PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the 33rd and 34th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 39, and of the Acts therein mentioned, that is to say, the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 113, the Act of the 4th and 5th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 39, and the Act of the 31st and 32nd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 114, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme, bearing date the 14th day of February, 1918, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

“ We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 33rd and 34th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 39, and of the Acts therein mentioned, that is to say, the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 113, the Act of the 4th and 5th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 39, and the Act of the 31st and 32nd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 114, have prepared, and now

humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for effecting a transfer of the ownership of the Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the Church and Cure (hereinafter called ‘ the said Benefice ’) of Burnham Deepdale, in the County of Norfolk, and in the Diocese of Norwich :

“ Whereas the Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Burnham Deepdale is vested for an estate in fee simple, free from incumbrances, in the Right Reverend Henry Joseph Corbett, Bishop of Gibraltar, and the Reverend William Hook Longsdon, of St. Andrew's Vicarage, Stockwell, in the County of Surrey, Clerk in Holy Orders, as Trustees upon certain Trusts declared in relation thereto under the Will, dated the 26th of January, 1895, with Codicil dated the 4th of April, 1905, of the late Reverend Edward Kerslake Kerslake, Clerk in Holy Orders, and the said Henry Joseph Corbett, Bishop of Gibraltar, and the said William Hook Longsdon, are therefore the Patrons or persons entitled to present to the said Benefice in case the same were now vacant :

“ And whereas the said Henry Joseph Corbett, Bishop of Gibraltar, and the said William Hook Longsdon, are desirous that the whole Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of
