rd and 34th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 39, and of the Acts therein mentioned, that is to say, the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 113, the Act of the 4th and 5th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 39, and the Act of the 31st and 32nd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 114, have prepared, and now

humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for effecting a transfer of the ownership of the Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the Church and Cure (hereinafter called ‘the said Benefice’) of Burnham Deepdale, in the County of Norfolk, and in the Diocese of Norwich:

“Whereas the Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Burnham Deepdale is vested for an estate in fee simple, free from incumbrances, in the Right Reverend Henry Joseph Corbett, Bishop of Gibraltar, and the Reverend William Hook Longsdon, of St. Andrew's Vicarage, Stockwell, in the County of Surrey, Clerk in Holy Orders, as Trustees upon certain Trusts declared in relation thereto under the Will, dated the 26th of January, 1895, with Codicil dated the 4th of April, 1905, of the late Reverend Edward Kerslake Kerslake, Clerk in Holy Orders, and the said Henry Joseph Corbett, Bishop of Gibraltar, and the said William Hook Longsdon, are therefore the Patrons or persons entitled to present to the said Benefice in case the same were now vacant:

“And whereas the said Henry Joseph Corbett, Bishop of Gibraltar, and the said William Hook Longsdon, are desirous that the whole Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of

and presentation to the said Benefice of Burnham Deepdale should be transferred to and be vested in the Right Reverend Bertram, now Bishop of Norwich, and his Successors in the said Bishopric:

"And whereas the said Bertram, Bishop of Norwich, is willing to accept such transfer, and in token of such his willingness, and also in token that the same transfer has that consent of the Bishop of the Diocese which by the Acts in the hereinbefore mentioned Act recited, or by some or one of them, is made necessary, he, the said Bertram, Bishop of Norwich, has executed this Scheme as hereinafter mentioned:

"And whereas the transfer of the Patronage of the said Benefice of Burnham Deepdale, which is hereinbefore mentioned, and hereinafter recommended and proposed, will, in our opinion, tend to make better provision for the Cure of Souls in the Parish or District in or in respect of which the right of Patronage or Advowson, so recommended and proposed to be transferred as aforesaid; arises or exists, that is to say, in the Parish of Burnham Deepdale:

"Now, therefore, with the consents of the said Henry Joseph Corbett, Bishop of Gibraltar, and the said William Hook Longsdon, being the persons whose consents as Patrons are required by the provisions of the hereinbefore mentioned Acts, and of the Act of the 1st and 2nd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 106, (in testimony of which consents they have severally signed and sealed this Scheme), and with the consent of the said Bertram, Bishop of Norwich, (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme, and sealed the same with his Episcopal Seal), We, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly recommend and propose that upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme, and without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order, the whole Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Burnham Deepdale shall be transferred to the said Bertram, Bishop of Norwich, and his Successors in the same Bishopric, and shall thereupon and thenceforth become and be absolutely vested in, and shall and may from time to time be exercised by, the said Bertram, Bishop of Norwich, and his Successors in the same Bishopric for ever.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any further or other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts, or of any of them, or of any other Act of Parliament."

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Norwich.

WHEREAS His Majesty has been pleased, in exercise of the power in that behalf conferred on Him by Section one, sub-section one, of the Trading with the Enemy (Extension of Powers) Act, 1915, by divers Proclamations, and in particular by a Proclamation dated the 23rd day of May, 1916, and amended on the 16th day of January, 1918, entitled "The Trading with the Enemy (Statutory List) Proclamation," to prohibit all persons or bodies of persons, incorporated or unincorporated, resident, carrying on business, or being in the United Kingdom from trading with any of the persons or bodies of persons mentioned in the List contained in the last mentioned Proclamation, such List being therein referred to as the Statutory List:

And whereas by Section one, sub-section two, of the said Act, it is provided that any List of persons and bodies of persons, incorporated or unincorporated, with whom such trading is prohibited by a Proclamation under the said Act may be varied or added to by an Order made by the Lords of the Council on the recommendation of a Secretary of State:

And whereas the Statutory List contained in the last mentioned Proclamation has been varied and added to by subsequent Orders of Council:

And whereas there was this day read at the Board a recommendation from the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs to the effect that the Statutory List should be further varied and added to as set forth in the Schedule hereto.

Now, therefore, Their Lordships, having taken the said recommendation into consideration, are pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered,

That the Statutory List be varied and added to as set forth in the Schedule hereto.

Whereof the Right Honourable Arthur James Balfour, one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, the Controller of the Foreign Trade Department, and all other persons whom it may concern, are to take notice and govern themselves accordingly.

NOTE (1).—All persons or firms resident, carrying on business or being in the United Kingdom are prohibited from having, with any person or firm mentioned in this List, or in any List issued under the Trading with the Enemy (Statutory List) Proclamation, any dealings other than such as are expressly authorised by paragraph 5 of the Proclamation. A List (The Consolidated List, No. 51A) consolidating all previous Lists, up to and including the 5th April, 1918, is in press and will shortly be published. This Consolidated List, which, together with the List herewith annexed, contains all the names which up to this date are included in the Statutory List.

Additions to and variations in these Lists will be published at intervals approximately of two weeks.

The Lists are published in the London Gazette and reproduced in the Board of Trade Journal, and separate copies of all Lists may be obtained at a small cost from the Superintendent of Publications, His Majesty's Stationery Office, Imperial House, Kingsway, W.C.

NOTE (2).—Where a person or firm mentioned in the List has more than one address in the country, or group of countries under which the name of the person or firm appears, all dealings in that country, or in any country in the group, with such person or firm are prohibited, even in cases where one only of the addresses or one only of the countries is specifically mentioned.

NOTE (3).—Trading is prohibited under the Trading with the Enemy Proclamations of 25th June, and 10th November, 1915, with any person or firm of enemy nationality resident or carrying on business in China, Siam, Persia, Morocco, Liberia or Portuguese East Africa. Persons or firms in the United Kingdom are therefore prohibited from trading with any person or firm of enemy nationality in any of those countries, even though such person or firm is not mentioned by name in the Statutory List.

NOTE (4).—In order to minimise as far as possible any inconvenience which may be caused to British traders by the dislocation of export trade owing to the inclusion in the Statutory List of a former connection, the Foreign Trade Department is collecting and classifying the names of non-enemy firms who may be able to act as substitutes for firms mentioned in the Statutory List. A considerable amount of information is already available at the Foreign Trade Department, and it is in many cases possible to suggest the names of satisfactory substitutes for *individual firms on the Lists*, without the necessity of referring the matter abroad. The Department is, however, prepared on application to enquire of His Majesty's Representatives abroad for the names of suitable substitutes. When the applicant wishes this done by telegraph he is required to undertake to pay the cost of telegraphic correspondence. It would greatly facilitate the work of the Foreign Trade Department if applicants in making enquiries would specify the particular trade or trades for which substitutes are required. *General enquiries for new connections abroad should be addressed to the Comptroller-General, Department of Overseas Trade (Development and Intelligence), 73, Basinghall Street, London, E.C. 2.*

NOTE (5).—The Statutory List for each country is telegraphed, on the day of issue, to His Majesty's Representative in that country, who is instructed to notify accordingly British Consular Officers, to whom persons abroad should apply for information as to names on the List. Persons and firms in the United Kingdom with agencies or branches abroad would, however, be well advised to furnish such agencies or branches with issues of the List as they appear. The names on the Lists for all countries in Central or South America are also notified to His Majesty's Ambassador at Washington, who transmits them to H.M. Consul-General at New York and to other centres in the United States likely to be interested.

NOTE (6).—It is not unusual for firms in Holland and the Netherlands East Indies to be registered under names commencing with descriptive terms such as "Handel Maatschappij" (Trading Company) or "Naamlooze Venootschap" (Limited Liability Company). In such cases it has been found more convenient to publish the firm under its proper name followed by the general descriptive term "Handel Maatschappij" or "Naamlooze Venootschap" (N.V.) as in the case of an English company. For instance, Handel Maat-

schappy van den Berg & Company, and Naamlooze Vennootschap de Komeet v/h Dumonceau Frères will be found under "Berg" and "Komeet" respectively, and not under "Handel" or "Naamlooze."

THE REPRESENTATION OF THE PEOPLE ACT, 1918.

REGISTRATION EXPENSES IN IRELAND.

In pursuance of the powers conferred by Section 15 of the Representation of the People Act, 1918, We, being Two of the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, have framed the following Scales of Registration Expenses for Ireland. These Scales will be applicable only to the first Register prepared under the Act.

I. Parliamentary Counties and Boroughs (except the Boroughs of Dublin and Belfast).

(a) Registration Officer's expenses in respect of payments to Deputies and Clerks, etc.:—

The actual out-of-pocket expenditure subject to the following limit:—

For the first 25,000 *electors in the Registration area. d.

For every elector ... 2

For each additional elector over 25,000 and up to and including 50,000 electors ... 1½

For each elector exceeding 50,000 ... 1

Provided that the minimum allowance for expenses shall be £100.

(b) Remuneration and Expenses of Secretaries of County Councils, †Clerks of Urban District Councils, and existing Clerks of the Union within the meaning of the Local Government (Ireland) Act, 1898.

1. *Remuneration*.—For every elector... 2½

2. *Expenses*.—The actual out-of-pocket expenditure properly vouched and certified by a statutory declaration by the responsible officer to the effect that it was necessarily and properly incurred in respect of clerical assistance and other outlay.

(c) Remuneration and Expenses of persons acting as Collectors of Poor Rate for the purposes of the Act.

(1) *Remuneration*.—For every elector 2

(2) *Expenses*.—The actual out-of-

pocket expenditure, properly vouched and certified by a statutory declaration by the responsible officer to the effect that it was necessarily and properly incurred in respect of travelling and other outlay.

* Note.—In these Scales "Elector" means an elector whose name appears on the completed Register and in respect of whose name the appropriate duties of the Officer have been performed.

† Note.—Includes Town Clerks who perform the duties under the Act of the Officers here named in respect of those duties.

II. Parliamentary Boroughs of Dublin and Belfast.

(a) Remuneration of Town Clerk as Registration Officer, £3 for every 1,000 electors up to a maximum limit of £350.

(b) Expenses of Registration Officer. The actual out-of-pocket expenditure, properly vouched and certified by a statutory declaration by the responsible officer to the effect that it was necessarily and properly incurred in respect of clerical assistance and other outlay.

(c) Remuneration and Expenses of persons acting as Poor Rate Collectors for the purposes of the Act. d.

(1) *Remuneration*.—For every elector 2

(2) *Expenses*.—The actual out-of-pocket expenditure, properly vouched and certified by a statutory declaration by the responsible officer to the effect that it was necessarily and properly incurred in respect of travelling and other outlay.

DEFENCE OF THE REALM (LIQUOR CONTROL).

ORDER OF THE CENTRAL CONTROL BOARD (LIQUOR TRAFFIC) FOR THE HUMBER AREA (EXTENSION).

Any person contravening any provision of this Order or of the Liquor Control Regulations is liable to imprisonment for six months with hard labour and a fine of £100.

We the Central Control Board (Liquor Traffic) in pursuance of the powers conferred upon us by the Acts and Regulations relating

to the Defence of the Realm hereby make the following Order:—

Limits of Area.

1. The area to which this Order applies is so much of the Humber Area as comprises the Petty Sessional Division of Epworth in the Administrative County of the Parts of Lindsey in the County of Lincoln.

Hours during which intoxicating liquor may be sold.

A.—For Consumption ON the Premises.

2. (1) The hours during which intoxicating liquor may be sold or supplied in any licensed premises or club for consumption on the premises shall be restricted and be as follows:—

On Weekdays:—

The hours between 12 noon and 2.30 p.m. and between 6 p.m. and 9 p.m.

On Sundays:—

The hours between 12.30 p.m. and 2.30 p.m. and between 6 p.m. and 9 p.m.

Except between the aforesaid hours no person shall—

(a) Either by himself or by any servant or agent sell or supply to any person in any licensed premises or club any intoxicating liquor to be consumed on the premises; or

(b) Consume in any such premises or club any intoxicating liquor; or

(c) Permit any person to consume in any such premises or club any intoxicating liquor.

B.—For Consumption OFF the Premises.

(2) The hours during which intoxicating liquor may be sold or supplied in any licensed premises or club for consumption off the premises shall (subject to the additional restrictions as regards spirits) be restricted and be as follows:—

On Weekdays:—

The hours between 12 noon and 2.30 p.m. and between 6 p.m. and 8 p.m.

On Sundays:—

The hours between 12.30 p.m. and 2.30 p.m. and between 6 p.m. and 8 p.m.

Except between the aforesaid hours no person shall—

(a) Either by himself or by any servant or agent sell or supply to any person in any licensed premises or club or (except as hereinafter expressly provided) dispatch therefrom any intoxicating liquor to be consumed off the premises; or

(b) Take from any such premises or club any intoxicating liquor; or

(c) Permit any person to take from any such premises or club any intoxicating liquor.

Additional Restrictions as to Spirits.

3. In addition to the above general restrictions as to hours during which intoxicating liquor may be sold or supplied, the sale and supply of spirits in licensed premises and clubs shall be subject to the following special restrictions, that is to say:—

(a) No orders for spirits to be consumed off the premises shall be given by or accepted from any person actually present in any licensed premises or club except on Mondays, Tuesdays, Wednesdays, Thursdays and Fridays and during the hours between 12 noon and 2.30 p.m.

(b) Spirits to be consumed off the premises must not (except as hereinafter expressly provided) be dispatched from any licensed premises or club, nor must they be taken therefrom by the person to whom they are sold or supplied or by any person acting on his behalf, except on the days and during the hours aforesaid.

(c) Spirits to be consumed off the premises shall not be sold or supplied or taken from any licensed premises or club in any bottle or other vessel not bearing a label showing the name and situation of the premises or club, or in any vessel of a capacity less than one reputed quart, or in any less quantity than one reputed quart, or in any open vessel.

(d) No spirits to be consumed off the premises shall be sold or supplied in or taken from any refreshment room in any railway station.

Conditions as to Distribution.

4. No person shall either by himself or any servant or agent—

(a) Sell, supply, distribute or deliver any intoxicating liquor from any van, barrow, basket or other vehicle or receptacle unless before the liquor is dispatched it has been ordered and the quantity, description and price thereof together with the name and address of the person to whom it is to be supplied has been entered in a delivery book or invoice, which shall be carried by the person delivering the liquor, and in a day book which shall be kept on the premises from which the liquor is dispatched.

(b) Carry or convey in any van, barrow, basket or other vehicle or receptacle while in use for the distribution or delivery of intoxicating liquor, any such liquor not entered in such delivery book or invoice and day book.

(c) Distribute or deliver any intoxicating liquor at any address not specified in such delivery book or invoice and day book.

(d) Refuse to allow any constable to examine such van, barrow, basket or other vehicle or receptacle or such delivery book or invoice.

(e) Solicit or canvass for orders for, or collect or receive payment for, intoxicating liquor except at the licensed premises.

(f) Send or cause to be sent or leave or cause to be left to or at any premises, or to or with any person, any order form for intoxicating liquor.

(g) Cause or permit any payment for intoxicating liquor to be made on his behalf by any person in the service or employment of the vendor of the liquor, or, being a person in such service or employment, make any such payment as the agent or on behalf of the purchaser of the liquor.

Hours of Opening for the Supply of Food and Non-intoxicants.

5. Notwithstanding any provisions of this Order or of the Law relating to licensing or the sale of intoxicating liquor:—

(a) Licensed premises may be opened for the supply of food and non-intoxicating liquor at the hour of 5.30 in the morning on all days and be kept open for this purpose from that hour until the evening closes.

ing hour prescribed by the general provisions of the Licensing Acts; and

(b) Refreshment houses may be kept open for this purpose at any time during which they may be kept open under the general provisions of the said Acts.

Saving Provisions.

6. Nothing in the foregoing provisions of this Order shall be deemed to prohibit, in cases where the same is otherwise lawful;

(a) The consumption of intoxicating liquor by any person in any licensed premises or club where he is residing; or

(b) The consumption of intoxicating liquor at a meal by any person in any licensed premises or club at any time within half an hour after the conclusion of the afternoon and evening hours during which the sale or supply of intoxicating liquor is permitted by this Order; Provided that the liquor was sold or supplied and served during such hours at the same time as the meal and for consumption at the meal; or

(c) The sale or supply of spirits to any person producing a certificate in writing dated and signed by a duly qualified medical practitioner that the spirits are immediately required for medicinal purposes and specifying the quantity of spirits required; Provided that the quantity sold or supplied shall not exceed the quantity specified in such certificate; or

(d) The dispatch from licensed premises for delivery at a place more than five miles distant of any spirits or other intoxicating liquor in the forenoon of any day on which the sale of the same for consumption off the premises is permitted by Article 2 (2) and Article 3 of this Order as the case may be.

Treating Prohibited.

7. No person shall either by himself or by any servant or agent sell or supply any intoxicating liquor to any person in any licensed premises or in any club for consumption on the premises unless the same is ordered and paid for by the person so supplied; nor shall any person order or pay for or lend or advance money to pay for any intoxicating liquor wherewith any other person has been or is to be supplied for consumption on the premises; nor shall any person consume in any licensed premises or club any intoxicating liquor which any other person has ordered or paid for or agreed to pay for or lent or advanced money to pay for;

Provided always that if such intoxicating liquor is supplied or served for consumption at a meal supplied at the same time and is consumed at such meal the provisions of this regulation shall not be deemed to be contravened if the person who pays for such meal also pays for such intoxicating liquor.

For the purposes of this regulation consumption on the premises includes consumption of intoxicating liquor in or on any highway open ground or railway station adjoining or near to the licensed premises or club in which the liquor was sold or supplied; and any person consuming intoxicating liquor in or on any such highway open ground or railway station shall be deemed to consume the liquor in such licensed premises or club as the case may be.

Credit Prohibited.

8. No person shall—

(1) (a) Either by himself or by any servant or agent sell or supply in any licensed premises or club or dispatch therefrom any intoxicating liquor to be consumed either on or off the premises; or

(b) Consume any intoxicating liquor in or take it from such premises or club;

unless it is paid for before or at the time when it is supplied or dispatched or taken away.

Provided always that if the liquor is sold or supplied for consumption at a meal supplied at the same time and is consumed at such meal, this provision shall not be deemed to be contravened if the price of the liquor is paid together with the price of such meal and before the person partaking thereof quits the premises.

(2) Introduce or cause to be introduced into the area any intoxicating liquor unless it is paid for before it is so introduced.

Long Pull Prohibited.

9. No person shall either by himself or by any servant or agent in any licensed premises or club sell or supply to any person as the measure of intoxicating liquor for which he asks an amount exceeding that measure.

Dilution of Spirits.

A.—Compulsory.

10. (a) No person shall on or after the sixth day of May, 1918, either by himself or by any servant or agent—

(1) Sell or supply to any person in any licensed premises or club for consumption on or off the premises or dispatch therefrom any whisky, brandy, rum or gin unless reduced to 30 degrees under proof.

(2) Introduce or cause to be introduced into the area any whisky, brandy, rum or gin unless reduced to 30 degrees under proof.

Provided always that the foregoing provisions of this Article shall not affect the sale or supply in bottles of whisky, brandy, rum or gin which is proved to have been bottled before the twenty-ninth day of April, 1918.

B.—Permissive.

(b) The sale of whisky, brandy, rum and gin reduced to a number of degrees under proof which falls between 30 and 50 is hereby permitted.

(c) In determining whether an offence has been committed under the Sale of Food and Drugs Acts by selling to the prejudice of the purchaser whisky, brandy, rum or gin not adulterated otherwise than by an admixture of water, it shall be a good defence to prove that such admixture has not reduced the spirit more than 50 degrees under proof.

Sale of Light Beer.

11. The Order of the Central Control Board (Liquor Traffic) made on the third day of July, 1916, with reference to the sale of light beer shall apply to the area and come into force on the twenty-ninth day of April, 1918.

Explanatory Provisions.

12.

(a) Nothing in this Order authorises any licensed premises to be kept open for the sale

of intoxicating liquor except during the hours permitted under the general provisions of the Licensing Acts.

(b) The prohibition under this Order of the sale supply and consumption of intoxicating liquor except during certain hours is not subject to the exceptions provided for in the Licensing Acts with respect to *bonâ fide* travellers and the supply of intoxicating liquor at railway stations or any other provisions in those Acts enabling intoxicating liquor to be supplied during closing hours in special cases.

(c) The expression "licensed premises" includes any premises or place where the sale of intoxicating liquor is carried on under a licence.

(d) This Order does not affect the sale or dispatch of intoxicating liquor to a trader for the purposes of his trade or to a registered club for the purposes of the club.

(e) This Order does not affect the sale or supply of intoxicating liquor to or in any canteen where the sale of intoxicating liquor is carried on under the authority of a Secretary of State or of the Admiralty.

Exhibition of Order.

13. The secretary of every club to which this Order applies and every holder of a licence for the sale of intoxicating liquor shall keep permanently affixed in some conspicuous place in the club or in each public room in the licensed premises a copy of this Order and any other notice required by the Board to be so affixed.

Commencement of Order.

14. This Order shall come into force on the twenty-ninth day of April, 1918.

SUPPLEMENTAL ORDER OF THE CENTRAL CONTROL BOARD (LIQUOR TRAFFIC) FOR THE HUMBER AREA (EXTENSION) WITH REFERENCE TO MEDICATED WINES AND NEW EXCISE LICENCES.

Any person contravening any provision of this Order or of the Liquor Control Regulations is liable to imprisonment for six months with hard labour and a fine of £100.

We, the Central Control Board (Liquor Traffic) in pursuance of the powers conferred upon us by the Acts and Regulations relating to the Defence of the Realm hereby make the following Order supplemental to the Order made on the eighteenth day of April, 1918, for the Humber Area (Extension).

Conditions as to the Sale of Medicated Wines.

1. On and after the sixth day of May, 1918, no person shall either by himself or by any servant or agent sell or supply to any person in any licensed premises for consumption off

the premises or dispatch therefrom any intoxicating liquor in the form of or prepared as (a) medicated wine or (b) any mixture or preparation which contains any drug or medicament or is sold or advertised for sale as containing or purporting to contain medicinal properties except in a bottle or other vessel bearing a label correctly stating in clear and legible words or figures the amount of proof spirit contained in such medicated wine or mixture or preparation. Provided always that nothing herein shall be deemed to affect the sale of—

(a) Any medicine mixture or preparation appearing in the British Pharmacopeia or the British Pharmaceutical Codex; or

(b) Any medicine mixture or preparation which is made up for a customer on the signed prescription of a medical practitioner; or

(c) Medicated or methylated spirits or spirits made up in medicine and sold by medical practitioners or chemists or druggists.

2. (a) The expression "licensed premises" in the foregoing Article includes any premises or place where the sale of intoxicating liquor for consumption off the premises is carried on under a licence.

(b) The foregoing Article does not affect the sale or dispatch of intoxicating liquor to a trader for the purposes of his trade.

Restrictions on the Sale of Intoxicating Liquor under new Excise Licences.

3. No person shall, except with the written authority of the Central Control Board (Liquor Traffic) and in accordance with the terms and conditions subject to which such authority may be granted, either by himself or by any servant or agent, sell or supply in any premises any intoxicating liquor under an excise licence granted in respect of such premises on or after the twenty-ninth day of April, 1918, unless an excise licence authorising such sale was in force in respect of such premises on the twenty-eighth day of April, 1918.

Provided always that nothing in this Article shall be deemed to affect the sale of intoxicating liquor under—

(a) An excise licence granted on the authority of a Justices' licence; or

(b) An excise licence granted to any person holding a canteen under the authority of a Secretary of State or of the Admiralty; or

(c) A manufacturer's licence.

ORDER OF THE LOCAL GOVERNMENT BOARD.

Public Health (Regulations as to Food) Act, 1907:

Regulations as to Shell-fish.

PORT OF PORTSMOUTH.

To the Mayor, Aldermen, and Burgesses of the Borough of Portsmouth;—

And to all others whom it may concern.

Whereas the Mayor, Aldermen, and Burgesses of the Borough of Portsmouth are the Port Sanitary Authority for the Portsmouth Port Sanitary District;

And whereas it appears to Us, the Local Government Board, that danger arises to public health from the consumption of shell-fish derived from within the Port Sanitary District, and for the prevention of danger arising to public health it is expedient that the Regulations hereinafter set forth be made by Us in relation to shell-fish:

Now, therefore, in the exercise of the powers conferred upon Us by the Public Health Act, 1875, the Public Health Act, 1896, and the Public Health (Regulations as to Food) Act, 1907, and of every other power enabling Us in that behalf, We hereby make the following Regulations, that is to say:—

ARTICLE I.—In these Regulations, unless the contrary intention appears,—

(1) The expression "District" means the Portsmouth Port Sanitary District.

(2) The expression "Langstone Harbour" means the part of the District which is described in the Schedule to these Regulations;

(3) The expression "Port Sanitary Authority" means the Port Sanitary Authority for the Portsmouth Port Sanitary District;

(4) The expression "Port Medical Officer" includes the Medical Officer of Health for the said Port Sanitary District, and any legally qualified medical practitioner appointed or employed by the Port Sanitary Authority to act in the execution of these Regulations; and

(5) The expression "Gutner layings" means the oyster ponds and layings situated in Gutner Creek to the west of Gutner Common in North Hayling, or such other layings as We, on the representation of the Port Sanitary Authority, may hereafter approve.

ARTICLE II.—These Regulations shall be executed and enforced by the Port Sanitary Authority, and the Port Medical Officer shall make all such inquiries and inspections, whether within or without the limits of jurisdiction of the Port Sanitary Authority, as may be necessary to secure that all the provisions of these Regulations are strictly complied with.

ARTICLE III.—A person shall not sell, distribute or offer for sale for human consumption any oysters taken from Langstone Harbour: Provided that this Article shall not apply to oysters which have been taken from Langstone Harbour and have subsequently been relaid in the Gutner layings in accordance with conditions specified in a permit granted by the Port Medical Officer to the person responsible for the relaying of the oysters.

ARTICLE IV.—A permit granted by the Port Medical Officer for the purposes of these Regulations shall specify the following conditions:—

(1) Oysters taken from Langstone Harbour during times of frost shall not be relaid in the Gutner layings;

(2) Oysters relaid in the Gutner layings must remain there for a period of not less than fifteen days;

(3) Oysters from Langstone Harbour shall during the period of relaying be kept separate from oysters from other sources;

(4) Oysters from Langstone Harbour shall be relaid in the Gutner layings in such manner and position as to secure that they shall become adequately cleansed, and it shall be a condition of the holding of a permit under these Regulations that the holder shall give to the Port

Medical Officer all such information as that officer may require regarding the number of oysters from Langstone Harbour which are relaid by him and the dates of relaying such oysters, and shall observe all reasonable directions of the Port Medical Officer with the view of rendering the relaid oysters fit for human consumption; and

(5) Any permit granted by the Port Medical Officer for the purposes of these Regulations shall be valid for not more than one year and may be revoked at any time by the Port Sanitary Authority if the conditions of the permit shall not have been satisfactorily observed or if the holder has not complied with the requirements of these Regulations.

ARTICLE V.—A person shall not sell, distribute or offer for sale for human consumption any cockles, mussels or butterfish taken from within the District unless and until they shall have been subjected to a process of sterilization by steaming under pressure in a suitable apparatus for at least 6 minutes. The sterilization shall be carried out either by the Port Sanitary Authority or in a manner approved by the Port Medical Officer.

ARTICLE VI.—(1) The Port Sanitary Authority may with Our consent appoint and pay a legally qualified medical practitioner to act in the execution of these Regulations.

(2) The Port Sanitary Authority may also, with Our consent, appoint or employ and pay a person to act, under the direction of the Port Medical Officer, in the execution of any such powers or in the discharge of any such duties of the Port Medical Officer under these Regulations as the Port Sanitary Authority assign to the person so appointed.

ARTICLE VII.—(1) If a difference arises in relation to any subject matter of, or to anything done under these Regulations, the difference may, on the application of all the parties affected, be referred to Us for determination.

(2) It shall be at Our option to determine any such difference as arbitrators or otherwise; and, if We elect to determine the difference as arbitrators, the provisions of the Regulation of Railways Act, 1868, respecting arbitrations by the Board of Trade, and the enactments amending those provisions shall apply, as if they were re-enacted in these Regulations, and in terms made applicable to Us, and to the determination of the difference.

(3) Where We elect to determine any such difference otherwise than as arbitrators, We may by Our Order determine the difference, and it shall be a condition of the reference of any difference to Us that Our determination shall be final and conclusive.

(4) Every Order made by Us in pursuance of this Article shall have effect as if the Order were enacted in these Regulations.

ARTICLE VIII.—Within the period of fourteen days after the date of these Regulations or within such further period as We may allow, the Port Sanitary Authority shall cause a statement of the effect of these Regulations to be published in one or more local newspapers circulating in the District, and may cause warning notices containing a copy of these Regulations or a sufficient statement of their terms to be posted in conspicuous places in the vicinity of any parts of the District where shell-fish are taken.

ARTICLE IX.—These Regulations may be cited as the "Portsmouth (Shell-fish) Regulations, 1918."

We further certify in pursuance of Section 2 of the Rules Publication Act, 1893, that on account of urgency the foregoing Regulations shall come into immediate operation, and We accordingly order that these Regulations shall come into force forthwith as Provisional Regulations.

THE SCHEDULE.

LANGSTONE HARBOUR.

So much of the Port of Portsmouth as is bounded on or towards the south by a line drawn from the southern extremity, at low water of spring tides, of the sands known as West Winner on the west of the harbour entrance, to the southern extremity, at low water of spring tides, of the sands known as East Winner on the east of the harbour entrance, on or towards the north-west by the bridge of the London Brighton and South Coast Railway Company crossing Broom Channel, and on or towards the north-east by Hayling Bridge crossing the waters known as North Lake or New Cut, together with all channels, lakes, creeks, streams, rithes, and other waters, and all the sands, muds, shores, and islands connected therewith, within the above-mentioned limits, together with all the sands known respectively as West Winner and East Winner.

NOTICE.—The Public Health Act, 1896, provides by Sub-section 3 of Section 1 that if any person wilfully neglects or refuses to obey or carry out, or obstructs the execution of any regulation made under any of the enactments mentioned in that Act he shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding one hundred pounds, and, in the case of a continuing offence, to a further penalty not exceeding fifty pounds for every day during which the offence continues.

The power of making regulations under the Public Health Act, 1896, and the enactments mentioned in that Act is enlarged by the Public Health (Regulations as to Food) Act, 1907.

STATUTORY RULES AND ORDERS, 1918.

UNEMPLOYMENT INSURANCE.

THE UNEMPLOYMENT INSURANCE (MUNITION WORKERS) FUND REGULATIONS MADE BY THE MINISTER OF LABOUR UNDER THE NATIONAL INSURANCE (UNEMPLOYMENT) ACTS, 1911 TO 1918.

The Minister of Labour, in pursuance of Section 2 of the New Ministries and Secretaries Act, 1916, Section 91 of the National Insurance Act, 1911, Section 3 (2) of the National Insurance (Part II.) (Munition Workers) Act, 1916, and all other powers in this behalf, hereby makes the following Regulations:—

1. (1) These Regulations may be cited as the Unemployment Insurance (Munition Workers) Fund Regulations, 1918.

(2) These Regulations shall have effect as from the date when the National Insurance (Part II.) (Munition Workers) Act, 1916,

came into operation, namely, the 4th day of September, 1916.

2. In these Regulations unless the context otherwise requires or admits:—

“The Principal Act” means Part II. of the National Insurance Act, 1911;

“The amending Act” means the National Insurance (Part II. Amendment) Act, 1914;

“The Munition Workers Act” means the National Insurance (Part II.) (Munition Workers) Act, 1916;

“The Vote” means the Vote for Labour Exchanges and Unemployment Insurance for the year ended 31st March, 1917, and the Vote for the Ministry of Labour for subsequent years;

“The Fund” means the Unemployment Fund established under Section 92 (1) of the Principal Act;

“The Unemployment Insurance (Munition Workers) Fund” means that part of the Fund representing the estimated receipts and expenditure in respect of workpeople insured under the Munition Workers Act, ascertained or apportioned in accordance with these Regulations.

3. Where under these Regulations the Minister of Labour is empowered to give directions on any matter, the directions may be given either generally or as regards any special matter.

4. The Interpretation Act, 1889, applies for the purpose of the interpretation of these Regulations as it applies for the purpose of the interpretation of an Act of Parliament.

5. The Ministry of Labour shall prepare accounts so far as practicable showing the estimated receipts and expenditure of the Unemployment Insurance (Munition Workers) Fund ascertained in accordance with these Regulations.

6. So much of the receipts and expenditure of the Fund in each year as it is practicable to identify as attributable to the Munition Workers Act shall be recorded in the books of account of the Ministry of Labour, in a separate account entitled the Unemployment Insurance (Munition Workers) Fund.

7. The receipts of the Fund in respect of contributions from employers and workmen represented by the sales of unemployment insurance stamps from the 4th September, 1916, to the 14th July, 1917, in respect of workmen insured under the Principal Act and the Munition Workers Act shall be apportioned in the ratio which the number of unemployment insurance books issued under the Principal Act during the Insurance Year ended the 14th July, 1917, and exchanged up to the Saturday nearest the 14th July, 1918, bears to the number of such books issued and exchanged up to the same date under the Munition Workers Act, due allowance being made as the Minister of Labour, with the approval of the Treasury, may direct for:—

(i.) the varying rates of contributions by adults and juveniles;

(ii.) sickness;

(iii.) the intermittent stamping of unemployment insurance books issued to workmen insured under Section 1 (1) (a) of the Munition Workers Act;

(iv.) any other circumstances for which allowance should be made.

8. The receipts of the Fund in respect of contributions by employers and workmen for periods subsequent to the 14th July, 1917, shall

be apportioned monthly according to the ratio applicable to the period ended the 14th July, 1917, or the ratio similarly ascertained for each successive insurance year, subject to such monthly adjustments as may appear proper in respect of unemployment insurance books issued, cancelled or lodged with Employment Exchanges during the month.

9. The receipts of the Fund in respect of contributions out of moneys provided by Parliament in accordance with Section 85 (6) of the Principal Act, shall be apportioned in the same proportion that the amounts of the apportioned contributions by employers and workmen bear to each other, subject to such adjustments as, with the approval of the Treasury, may be necessary to comply with the provisions of Section 4 of the Amending Act.

10. The receipts of the Fund in each year arising from dividends and interest on the investments representing surplus moneys of the Fund held by the National Debt Commissioners, under Section 92 (3) of the Principal Act, shall be apportioned according to the ratio that the periodical balance of the Unemployment Insurance (Munition Workers) Fund bears to the rest of the Fund subject to such adjustments as may, with the approval of the Treasury, be proper in respect of the moneys, and the dividends, and interest arising therefrom, held by the National Debt Commissioners on the 4th September, 1916, on account of the Fund. The periodical balances shall be ascertained at the end of the period ended the 14th July, 1917, and monthly thereafter.

11. The expenditure of the Fund in respect of the amount payable to the Vote pursuant to Section 89 (2) of the Principal Act, shall be apportioned in accordance with the ratio which the amount of the apportioned receipts on income account of the Unemployment Insurance (Munition Workers) Fund bears to the rest of the income of the Fund, subject to such adjustments of each proportion as may, with the approval of the Treasury, be necessary to comply with the provisions of Section 4 of the amending Act.
