At the Council Chamber, *Whitehall*, the 12th day of *July*, 1918.

By the Lords of His Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council.

No. 59.

**W**HEREAS His Majesty has been pleased, in exercise of the power in that behalf conferred on Him by Section one, sub-section one, of the Trading with the Enemy (Extension of Powers) Act, 1915, by divers Proclamations, and in particular by a Proclamation dated the 23rd day of May, 1916, and amended on the 16th day of January, 1918, entitled "The Trading with the Enemy (Statutory List) Proclamation," to prohibit all persons or bodies of persons, incorporated or unincorporated, resident, carrying on business, or being in the United Kingdom from trading with any of the persons or bodies of persons mentioned in the List contained in the last mentioned Proclamation, such List being therein referred to as the Statutory List:

And whereas by Section one, sub-section two, of the said Act, it is provided that any List of persons and bodies of persons, incorporated or unincorporated, with whom such trading is prohibited by a Proclamation under

the said Act may be varied or added to by an Order made by the Lords of the Council on the recommendation of a Secretary of State:

And whereas the Statutory List contained in the last mentioned Proclamation has been varied and added to by subsequent Orders of Council:

And whereas there was this day read at the Board a recommendation from the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs to the effect that the Statutory List should be further varied and added to as set forth in the Schedule hereto.

Now, therefore, Their Lordships, having taken the said recommendation into consideration, are pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered,

That the Statutory List be varied and added to as set forth in the Schedule hereto.

Whereof the Right Honourable Arthur James Balfour, one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, the Controller of the Foreign Trade Department, and all other persons whom it may concern, are to take notice and govern themselves accordingly.

NOTE (1).—All persons or firms resident, carrying on business or being in the United Kingdom are prohibited from having, with any person or firm mentioned in this List, or in any List issued under the Trading with the Enemy (Statutory List) Proclamation, any dealings other than such as are expressly authorised by paragraph 5 of the Proclamation. A List (The Consolidated List, No. 56A) consolidating all previous Lists, up to and including that of the 31st May, 1918, together with List No. 57 of 14th June, 1918, List No. 58 of 28th June, 1918, and the List herewith annexed, contain all the names which up to this date are included in the Statutory List.

Additions to and variations in these Lists will be published at intervals approximately of two weeks.

The Lists are published in the London Gazette and reproduced in the Board of Trade Journal, and separate copies of all Lists may be obtained at a small cost from the Superintendent of Publications, His Majesty's Stationery Office, Imperial House, Kingsway, W.C.

NOTE (2).—Where a person or firm mentioned in the List has more than one address in the country, or group of countries under which the name of the person or firm appears, all dealings in that country, or in any country in the group, with such person or firm are prohibited, even in cases where one only of the addresses or one only of the countries is specifically mentioned.

NOTE (3).—Trading is prohibited under the Trading with the Enemy Proclamations of 25th June, and 10th November, 1915, with any person or firm of enemy nationality resident or carrying on business in China, Siam, Persia, Morocco, Liberia or Portuguese East Africa. Persons or firms in the United Kingdom are therefore prohibited from trading with any person or firm of enemy nationality in any of those countries, even though such person or firm is not mentioned by name in the Statutory List.

NOTE (4).—In order to minimise as far as possible any inconvenience which may be caused to British traders by the dislocation of export trade owing to the inclusion in the Statutory List of a former connection, the Foreign Trade Department is collecting and classifying the names of non-enemy firms who may be able to act as substitutes for firms mentioned in the Statutory List. A considerable amount of information is already available at the Foreign Trade Department, and it is in many cases possible to suggest the names of satisfactory substitutes for individual firms on the Lists, without the necessity of referring the matter abroad. The Department is, however, prepared on application to enquire of His Majesty's Representatives abroad for the names of suitable substitutes. When the applicant wishes this done by telegraph he is required to undertake to pay the cost of telegraphic correspondence. It would greatly facilitate the work of the Foreign Trade Department if applicants in making enquiries would specify the particular trade or trades for

which substitutes are required. General enquiries for new connections abroad should be addressed to The Comptroller-General, Department of Overseas Trade (Development and Intelligence), 73, Basinghall Street, London, E.C. 2.

NOTE (5).—The Statutory List for each country is telegraphed, on the day of issue, to His Majesty's Representative in that country, who is instructed to notify accordingly British Consular Officers, to whom persons abroad should apply for information as to names on the List. Persons and firms in the United Kingdom with agencies or branches abroad would, however, be well advised to furnish such agencies or branches with issues of the List as they appear. The names on the Lists for all countries in Central or South America are also notified to His Majesty's Ambassador at Washington, who transmits them to H.M. Consul-General at New York and to other centres in the United States likely to be interested.

NOTE (6).—It is not unusual for firms in Holland and the Netherland East Indies to be registered under the names commencing with descriptive terms such as "Handel Maatschappij" (Trading Company) or "Naamlooze Venootschap" (Limited Liability Company). In such cases it has been found more convenient to publish the firm under its proper name, followed by the general descriptive term "Handel Maatschappij" or "Naamlooze Venootschap" (N.V.) as in the case of an English company. For instance Handel Maatschappij van den Berg & Company, and Naamlooze Venootschap de Komeet v/h Dumonceau Frères will be found under "Berg" and "Komeet" respectively, and not under "Handel" or "Naamlooze."

Notice is hereby given, under the Rules Publication Act, 1893, and the Bankruptcy Act, 1914, that the Lord Chancellor, with the concurrence of the President of the Board of Trade, proposes to make the following rules for the amendment of the Bankruptcy Rules, 1915:—

1. The following shall be inserted in the Bankruptcy Rules, 1915, as Rule 103A:—

"103A. During the continuance of the present war and thereafter until such date as the Lord Chancellor shall appoint the total in any Bill of Costs of the costs and charges (as distinct from payments) prescribed by Rule 103 and in Part II. of the Appendix (including all Bills taxed pursuant to Rule 96) shall be increased in respect of business done after the 30th day of April, 1918, by 20 per centum, and such increase shall be allowed upon any taxation whether as between Party and Party or as between Solicitor and Client.

Provided that this Rule shall not apply to the remuneration prescribed by the Soli-

citors Remuneration Act, 1881, or to Bills carried in for taxation or delivered to the client sought to be charged therewith or to the party chargeable therewith before this Rule comes into operation or to Bills then already taxed and certified or allowed, and that it shall not affect the power of the Court to fix a sum to be paid in lieu of taxed costs under Rule 96 (1)."

2. These Rules may be cited as the Bankruptcy Amendment Rules, 1918.

Notice is hereby given, under the Rules Publication Act, 1893, and Section 237 of the Companies (Consolidation) Act, 1908, that the Lord Chancellor, with the concurrence of the President of the Board of Trade, proposes to make the following Rules for the amendment of the Companies (Winding Up) Rules, 1909:

1. The following Rule shall be inserted in the Companies (Winding Up) Rules as Rule 184A:

"184A. During the continuance of the present war and thereafter until such date as the Lord Chancellor shall appoint, the total of any items of costs (as distinct from payments) in respect of any business done after the 30th day of April, 1918, in a winding-up in a county court shall be increased by 20 per centum, and such increase shall be allowed upon any taxation of costs whether as between Party and Party or as between Solicitor and Client

Provided that this Rule shall not apply to the remuneration prescribed by the Solicitors' Remuneration Act, 1881, and that it shall not affect the power to direct payment of a sum in lieu of costs under Order 65 rule 23 of the Rules of the Supreme Court or the power to allow a fixed sum for costs under Order 65 rule 27 (38) of the said Rules, or a gross sum under Order 65 rule 27 (38a) of the said Rules.

Provided also that this rule shall not apply to Bills of Costs which have at the date on which this rule comes into operation already been delivered to the Official Receiver or Liquidator for taxation or delivered to a client sought to be chargeable therewith or to the person chargeable therewith or liable therefor or to bills then already taxed and certified or allowed. The increase hereby authorised shall not affect the question whether a Bill of Costs when taxed is or is not less than by one-sixth part than the bill delivered, sent, or left."

2. These Rules may be cited as the Companies Act Amendment Rules, 1918.

## THE STATUTES OF THE DISTINGUISHED SERVICE ORDER.

(REVISED EDITION.)

GEORGE R.I.

GEORGE THE FIFTH, by the Grace of God,  
of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and  
Ireland, and of the British Dominions beyond

the Seas King, Defender of the Faith, Emperor of India, to all to whom these presents shall come, greeting;

Whereas Her late Majesty Our Beloved Grandmother Queen Victoria by a Warrant dated the 6th day of September 1886 did institute and create a new Naval and Military Order of Distinction designated the Distinguished Service Order for the purpose of rewarding individual instances of meritorious or distinguished service in war;

And Whereas the said Royal Warrant was subsequently amended by Royal Warrants dated 24th July 1902, 2nd July 1903, 15th October 1903 and 23rd August 1916;

And Whereas it is Our Royal Will and Pleasure that the Officers of Our recently constituted Air Force shall be eligible for appointment to Our said Distinguished Service Order;

And Whereas We deem it expedient that all amendments to the Statutes of Our said Order heretofore promulgated, or now to be promulgated, shall be incorporated in a Royal Warrant under Our Sign Manual;

Now Therefore We do hereby declare that the rules and ordinances heretofore in force for the government of Our said Order shall be abrogated, cancelled and annulled, and We are graciously pleased to make, ordain and establish the following rules and ordinances in substitution for the same, which shall henceforth be inviolably observed and kept;

Firstly: It is ordained that this Order shall henceforth be styled and designated the "Distinguished Service Order."

Secondly: It is ordained that the Order shall consist of the Sovereign, and of such Members or Companions as We, Our Heirs or Successors shall appoint.

Thirdly: It is ordained that We, Our Heirs and Successors, Kings and Queens, Regnant of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, Emperors and Empresses of India, are and for ever shall be Sovereigns of this Order.

Fourthly: It is ordained that no person shall be eligible for this distinction who doth not actually hold, at the time of his nomination, a Commission in Our Navy, in Our Land Forces or Marines, in Our Air Force or in Our Indian or Colonial Naval or Military Forces, or a Commission in one of the Departments of Our Navy, Army or Air Force, the holder of which is entitled to Honorary or relative Navy, Army or Air Force rank, nor shall any person be nominated unless his services shall have been marked by the especial mention of his name, by the Admiral or Senior Naval Officer Commanding a Squadron or detached Naval Force, or by the Commander-in-Chief of the Forces in the Field, in despatches for meritorious or distinguished service in the Field, or before the enemy.

Fifthly: It is ordained that Foreign Officers who have been associated in Naval, Military or Aerial operations with Our Forces shall be eligible to be Honorary Members of this Order.

Sixthly: It is ordained that when We, Our Heirs and Successors, shall be pleased to appoint any person to be a Member of this Order, such appointment shall be made by Warrant under Our Sign Manual, and countersigned by one of Our Principal Secretaries of State.

Seventhly: It is ordained that anyone who,

after having performed services for which this Order is awarded, subsequently performs an approved act of gallantry which, if he had not received the Order, would have entitled him to it, shall be awarded a Bar to be attached to the riband by which the Badge is suspended, and for every additional such act an additional Bar may be added.

Eighthly: It is ordained that an Officer shall be appointed to this Order, that is to say, a Secretary and Registrar.

Ninthly: It is ordained that the Secretary and Registrar of this Order shall be appointed by Us, Our Heirs and Successors, and shall have the custody of the archives of the Order. He shall attend to the service of the Order and shall execute such directions as he may receive from our Principal Secretary of State for War.

Tenthly: It is ordained that this Order shall rank next to and immediately after Our Order of the British Empire, and that the Companions thereof shall in all places and assemblies whatsoever have place and precedence next to and immediately after the Commanders of Our said Order of the British Empire and shall rank among themselves according to the date of their respective nominations.

Eleventhly: It is ordained that the Badge of the Order shall consist of a gold cross, enamelled white, edged gold, having on one side thereof in the centre, within a wreath a laurel enamelled green, the Imperial Crown in gold upon a red enamelled ground and on the reverse, within a similar wreath and on a similar red ground, the Royal Cypher, and shall be suspended from the left breast by a red riband, edged blue, of one inch in width.

Twelfthly: It is ordained that the names of those whom We may be pleased to admit to Membership of this Order shall be published in the London Gazette, and a registry thereof kept in the Office of Our Secretary of State for War.

Thirteenthly: In order to make such additional provision as shall effectively preserve pure this honourable distinction, it is ordained that if any person admitted to Membership of this Order shall be convicted of treason, cowardice, felony, or of any infamous crime, or if he be accused of any such offence and doth not after a reasonable time surrender himself to be tried for the same, his name shall be erased, by an Order under the Royal Sign Manual, from the register of Members of the said Order. And it is hereby declared that We, Our Heirs and Successors, shall be the sole judge of the conduct which may require the erasure from the register of the name of the offending person, and that it shall at all times be competent for Us, Our Heirs and Successors, to restore the name if such restoration should be justified by the circumstances of the case.

Lastly: We reserve to Ourselves, Our Heirs and Successors full power of annulling, altering, abrogating, augmenting, interpreting or dispensing with these Regulations or any part thereof by a notification under the Sign Manual of the Sovereign of the Order.

## ARMY COUNCIL ORDER.

THE FORMALDEHYDE (DEALINGS) ORDER,  
1918.

In pursuance of the powers conferred upon them by the Defence of the Realm Regulations, the Army Council hereby order as follows:—

1. No person shall purchase, sell or make, or take delivery of or payment for any Formaldehyde (40 per cent. solution) at any price other than £150 per barrel delivered free on rail; provided that upon any sale of any quantity exceeding ten gallons and not exceeding one barrel an addition of 7d. per lb. may be made; and provided that upon any sale of any quantity exceeding five gallons and not exceeding ten gallons an addition of 7½d. per lb. may be made; and provided that upon any sale of any quantity not exceeding five gallons an addition of 8d. per lb. may be made; and provided further that upon any sale of any quantity less than one barrel additional charges may be added to the sale price in respect of carriage and containers, such charges to be limited to any expenses actually incurred by the vendor, subject to an addition of 1d. per container in the case of containers holding less than one-half gallon.

2. This Order may be cited as the Formaldehyde (Dealings) Order, 1918.

GOVERNMENT BOARD.THE PUBLIC HEALTH (TUBERCULOSIS)  
REGULATIONS, 1918.

To the Mayor, Aldermen, and Commons  
of the City of London, in Common  
Council assembled:—

To the Councils of the several Metropoli-

To the Councils of the several Rural Dis-

And to all others whom it may concern.

Whereas by the Public Health (Tuberculosis) Regulations, 1916, and by the Public Health (Tuberculosis) Regulations, 1917, We, the Local Government Board, altered the Public Health (Tuberculosis) Regulations, 1912 (herein-after referred to as "the Regulations of 1912"), so as to provide for the transmission to the Army Council, or to the Chief Commissioner of Medical Services, by every Medical Officer of Health, of the name and other specified particulars of every male person between certain specified ages entered in the Register kept by the Medical Officer of Health in pursuance of sub-division (2) of Article XI. of the Regulations of 1912:

Now, therefore, in the exercise of the powers conferred upon Us by the several Statutes in that behalf, We do by this Our Order rescind the Public Health (Tuberculosis) Regulations, 1916, and the Public Health (Tuberculosis) Regulations, 1917, and do alter the Regula-

tions of 1912 and make the following Regulations, that is to say:—

ARTICLE I.—Expressions in these Regulations, unless the contrary intention appears, have the same meaning as the like expressions have in the Regulations of 1912.

ARTICLE II.—(a) Every Medical Officer of Health shall forthwith send to the Chief Commissioner of Medical Services, Ministry of National Service, Westminster, London, S.W. 1, in the form shown in the Schedule to this Order, a list containing the names and other specified particulars of all male persons entered in the Register kept by the Medical Officer of Health in pursuance of sub-division (2) of Article XI. of the Regulations of 1912 who were between the ages of forty-five and forty-nine years on the first day of January, 1916.

(b) Every Medical Officer of Health shall send to the said Chief Commissioner of Medical Services the name and other specified particulars of every male person between the ages of sixteen and fifty-three years hereafter entered in the said Register within a week after the entry is made therein.

ARTICLE III.—All information received in pursuance of these Regulations and of the Regulations hereby rescinded shall be regarded by every person who has access thereto as confidential.

ARTICLE IV.—Any expenses incurred by a Medical Officer of Health in carrying out the duties imposed upon him by these Regulations and by the Regulations hereby rescinded shall be defrayed by the Local Authority of the District for which he is Medical Officer of Health.

ARTICLE V.—This Order may be cited as the Public Health (Tuberculosis) Regulations, 1918, and shall be in force during the continuation of the present War.

## ADMIRALTY NOTICE TO MARINERS.

No. 825 of the year 1918.

ENGLAND, EAST COAST.

*River Humber and Approaches—Pilotage, Traffic and Fishing Regulations.**Former Notice.*—No. 764 of 1918; hereby cancelled.

Mariners are hereby warned that, under the Defence of the Realm (Consolidation) Regulations, 1914, the following Regulations have been made by the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, and are now in force:—

1. That portion of the Humber which lies between two straight lines, drawn from shore to shore, as follows:—(1) a line drawn  $225^{\circ}$  (*S.  $61^{\circ}$  W. Mag.*) through Spurn lighthouse, (2) drawn  $344^{\circ}$  (*North Mag.*) from the east side of Barrow haven, will be referred to as the "port" in these regulations.

2. Shipowners and local agents are warned that their vessels are to conform to the following regulations:—

(I.) Except under exceptional circumstances merchant vessels will be free to enter or leave the port during the hours of Official day.

(II.) Before entering the port merchant vessels must receive permission and the necessary instructions from the Examination steamer, and before leaving they must obtain permission through the Collector of Customs at Hull, Grimsby, or Goole, as the case may be.

(III.) Shipowners and local agents are advised to time the arrival of their vessels at the port for daylight.

(IV.) Vessels desiring to enter the port from seaward are to close the Examination steamer. In the event of the Examination steamer being off her station they are to proceed to the Southern Examination anchorage (except during strong northerly or easterly winds, when they shall proceed to the Northern Examination anchorage) and there anchor.

(V.) The Examination steamer will be met midway between Bull light-vessel and Chequer Shoal buoy.

The Examination steamer will be distinguished by the following means:—

*By Day.*—A white ensign, and at the foremast head the special flag mentioned in Part II. of Admiralty Notice to Mariners No. 814 of 1918. When the port is closed 3 red balls will be hoisted in addition to the special flag.

*By Night.*—Three lights vertically, 3 feet apart, conspicuously displayed at the end of a yard so as to show an unbroken light round the horizon. When the port is closed these lights will be red, when it is open they will be white.

NOTE.—These lights are in addition to the ordinary navigation lights.

(VI.) There are two Examination anchorages. The northern is to be used in strong northerly and easterly winds. The southern is to be used under all other conditions.

The Northern Examination anchorage comprises those portions of Hawke road and Middle shoal included between the intersection of the following lines of bearing:—

(1) Skeffling church,  $18^{\circ}$  (*N.  $34^{\circ}$  E. Mag.*),

(2) Skeffling church,  $4^{\circ}$  (*No.  $20^{\circ}$  E. Mag.*).

(3) Spurn lighthouse,  $120^{\circ}$  (*S.  $44^{\circ}$  E. Mag.*).

(4) Extreme of Spurn point,  $115^{\circ}$  (*S.  $49^{\circ}$  E. Mag.*).

The Southern Examination anchorage comprises the area bounded as follows:—

(1) On the north by the Bull sand.

(2) On the south by the three fathom contour line northward of Tetney haven.

(3) On the east by the line joining the Bull light-vessel and entrance to Tetney haven.

(4) On the west by a line parallel to and 7 cables from the eastern limit (3).

NOTE.—When the Southern Examination anchorage is full of shipping further arrivals should anchor eastward of and as near to it as possible.

*Emergency Anchorage.*—This comprises the area bounded as follows:—

(a) On the North by the Middle shoal.

(b) On the South by the Bull sand.

(c) On the East by the bearing Cleethorpes Sewer Outfall beacon,  $240^{\circ}$  (*S.  $76^{\circ}$  W. Mag.*).

(d) On the West by the bearing Skeffling church  $18^{\circ}$  (*N.  $34^{\circ}$  E. Mag.*).

3. All pilotage certificates granted to masters and mates for the whole or any part of the Humber Pilotage district are suspended, and further all vessels (irrespective of draught, size, or nationality, but with the exception of those provided for in paragraph 4) bound to or from any place on the Humber must be conducted by licensed pilots over the whole or any part of the waters between Hull and the Outer Pilotage station of the Humber Pilotage district, which until further notice will be situated in the neighbourhood of the Bull light-vessel.

4. In the case of lighter inter-dock traffic and of small British vessels engaged in local traffic above Immingham, pilotage by licensed pilots is not compulsory.

5. During the hours of official night, and during fog with visibility of less than half-a-mile, no traffic is permitted to move on the Humber below Paull point; also when these conditions prevail no vessel shall approach within a radius of five miles from Humber light-vessel.

6. Every vessel shall endeavour to approach the Humber in sufficient time to enable such vessel to obtain a pilot and arrive at her destination, or at a position in which she is permitted to anchor, before the commencement of official night, but, should occasions arise when a vessel is delayed through unforeseen or unpreventable circumstances from arriving in time, she may approach the Examination steamer, from whom she will receive directions as to anchoring until the end of official night. The Examination steamer will be found in the neighbourhood of the Bull light-vessel after the commencement of official night. In the event of an incoming vessel being unable immediately to find the Examination steamer in these circumstances, she is to remain in the vicinity of the Bull light-vessel, but shall not cross the line drawn  $225^{\circ}$  (*S.  $61^{\circ}$  W. Mag.*) through Spurn lighthouse without permission. Outward-bound vessels shall not pass Hawkins point later than 45 minutes before the commencement of official night.

7. Vessels when leaving the Humber must proceed as directed by the Shipping Intelligence Officer. Should it be necessary to wait for the



weather to moderate or clear, they must remain at an authorised anchorage.

The pilot lobbies will be notified when the existence of fog outside the river is known.

8. All vessels proceeding into or out of the Humber must be navigated by way of Hawke and Sunk roads passing to the northward of the Bull light-vessel, except those outward-bound from Grimsby, which may cross the Middle shoal passing at once into the channel north of the Middle.

NOTE.—The five-fathom channel through the Sunk and Hawke roads is very narrow at the western entrance and also at a point north of the Middle light-vessel; deep-draught vessels steaming against the tide when approaching the buoys marking these portions of the channel should endeavour to avoid passing others between them by easing engines to allow ships with the tide under them to get through first. Smaller vessels outward-bound should pass close to the southward of the buoys marking the south side, and those inward-bound close to the northward of the buoys marking the north side, of the narrow portions of the channel, provided always that their draught of water and the state of the tide will admit.

9. Sailing vessels of 50 tons register and upwards must be towed through the Boom Defence gateways. Should tugs not be available, sailing vessels entering the Humber may anchor temporarily north-westward of the No. 2 Lower Middle light-float at a distance of not more than  $1\frac{1}{2}$  miles from it, but they must not bring the before-mentioned light-float to bear to the southward of  $128^{\circ}$  (*S.  $36^{\circ}$  E. Mag.*).

10. All vessels entering or leaving Grimsby docks must pass to the southward of the No. 4 Lower Burcom B.W.V.S. buoy, except those making use of the channel southward of the Burcom shoal (hereinafter called the Burcom channel), which are exempted from this condition, but no vessel may cross the Burcom shoal between the No. 5 Middle Burcom and No. 4 Lower Burcom B.W.V.S. buoys. Vessels using the Burcom channel must pass into and out of its western end to the eastward of No. 6 Upper Burcom B.W.V.S. buoy, and its eastern end by a passage of 220 feet wide, each side of which is marked by a dolphin surmounted by a black triangle supported on a white pole. No vessel is permitted to tow more than two craft at one time through this passage.

Vessels making use of this passage are cautioned to keep well in the middle of the opening and are subject to the following regulations:—

(1.) Vessels navigating against the tide must in all cases give way to those navigating with the tide.

(2.) No vessel must approach the defences in this part of the river nearer than a quarter of a mile except to pass through the before-mentioned passage or to enter or leave the docks or old outfall at Grimsby.

(3.) No vessel may tow more vessels at one time than she can safely navigate through the passage, and under no circumstances is the tow to comprise more than two craft.

(4.) Distant signals will be shown from the flagstaff on the West Pier at the Grimsby Dock entrance as follows:—

(a) Two black balls will denote that the passage is open.

(b) Three black balls will denote that the passage is closed.

(c) No signal being hoisted denotes that traffic is suspended.

When signal (b) three black balls is hoisted, no vessel may approach the passage, and when traffic is suspended no vessels, other than H.M. Ships on special duty, may use the passage.

11. Prohibited areas:—

(I.) Anchorage is prohibited for all vessels between the following lines:—

(a) Joining Stone Creek Coast Guard flag-staff and the eastern extremity of the eastern jetty at Immingham.

(b) Joining the riverward beacon of the two centre measured mile beacons on Sunk island and the northernmost of two clumps shown southward of Stallingborough on Admiralty Chart No. 109. The latter line passes through the position of No. 6 Upper Burcom buoy.

(II.) No merchant vessel shall anchor (except when granted special permission) between the before-mentioned prohibited anchorage area (I.) and the line of transit of the eastern measured mile beacons on Sunk island produced to the Lincolnshire shore or (except as provided for in paragraph 9) to the northward of the line of the Killingholme leading lights or within  $1\frac{1}{2}$  cables of any of the Admiralty mooring buoys.

(III.) Anchorage is prohibited between the following lines:—

(a) Joining New Clee railway station and Patrington church.

(b) Joining Middle light-vessel and No. 4 Lower Burcom B.W.V.S. buoy, extending to both banks of the Humber.

(IV.) Anchorage is prohibited to merchant vessels to the southward of a line joining No. 4 Lower Burcom B.W.V.S. buoy and Spurn lighthouse, or to the eastward of a line joining Cleethorpes pier pavilion and Skeffling church, except so far as the Examination anchorages are concerned.

(V.) No vessel of any description may anchor on the south side of the Bull sand between the western limit of the Southern Examination anchorage described in paragraph 2 of this notice and the line of bearing Cleethorpes Sewer outfall beacon (on which a red light is exhibited in peace time) in a direction  $240^{\circ}$  (*S.  $76^{\circ}$  W. Mag.*), nor on the north side of the Bull sand between the before-mentioned line of bearing of Cleethorpes Sewer outfall and a line joining Spurn lighthouse and the Bull light-vessel produced to the Bull sand; nor within 3 cables of the No. 4 Lower Burcom B.W.V.S. buoy.

(VI.) No merchant vessel of any description may enter, pass through or remain in the area bounded as follows, without special permission:—

(1) On the North by the bearing Skitter Haven No. 8 B.W.V.S. buoy  $55^{\circ}$  (*N.  $71^{\circ}$  E. Mag.*).

(2) On the South by the bearing Killingholme Oil Fuel jetty,  $235^{\circ}$  (*S.  $71^{\circ}$  W. Mag.*).

(3) On the East by a line joining the before-mentioned No. 8 buoy and Killingholme No. 7 light-float.

(4) On the West by the Lincolnshire River bank.

12. No neutral vessel may lie alongside any of the piers or jetties in the Humber at night without special permission.

13. No merchant vessels or boats, etc., will be allowed to approach within a quarter of a mile of any defence work (except to pass through the Boom gateways or to enter or

leave the old outfall or docks at Grimsby) or to go alongside any Government ship, vessel, lighter, or any other Government craft, or any Government establishment, without special permission. All vessels proceeding up and down the Humber are to pass at a distance at least three cables from H.M. Ships, if the depth of water and circumstances of navigation permit.

14. All vessels employed in laying moorings, raising wrecks, etc., must be passed at slow speed, propelling engines being eased at least 300 yards before reaching such vessels and so continued for 150 yards after passing them. While the said mooring or wreck raising craft are at work they will each fly a red flag.

15. Anchor lights above Immingham and in the Northern Examination Anchorage are to be reduced in power and screened as prescribed in Admiralty Notice to Mariners No. 772 of 1918.

Below Immingham (Northern Examination Anchorage excepted) they are to be screened as previously directed and further reduced in brilliancy so as to be invisible at any greater distance than half-a-mile.

This order will not absolve the Masters of vessels at anchor from keeping a sharp lookout and giving warning on the approach of any craft under way.

Anchor lights authorised by these orders are never on any account to be extinguished; the order "Out Lights" will not apply to them.

Bow and masthead steaming lights are to be as prescribed in Admiralty Notice to Mariners No. 772 of 1918.

Other lights are to be as prescribed in Admiralty Notice to Mariners No. 772 of 1918, and this order applies also to vessels in dock or alongside quays and jetties. Notwithstanding anything in these orders, dredgers may be permitted to work at Hull and Immingham at night provided all their lights are extinguished within half-an-hour of issue of the general order "Out Lights."

The above orders apply to vessels of every description, other than H.M. ships. The latter should, however, comply so far as the visibility of anchor lights eastward of Immingham is concerned.

16. No vessel is permitted to tow more than three craft at one time through a gateway of the Boom defence or more than two through the passage in the Burcom channel described in paragraph 10. Owners of tugs may apply to the Humber Conservancy Board for pilot licences for the masters of their vessels which will enable them to pilot their own vessels and river craft comprising their tow (in certain parts of the river). The number of craft towed will be restricted according to the power of the tug.

17. Humber Rule No. 18 is to be strictly enforced. No sound signals other than navigation signals authorised by the Regulations for Preventing Collisions at Sea, and by Humber Rules Nos. 14 to 16 (inclusive) at all times of the day or night, and No. 17 during the day only, are on any account to be used by vessels in any part of the Humber, the Old Harbour at Hull, or within any of the docks at Hull, Immingham or Grimsby.

18. Owners of small vessels plying in the vicinity of the Humber are instructed not to paint their craft light *grey*, and are hereby directed to have any vessels so coloured re-

painted. They are warned that small vessels painted *grey* run a great risk of being fired upon in mistake for submarines. Vessels painted *black* run the least risk.

19. Fishing in the Humber.—No vessel is allowed to fish in the Humber below Hull without a permit from the Admiralty port officer; all fishing, shrimping, trawling, or whelking in this portion of the river in areas other than those for which permits are granted is prohibited.

20. Regulations affecting Pleasure Craft and Pleasure Fishing.—Pleasure boats of every description on the Humber must henceforth be provided with permits to be obtained from the Admiralty Port Officer; they may ply for hire at Cleethorpes only between the Eastern and Western Sewer Outfall Beacons, and must keep within a distance of one mile from the shore.

It being considered desirable to encourage *bona fide* efforts on the part of amateur fishermen to increase the national supplies of fish, pleasure boats will be granted fishing permits on application to the Admiralty Port Officer, the holding of which will remove the restriction as to the limits within which pleasure boats may ordinarily ply for hire, provided their object is to catch fish.

No able-bodied professional fishermen or boatmen between the ages of 18 and 60 may be employed on land or sea in connection with any boat for which a pleasure permit has been issued.

No registered fishing boat or mechanically propelled craft will be granted a pleasure permit except for the purpose of fishing, but when they cannot fish their owners may apply to the Admiralty Port Officer for special permission to ply for hire provided the foregoing paragraph having reference to the ages of the crews of craft to which pleasure permits have been issued is complied with.

Notwithstanding anything in these orders, rowing boats may pass along the shore at Cleethorpes, but they must keep within 400 yards of the High Water mark of Spring Tides.

21. Excursions by Water.—Excursions by water are limited to the River Humber above Hull, and Rivers Ouse and Trent. Excursion steamers will not be allowed to ply without a permit from the Admiralty port officer, Dock Offices, Immingham, and in no case are they to pass to the eastward of a line joining Victoria Dock entrance, Hull, and the east beacon on Skitter Ness.

22. Patrol of Internal Waterways.—The internal waterways of the port will be policed by Naval patrol vessels and by the Humber Conservancy Board under the direction of the Naval authorities.

Captains and Masters of Merchant Vessels and persons in charge of barges or boats of any kind are hereby warned to observe any orders which may be given to them by the Naval Patrol vessels or the duly authorised officers of the Humber Conservancy Board.

23. All instructions given by Officers in command of H.M. ships, Patrol vessels or Examination steamers, or the duly authorised officers of the Humber Conservancy Board, are to be implicitly and promptly obeyed even should they conflict with these orders.

24. Masters of vessels are hereby warned that they cannot anchor off the coast, or pass to the westward of the meridian of long. 0° 9' E. between Kilnsea beacon and Withernsea during

the hours of darkness without incurring great risk on account of occasional night firing practice from coastal batteries.

When gun-firing is taking place in the vicinity of the Humber masters of vessels should keep their crews under cover as much as possible.

25. Warning.—Warning is hereby given that vessels disobeying the above regulations will be liable to be fired on.

*Variation.*—16° W.

*Note.*—This Admiralty Notice to Mariners is a revision of the former Notice quoted above.

#### *Caution.*

This Admiralty Notice to Mariners is issued under the provisions of the Defence of the Realm (Consolidation) Regulations, 1914, and failure to comply strictly with the directions contained in it will constitute an offence against those Regulations.

Any person found guilty of such an offence is liable to severe penalties both of imprisonment and fine.

Any person aiding or abetting the commission of such an offence is himself guilty of an offence against the Regulations.

Attention is also drawn to the fact that any infringement of the directions contained in this Admiralty Notice to Mariners is liable to result in the detention of the ship or vessel.

### ADMIRALTY NOTICE TO MARINERS.

No. 828 of the year 1918.

ENGLAND, SOUTH COAST.

*Former Notice.*—No. 469 of 1918; hereby cancelled.

Notice is hereby given that, under the Defence of the Realm (Consolidation) Regulations, 1914, the following Regulations have been made by the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty and are now in force:—

(1) *Beachy Head to St. Albans Head—Traffic Regulations.*

#### 1. REGULATIONS REGARDING TRADING, FISHING AND PLEASURE CRAFT.

1. The areas on the South Coast of England to which the following orders apply are:—

Area A.—Enclosed by a line from Beachy head to Owers light-vessel to Boulder bank buoy, thence in a 315° (*N. 30° W. Mag.*) direction to the Portsmouth Defence area.

Area B.—Enclosed by a line from Culver cliff to a point 3 miles, 90° (*S. 75° E. Mag.*), from Culver cliff, thence within the 3-mile limit to a point 3 miles, 180° (*S. 15° W. Mag.*), from Freshwater Gate, thence to Freshwater Gate.

Area C.—Enclosed by a line joining Chewton Bunny to Christchurch ledge buoy, thence to a point 3 miles, 180° (*S. 15° W. Mag.*), from Anvil point, thence to a point 3 miles 180° (*S. 15° W. Mag.*), from St. Albans head, thence to St. Albans head.

2. The term craft as used herein includes ships, barges, boats and vessels of all descrip-

tions, and the orders apply to all fishing and pleasure craft.

3. No craft are to go out in the specified areas between sunset and sunrise.

4. All craft from places within these areas are to be on shore or back in their harbour half an hour after sunset.

5. No craft are to put to sea during fog or thick weather, and any caught at sea by fog, etc., are to return to shore or harbour at once, if possible.

6. Craft unable to return to harbour owing to failing wind or fog, etc., are to anchor and show the regulation anchor lights at night. No bright lights are permitted. Fishing craft anchoring off Brighton or Hove are to anchor between the piers.

7. Craft found after dark in the areas detailed in paragraph 1 are liable to be fired upon.

8. Fishing is permitted during daylight hours in areas A, B and C except within the limits stated in paragraph 9, by all *bona fide* fishermen, provided they are in possession of a permit which can be obtained from the Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, through their District Fishery Officers or the Coastguard. When applying for these permits, fishermen are to state the port from which they intend to work, and this will be entered on the permit. Permits for areas A, B and C are only issued to craft registered locally. Under no circumstances are fishermen allowed to carry passengers in their boats.

Permits will not be issued for vessels transferred from ports of registry outside areas A, B and C to ports of registry inside those areas.

9. No small craft may anchor or be under way in the area bounded as follows:—

(a) *On the North.*—By the coastline between Seaford head and Crowlink Coastguard Station.

(b) *On the West.*—By a line drawn from Seaford head in a 158° (*S. 7° E. Mag.*) direction for a distance of 1 $\frac{3}{10}$  miles.

(c) *On the East.*—By a line drawn from Crowlink Coastguard Station in a 197° (*S. 32° W. Mag.*) direction for a distance of 1 $\frac{3}{10}$  miles.

(d) *On the South.*—By a line joining the southern extremities of limits (b) and (c).

10. All unregistered fishing craft must carry their permit number painted on each bow in figures not less than 12 inches in height. Vessels registered as British sea fishing boats are to comply with the statutory rules as regards lettering and numbering.

11. Night fishing is permitted by special permit in a portion of area A by craft for which a Board of Agriculture and Fisheries permit has been issued. Applications for these special permits to be made to Captain A. B. Purvis, D.C.W.O., Worthing, through Mr. Edward Page, Chief Fishery Officer, 61, Tamworth Road, Hove.

12. Fishing is absolutely prohibited for all steam, oil, or petrol-driven fishing vessels of over 50-ft. keel length.

13. The following orders regarding oil of all kinds and petrol are to be complied with:—

(a) Oil, motor spirit, petrol, or other goods may not be shipped on board craft of any description, whether coasting or foreign, either as stores for the equipment or navigation of the vessel or as merchandise, except at places which are under the supervision of a Customs Officer. Such goods must be

properly pre-entered before shipment, and a clearance must be obtained from the Customs Officials in accordance with the Customs War Powers Act, 1915, pars. 1 to 3.

(b) In places where there are no Customs Officials, oil or petrol-driven craft cruising in pleasure areas, and oil or petrol-driven fishing craft of 50-ft. keel length and under, may obtain their stores locally provided the Coast-Watching Officer as representing the Customs Officials is previously notified and a Stock Book giving particulars of quantities received and used is kept on board and open for inspection.

(c) Sailing vessels may not have on board a quantity of petrol, motor spirit, benzine, paraffin, petroleum or similar substances exceeding four gallons.

14. Owners of motor craft, pleasure craft, and small craft of all descriptions are to supply to the Coastguard Officer of the district lists of all their boats and vessels which they may place afloat, and they are to obtain from him permits for them. Without such permits these craft are not to be used. The number of the permit is to be painted on each bow in figures not less than 12 inches in height.

15. Motor craft, pleasure craft, and small craft of all descriptions are not to proceed outside of their ports, creeks or rivers, during the hours of official day, unless in possession of a permit which may be obtained from a Customs Official on personal application, or (in places where there is no Customs Official) from the Coastguard Officer of that district.

16. The areas within which pleasure craft with permits may move during daylight are as follows, and, except as provided for in paragraph 17, they are forbidden to move in any other areas:—

Newhaven: Within one mile radius from the end of the western breakwater.

Rottingdean: Within one mile radius of the slipway.

Brighton: Within one mile radius from eastern pier.

Hove: Within one mile radius from Coastguard station.

Shoreham: Within one mile radius from the end of western pier.

Worthing: Within one mile radius from the end of town pier.

East Preston: Within one mile radius of Coastguard boathouse.

Littlehampton: Within one mile radius from the end of western pier.

Bognor: Within one mile radius of green fishing light.

Pagham: Within one mile radius from the coast watching hut.

Selsea: Within one mile radius from Coastguard station.

Sandown Bay: Inside the line joining Culver cliff and Dunnose head.

Ventnor: Within one mile of Ventnor pier.

Christchurch: Inside line joining Chewton Bunny to Christchurch ledge buoy, and thence to Christchurch head.

Christchurch head to Sandbanks: Within 500 yards of low water mark.

*Note.*—Boating off Bournemouth is permitted inside a line joining the Martello tower near Sugar Loaf Chine and Southbourne provided the boats are supervised and inspected by the Piermaster and Beach Inspectors in conjunction with the Coast-Watching Officer.

Poole harbour: Within line joining North and South havens.

Studland bay: From opposite Studland village to the old breakwater within 400 yards of low water mark.

Swanage bay: To the west of line joining Ballard and Peverill points.

17. At certain ports and places where pleasure cruising is permitted in areas A and C a strictly limited number of permits will be issued to amateur fishermen, who are residents and British born, to fish during daylight only in an extension of the pleasure cruising area. The conditions and regulations under which these permits are issued are printed on the permits and are to be strictly complied with. This relaxation of the rules has been made with the sole purpose of increasing the food supply.

Applications for these permits should be made:—

By residents of Newhaven to the Senior Naval Officer, Newhaven.

By residents of other places and ports in area A to Captain A. B. Purvis, R.N., Divisional Coast-Watching Officer, Lorne House, Broadwater Road, Worthing.

By residents of ports and places in area C to Captain A. L. K. Knapton, R.N., Divisional Coast-Watching Officer, Rope Hill, Lymington.

18. Pleasure permits will be issued at the discretion of the Customs Official and Coastguard Officer subject to the following conditions:—

(a) No person shall receive a pleasure permit in respect of any craft for which he has been granted a Board of Agriculture and Fisheries fishing permit.

(b) Subject to par. (a), pleasure permits may be granted to private owners and to owners of craft for hire, on the strict understanding that no professional fisherman or boatman between the ages of 18 and 60 be employed either on shore or at sea in connection with such craft. Any infringement of this rule will lead to the immediate withdrawal of the permit.

(c) All persons who receive pleasure permits will be expected to do their utmost to increase the food supply by catching fish; but this does not give them authority to go outside the limits of the pleasure area.

(d) The pleasure permit is always to be carried by the person in charge of the craft when the craft is in use, and the owner of the craft is responsible that those using the craft understand the orders relating to pleasure cruising.

19. *Shipping of Amateurs as Crew on Commercial Fishing Vessels.*—Where it is proved that there is a shortage of *bonâ fide* fishermen to form the crews of fishing craft provided with Board of Agriculture and Fisheries fishing permits, permission may be granted to a limited number of approved amateur fishermen or yachtsmen enabling them to ship as crew on such craft. In cases where this is required application is to be made to the District Inspector of the Board of Agriculture and Fisheries (Mr. E. S. Russell, Warblington Cottage, Havant).

20. No excursion traffic is allowed except with the written permission of the Commander-in-Chief, to be obtained for the season in regard to standing excursions, and on each occasion of special excursions.

21. Nothing in these orders shall affect the

standing orders relating to the Defence Areas at Portsmouth, Newhaven, and Poole.

## II. NEWHAVEN AND APPROACH— CAUTION WITH REGARD TO EX- TINCTION OF LIGHTS; TRAFFIC REGULATIONS; AREA WITHIN WHICH ANCHORING AND TRAWL- ING IS PROHIBITED.

### CAUTION WITH REGARD TO EXTINGUISHMENT OF LIGHTS.

Notice is hereby given that the following lights within the port are liable to be extinguished without further notice being issued:—

1. Light at South end of West pier.
2. Light at North end of West pier.
3. Light at end of Sea wall.
4. Red Leading Light on Packet wharf.

### REGULATIONS FOR THE INTERNAL TRAFFIC OF THE PORT OF NEWHAVEN.

The port is now closed. Entry into the Port of Newhaven is prohibited to all merchant ships other than those on Government Service, and those which may have previously obtained special permission to enter from the Senior Naval Officer at Newhaven.

Until further notice, the following regulations are to be observed by all merchant shipping (including barges, boats and private vessels), moving within the limits of the Commercial Port of Newhaven.

#### Entrance into Port.

1. Shipowners and local agents are warned that their vessels should be directed to arrive at, and leave, the port as a general rule by daylight, and to conform to the following regulations.

2. Shipowners and local agents will facilitate the entry of their vessels by giving previous notice of probable time of arrival to the Senior Naval Officer, Newhaven (Telegraphic address:—Divisional Transports, Newhaven), with particulars of appearance, &c., so that they may be readily identified.

3. A vessel wishing to enter the port is to proceed to the Examination Anchorage marked on Admiralty Charts Nos. 2154 and 1652, and there anchor, unless previously met by the Examination Steamer. Instructions will be given to the Master by the Examining Officer as to entering.

4. The Examination Anchorage is westward of the breakwater. It is a square area, of which the sides are 888 yards long, the northern one being drawn in the direction 255° (*West Mag.*) from a point situated 255° (*West Mag.*) and 800 yards from the Breakwater Lighthouse. (See Admiralty Charts Nos. 1652 and 2154).

5. The Examination Steamer will be found at the seaward end of the entrance channel.

6. The Examination Steamer will be distinguished by the following means:—

**BY DAY.**—A white ensign, and at the foremast head a special pilot flag (white and red, horizontal, surrounded by a blue border). When the port is closed the Examination Steamer will, in addition, hoist three red balls, and three red balls will be similarly hoisted at the flagstaff at the West pier.

**BY NIGHT.**—Three lights vertically, six feet apart, conspicuously displayed at the end of the yard, so as to show an unbroken light round the horizon. When the port is closed, these lights will be red; when it is open, they will be white.

**NOTE.**—These lights are in addition to the ordinary navigation lights, and they will also be hoisted at the flagstaff at the West pier.

#### Leaving Port.

7. No vessel is to attempt to leave the port without having first received permission from the Senior Naval Officer.

#### Pilots.

8. At the discretion of the Chief Examining Officer, small coasters and fishing vessels, whose masters are British subjects, or those transports whose masters are in possession of a pilotage certificate for the port, will be allowed to enter or leave the port without a pilot.

9. Subject to the above exemptions, pilotage is compulsory, and all merchant vessels must have a licensed local pilot on board before leaving or attempting to enter.

#### Traffic by Day.

10. The movements of all vessels, barges, or boats of any kind are subject to the direction of the Senior Naval Officer, whose orders are to be obeyed immediately.

11. Subject to the above, merchant shipping may move as usual within the port of Newhaven, taking care to keep clear of any H.M. ships which are being navigated in the port.

#### Traffic by Night.

12. All vessels, barges, and boats must display the regulation lights.

13. When anchoring care must be taken to be well clear of the fairway.

#### Approach to Government Vessels and Establishments.

14. No vessel or boats will be allowed to approach any Government ship, vessel, or lighter, or other Government craft, or any Government establishment, without special permission.

#### Warning.

15. Vessels disobeying these Regulations will be liable to be fired on.

### AREA WITHIN WHICH ANCHORING AND TRAWLING IS PROHIBITED.

All vessels are prohibited from anchoring or trawling or any other forms of bottom fishing with nets, in an area formed by lines joining the following positions:—

(a) Birling gap.

(b) Lat. 50° 38' 00" N., long. 0° 09' 00" E.

(c) Lat. 50° 39' 00" N., long. 0° 02' 00" W.

(d) Lat. 50° 43' 00" N., long. 0° 02' 00" W.

(e) Seaford head.

## III. SPITHEAD APPROACH—RESTRICTION OF TRAFFIC; PROHIBITED ANCHORAGE.

1. Passage of vessels between Noman's fort and the charted position of Warner light-vessel is entirely prohibited.

2. Vessels of all descriptions are prohibited from anchoring in St. Helen's roads to the westward of a line drawn in a 162° (*S. 3° Mag.*) direction from Noman's fort.

## IV. POOLE BAY AND SOLENT APPROACH — RESTRICTION OF TRAFFIC.

No craft of any description, other than craft employed on Admiralty work, is to be under way to the northward of a line joining St. Catherine's point and Arvil point, between

one hour after sunset and one hour before sunrise, or during fog.

(2) *Portland Harbour Approach—Restriction of Traffic.*

No vessels or boats of any description are to move in the area north of a line joining Portland bill with St. Albans head, by day or night, unless proceeding into Weymouth anchorage.

*Variation.*—15° W.

*Note.*

This Notice is a revision of the former Notice quoted above.

Notice is hereby given that under the Defence of the Realm (Consolidation) Regulations, 1914, the following Regulations have been made by the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty and are now in force:—

1. That portion of Loch Linnhe which lies north-eastward of a line joining Salachan point and Kentallen pier is closed to British and Allied ships during the hours of official night, and to Neutral shipping at all times.

2. Except under exceptional circumstances British and Allied merchant vessels will be free to enter or leave during the hours of official day.

3. Before entering, vessels must receive permission and the necessary instructions from the control vessel.

4. Vessels are advised so to time their arrival as to reach the entrance to Loch Aber during official daylight in order to obviate having to lie off.

5. The control vessel will be met with in the vicinity of the Culchenna Spit light-buoy and will be distinguished by the following means:—

*By day:* A white ensign, and, at the foremast-head, the special flag mentioned in Part II. of Admiralty Notice to Mariners No. 814 of

1918, for an examination steamer and any subsequent re-publication thereof. When the port is closed 3 red balls will be hoisted in addition to the special flag.

6. In the event of the port being closed by day 3 red balls will also be hoisted on the flag-staff on Corran point.

7. During fog, or when the visibility is less than one mile, no traffic entering will be permitted to pass to the north-eastward of the line defined in paragraph 1, and vessels are to keep seaward of the line.

8. All instructions given by officers in command of H.M. ships, or patrol vessels, are to be promptly obeyed.

9. All vessels under way within 5 miles of Corran point lighthouse are to exhibit side lights from one hour after sunset to one hour before sunrise. Side lights are to be exhibited also during daytime should the visibility become less than one mile.
