The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the 10th day of July, 1918, in the words following, viz.:—

"Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted, *inter alia*, that all pay, pensions, or other allowances in the nature thereof, payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being, or having been, an Officer, Seaman, or Marine therein, shall be paid in such manner and subject to such restrictions, conditions, and provisions, as are, from time to time, directed by Order in Council:

"And whereas in the Regulations for the Government of Your Majesty's Navy, and in sundry Orders in Council, provision is made for the grant to Officers, subject to certain conditions, and during certain limited periods, of sick leave on full pay:

"And whereas in sundry Orders in Council provision is made, subject to certain con-

ditions, for the grant of non-effective pay during periods of unemployment to Officers of the Royal Navy and Royal Marines at rates dependent upon their rank and service:

"And whereas under the Instructions for Royal Marine Divisions Officers of the Royal Marines, who are maintained at the public expense in a Naval Hospital during full-pay sick leave, are liable to deduction from their full pay while so maintained:

"And whereas we are of opinion that it is desirable in certain respects to modify the said Regulations for the period of the present War:

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council, to sanction the Regulations contained in the Schedule annexed hereto, with effect for the periods defined therein.

"The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in these proposals.

" SCHEDULE.

"1. Permanent and Temporary Officers, except those signed on Articles T.124 and its variants, may, at the discretion of the Admiralty, be borne on Ships Books for full-pay sick leave for a period not exceeding 12 months when the disability or sickness is certified to be

due to causes beyond the Officer's own control, provided that there be a reasonable probability of return to duty.

"2. No Naval or Marine Officer below the rank or relative rank of Flag Officer, who is temporarily unemployed, but has a definite liability for further active service, to be discharged to non-effective pay or to shore without pay, as the case may be, except:—

(a) after the maximum period of full-pay sick leave has been exhausted, and

(b) when unemployed at his own request, or owing to misconduct, or to refusal of employment, or to disability due to causes within his own control.

"3. Officers of the Royal Navy and Royal Marines placed on half pay under the preceding Regulation to receive, if more beneficial to them than the rate of half pay prescribed under existing Regulations, half pay of 5s. a day.

"4. Hospital stoppages in no case to be enforced against Marine Officers on full pay in cases of injury or sickness attributable to military service whether in the field or otherwise.

"5. These Regulations shall have effect, at the discretion of the Admiralty, as regards Clause 1 from the 1st October, 1917, until a date not exceeding 12 months after the cessation of Hostilities, as regards Clauses 2 and 3 from the 1st October, 1917, until the conclusion of Hostilities, and as regards Clause 4 from the 1st March, 1918, until a date not exceeding 18 months after the cessation of Hostilities."

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed.

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

"Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted, *inter alia*, that all pay, pensions, or other allowances in the nature thereof, payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being, or having been, an Officer, Seaman, or Marine therein, shall be paid in such manner, and subject to such restrictions, conditions, and provisions, as are, from time to time, directed by Order in Council:

"And whereas by the Officers of the Royal Naval Reserve Act, 1863, it is enacted, *inter alia*, that the Admiralty may enrol Officers of Reserve to the Royal Navy under and subject to such Rules, Orders and Regulations as the Admiralty may, with the consent of Your Majesty in Council, from time to time establish:

"And whereas by the Regulations for the Royal Naval Reserve (Officers) it is provided

that Royal Naval Reserve Officers of or below the rank of Commander shall, when employed on Navigating Duties in Your Majesty's Fleet, receive an allowance of 4s. or 2s. 6d. a day, according to their Rank and Mercantile Marine Qualifications:—

"And whereas we consider that certain service in the Royal Navy should also be allowed to count towards the qualifying service for such Allowances:

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council, to approve of the present Regulations as to the payment of Navigating Allowance being amplified as follows:—

(1) Royal Naval Reserve Officers appointed for Navigating Duties who are not fully qualified under Article 101 of the Royal Naval Reserve Regulations (Officers) for the 4s. rate of Navigating Allowance, to be eligible to receive Navigating Allowance at the rate of 4s. a day provided that in each case:—

(a) The Officer's Rank is not lower than that of Lieutenant:

(b) He has served for a period of 3 years as Navigating Officer in one or more of Your Majesty's Ships:

(c) Payment of the Allowance at the rate of 4s. a day is recommended by the Commanding Officer.

(2) Royal Naval Reserve Officers who possess an Extra Master's Certificate to be allowed to count all 'Active Service' during the War towards the 3 years qualifying service required under Article 101 of the Royal Naval Reserve Regulations (Officers) for the higher rate of 4s. a day.

(3) Royal Naval Reserve Officers who are not fully qualified under Article 102 of the Royal Naval Reserve Regulations (Officers) to be allowed to count all 'Active Service' during the War towards the one year's qualifying service required for payment of Navigating Allowance at the rate of 2s. 6d. a day.

"The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in these proposals."

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed.

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

And whereas it has been made to appear that the fees specified in the Schedule hereto are reasonable and proper:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by virtue of the power vested in Him by the said Act, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, is pleased to direct that the fees specified in the Schedule hereto annexed shall be taken accordingly in substitution for the fees specified in the Schedule to the Order in Council dated the 21st day of December, 1907.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the 33rd and 34th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 39, and of the Acts therein mentioned, that is to say, the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 113, the Act of the 4th and 5th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 39, and the Act of the 31st and 32nd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 114, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme, bearing date the 27th day of June, 1918, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

“We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 33rd and 34th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 39, and of the Acts therein mentioned, that is to say, the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 113, the Act of the 4th and 5th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 39, and the Act of the 31st and 32nd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 114, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for effecting a transfer of the ownership of the Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the Church and Cure (hereinafter called ‘the said Benefice’) of Purbrook, in the County of

Southampton, and in the Diocese of Winchester:

“Whereas the Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Purbrook is vested in the Rector or Incumbent for the time being of the Rectory of the Parish of Farlington, in the said County of Southampton, and in the said Diocese of Winchester:

“And whereas the Reverend Arthur James Richards, Rector of the said Parish of Farlington, is desirous that the whole Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Purbrook, now vested in him, as aforesaid, as such Rector or Incumbent, should be transferred to and be vested in the Bishop for the time being of the said Diocese of Winchester:

“And whereas the Right Reverend Edward Stuart, now Bishop of the said Diocese of Winchester, is willing to accept such transfer, and in token of such his willingness, and also in token that the same transfer has that consent of the Bishop of the Diocese which, by the Acts in the hereinbefore mentioned Act recited, or by some or one of them, is made necessary, he, the said Edward Stuart, Bishop of the said Diocese of Winchester, has executed this Scheme as hereinafter mentioned:

“And whereas the transfer of the Patronage of the said Benefice of Purbrook, which is hereinbefore mentioned, and hereinafter recommended and proposed, will, in our opinion, tend to make better provision for the Cure of Souls in the Parish in or in respect of which the right of Patronage or Advowson, so recommended and proposed to be transferred as aforesaid, arises or exists, that is to say, in the New Parish of Purbrook:

“Now, therefore, with the consent of the said Arthur James Richards, Rector or Incumbent of the said Parish of Farlington, acting as such Rector or Incumbent, (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this Scheme), and with the consent of the said Edward Stuart, Bishop of the said Diocese of Winchester, (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme, and sealed the same with his Episcopal Seal), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly recommend and propose that upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme, and without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order, the whole Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Purbrook, now vested in him, the said Arthur James Richards, as such Rector or Incumbent of the said Rectory of Farlington as aforesaid, shall be transferred from him, the said Arthur James Richards, and from his Successors, Rectors or Incumbents of the said Rectory of Farlington, to the said Edward Stuart, Bishop of the said Diocese of Winchester, and his Successors, Bishops of the same Diocese, and shall thereupon and thenceforth become and be absolutely vested in, and shall and may from time to time be exercised by, the said Edward Stuart, Bishop of the said Diocese of Winchester, and by his Successors, Bishops of the same Diocese for ever.

“And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any further or other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the

provisions of the said Acts, or of any of them, or of any other Act of Parliament."

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Winchester.

THE HORSES ORDER No. 2, 1918, DATED JULY 18TH, 1918, MADE BY THE BOARD OF TRADE UNDER REGULATIONS 2F AND 2JJ OF THE DEFENCE OF THE REALM REGULATIONS.

The Board of Trade, deeming it expedient to make further exercise of the powers conferred upon them by Regulations 2F and 2JJ of the

Defence of the Realm Regulations, hereby order as follows:—

1. In this Order the expression Omnibus means a vehicle in which passengers are carried for hire and which is constructed to carry more than six persons including the driver, and includes a char-a-banc, wagonette, brake, stage-coach or carriage constructed as aforesaid.

2. No person shall drive a horse or cause or permit any horse to be driven in an omnibus except—

(a) While plying for hire upon any route on which it was regularly accustomed to run during the month of March 1918 or upon any route which is certified by the Chief Officer of Police for the area in which such route is situate to be necessary or desirable in the interest of the Travelling Public.

(b) For conveying passengers, luggage or goods to or from a railway station or port in connection with a journey by rail or sea.

(c) For the conveyance of workmen to or from their work.

(d) For the conveyance of sick or injured persons from one hospital, nursing or convalescent home to another, or between such a place and their residences.

(e) For the carriage of mails.

(f) On any sudden or urgent necessity where life or limb is or may be endangered.

(g) For any purpose for which permission in writing has been granted by the Controller of Horse Transport.

3. Nothing in paragraph 2 (a) of this Order shall prevent one omnibus being substituted for another on the same route, but so that the total number of omnibuses plying on the same route be not increased.

4. This Order does not apply to Ireland.

5. Infringements of this Order are summary offences against the Defence of the Realm Regulations.

6. This Order may be cited as the Horses Order No. 2, 1918, and shall come into force on July 25th, 1918.

THE HAY AND STRAW ORDER, No. 2 1918, DATED JULY 18TH 1918, MADE BY THE BOARD OF TRADE UNDER REGULATION 2F AND 2JJ OF THE DEFENCE OF THE REALM REGULATIONS.

The Board of Trade deeming it expedient to make further exercise of the powers conferred upon them by Regulations 2F and 2JJ of the Defence of the Realm Regulations for the purpose of regulating and maintaining the supply of hay and straw, hereby order as follows:—

1. This Order applies to all horses in Great Britain except those mentioned in the first Schedule.

2. No person without the consent in writing of the Controller of Horse Transport shall feed or cause or permit to be fed any long hay to any horse to which this Order applies.

3. No person without such consent as afore-

said shall feed or cause or permit to be fed to any such horse any chaff except in accordance with the scale set out in the second Schedule.

4. No chaff shall be fed to any such horse which contains less than one-third of straw.

5. No person shall manufacture or sell any chaff containing less than one-third of straw.

6. Any person in possession of a horse to which this Order applies shall keep a record in writing showing (1) the number and class of horses kept by him; (2) the total maximum daily ration of chaff authorised by this Order; (3) the description and quantity of chaff fed to such horse each week; (4) the description and quantity of all hay and straw and chaff purchased by him and the date of such purchase. Such records shall at all reasonable times be open to the inspection of an Officer of Police or any person authorised by the Controller of Horse Transport.

7. No straw shall be used for the purpose of bedding horses.

8. In this Order "Horse" includes a mare, gelding, colt, filly, pony, mule and ass. "Hay" includes clover. "Chaff" means any chopped hay or straw.

9. This Order shall come into effect on 25th July 1918.

10. The Hay and Straw Order 1918 is hereby revoked.

11. Infringements of this Order are summary offences against the Defence of the Realm Regulations.

12. This Order may be cited as the Hay and Straw Order No. 2 1918.

THE COCOA AND SWEETMEAT BOX AND ADVERTISEMENT ORDER, 1918, DATED THE 19TH DAY OF JULY, 1918, MADE BY THE BOARD OF TRADE UNDER REGULATIONS 2 F AND 2 JJ OF THE DEFENCE OF THE REALM REGULATIONS.

The Board of Trade deeming it expedient to make further exercise of their powers under the Defence of the Realm Regulations as respects paper, hereby order as follows:—

PART I.—COCOA, CHOCOLATE AND SWEETMEAT BOXES.

1. No person shall import or manufacture Flanged, Domed or Padded lid boxes for the purpose of packing chocolates or other sweetmeats; and no person shall use any such box for the purpose aforesaid, unless such box was manufactured before the date of this Order.

2. No person shall use for the manufacture of boxes for the packing of chocolates or other sweetmeats any description of cardboard exceeding in substance the undermentioned scale:—

Scale.

For $\frac{1}{4}$ -lb. boxes: 8 oz. strawboard (22 in. by 32 in.) or its equivalent in grey board caliper, .020.

For $\frac{1}{2}$ -lb. boxes: 10 oz. strawboard (22 in. by 32 in.) or its equivalent in grey board caliper, .027.

For 1-lb. boxes: 12 oz. strawboard (22 in. by 32 in.) or its equivalent in grey board caliper, .032.

For 2-lb. boxes: 14 oz. strawboard (22 in. by 32 in.) or its equivalent in grey board caliper, .038.

For 3-lb. boxes: 18 oz. strawboard.

For 4-lb. boxes: 18 oz. strawboard.

The lids of any such boxes shall not exceed 1 in. in depth.

3. No person shall use any box for the packing of chocolates or other sweetmeats made of board which exceeds in substance the foregoing scale.

4. No person shall use any description of cardboard exceeding 12 oz. substance (22 in. by 32 in.) for the manufacture of boxes to be used as outer packings (hereinafter called Outers) for chocolates or other sweetmeats, and no lid of any such Outer shall exceed 1 in. in depth.

5. No person shall use any Outer made of cardboard exceeding 12 oz. substance (22 in. by 32 in.) for the purpose referred to in the last paragraph.

6. No person shall use for packing Cocoa Powder in packets (oblong or square) board exceeding the following scale:—

For packets containing up to $\frac{1}{4}$ lb. net weight of cocoa board calipering .018 of an inch.

For packets containing up to $\frac{1}{2}$ lb. net weight of cocoa board calipering .023 of an inch.

For packets containing up to 1 lb. net weight of cocoa board calipering .029 of an inch.

For packets containing up to 2 lbs. net weight of cocoa board calipering .035 of an inch.

For round containers (spiral or otherwise wound) containing up to 2 lbs. net weight of Cocoa, the finished thickness must not exceed .070, and for larger containers con-

taining up to 7 lbs. net weight of Cocoa the finished thickness must not exceed .090.

7. No person shall use any packet or container for the packing of cocoa powder which exceeds in substance the foregoing scale.

8. No person shall use any description of cardboard or paper exceeding a substance of 270 lbs., 36 by 45, 480 sheets, for the manufacture of outers for the packing of tins, packets or drums containing cocoa not exceeding 3 lbs. net weight.

9. Nothing herein shall apply to the manufacture of any box or outer from board or paper which was actually in stock with the manufacturer at the date of this Order, nor to the use of boxes or outers which were actually in stock with the user or which are certified by the manufacturer to have been made from board or paper which was actually in stock with him at the date of this Order.

10. No person shall use or sell any imported box or outer, the manufacture of which would have been prohibited by this Order if made in the United Kingdom.

PART II.—ADVERTISEMENTS.

11. Nothing shall be printed upon any outer, nor shall any printed matter be used as a wrapping or in connection with any outer used for the packing of cocoa, chocolate or other sweetmeats, except a printed end label, the size of which shall not exceed 20 square inches.

12. No person shall cause to be made or printed any showcards, posters, window bills, stiffeners for packets, whether plain or printed, or any other advertising matter involving the use of paper or cardboard, relating to cocoa, chocolate or other sweetmeats, and no person shall issue or display any such advertising matter relating to the goods aforesaid, whether made or printed in the United Kingdom or abroad, unless it was actually in stock at the date of this Order with the person issuing or displaying the same.

13. Nothing in paragraph 11 of this Order shall prohibit the advertisement of an alteration in a manufacturer's packings or prices by means of a bill not exceeding 125 square inches in size.

14. No paper or cardboard shall be used in connection with any coupon gift or similar scheme for or in connection with the sale of cocoa, chocolate, or other sweetmeats.

PART III.—GENERAL.

15. In this Order "board" includes cardboard, strawboard, newsboard, woodpulp board and millboard.

16. Infringements of this Order are summary offences against the Defence of the Realm Regulations.

17. This Order may be cited as The Cocoa and Sweetmeat Box and Advertisement Order, 1918.

ADMIRALTY NOTICE TO MARINERS.

No. 872 of the year 1918.

SPECIAL INSTRUCTIONS TO MERCHANT VESSELS.

Former Notice.—No. 772 of 1918; hereby cancelled.

(1) *Information respecting War Instructions for Merchant Vessels.*

Notice is hereby given that, under the Defence of the Realm (Consolidation) Regulations, 1914, the following Order has been made by the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty and is now in force:—

The Orders contained in Admiralty War Instructions for British Merchant Ships or in any instructions or advice, confidential or otherwise, issued or given to Masters of vessels by British or Allied Naval Officers, or by other duly authorised Officers or Officials, as to routes to be taken and other precautions to be observed to avoid capture or destruction by the enemy, are to be observed even when they are in conflict with the provisions of the Regulations for preventing Collisions at Sea, and every vessel observing such regulations, instructions or advice shall be deemed to be taking measures to meet "special circumstances" within the meaning of Article 27 of the Regulations for preventing Collisions at Sea.

(2) *Caution as to obeying Orders received from H.M. Ships, etc.*

The attention of all Masters or other persons in command or charge of vessels is directed to the duty of obeying promptly and strictly all orders, whether by way of signal or otherwise, given by any Officer in Command of any of His Majesty's Ships or by any Naval or Military Officer engaged in the defence of the coast. Cases have been reported to the Admiralty in which British Merchant vessels have wilfully disregarded the Orders given by Patrol Boats, &c., and it is therefore considered necessary to remind all persons concerned of the penalties provided for such acts of disobedience.

Where vessels neglect to obey Orders so given the person in charge is liable to prosecution under the Defence of the Realm (Consolidation) Regulations, 1914, and upon conviction to be fined £100 or imprisoned for six months or, where the disobedience was of an aggravated kind, to suffer both penalties.

It should also be noted that failure to obey orders may necessitate the seizure and detention of the vessel, when found in any port of the United Kingdom subsequently to the time at which the act of disobedience was committed.

(3) _____

(4) *Procedure for Visit and Search of Vessels by H.M. Ships.*

In view of the danger of H.M. Ships closing vessels, apparently Neutral, British or Allied traders, but which are in reality German raiding cruisers, it is necessary to adopt a special Boarding procedure as a measure of precaution.

When it is desired to put into force the special Boarding procedure it will be as follows:—

A red pendant of a specially large size will be hoisted by the man-of-war exercising the right of visit and search. The hoisting of this pendant will be accompanied by the firing of a rocket. This will signify that the merchant ship is to close the boat lowered by the man-of-war, whether the man-of-war remains in the vicinity of the boat or not.

(5) *Regulations with regard to Vessels' Lights.*

Notice is hereby given that, under the Defence of the Realm (Consolidation) Regulations, 1914, the following Order has been made by the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, and is now in force:—

(a) In areas in which submarines and/or raiders are likely to be met, which areas are defined in war instructions for British merchant ships or within such limits as may be defined by officers responsible for the issue of route instructions at home or abroad, and

(b) In areas other than those above mentioned, whenever information is received by war warnings, or otherwise, that submarines and/or raiders are operating.

(1) Vessels are to be carefully darkened from sunset to sunrise. No light of any description shall be exposed in any vessel so as to be visible outboard or to reflect upwards, other than navigation lights at such times and in such circumstances as they are authorised to be shewn by this Order, and lights which are necessary for signalling purposes.

Any Naval Officer whom the Senior Naval

Officer of the Port may appoint for the purpose, may board any vessel entering the port to inspect the means provided for the screening and shading of lights as this Order requires. The Master of such vessel shall give facilities for such inspection and shall, if the Inspecting Officer so requires, sign a certificate to the effect that adequate means of screening lights are provided on board.

(2) *Navigation lights* must be dimmed to a visibility not exceeding two miles.

Subject to any directions given under paragraph 8 hereof, they are only to be exhibited (a) for avoiding collision, in which case they are to be extinguished as soon as the danger of collision is past; (b) when exceptional circumstances make their use absolutely necessary.

They must be so arranged that they can be instantly shewn when required to be exhibited.

(3) *Masthead lights.* No masthead light of a brilliancy exceeding $2\frac{1}{2}$ candle power at its source is to be exhibited. Dioptric lenses and reflectors are to be removed from the lanterns, and lights are to be shaded with plain opal glass.

One masthead light only is to be used, and this light is never to be used unless the Master considers it absolutely necessary.

The use of masthead lights is to be discontinued until provision has been made for their being reduced in accordance with this Order.

(4) *Side lights.* No side light of a brilliancy exceeding eight candle power at its source shall be exhibited. Dioptric lenses and reflectors are to be removed from the lanterns, and the lights are to be shaded with plain coloured glass.

Ships with electric lamps are to carry five candle power bulbs for use when specially ordered.

Oil side lamps are only to be exhibited if electric lights are not available.

(5) *Stern lights.* No stern light of a brilliancy exceeding $2\frac{1}{2}$ candle power at its source shall be exhibited. Dioptric lenses and reflectors are to be removed from the lanterns, and lights are to be shaded with plain opal glass.

Stern lights are to be electric where electric light is installed, and are to be controlled from the bridge.

In vessels where electric light is not installed, an oil lamp or electric torch of equivalent brilliancy may be substituted.

Stern lights are not to be exhibited when navigation lights are ordered to be shewn unless stern lights are definitely mentioned in the order.

Stern lights are only to be exhibited (a) for the purpose of avoiding a collision, in which case they are to be extinguished as soon as the danger of collision is passed, or (b) in accordance with any directions given under paragraph 8 hereof.

Vessels in convoy when ordered to exhibit a stern light are to have such light screened so as to shew not more than three points from the right astern on each quarter.

(6) *Dimmers.* In ships fitted with dimmers, bulbs of a higher candle power may be used, but lights are not to be shewn of a brilliancy exceeding that stated in this Order, except in special circumstances, such as imminent danger of collision, thick weather, or while navigating in and entering or leaving any harbour; such

ships are to be supplied with bulbs of the prescribed candle power, which are to be inserted and used in the lamps should the dimmers fail from any cause.

(7) *Anchor lights.* The visibility of anchor lights is not to exceed one mile.

No electrically lit lanterns are to be used as anchor lights, except in vessels carrying volatile oil or spirits in bulk.

All anchor lanterns are to be fitted with overhead screens, so arranged as to cut off the light at an angle of between 20 and 25 degrees above the horizontal.

NOTE.—Specimen screens can be viewed at the Board of Trade Surveyors' Offices at Leith, North Shields, Hull, Plymouth, Cardiff, Liverpool, Glasgow, and Dublin.

(8) Notwithstanding the foregoing provisions of this Order, the Senior Naval Officer or Naval Officer in Charge at any port of the United Kingdom may give instructions either general or special for the shewing of such navigation, anchor or other lights in waters within his jurisdiction, as he may consider necessary for the safety of shipping in such waters.

In waters other than those last mentioned, the Senior Naval Officer present on board any of H.M. ships or any Naval Officer appointed for the purpose may give directions either general or special for the exhibition of any lights he may require to be shewn.

(9) The owner of every vessel shall provide for fitting and maintaining on board the vessel the equipment of lights prescribed hereby, including adequate means of controlling, shading and screening navigation and anchor lights and all other lights on board which require to be screened to enable the vessel to be thoroughly darkened, and if any owner fails so to provide, he shall be guilty of an offence against the Defence of the Realm Regulations.

The Master, Officer, member of the crew, passenger or any other person on board any vessel who is affected by any of the provisions of this Order and fails to comply therewith shall likewise be guilty of an offence.

(10) This Order shall apply to vessels of every description other than H.M. ships or hospital ships, except that it shall not apply to a vessel not being a British vessel where the non-compliance with this Order takes place on the high seas outside the territorial waters adjacent to the United Kingdom.

Note.

This Notice is a revision of the former Notice quoted above.

Caution.

Sections (1) and (5) of this Admiralty Notice to Mariners are issued under the provisions of the Defence of the Realm (Consolidation) Regulations, 1914, and failure to comply strictly with the directions contained in them will constitute an offence against those Regulations.

Any person found guilty of such an offence is liable to severe penalties, both of imprisonment and fine.

Any person aiding or abetting the commission of such an offence is himself guilty of an offence against the Regulations.

Attention is also drawn to the fact that any infringement of the directions contained in sections (1) and (5) of this Admiralty Notice to

Mariners is liable to result in the detention of the ship or vessel.
