PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

HEREAS there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the 17th day of June, 1918, in the words following, viz.:—

"Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted, inter alia, that all pay, pensions, or other allowances in the nature thereof, payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman, or Marine therein, shall be paid in such manner, and subject to such restrictions, conditions, and provisions, as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

"And whereas by Your Majesty's Order in Council of the 20th October, 1898, sanction was given for the payment of an Allowance of sixpence per diem to properly qualified Royal Marine Gunnery Instructors when employed afloat for the instruction of Royal Marine

Training Classes:

"And whereas we consider it desirable that the conditions of payment of this Allowance should be assimilated to those governing the payment of Non-substantive Pay to Seamen Cuppers Instructors:

Gunnery Instructors:

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council, to sanction with effect from the 26th day of April, 1918, the payment at our discretion of the Non-substantive Pay of 6d. per diem continuously to such qualified Royal Marine Gunnery Instructors, and not only when actually employed on the duties affoat.

"The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in this proposal."

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed.

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the 33rd and 34th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 39, and of the Acts therein mentioned, that is to say, the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 113, the Act of the 4th and 5th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 39, and the Act of the 31st and 32nd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 114, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme, bearing date the 30th day of May, 1918, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 33rd and 34th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 39, and of the Acts therein mentioned, that is to say, the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 113, the Act of the 4th and 5th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 39, and the Act of the 31st and 32nd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 114, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for effecting a transfer of the ownership of a part or share of the Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the Church and Cure (hereinafter called 'the said Benefice') of Pickworth with Walcot, in the County of Lincoln, and in the Diocese of Lincoln:

"Whereas two one-third parts or shares of and in the Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Pickworth with Walcot, that is to say, every turn or right of nomination or presentation to the said Benefice which shall occur or arise on a vacancy of such Benefice happening after the date hereof for ever (with the exception of the third turn or right of nomination or presentation, and of every third succeeding turn or right of nomination or presentation thereafter) are vested for an estate in fee simple, inpossession, free from incumbrances, in Stephen Robert Andrews, of Bourne, in the County of Lincoln, Solicitor, as Trustee for sale under the Will of the late Reverend John Nicholas Andrews, of Pickworth, in the said County of Lincoln, bearing date the 20th day of May, 1897, and under the said Will Elizabeth Charlotte Andrews, the only surviving daughter of the said John Nicholas Andrews, was at the date of his death entitled to the whole of the proceeds of the sale of the said two one-third parts or shares of and in the said Advowson:

"And whereas the said Elizabeth Charlotte Andrews died on the 19th day of July, 1916, having by her Will dated the 9th day of July, 1916, bequeathed the whole of her interest in the Advowson of the said Benefice to the Dean and Chapter of the Cathedral Church of Lincoln:

"And whereas the said Dean and Chapter of Lincoln are desirous that the said share and interest in the Patronage of the said Benefice of Pickworth with Walcot should not be sold, but should be transferred to them the said Dean and Chapter of Lincoln, and the said Stephen Robert Andrews, at the request of the said Dean and Chapter of Lincoln, is willing

that the said share and interest in the said Patronage should be so transferred to the said Dean and Chapter of Lincoln:

"And whereas the said Dean and Chapter of Lincoln, in token of their willingness to accept such transfer, have executed this Scheme as hereinafter mentioned:

"And whereas the Right Reverend Edward Lee, now Bishop of Lincoln, is consenting to the transfer of Patronage which is hereinafter recommended and proposed, and in token of such his consent, which by the Acts in the hereinbefore mentioned Act recited, or by some or one of them, is made necessary, he, the said Edward Lee, Bishop of Lincoln, has executed this Scheme as hereinafter mentioned:

"And whereas the transfer of the Patronage of the said Benefice of Pickworth with Walcot, which is hereinbefore mentioned, and hereinafter recommended and proposed, will, in our opinion, tend to make better provision for the Cure of Souls in the Parishes in or in respect of which the right of Patronage or Advowson, so recommended and proposed to be transferred as aforesaid, arises or exists, that is to say, in the Parishes of Pickworth and Walcot:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the said Stephen Robert Andrews (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this Scheme) and with the consent of the said Dean and Chapter of Lincoln (in testimony whereof they have caused their Common or Capitular Seal to be affixed to this Scheme) and with the consent of the said Edward Lee, Bishop of Lincoln, (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme, and sealed the same with his Episcopal Seal), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly recommend and propose that upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme, and without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order, the two one-third parts or shares of and in the Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Pickworth with Walcot, that is to say, every turn or right of nomination or presentation to the said Benefice which shall occur or arise on a vacancy of such Benefice happening after the date hereof for ever (with the exception of the third turn or right of nomination or presentation, and of every third succeeding turn or right of nomination or presentation thereafter) which said two one-third parts or shares of and in the said Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage are now vested in him, the said Stephen Robert Andrews, as aforesaid, shall be transferred to the said Dean and Chapter of Lincoln, and their Successors, and shall thereupon and thenceforth become and be absolutely vested in, and shall and may from time to time be exercised by, the said Dean and Chapter of Lincoln,

and their Successors for ever.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any further or other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts, or of any of them, or of any other Act of Parliament."

And whereas the said Scheme has been

approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant

to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Lincoln.

WHEREAS the Local Government Board, after giving to the Incumbent and the Churchwardens of the Parish of Llanarth, in the County of Cardigan, 10 days' previous Notice of their intention in that behalf, have, under the provisions of the Burial Act, 1853, as amended by the Burial Act, 1900, made a Representation to His Majesty in Council that, for the protection of the public health, the opening of any new Burial Ground in the Civil Parish of Llanarth aforesaid, save with the previous approval of the Local Government Board, should be prohibited, and that Burials should be discontinued therein, as follows, viz.:—

Leanarth.—Forthwith and entirely in the Parish Church of St. David, Llanarth, in the County of Cardigan, and in the Churchyard attached thereto; Provided that in any earthen grave now existing in the said Churchyard the burial may be allowed of the body of any member of the family of the person or persons heretofore buried in such grave, subject to the condition that no part of the coffin containing the body shall be at a depth less than 3 feet below the level of the surface of the ground adjoining the grave.

Now, therefore, His Majesty in Council is pleased hereby to give Notice of such Representation, and to order that the same be taken into consideration by a Committee of the Privy Council on the 6th day of August next.

And His Majesty is further pleased to direct that this Order be forthwith published in the London Gazette, and that copies thereof be affixed on the doors of the Churches or Chapels of, or on some conspicuous places within, the Parish affected by such Representation one month before the said 6th day of August.

WHEREAS His Majesty has been pleased, in exercise of the power in that behalf conferred on Him by Section one, subsection one, of the Trading with the Enemy (Extension of Powers) Act, 1915, by divers Proclamations, and in particular by a Proclama-

tion dated the 23rd day of May, 1916, and amended on the 16th day of January, 1918, entitled "The Trading with the Enemy (Statutory List) Proclamation," to prohibit all persons or bodies of persons, incorporated or unincorporated, resident, carrying on business, or being in the United Kingdom from trading with any of the persons or bodies of persons mentioned in the List contained in the last mentioned Proclamation, such List being therein referred to as the Statutory List:

And whereas by Section one, sub-section two, of the said Act, it is provided that any List of persons and bodies of persons, incorporated or unincorporated, with whom such trading is prohibited by a Proclamation under the said Act may be varied or added to by an Order made by the Lords of the Council on the recommendation of a Secretary of State:

And whereas the Statutory List contained in the last mentioned Proclamation has been varied and added to by subsequent Orders of Council:

And whereas there was this day read at the Board a recommendation from the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs to the effect that the Statutory List should be further varied and added to as set forth in the Schedule hereto.

Now, therefore, Their Lordships, having taken the said recommendation into consideration, are pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered,

That the Statutory List be varied and added to as set forth in the Schedule hereto.

Whereof the Right Honourable Arthur James Balfour, one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, the Controller of the Foreign Trade Department, and all other persons whom it may concern, are to take notice and govern themselves accordingly.

Note (1).—All persons or firms resident, carrying on business or being in the United Kingdom are prohibited from having, with any person or firm mentioned in this List, or in any List issued under the Trading with the Enemy (Statutory List) Proclamation, any dealings other than such as are expressly authorised by paragraph 5 of the Proclamation. A List (The Consolidated List, No. 56A) consolidating all previous Lists, up to and including that of the 31st May, 1918, is in press and will shortly be published. This consolidated List, together with the List herewith annexed, contains all the names which up to this date are included in the Statutory List.

Additions to and variations in these Lists will be published at intervals approximately of two weeks.

The Lists are published in the London Gazette and reproduced in the Board of Trade Journal, and separate copies of all Lists may be obtained at a small cost from the Superintendent of Publications, His Majesty's Stationery Office, Imperial House, Kingsway, W.C.

Note (2).—Where a person or firm mentioned in the List has more than one address in the country, or group of countries under which the name of the person or firm appears, all dealings in that country, or in any country in the group, with such person or firm are prohibited, even in cases where one only of the

addresses or one only of the countries is specifically mentioned.

Note (3).—Trading is prohibited under the Trading with the Enemy. Proclamations of 25th June, and 10th November, 1915, with any person or firm of enemy nationality resident or carrying on business in China, Siam, Persia, Morocco, Liberia or Portuguese East Africa. Persons or firms in the United Kingdom are therefore prohibited from trading with any person or firm of enemy nationality in any of those countries, even though such person or firm is not mentioned by name in the Statutory List.

Note (4).—In order to minimise as far as possible any inconvenience which may be caused to British traders by the dislocation of export trade owing to the inclusion in the Statutory List of a former connection, the Foreign Trade Department is collecting and classifying the names of non-enemy firms who may be able to act as substitutes for firms mentioned in the Statutory List. A considerable amount of information is already available at the Foreign Trade Department, and it is in many cases possible to suggest the names of satisfactory substitutes for individual firms on the Lists, without the necessity of referring the matter abroad. The Department is, however, prepared on application to enquire of His Majesty's Representatives abroad for the names of suitable substitutes. When the applicant wishes this done by telegraph he is required to undertake to pay the cost of telegraphic correspondence. It would greatly facilitate the work of the Foreign Trade Department if applicants in making enquiries would specify the particular trade or trades for which substitutes are required. General enquiries for new connections abroad should be addressed to The Comptroller General, Department of Overseas Trade (Development and Intelligence), 73, Basinghall Street, London,

Note (5).—The Statutory List for each country is telegraphed, on the day of issue, to His Majesty's Representative in that country, who is instructed to notify accordingly British Consular Officers, to whom persons abroad should apply for information as to names on the List. Persons and firms in the United Kingdom with agencies or branches abroad would, however, be well advised to furnish such agencies or branches with issues of the List as they appear. The names on the Lists for all countries in Central or South America are also notified to His Majesty's Ambassador at Washington, who transmits them to H.M. Consul-General at New York and to other centres in the United States likely to be interested.

Note (6).—It is not unusual for firms in Holland and the Netherland East Indies to be registered under the names commencing with descriptive terms such as "Handel Maatschappy" (Trading Company) or "Naamlooze Venootschap" (Limited Liability Company). In such cases it has been found more convenient to publish the firm under its proper name, followed by the general descriptive term "Handel Maatschappy" or "Naamlooze Venootschap" (N.V.), as in the case of an English company. For instance Handel Maatschappy van den Berg & Company, and Naamlooze Venootschap de Komeet v/h Dumonceau Frees will be found under "Berg" and "Komeet" respectively, and not under "Handel" or "Naamlooze."

The following Statutes made by the University of Cambridge, on the 22nd day of June, 1918, have been submitted for the approval of His Majesty in Council, and Notice of their having been so submitted is published in accordance with the provisions of "The Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1877 '':-

STATUTES to alter and amend the Statutes in relation to the University of Cambridge made under "The Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1877 " (40 and 41 Victoria, Chapter 28), which amending Statutes are now submitted for the approval of His Majesty the King in Council.

We, the Chancellor, Masters and Scholars of the University of Cambridge, in pursuance of the power given to us by the 53rd Section of the said Act, do hereby alter the Statutes made under the said Act in relation to our said University in manner following:

STATUTE A. CHAPTER I.

Terms.

By repealing the first Paragraph of this Chapter and substituting therefor the following Paragraph:-

"There shall be three terms in the year, called respectively the Michaelmas Term, the Lent Term, and the Easter Term. The University shall have power to determine by Grace the days on which each term shall begin and end, provided that the three terms shall together include Two hundred and twenty-seven days at least. If Easter fall within term the University libraries, laboratories and museums shall be closed, and lectures shall not be given on Good Friday."

STATUTE A. CHAPTER IV.

Elections.

By adding to the third Paragraph of Section 4, "Election of Proctors," the following proviso:-

" Provided always that for any election of a Proctor which shall take place during the present War, or within two years after its termination, the Head of the College nominating any person for the office shall not be required to present such certificate as here-inbefore mentioned that the person nominated has resided in the University during the last two years for the greater part of each of three terms at least."

10a. During the continuance of the present war and thereafter until such date as the Lord Chancellor shall appoint the total in any Bill of Costs of the fees prescribed by this Order (as distinct from payments) shall in respect of business done in any cause or matter in the Supreme Court after the 31st day of December, 1917, be increased by 20 per centum, and such increase shall be allowed upon any taxation of costs in respect of any such business as well between Party and Party as between Solicitor and Client and in taxations under or pursuant to the Solicitors Act, 1843.

Provided that this Rule shall not apply to the remuneration prescribed by the Solicitors' Remuneration Act, 1881, and that it shall not affect the power to direct payment of a sum in lieu of costs under Order 65, rule 23, or the power to allow a fixed sum for costs under Order 65, rule 27 (38) or a gross sum under Order 65, rule 27 (38a).

Provided also that this Rule shall not apply to Bills of Costs which have at the date on which this Rule comes into operation already been delivered to the client sought to be charged therewith or to the person chargeable therewith or liable therefor or to bills then already taxed and certified or allowed.

The increase hereby authorised shall not affect the question whether a Bill of Costs when taxed is or is not less by one-sixth part than the bill delivered, sent, or left.

- (3) Any shipping document from a shipping company or business firm, provided that such document
 - a) either relates to the cargo or charter of the vessel in which it is conveyed, or contains information pertaining to the shipping business of the company or firm to which the vessel belongs or by which it is chartered of such a kind that its conveyance abroad, and delivery to the company's or firm's representative, is indispensable to the proper conduct of such business;

(b) is placed for conveyance in the ship's

box; and
(c) is handed over on demand in an open cover for inspection to any competent naval or military authority or to any person authorised by him, or to any Aliens Officer or Officer of Police, unless it can be shown that it has already been examined and passed by an Officer of the Postal Censorship.

ORDER.

GAS WORKS.

The Minister of Munitions, in exercise of the powers conferred upon him by regulation 8g of the Defence of the Realm Regulations, and of all other powers enabling him, hereby orders as follows:—

- 1. This Order shall apply to all Gas Works throughout the United Kingdom, excepting only Gas Works which possess coal gas plants only and have no plant installed for scrubbing or washing their gas either with oil or with tar.
- 2. As on and from the 1st July, 1918, the manufacture and production of gas in all gas works to which this Order applies shall becarried out in accordance with the general regulations set out in the schedule hereto, save and except only if and so far as such general regulations may in the case of any particular Gas Works be varied or superseded by any special directions or regulations given or madefrom time to time with regard to such Gas Works by or under the authority of the Minister of Munitions.
- 3. This Order may be cited as the "Gas Works (Ministry of Munitions) Order, 1918," and the regulations set out in the schedule hereto as the "Gas Works (Ministry of Munitions) General Regulations, 1918."

Note.—All applications with reference to this Order or under or with reference to the General Regulations set out in the schedule hereto should be addressed to the Ministry of Munitions, Department of Explosives Supply, Storey's Gate, S.W. 1, and marked "E. G. S."

THE SCHEDULE.

General Regulations.

- 1. Gas Works which have coal gas plants only shall work such plants so as to produce gas of a calorific power of as nearly as possible 500 B.Th.U. gross, but not in any event less than that calorific value, before scrubbing as mentioned in regulation 3 below.
- 2. Gas Works which have both coal gas and water gas plants shall work such plants so as to produce a gas of the calorific value specified in regulation 1 above. Gas of the required calorific value may be produced either by working the coal gas plant alone so as to produce a gas which (before scrubbing in the case of works having scrubbing facilities) is of the required calorific value, or by working the coal gas plant so as to produce gas of a higher calorific value, and subsequently mixing with the same such a quantity of uncarburetted water gas as, apart from any reduction in the calorific value of the coal gas produced by scrubbing, would produce a mixed gas of the required calorific value.
- 3. All Gas Works which have facilities for scrubbing their coal gas shall scrub the whole of the coal gas produced at such works to the fullest possible extent for the extraction of ammonia, toluol and benzol. Scrubbing for toluol and benzol shall be effected with oil, at works where there is a benzol recovery plant, and, at other works, with tar.
- 4. If at any time it is impossible for any Gas Works to supply the full demands of its consumers for gas, whilst complying with the above regulations, notwithstanding that it is working its coal gas plant to its full capacity, then
 - (a) If such gas works has a water gas plant, the balance of its consumers' requirements shall be made by an admixture or further admixture of uncarburetted water gas, but so that the calorific value of the mixed gas, as actually delivered to its consumers, shall be maintained as high as possible, with a minimum, under all circumstances, of 450 B.Th.U. gross. Should this be impossible without carburetting the water gas, the water gas shall be carburetted with gas oil so as to bring the mixed gas up to the minimum calorific value specified above, and such gas works shall take forthwith all possible steps for obtaining the gas oil required for the purpose.
 - (b) If such gas works has no water gas plant, it must notify the Minister of Munitions forthwith of its inability to supply its consumers' full demands, reporting in detail all the circumstances which render it impossible for it to do so, and must comply with any instructions or directions which may be given by or under the authority of the Minister of Munitions after consultation with the Board of Trade as to the steps to be taken by it in the circumstances.
- 5. Excepting only as provided in regulation 4 (a) above no gas works shall in any circumstances use any gas oil for carburetting its water gas (whether before or after admixture

with its coal gas) without the previous authority in writing of the Minister of Munitions or his duly authorised representative.

ADMIRALTY NOTICE TO MARINERS. No. 764 of the year 1918. ENGLAND, EAST COAST.

River Humber and Approaches—Pilotage, Traffic and Fishing Regulations.

Former Notice.-No. 719 of 1918; hereby cancelled.

Mariners are hereby warned that, under the Defence of the Realm (Consolidation) Regulations, 1914, the following Regulations have been made by the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, and are now in force :-

- 1. That portion of the Humber which lies between two straight lines, drawn from shore to shore, as follows:—(1) a line drawn 225° (S. 61° W. Mag.) through Spurn lighthouse, (2) drawn 344° (North Mag.) from the east side of Barrow haven, will be referred to as the "port" in these regulations.
- 2. Shipowners and local agents are warned that their vessels are to conform to the following regulations:
- (I.) Except under exceptional circumstances merchant vessels will be free to enter or leave the port during the hours of Official day...
- (II.) Before entering the port merchant vessels must receive permission and the necessary instructions from the Examination steamer, and before leaving they must obtain permission through the Collector of Customs at Hull, Grimsby, or Goole, as the case may be.
- (III.) Shipowners and local agents advised to time the arrival of their vessels at the port for daylight.
- (IV.) Vessels desiring to enter the port from seaward are to close the Examination steamer. In the event of the Examination steamer being off her station they are to proceed to the Southern Examination anchorage (except during strong northerly or easterly winds, when they shall proceed to the Northern Examination anchorage) and there anchor.
- V.) The Examination steamer will be met midway between Bull light-vessel and Chequer Shoal buoy.

The Examination steamer will be distinguished by the following means:-

By Day.—A white ensign, and at the foremast head the special flag mentioned in Part II. of Admiralty Notice to Mariners No. 170 of 1918. When the port is closed 3 red balls will be hoisted in addition to the special flag.

By Night.—Three lights vertically, 3 feet apart, conspicuously displayed at the end of a yard so as to show an unbroken light round the horizon. When the port is closed these lights will be red, when it is open they will be white.

Note.—These lights are in addition to the ordinary navigation lights.

(VI.) There are two Examination anchorages. The northern is to be used in strong northerly and easterly winds. The southern is to be used under all other conditions.

The Northern Examination anchorage comprises those portions of Hawke road and Middle shoal included between the intersection of the following lines of bearing:

- (1) Skeffling church, 18° (N. 34° E. Mag.). (2) ,, ,, 4° (N. 20° E. Mag.).
- (3) Spurn lighthouse, 120° (S. 44° E. Mag.).

(4) Extreme of Spurn point, 115° (S. 49° E.Mag.).

The Southern Examination anchorage comprises the area bounded as follows:-

- (1) On the north by the Bull sand.
- (2) On the south by the three-fathom contour line northward of Tetney haven.
- (3) On the east by the line joining the Bull light-vessel and entrance to Tetney haven.
- (4) On the west by a line parallel to and 7cables from the eastern limit (3).

Note.—When the Southern Examination anchorage is full of shipping further arrivals should anchor eastward of and as near to it as possible.

Emergency Anchorage.—This comprises the area bounded as follows:-

- a) On the North by the Middle shoal.
- (b) On the South by the Bull sand.
- (c) On the East by the bearing Cleethorpes Sewer Outfall beacon, 240° (S. 76° W. Mag.). (d) On the West by the bearing Skeffling
- church, 4° (N. 20° E. Mag.).
- 3. All pilotage certificates granted to masters and mates for the whole or any part of the Humber Pilotage district are suspended, and further all vessels (irrespective of draught, size, or nationality, but with the exception of those provided for in paragraph 4) bound to or from any place on the Humber must be conducted by licensed pilots over the whole or any part of the waters between Hull and the Outer Pilotage station of the Humber Pilotage district, which until further notice will be situated in the neighbourhood of the Bull light-vessel.
- 4. In the case of lighter inter-dock traffic and of small British vessels engaged in local traffic above Immingham, pilotage by licensed pilots is not compulsory.
- 5. During the hours of official night, and during fog with visibility of less than half-amile, no traffic is permitted to move on the Humber below Paull point; also when these conditions prevail no vessel shall approach within a radius of five miles from Humber light-vessel.
- 6. Every vessel shall endeavour to approach the Humber in sufficient time to enable such vessel to obtain a pilot and arrive at her destination, or at a position in which she is permitted to anchor, before the commencement of official night, but, should occasion arise when a vessel is delayed through unforseen or unpreventable circumstances from arriving in time, she may approach the Examination steamer, from whom she will receive directions as to The anchoring until the end of official night. Examination steamer will be found in the neighbourhood of the Bull light-vessel after the commencement of official night. event of an incoming vessel being unable immediately to find the Examination steamer in these circumstances, she is to remain in the vicinity of the Bull light-vessel, but shall not cross the line drawn 225° (S. 61° W. Mag.) through Spurn lighthouse without permission. Outward bound vessels shall not pass Hawkins point later than 45 minutes before the commencement of official night.
- 7. Vessels when leaving the Humber must proceed as directed by the Shipping Intelligence Officer. Should it be necessary to wait for the weather to moderate or clear, they must remain at an authorised anchorage.

The pilot lobbies will be notified when the existence of fog outside the river is known.

8. All vessels proceeding into or out of the Humber must be navigated by way of Hawke and Sunk roads passing to the northward of the Bull light-vessel, except those outward-bound from Grimsby, which may cross the Middle shoal passing at once into the channel north of the Middle.

Note.—The five-fathom channel through the Sunk and Hawke roads is very narrow at the western entrance and also at a point north of the Middle light-vessel; deep-draught vessels steaming against the tide when approaching the buoys marking these portions of the channel should endeavour to avoid passing others between them by easing engines to allow ships with the tide under them to get through Smaller vessels outward-bound should pass close to the southward of the buoys marking the south side, and those inward-bound close to the northward of the buoys marking the north side, of the narrow portions of the channel, provided always that their draught of water and the state of the tide will admit.

- 9. Sailing vessels of 50 tons register and upwards must be towed through the Boom Defence gateways. Should tugs not be available, sailing vessels entering the Humber may anchor temporarily north-westward of the No. 2 Lower Middle light-float at a distance of not more than 1½ miles from it, but they must not bring the before-mentioned light-float to bear to the southward of 128° (S. 36° E. Mag.).
- 10. All vessels entering or leaving Grimsby docks must pass to the southward of the No. 4 Lower Burcom B.W.V.S. buoy, except those making use of the channel southward of the Burcom shoal (hereinafter called the Burcom channel), which are exempted from this condition, but no vessel may cross the Burcom shoal between the No. 5 Middle Burcom and No. 4 Lower Burcom B.W.V.S. buoys. Vessels using the Burcom channel must pass into and out of its western end to the eastward of No. 6 Upper Burcom B.W.V.S. buoy, and its eastern end by a passage of 220 feet wide, each side of which is marked by a dolphin surmounted by a black triangle supported on a white pole. No vessel is permitted to tow more than two craft at one time through this passage.

Vessels making use of this passage are cautioned to keep well in the middle of the opening and are subject to the following regu-

lations:---

- (1.) Vessels navigating against the tide must in all cases give way to those navigating with the tide.
- (2.) No vessel must approach the defences in this part of the river nearer than a quarter of a mile except to pass through the before-mentioned passage or to enter or leave the docks or old outfall at Grimsby.

old outfall at Grimsby.

(3.) No vessel may tow more vessels at one time than she can safely navigate through the passage, and under no circumstances is the tow

to comprise more than two craft.

(4.) Distant signals will be shown from the flagstaff on the West Pier at the Grimsby Dock entrance as follows:—

- (a) Two black balls will denote that the passage is open.
- (b) Three black balls will denote that the passage is closed.
- (c) No signal being hoisted denotes that traffic is suspended.

When signal (b) three black balls is hoiste'l, no vessel may approach the passage, and when traffic is suspended no vessels, other than H.M. Ships on special duty, may use the passage.

- 11. Prohibited areas:-
- (I.) Anchorage is prohibited for all vessels between the following lines:—
 - (a) Joining Stone Creek Coast Guard flagstaff and the eastern extremity of the eastern jetty at Immingham.
 - (b) Joining the riverward beacon of the two centre measured mile beacons on Sunk island and the northernmost of two clumps shown southward of Stallingborough on Admiralty Chart No. 109. The latter line passes through the position of No. 6 Upper Burcom buoy.
- (II.) No merchant vessel shall anchor (except when granted special permission) between the before-mentioned prohibited anchorage area (I.) and the line of transit of the eastern measured mile beacons on Sunk island produced to the Lincolnshire shore or (except as provided for in paragraph 9) to the northward of the line of the Killingholme leading lights or within 1½ cables of any of the Admiralty mooring buoys.
- (III.) Anchorage is prohibited between the following lines:—
 - (a) Joining New Clee railway station and Patrington church.
 - (b) Joining Middle light-vessel and No. 4 Lower Burcom B.W.V.S. buoy, extending to both banks of the Humber.
- (IV.) Anchorage is prohibited to merchant vessels to the southward of a line joining No. 4 Lower Burcom B.W.V.S. buoy and Spurn lighthouse, or to the eastward of a line joining Cleethorpes pier pavilion and Skeffling church, except so far as the Examination anchorages are concerned.
- (V.) No vessel of any description may anchor on the south side of the Bull sand between the western limit of the Southern Examination anchorage described in paragraph 2 of this notice and the line of bearing Cleethorpes Sewer outfall beacon (on which a red light is exhibited in peace time) in a direction 240° (S. 76° W. Mag.), nor on the north side of the Bull sand between the before-mentioned line of bearing of Cleethorpes Sewer outfall and a line joining Spurn lighthouse and the Bull light-vessel produced to the Bull sand; nor within 3 cables of the No. 4 Lower Burcom B.W.V.S. buoy.
- (VI.) No merchant vessel of any description may enter, pass through or remain in the area bounded as follows, without special permission:—
 - (1) On the North by the bearing Skitter Haven No. 8 B.W.V.S. buoy, 55 (N. 71° E. Mag.).

(2) On the South by the bearing Killing-holme Oil Fuel jetty, 235° (S. 71° W. Mag.),
(3) On the East by a line joining the

- (3) On the East by a line joining the before-mentioned No. 8 buoy and Killing-holme No. 7 light-float.

 (4) On the West by the Lincolnshire
- (4) On the West by the Lincolnshire River bank.
- 12. No neutral vessel may lie alongside any of the piers or jetties in the Humber at night without special permission.
- 13. No merchant vessels or boats, etc., will be allowed to approach within a quarter of a

mile of any defence work (except to pass through the Boom gateways or to enter or leave the old outfall or docks at Grimsby) or to go alongside any Government ship, vessel, lighter, or any other Government craft, or any Government establishment, without special permission. All vessels proceeding up and down the Humber are to pass at a distance at least three cables from H.M. Ships, if the depth of water and circumstances of navigation permit.

- 14. All vessels employed in laying moorings, raising wrecks, etc., must be passed at slow speed, propelling engines being eased at least 300 yards before reaching such vessels and so continued for 150 yards after passing them. While the said mooring or wreck raising craft are at work they will each fly a red flag.
- 15. Anchor lights above Immingham and in the Northern Examination Anchorage are to be reduced in power and screened as prescribed in Admiralty Notice to Mariners No. 689 of 1918.

Below Immingham (Northern Examination Anchorage excepted) they are to be screened as previously directed and further reduced in brilliancy so as to be invisible at any greater distance than half-a-mile.

This order will not absolve the Masters of vessels at anchor from keeping a sharp look-out and giving warning on the approach of any oraft under way.

Anchor lights authorised by these orders are never on any account to be extinguished; the order "Out Lights" will not apply to them.

Bow and masthead steaming lights are to be as prescribed in Admiralty Notice to Mariners No. 689 of 1918.

Other lights are to be as prescribed in Admiralty Notice to Mariners Notice No. 689 of 1918, and this order applies also to vessels in dock or alongside quays and jetties. Notwithstanding anything in these orders, dredgers may be permitted to work at Hull and Immingham at night provided all their lights are extinguished within half-an-hour of issue of the general order "Out Lights."

The above orders apply to vessels of every description, other than H.M. ships. The latter should, however, comply so far as the visibility of anchor lights eastward of Immingham is concerned.

- 16. No vessel is permitted to tow more than three craft at one time through a gateway of the Boom defence or more than two through the passage in the Burcom channel described in paragraph 10. Owners of tugs may apply to the Humber Conservancy Board for pilot licences for the masters of their vessels which will enable them to pilot their own vessels and river craft comprising their tow (in certain parts of the river). The number of craft towed will be restricted according to the power of the tug.
- 17. Humber Rule No. 18 is to be strictly enforced. No sound signals other than navigation signals authorised by the Regulations for preventing Collisions at Sea, and by Humber Rules Nos. 14 to 16 (inclusive) at all times of the day or night, and No. 17 during the day only, are on any account to be used by vessels in any part of the Humber, the Old Harbour at Hull, or within any of the docks at Hull, Immingham or Grimsby.
- 18. Owners of small vessels plying in the vicinity of the Humber are instructed not to paint their craft light grey, and are hereby

- directed to have any vessels so coloured repainted. They are warned that small vessels painted *grey* run a great risk of being fired upon in mistake for submarines. Vessels painted *black* run the least risk.
- 19. Fishing in the Humber.—No vessel is allowed to fish in the Humber below Hull without a permit from the Admiralty port officer; all fishing, shrimping, trawling, or whelking in this portion of the river in areas other than those for which permits are granted is prohibited.
- 20. Regulations affecting Pleasure Craft and Pleasure Fishing.—Pleasure boats of every description on the Humber must henceforth be provided with permits to be obtained from the Admiralty Port Officer; they may ply for hire at Cleethorpes only between the Eastern and Western Sewer Outfall Beacons, and must keep within a distance of one mile from the shore.

It being considered desirable to encourage bona fide efforts on the part of amateur fishermen to increase the national supplies of fish, pleasure boats will be granted fishing permits on application to the Admiralty Port Officer, the holding of which will remove the restriction as to the limits within which pleasure boats may ordinarily ply for hire, provided their object is to catch fish.

No able-bodied professional fishermen or boatmen between the ages of 18 and 60 may be employed on land or sea in connection with any boat for which a pleasure permit has been issued.

No registered fishing boat or mechanically propelled craft will be granted a pleasure permit except for the purpose of fishing, but when they cannot fish their owners may apply to the Admiralty Port Officer for special permission to ply for hire provided the foregoing paragraph having reference to the ages of the crews of craft to which pleasure permits have been issued is complied with.

Notwithstanding anything in these orders, rowing boats may pass along the shore at Cleethorpes, but they must keep within 400 yards of the High Water mark of Spring Tides.

- 21. Excursions by Water.—Excursions by water are limited to the River Humber above Hull, and Rivers Ouse and Trent. Excursion steamers will not be allowed to ply without a permit from the Admiralty port officer, Dock Offices, Immingham, and in no case are they to pass to the eastward of a line joining Victoria Dock entrance Hull, and the east beacon on Skitter Ness.
- 22. Patrol of Internal Waterways.—The internal waterways of the port will be policed by Naval patrol vessels and by the Humber Conservancy Board under the direction of the Naval authorities.

Captains and Masters of Merchant Vessels and persons in charge of barges or boats of any kind are hereby warned to observe any orders which may be given to them by the Naval Patrol vessels or the duly authorised officers of the Humber Conservancy Board.

23. All instructions given by Officers in command of H.M. ships, Patrol vessels or Examination steamers, or the duly authorised officers of the Humber Conservancy Board, are to be implicitly and promptly obeyed even should they conflict with these orders.

24. Masters of vessels are hereby warned that they cannot anchor off the coast, or pass to the westward of the meridian of long. 0° 9' E. between Kilnsea beacon and Withernsea during the hours of darkness without incurring great risk on account of occasional night firing practice from coastal batteries.

When gun-firing is taking place in the vicinity of the Humber masters of vessels should keep their crews under cover as much as possible,

25. Warning.—Warning is hereby given that vessels disobeying the above regulations will be liable to be fired on.

Variation.—16° W.

Note.—This Admiralty Notice to Mariners is a revision of the former Notice quoted above.

Caution.

CAUTION WHEN APPROACHING BRITISH PORTS.

PART I.

CLOSING OF PORTS.

Former Notice.—No. 170 of 1918; hereby cancelled.

(1) My Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, having taken into consideration the fact that it may be necessary to forbid all entrance to certain ports of the Empire, this is to give Notice that on approaching the shores of the United Kingdom, or any of the ports or localities of the British Empire, referred to in Part III of this Notice, a sharp look-out should be kept for the signals described in the following paragraph, and for the vessels mentioned in paragraph (5), Part II, of this Notice, and the distinguishing and other signals made by them. In the event of such signals being displayed, the port or locality should be approached with great caution, as it may be apprehended that obstructions may

- (2) If entrance to a port is prohibited, three red vertical lights by night, or three red vertical balls by day, will be exhibited in some conspicuous position, in or near to its approach, which signals will also be shown by the vessels indicated in paragraph (5), Part II., of this Notice.
- If these signals are displayed, vessels must approach the port with the greatest caution and implicitly obey all orders or signals given them by the Examination vessel or signal station.
- (3) At all the ports or localities at home or abroad referred to in Part III of this Notice, search-lights are occasionally exhibited for exercise.

Instructions have been given to avoid directing moveable search-lights during practice on to vessels under way, but mariners are warned that great care should be taken to keep a sharp look-out for the signals indicated in paragraph (2) above, when search-lights are observed to be working.


EXAMINATION SERVICE.

- (4) In certain circumstances it is also necessary to take special measures to examine vessels desiring to enter the ports or localities at home or abroad, referred to in Part III of this Notice.
- (5) In such case, vessels carrying the distinguishing flags or lights mentioned in paragraph (7) will be charged with the duty of examining ships which desire to enter the ports and of allotting positions in which they shall anchor. If Government vessels, or vessels belonging to the local port authority, are found patrolling in the offing, merchant vessels are advised to communicate with such vessels with a view to obtaining information as to the course on which they should approach the Port. Such communication will not be necessary in cases where the pilot on board has already received this information from the local authorities.
- (6) As the institution of the Examination Service at any port will never be publicly advertised, especial care should be taken in approaching the ports, by day or night, to keep a sharp look-out for any vessel carrying the flags or lights mentioned in paragraph (7), and to be ready to "bring to" at once when hailed by her or warned by the firing of a gun or sound rocket.

In entering by night any of the ports mentioned in Part III, serious delay and risk will be avoided if four efficient all round lamps, two red and two white, are kept available for use.

(7) By day the distinguishing flags of the Examination Steamer will be a special flag (white and red horizontal surrounded by a blue border) and a blue ensign.

Also, three red vertical balls if the port is closed.



By night the steamer will carry:—
(a) Three red vertical lights if the port is closed.

(b) Three white vertical lights if the port is open.

The above lights will be carried in addition to the ordinary navigation lights, and will show an unbroken light round the horizon.

- (8) Masters are warned that, when approaching a British port where the Examination Service is in force, they must have the distinguishing signal of their vessel ready to hoist immediately the Examination Steamer makes the signal.
- (9) Masters are warned that, before attempting to enter any of these ports when the Examination Service is in force, they must in their own interests strictly obey all instructions given to them by the Examination Steamer.

Whilst at anchor in the Examination Anchorage, Masters are warned that they must not lower any boats, communicate with the shore, work cables, move the ship, or allow anyone to leave the ship, without permission from the Examination Steamer (except to avoid accident).

- (10) In case of fog, Masters are enjoined to use the utmost care, and the Port should be approached with caution.
- (11) Merchant vessels when approaching ports are especially cautioned against making use of private signals of any description, either by day or night: the use of them will render a vessel liable to be fired on.
- (12) The pilots attached to the ports will be acquainted with the regulations to be followed.

SWEEPING OPERATIONS.

Notice is hereby given, that under the Defence of the Realm (Consolidation) Regulations, 1914, the following Regulations have been made by the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, and are now in force:—

H.M. Vessels are constantly engaged in sweeping operations off the coasts of the United Kingdom.

Whilst so engaged, they work in pairs connected by a wire hawser, and are consequently hampered to a very considerable extent in their manœuvring powers.

With a view to indicating the nature of the work on which these vessels are engaged, they will show the following signals:—

A black ball at the foremast head and a similar ball at the yardarm, or where it can best be seen, on that side on which it is dangerous for vessels to pass.

For the public safety, all other vessels, whether steamers or sailing craft, must keep out of the way of vessels flying this signal, and should especially remember that it is dangerous to pass between the vessels of a pair, as the vessels may have mines trailing in their sweeps and also on account of the danger caused to traffic if mine-sweepers have to slip their sweeps to get out of the way of vessels.

Caution.

Part IV of this Admiralty Notice to Mariners is issued under the provisions of the Defence of the Realm (Consolidation) Regulations, 1914, and failure to comply strictly with the directions contained in it will constitute an offence against those Regulations.

Any person found guilty of such an offence is liable to severe penalties both of imprisonment and fine.

- 1. Two light-vessels and four light-buoys have been established to mark a gateway in the Dover channel off Folkestone, as shown on the

Shipping is hereby warned that the only passage for traffic proceeding between the Downs and Dungeness is between the North-East and South-East gate light-buoys and then between North and South Folkestone gate light-vessels shown on the chart, and between North-West and South-West gate light-buoys and vice versa, and that Article 25 of the Collision Regulations must be complied with, that is to say, East-bound traffic must keep to the Southern side of the passage and West-bound traffic must keep to the Northern side. Ships disregarding this warning will do so at their own peril.
- 3. Caution.—Mariners are warnedexercise great caution when approaching the ships' passage between the Folkestone gate light-vessels, as the tidal streams may at times set obliquely across the passage.
