And whereas the said Scheme hath been transmitted by the said Bishop to the said Archbishop for his consideration:

And whereas the said Archbishop, being satisfied with the said Scheme, hath certified the same and the Consents aforesaid to His Majesty in Council by his Report dated the 4th day of September, 1917, which said Report is in the words and figures following:—

"We, the undersigned, Randall Thomas, Archbishop of the Province of Canterbury, do hereby report to Your Majesty in Council:—

"That the Right Reverend Bertram, Lord Bishop of Norwich, has represented unto us amongst other things:—

"That there is, in the County of Norfolk, and his Diocese of Norwich, the Benefice and Consolidated Rectories of Blakeney (with the Chapelry of Glandford), Cockthorpe, and Langham Parva:

"That there is also, in the same County and Diocese, the Benefice and Rectory of Wiveton:

"That it appears to the said Lord Bishop that under the provisions of the Pluralities Act, 1838, the said Chapelry of Glandford may be advantageously separated from the said Benefice of Blakeney with Glandford, Cockthorpe, and Langham Parva, and united to the said Rectory of Wiveton, to which it is contiguous, for ecclesiastical purposes:

"That pursuant to the directions contained in the said Act the said Lord Bishop has drawn up a Scheme in writing describing the mode in which it appears to him that the proposed alteration may best be effected, and how the changes consequent upon such alteration in respect of Ecclesiastical Jurisdiction, Glebe Lands, Tithe-Rent-Charges, and other Ecclesiastical Dues, Rates, and Payments, and in respect to Patronage and Rights to Pews, may be made with justice to all parties interested, which Scheme, together with the Consents in writing of the Honourable Rachel Anstruther-Gough-Calthorpe, the Patron or person entitled to present to the said Benefice of Blakeney (with the Chapelry of Glandford), Cockthorpe, and Langham Parva, in case the same were now vacant, and Sir Alfred Jodrell, Bt., the Patron or person entitled to present to the said Benefice of Wiveton, in case the same were now vacant, has been transmitted to us by the said Lord Bishop for our consideration:

"The Representation and Scheme of the said Lord Bishop are hereunto annexed:

"And We, the said Archbishop, being on full consideration and inquiry satisfied with the said Scheme, do hereby, pursuant to the said Act, certify the same and such Consents as aforesaid to Your Majesty in Council, to the intent that Your Majesty in Council may, in case Your Majesty in Council shall think fit so to do, make and issue an Order for carrying the said Scheme into effect, and we recommend that the endowment of the said Chapelry of Glandford, consisting of an appportioned Tithe-Rent-Charge of £97., and 9 acres of Glebe of the approximate annual value of £8., shall be assigned and attached to the said Parish of Wiveton.
