At the Council Chamber, Whitehall, the 31st day of May, 1918.

By the Lords of His Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council.

WHEREAS His Majesty has been pleased, in exercise of the power in that behalf conferred on Him by Section one, sub-section one, of the Trading with the Enemy (Extension of Powers) Act, 1915, by divers Proclamations, and in particular by a Proclamation dated the 23rd day of May, 1916, and amended on the 16th day of January, 1918, entitled "The Trading with the Enemy (Statutory List) Proclamation," to prohibit all persons or bodies of, persons, incorporated or unincorporated, resident, carrying on business, or being in the United Kingdom from trading with any of the persons or bodies of persons mentioned in the List contained in the last-mentioned Proclamation, such List being therein referred to as the Statutory List:

And whereas by Section one, sub-section two, of the said Act, it is provided that any List of persons and bodies of persons, incorporated or unincorporated, with whom such trading is pro-

hibited by a Proclamation under the said Act may be varied or added to by an order made by the Lords of the Council on the recommendation of a Secretary of State:

And whereas the Statutory List contained in the last mentioned Proclamation, has been varied and added to by subsequent Orders of Council

And whereas there was this day read at the Board a recommendation from the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs to the effect that the Statutory List should be further varied and added to as set forth in the Schedule hereto.

Now, therefore, Their Lordships, having taken the said recommendation into consideration, are pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered,

That the Statutory List be varied and added to as set forth in the Schedule hereto.

Whereof the Right Honourable Arthur Balfour, one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, the Controller of the Foreign Trade Department, and all other persons whom it may concern, are to take notice and govern themselves accordingly.

Note (1).—All persons or firms resident, carrying on business or being in the United Kingdom are prohibited from having, with any person or firm mentioned in this List, or in any List issued under the Trading with the Enemy (Statutory List) Proclamation, any dealings other than such as are expressly authorized by paragraph 5 of the Proclamation. A List (The Consolidated List, No. 51A) consolidating all previous Lists, up to and including that of the 5th April, 1918, together with List No. 52 of 19th April, 1918, List No. 53 of 3rd May, 1918, List No. 54 of 17th May, 1918, List No. 55 of 24th May, 1918, and the List No. 55 of 24th May, 1918, and 1918, annexed, contain all the names which up to this date are included in the Statutory List.

Additions to and variations in these Lists will be published at intervals approximately of two weeks.

The Lists are published in the London Gazette and reproduced in the Board of Trade Journal, and separate copies of all Lists may be obtained at a small cost from the Superintendent of Publications, His Majesty's Stationery Office, Imperial House, Kingsway, W.C.

Note (2).—Where a person or firm mentioned in the List has more than one address in the country, or group of countries under which the name of the person or firm appears, all dealings in that country, or in any country in the group, with such person or firm are prohibited, even in cases where one only of the addresses or one only of the countries is specifically mentioned.

NOTE (3).—Trading is prohibited under the Trading with the Enemy Proclamations of 25th June, and 10th November, 1915, with any person or firm of enemy nationality resident or carrying on business in China, Siam, Persia, Morocco, Liberia or Portuguese East Africa. Persons or firms in the United Kingdom are therefore prohibited from trading with any person or firm of enemy nationality in any of those countries, even though such person or firm is not mentioned by name in the Statutory

Note (4).—In order to minimise as far as possible any inconvenience which may be caused to British traders by the dislocation of export trade owing to the inclusion in the Statutory List of a former connection, the Foreign Trade Department is collecting and classifying the names of non-enemy firms who may be able to act as substitutes for firms mentioned in the Statutory List. A considerable amount of information is already available at the Foreign Trade Department, and it is in many cases possible to suggest the names of satisfactory substitutes for individual firms on the Lists, without the necessity of referring the matter abroad. The Department is, however, pre-pared on application to enquire of His abroad. Majesty's Representatives abroad for the names of suitable substitutes. When the applicant wishes this done by telegraph he is required to undertake to pay the cost of telegraphic correspondence. It would greatly facilitate the work of the Foreign Trade Department if applicants in making enquiries would specify the particular trade or trades for which substitutes are required. General enquiries for new connections abroad should be addressed to the Comptroller -General, Department of Overseas Trade (Development and Intelligence), 73, Basinghall Street, London, E.U. 2.

Note (5).—The Statutory List for each country is telegraphed, on the day of issue, to His Majesty's Representative in that country, who is instructed to notify accordingly British Consular Officers, to whom persons abroad should apply for information as to names on the List. Persons and firms in the United Kingdom with agencies or branches abroad would, however, be well advised to furnish such agencies or branches with issues of the List as they appear. The names on the Lists for all countries in Central or South America are also notified to His Majesty's Ambassador at Washington, who transmits them to H.M. Consul-General at New York and to other centres in the United States likely to be interested.

Note (6).—It is not unusual for firms in Holland and the Netherland East Indies to be registered under the names commencing with descriptive terms such as "Handel Maatschappy" (Trading Company) or "Naamlooze Venootschap" (Limited Liability Company). In such cases it has been found more convenient to publish the firm under its proper name followed by the general descriptive term "Handel Maatschappy" or "Naamlooze Venootschap" (N.V.) as in the case of an English company. For instance Handel Maatschappy van dem Berg & Company, and Naamlooze Venootschap de Komeet v/h Dumonceau Frères will be found under "Berg" and "Komeet" respectively, and not under "Handel" or "Naamlooze."

ORDER OF THE BOARD OF AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES.

(DATED 28TH MAY 1918.)

SHEEP-DIPPING (DEVON) ORDER OF 1918.

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1914, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

Provision as to Removal of Sheep from Commons, etc., in Dartmoor District and Double Dipping of such Sheep.

- 1.—(1.) All sheep shall be removed or caused to be removed by the owner or person in charge thereof from the moors, commons, unenclosed lands, or newtakes described in the First Schedule hereto as "the Scheduled Commons," on or before the twentieth day of June in each year while this Order is in operation.
- (2.) All sheep which are on a Scheduled Common on the thirty-first day of October in any year while this Order is in operation shall be removed or caused to be removed therefrom by the owner or person in charge of the sheep not later than the first day of November in the same year.
- (3.) No sheep shall be moved or permitted to be moved or to stray on to a Scheduled Common during the period commencing on the twentieth day of June in any year and terminating on the thirtieth day of that month, nor during the period commencing on the first day of November in any year and terminating on the fifteenth day of that month.
- (4.) The Local Authority may cause any sheep found on a Scheduled Common during either of the two periods specified above, to be seized, detained, and double dipped in the mode prescribed by this Order, and may re-cover summarily the expenses necessarily incurred by them in so doing from the owner of the sheep seized.
- (5.) No sheep shall, except as hereinafter provided, be moved on to a Scheduled Common from any premises or place within the Scheduled Area defined in the First Schedule hereto during the period commencing on the first day of July and terminating on the thirtieth day of November in any year while this Order is in operation, unless, immediately before such movement, there has been delivered up at, or sent by post to, the nearest Police Station in the District, a declaration made by the owner of the sheep or his authorised agent to the effect that the sheep to be moved have been dipped twice by the owner or person in charge thereof in the mode prescribed by this Order within twenty-eight days before they are so moved; but this provision shall not authorise movement of sheep on to a Scheduled Common during the period commencing on the first day of November and terminating on the fifteenth day of that month.

Prohibition of Movement of Undipped Sheep into Dartmoor District from 1st July to 30th November.

2. Sheep shall not, during the period commencing on the first day of July, and terminating on the thirtieth day of November in any year while this Order is in operation, be moved into the Scheduled Area defined in the First Schedule hereto from any place outside the Area, unless they are accompanied by a licence authorising such movement granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the county of Devon, either—

(a) upon production to the Inspector of a declaration signed by the owner of the sheep or his agent authorised in writing for this purpose, that the sheep to be moved have been dipped twice in the mode prescribed by this Order within twenty-eight days before the licence is granted, and have since the second dipping been kept separate from other sheep not so dipped; or

(b) where the place of destination is not a Scheduled Common, then subject to the condition, which shall be specified in the licence, that the sheep shall, after arrival at the place of destination specified in the licence, be there detained and kept separate from all other sheep until they have been dipped twice in the mode prescribed by this Order, or until the sheep are moved from such place of destination to a slaughterhouse under the authority of a licence granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the county of Devon, where they shall be detained until they are slaughtered.

Movement of Sheep from Scheduled Commons to enclosed holdings from 1st July to 31st October.

- 3.—(1.) Sheep shall not be moved from a Scheduled Common to an enclosed holding within the Scheduled Area defined in the First Schedule hereto during the period commencing on the first day of July and terminating on the thirty-first day of October in any year while this Order is in operation, unless (a) the sheep have within twenty-eight days before the movement been dipped twice in the mode prescribed by this Order, and have since the second dipping been kept separate from other sheep not so dipped, or (b) the sheep are dipped twice in the mode prescribed by this Order within twenty-one days of their arrival at the place of destination.
- (2) Immediately after the completion of such movement, the owner or person in charge of the sheep shall deliver up at, or send by post to, the nearest Police Station in the district, a Declaration stating the number and description of the sheep so moved, and the place of destination, and whether the sheep were dipped in the prescribed manner before movement.

(3) In the case of sheep intended to be dipped after arrival at the place of destination the owner or person in charge shall, immediately after the completion of the prescribed double dipping, deliver up at, or send by post to, the nearest Police Station in the district, a Declaration stating that the sheep have been so dipped and the dates of the dippings.

Prohibition of Movement of Undipped Sheep out of the Scheduled Area from 1st July to 31st October.

4.—(1.) Sheep shall not, during the period commencing on the first day of July, and terminating on the thirty-first day of October, in any year while this Order is in operation be moved out of the Scheduled Area defined in the First Schedule hereto, unless the sheep are accompanied by a licence authorising such

movement granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the county of Devon.

(2.) Unless the Inspector is satisfied—

- (a) by the production of a declaration signed by the owner of the sheep, or his agent authorised in writing for the purpose, that the sheep to be moved have not been on any Scheduled Common during the said period; or
- (b) that the sheep are to be moved direct to a slaughterhouse;
- a licence for movement under this Article shall, subject as hereinafter provided, be granted only for sheep in respect of which the Inspector is satisfied that they have within twenty-eight days before the licence is granted been dipped twice in the mode prescribed by this Order, and have since the second dipping been kept separate from other sheep not so dipped.
- (3.) Sheep moved with a licence granted under this Article to a slaughterhouse shall after their arrival thereat be there detained until they are slaughtered.
- (4.) A copy of a licence under this Article authorising movement of sheep to a slaughterhouse shall be sent by the Inspector granting the same to the Local Authority of the District in which the slaughterhouse is situate.

Movement to Dipping Places.

5. In any case in which the dipping of sheep on any Scheduled Common required as a condition precedent to the granting of a licence under the preceding Article, is, in the opinion of an Inspector of the Local Authority of the District, impracticable, a licence authorising movement of the sheep may be granted without the sheep being previously dipped, but subject to the condition, which shall be specified in the licence, that during the movement to and from the premises specified in the licence and until they have been dipped twice in the mode prescribed by this Order, the sheep shall be kept separate from all other sheep.

Provision for Movement of Tack Sheep.

6. The provisions of this Order which require the double dipping of sheep as a condition attaching to the granting of a licence authorising movement into or out of the Scheduled Area described in the First Schedule hereto shall apply without the requirement of double dipping in the case of sheep in respect of which the Inspector granting the licence is satisfied that they have already been twice double-dipped during the current year in order to comply with such provisions.

Double Dipping of Sheep in Dartmoor District during period from 1st to 24th July.

- 7.—(1.) All sheep (except those exempted by this Article) which are in the Scheduled Area defined in the First Schedule hereto at any time during the period commencing on the first day of July, in any year while this Order is in operation, and terminating on the twenty-fourth day of that month, shall be caused to be dipped twice during that period by the owner or person in charge thereof in the mode prescribed by this Order.
- (2.) The provisions of this Article shall not apply to the following sheep:—
 - (i.) Sheep moved by railway through the said Area;

(ii.) Sheep slaughtered in the said Area before the twenty-fifth day of July;

(iii.) Sheep which, in the opinion of the Local Authority, it is impracticable or inexpedient to dip in accordance with the requirements of this Article, on account of their being intended for exhibition or of any other special circumstances, and which are accordingly exempted by an exemption signed by the Clerk of the Local Authority. The exemption may be granted subject to conditions as to subsequent dipping or otherwise. A copy of every exemption shall be in the Form A set forth in the Second Schedule to the Sheep Dipping (England and South Wales) Order of 1915 (hereinafter referred to as "the principal Order"), or to the like effect;

(iv.) Sheep which have already been dipped twice during the current year under and in accordance with the provisions of Articles 1, 2, 3 or 4 of this Order;

(v.) Sheep which during the period specified in this Article have been dipped twice under and in accordance with the provisions of an Order of the Board or of any Regulations made by a Local Authority under any such Order.

(3.) The dipping prescribed by this Article shall be instead of the dipping required under

Article 3 of the principal Order.

(4.) If a sheep is not dipped as required by this Article the owner and person in charge of the sheep on the twenty-fourth day of July shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

Notice to Local Authority of Time and Place of Intended Dipping and Returns of Dippings.

- 8.—(1.) For the purpose of enabling the Local Authority to be represented at the dipping of sheep under Article 7 of this Order whenever they think such a course desirable, the owner or person in charge of any sheep required to be dipped thereunder shall give such written notice of his intention to dip his sheep as is hereinafter provided:—
 - (i.) The notice shall be delivered, or sent by post, to such persons as the Local Authority of the District may appoint to receive such notices in respect of sheep in their District.
 - (ii.) The notice shall be sent or delivered at such time as to be received by the appointed person three clear days, at least, before the intended time of dipping; unless a shorter notice is authorised by the Local Authority.

(iii.) The notice shall state the time and place of the intended dipping, and the approximate number of sheep intended to be dipped.

(2.) If from any cause the dipping of the sheep on the date specified in a notice becomes impracticable, no further notice shall be required if the sheep are dipped as soon after such date as is practicable.

(3.) A return in the Form B set forth in the Second Schedule to the principal Order, or to the like effect, shall be sent immediately after each dipping by the owner or person in charge of the sheep dipped to the person appointed to receive such returns by the Local Authority

of the District in which the sheep are dipped. except in any case in which an Inspector or other officer of the Local Authority is present at the dipping.

Mode of Dipping Prescribed.

9. Where under this Order it is provided that sheep are to be dipped twice, they shall be dipped by a thorough immersion in a sheep-dip approved by the Board for sheep-scab or purporting to be so approved, with an interval of not less than seven nor more than fourteen days between the dippings.

Licences.

10. A licence under this Order shall be in force for eight days, inclusive of the day of issue, and shall be in the form set forth in the Second Schedule to this Order or to the like effect.

Provision for Movement through Area by Railway.

11. For the purposes of this Order, sheep shall not be deemed to be moved out of, or into the Scheduled Area defined in the First Schedule hereto, or on to any moor, common, or unenclosed place, in any case where they are moved through such Area, moor, common, or unenclosed place by railway from a place outside the same to another place outside the same without unnecessary delay and without the sheep being untrucked within the Area, moor, common, or unenclosed place.

Production of Licences; Names and Addresses.

- 12.—(1.) Any person in charge of a sheep being moved, where under this Order a licence is necessary, shall, on demand of a Justice, or of a constable, or of an Inspector or other officer of the Board or of a Local Authority, produce and show to him the licence, if any, authorising the movement, and shall allow it to be read and a copy of or extract from it to be taken by the person to whom it is produced.
- (2.) Any person so in charge shall, on demand as aforesaid, give his name and address to the Justice, or constable, or Inspector or other officer.

Local Authority to enforce Order.

13. The provisions of this Order shall be executed and enforced by the Local Authority.

Offences.

- 14.—(1.) If a sheep is moved in contravention of this Order, or of a licence granted thereunder, the owner of the sheep, and the person in charge thereof, and the person causing, directing, or permitting the movement, and the person moving or conveying the sheep, and the consignee or other person receiving or keeping it knowing it to have been moved in contravention as aforesaid, and the occupier of the place from which the sheep is moved, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.
- (2.) If a person in charge of a sheep being moved, where under this Order a licence is necessary, on demand made under this Order, fails to give his true name and address, or gives a false name or address, he shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

(3.) If a sheep is not dipped or isolated as required by this Order, the owner of the sheep, and the person in charge thereof, and the occupier of the place where the sheep is at the time of default, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

Revocation.

15. The Sheep Dipping (Devon) Order of 1917 is hereby revoked.

Short Title.

16. This Order may be cited as the Sheep-Dipping (Devon) Order of 1918.


