A PROCLAMATION

WITHDRAWING CERTAIN CERTIFICATES OF EXEMPTION FROM MILITARY SERVICE.

GEORGE R.I.

**W**HEREAS by Sub-section (1) of Section three of the Military Service (No. 2) Act, 1918, it is provided that His Majesty may, by Proclamation declaring that a national emergency has arisen, direct that any certificates of exemption, other than certificates ex-

pressed to be granted or renewed solely on the ground specified in paragraph (c) or on the ground specified in paragraph (d) of Sub-section (1) of Section two of the Military Service Act, 1916, granted or renewed to any class or body of men specified in the Proclamation, or to men of any class or description so specified shall, as from the date specified in the Proclamation cease to have effect, and all certificates to which the Proclamation applies shall as from that date cease to be in force:

And whereas by Sub-section (2) of Section three of the Military Service (No. 2) Act, 1918, it is provided that while any such Proclamation remains in operation no application shall, except in so far as the Proclamation provides for the making of applications in any special cases, be entertained for the grant or renewal of the certificates mentioned in that Sub-section:

And whereas a national emergency has arisen:

Now, therefore, We, by and with the advice of Our Privy Council, in pursuance of the said Act and all other powers enabling Us in that behalf, do hereby direct that, as from the Twenty-fourth day of April, 1918, the certificates of exemption from military service

specified in the First Schedule to this Our Royal Proclamation shall cease to have effect:

And in pursuance of the powers aforesaid We do hereby further direct that, notwithstanding that this Our Royal Proclamation is in operation, applications for certificates of exemption may be made in the special cases and subject to the provisions specified in the Second Schedule hereto.

#### FIRST SCHEDULE.

All certificates of exemption granted or renewed to men born in the years 1895, 1896, 1897, 1898, and 1899, exclusive of:—

(1) Certificates held by men who pursuant to their last authorised medical examination are at the date of this Proclamation:—

(a) In medical category C2, B3 or C3 or in Grade 3, or

(b) In medical category B1, B2, B3, C1, C2, or C3, or in Grade 2 or Grade 3 if in their case they are at the date of this Proclamation whole time employed on a farm in farm work and are duly registered pursuant to the National Registration Acts, 1915 and 1918, as being occupied on agricultural work.

(2) Certificates granted or renewed on grounds of employment by Colliery Recruiting Courts to persons employed in or about coal mines.

(3) Certificates granted or renewed on grounds of employment by Port Labour Committees, or the London Shipowners and Transport Workers' Military Service Committee to men who at the date of this Proclamation are pursuant to their last authorised medical examination in a medical grade or category other than Grade 1 or Category A.

(4) Certificates granted or renewed to persons who at the date of this Proclamation are duly qualified medical practitioners.

(5) Certificates expressed to be granted or renewed solely on the ground specified in paragraph (c) or on the ground specified in paragraph (d) of Sub-section (1) of Section two of the Military Service Act, 1916, that is to say, on the grounds of ill-health or infirmity or of a conscientious objection to the undertaking of combatant service.

#### SECOND SCHEDULE.

A. Application may be made to an Appeal Tribunal for the grant or renewal of a certificate of exemption solely on the ground specified in paragraph (a) of Sub-section (1) of Section two of the Military Service Act, 1916, in respect of a man who has established to the satisfaction of the County Agricultural Executive Committee in England or Wales, or the Board of Agriculture for Scotland in Scotland, that he is a highly skilled agricultural worker, whole time employed on a farm in farm work, and that he is irreplaceable and essential to the cultivation of the farm, provided that the application is lodged in accordance with the Regulations for Tribunals not later than the 15th day of May, 1918.

B. Application may be made to a Tribunal for the grant or renewal of a certificate of exemption:—

(i) Solely on the ground specified in paragraph (b) of Sub-section (1) of Section two of the Military Service Act, 1916, in respect

of a man who establishes to the satisfaction of the Tribunal that he is the last surviving son of a widow, of whom at least one son has died as a result of wounds received in, or sickness contracted by, service with Our Armed Forces during the present War; or

(ii) Solely on the ground specified in paragraph (d) of Sub-section (1) of Section two of the Military Service Act, 1916, in respect of a man whose certificate was expressed to be granted or renewed on such ground in addition to a ground specified in paragraphs (a) or (b) of that Sub-section;

provided that such application is lodged, in accordance with the Regulations for Tribunals, not later than the Eighth day of May, 1918.

Given at Our Court at *Buckingham Palace*, this Twentieth day of *April*, in the year of our Lord One thousand nine hundred and eighteen, and in the Eighth year of Our Reign.

#### *Explanatory Notes.*

Note 1.—This Proclamation operates to withdraw only certificates of exemption granted by Tribunals and by Government Departments under Section 2 of the Military Service Act, 1916. It does not affect *protection* certificates issued under the Schedule of Protected Occupations, M.M. 130 (Revised), namely Forms 3476A, 3476B, and 3476 W.M.V., to men employed on Admiralty, War Office or Munitions work, or protection certificates issued to men employed by Railway Companies.

Note 2.—Certificates of exemption to which this Proclamation applies cease to be in force on the 24th April, 1918. The holder of such a certificate must forthwith transmit the certificate, together with a notification that it has ceased to be in force, to the Local Office of the Ministry of National Service for the area in which the holder of the certificate is registered under the National Registration Acts, 1915 and 1918. If any man fails without reasonable cause or excuse to do so he is guilty of an offence under the Military Service (No. 2) Act, 1918.

#### A PROCLAMATION

UNDER THE MUNITIONS OF WAR ACTS,  
1915 TO 1917.

GEORGE R.I.

**W**HEREAS by section three of the Munitions of War Act, 1915, as amended by the Munitions of War (Amendment) Act, 1916, it is provided that the differences to which Part I. of the first-mentioned Act applies are differences as to rates of wages, hours of work, or otherwise as to terms or conditions of or affecting munitions work, and also any differences as to rates of wages, hours of work, or otherwise as to terms or conditions of or affecting employment on any other work of any description, if that Part of that Act is applied to such a difference by His Majesty by Proclamation, on the ground that in the opinion of His Majesty the existence or continuance of the difference is directly or indirectly prejudicial to the manufacture, transport, or supply of

Munitions of War; and it is also provided that the said Part of the said Act may be so applied to such a difference at any time, whether a lock-out or strike is in existence in connection with the difference to which it is applied or not; Provided that if in the case of any industry the Minister of Munitions is satisfied that effective means exist to secure the settlement without stoppage of any difference arising on work other than on munitions work, no Proclamation shall be made under the said section with respect to any such difference:

And whereas a difference within the meaning of the said section exists between employers and persons employed as General Cargo Workers and Dock Labourers, in the Port of London, as to rates of wages, hours of work, or otherwise as to terms and conditions of or affecting employment of workers loading, discharging, and handling cargoes at quays and wharves overside and in warehouses at docks or wharves, including all men engaged on dock labour embraced in existing local agreements:

And whereas the Minister of Labour has investigated the matter and the Minister of Munitions, having considered the results of the investigation made by the Minister of Labour and his representations to the Minister of Munitions, is not satisfied that effective means exist to secure the settlement of the said difference without stoppage, being a difference arising on work other than munitions work:

And whereas in Our opinion the existence or continuance of the said difference is directly and indirectly prejudicial to the manufacture, transport, or supply of Munitions of War:

Now, Therefore, We, by and with the advice of Our Privy Council, are pleased to proclaim, direct, and ordain, that Part I. of the Munitions of War Act, 1915, shall apply to the said difference.

**WHEREAS** by an Order in Council, dated the twenty-eighth day of November, nineteen hundred and fourteen, His Majesty was pleased to make regulations (called the "Defence of the Realm Regulations") under the Defence of the Realm Consolidation Act, 1914, for securing the public safety and the defence of the realm:

And whereas the said Act has been amended by the Defence of the Realm (Amendment) Act, 1915, the Defence of the Realm (Amendment) (No. 2) Act, 1915, and the Munitions of War Act, 1915, and other enactments:

And whereas the said regulations have been amended by various subsequent Orders in Council:

And whereas it is expedient further to amend the said regulations in manner herein-after appearing:

Now, therefore, His Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to

order, and it is hereby ordered, that the following amendment be made in the said regulations:—

Regulation 14B shall be amended as follows:—

(1) In the fourth paragraph after the words "deportation of aliens," there shall be inserted the words "or any committee specially appointed by the Secretary of State for the purposes of this regulation."

(2) After the fourth paragraph (ending with the words "high judicial office") the following paragraph shall be inserted:—

"In any area in respect of which the operation of section one of the Defence of the Realm (Amendment) Act, 1915, is for the time being suspended, this Regulation shall apply in relation to any person who is suspected of acting or having acted or of being about to act in a manner prejudicial to the public safety or the defence of the realm, as it applies in relation to persons of hostile origin or association."

(3) In the fifth paragraph after the word "Scotland," where it first occurs, there shall be inserted the words "and Ireland," and after the word "Scotland," where it secondly occurs, there shall be inserted the words "and the Chief Secretary respectively," and at the end of the paragraph there shall be inserted the words "but an order under this regulation may require the person to whom the order relates to reside or to be interned in any place in the British Islands."

#### THE RAW COTTON (FOURTH CENSUS) ORDER, 1918.

Dated 19th day of April, 1918, made by the Board of Trade under Regulations 2 G and 2 JJ of the Defence of the Realm Regulations.

The Board of Trade, deeming it desirable to make further exercise of their powers under Regulations 2 G and 2 JJ of the Defence of the Realm Regulations, hereby order as follows:—

1. Every person who spins and every person who spins and manufactures raw cotton shall, on or before the 27th day of April, 1918, make a return to the Cotton Control Board in the form contained in the first schedule to this Order, giving such particulars of his business as are required by such form.

2. Every person who deals in raw cotton other than a member of the Liverpool or Manchester Cotton Associations shall, on or before the 27th day of April, 1918, make a return to the Cotton Control Board in the form contained in the second schedule to this Order, giving such particulars of his business as are required by such form.

3. Every person who deals in cotton who is a member of the Liverpool or Manchester Cotton Associations shall, if and when required by the Cotton Control Board, make a return to them, giving such particulars of his business in such form as the Cotton Control Board may direct.

4. This Order may be cited as the Raw Cotton (Fourth Census) Order, 1918.

#### DEFENCE OF THE REALM REGULATIONS.

##### RULES FOR NAVAL ORDNANCE MAGAZINE DEPÔTS, &C., UNDER THE CHARGE OF THE ADMIRALTY.

In pursuance of the powers conferred upon them by Defence of the Realm Regulation 35A, the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, after consultation with a Secretary of State, hereby make the following rules:—

##### 1. *Application.*

These rules shall apply to every person employed in the Naval Ordnance Magazine Depôts, and shall have effect over the whole area within the Depôt except only such areas or buildings (if any) as are expressly excepted by the order of the Officer in Charge of the Depôt. The posting of these Rules conspicuously in or at the entrance to the Depôt shall be deemed to be notice of their contents to all persons concerned.

For the purposes of these Rules Naval Ordnance Magazine Depôt shall include any hulk under the charge of the Admiralty which is used for the storage of explosives.

##### 2. *Smoking, Tobacco, etc.*

No person shall smoke anywhere within the Depôt, or bring into or have in his possession while within the Depôt any cigar, cigarette, tobacco, pipe, or contrivance for smoking, except as authorised by the Officer in Charge of the Depôt or the Depôt Rules.

##### 3. *Matches, Lights, etc.*

No person shall bring within the Depôt or have in his possession whilst within the Depôt any match or apparatus for producing light, or any lamp, light or fire of any description or any article of iron or steel, except as authorised by the Officer in Charge of the Depôt or by the Depôt Rules.

##### 4. *Searching.*

The Police and anyone authorised by the Officer in Charge of the Depôt may search at any time any person entering or being within the Depôt, and may examine such person's clothing and any bag, basket, parcel or other article being carried, and any person entering or being within the Depôt shall, if so required by any such authorised person, submit to being searched and comply with any reasonable directions or regulations given or made with the object of enabling the same to be carried

out. Provided that in no case shall any female person be searched by, or in the presence of, anyone but a female person.

#### 5. Intoxication.

No person in a state of intoxication shall enter or remain within the Depôt.

#### 6. Saving of Other Rules.

Nothing in these rules shall affect any shop or other rules of or prescribed for the Depôt, or the power to impose fines for the breach of such rules, subject to the provisions of the Truck Acts.

Any person failing to comply with the above rules will be guilty of an offence against the Defence of the Realm (Consolidation) Regulations and liable on summary conviction to imprisonment with or without hard labour for a period not exceeding six months or to a fine not exceeding £100 or both.

The Admiralty Rules dated the 12th of March, 1917, are hereby cancelled.

The KING has been graciously pleased to approve of the posthumous award of the Albert Medal in Gold for gallantry in saving life at sea to Commander Francis Herbert Heaveningham Goodhart, D.S.O., R.N.

The account of the services, in respect of which the medal has been conferred, is as follows:—

Owing to an accident, one of H.M. submarines sank and became fast on the bottom in 38 feet of water, parts of the vessel becoming flooded. After several hours the only prospect of saving those remaining on board appeared to be for someone to escape from the submarine in order to concert measures with the rescuers, who were by this time present on the surface. Commander Goodhart, after consultation with the Commanding Officer, volunteered to make the attempt. Accordingly, after placing in his belt a small tin cylinder with instructions for the rescuers, Commander Goodhart went into the conning tower with the Commanding Officer. The conning tower was flooded up to their waists, and the high-pressure air was turned on; the clips of the conning tower were knocked off and the conning tower lid was soon wide open. Commander Goodhart then stood up in the dome, took a deep breath, and made his escape, but, unfortunately, was blown by the pressure of air against part of the superstructure, and was killed by the force of the blow.

The Commanding Officer, whose intention it had been to return inside the submarine after Commander Goodhart's escape, was involuntarily forced to the surface by the air pressure, and it was thus rendered possible for the plans for rescuing those still inside the submarine to be carried out.

Commander Goodhart displayed extreme and heroic daring in attempting to escape from the submarine in order to save the lives of those remaining on board, and thoroughly realised the forlorn nature of his act. His last remark to the Commanding Officer was: "If I don't get up, the tin cylinder will."
