## REGISTRATION EXPENSES.

In pursuance of the powers conferred by section 15 of the Representation of the People Act, 1918, We, being two of the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, have framed the following scales of Registration Expenses for Scotland. These scales will be applicable only to the first and second Registers prepared under the Act.

Expenditure.

The actual expenditure supported as far as possible by vouchers and certified by a statutory declaration by the Registration Officer to the effect that it was necessarily and properly incurred. First class railway expenses and subsistence allowance at the rate of £1 a night when the Registration Officer is necessarily absent from home on account of his registration duties will be allowed.
