

so admitted, take the oath of allegiance in the usual form :

Provided that a person who has in any capacity whatsoever previously taken the oath of allegiance and makes a declaration of that fact in such manner as the Treasury direct shall not be required to take the oath again under this regulation.

(2) Without prejudice to the power of any other persons to administer an oath, the oath under this regulation may be administered to the persons required to take the same by such persons, or persons of such class, as in England the Lord Chancellor, in Scotland the Lord Advocate, and in Ireland the Lord Chancellor for Ireland, may direct.

(3) For the purpose of securing compliance with the requirements of this regulation a record shall be kept in every Government department of the persons by whom the oath of allegiance is taken under this regulation and of the persons who are exempt from the requirements of this regulation by reason of having previously taken the oath.

(4) In this regulation the expression 'oath' includes affirmation as respects a person who is permitted by law to make a solemn affirmation instead of taking an oath."

**PRESENT,**

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

**WHEREAS** it is provided by section six of the *Juries Act, 1918*, that His Majesty may by Order in Council modify in such manner as He thinks advisable for the purpose of avoiding unnecessary expense and labour any of the provisions of the *Juries Act, 1825*, and the *Juries Act, 1862*, as to the preparation of the lists of men qualified and liable to serve as jurors, so as to provide that any such list may be prepared by altering or supplementing the last previous list and as to the place and manner of the publication thereof :

Now, therefore, His Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

1. (1) The overseers, instead of proceeding in manner directed by section eight of the *Juries Act, 1825*, shall make out the jury list for their respective parishes and townships as follows:—

The overseers shall take a copy of the jury list in force for the current year (in this Order referred to as "the existing list") and shall strike out therefrom the names of all such persons appearing therein as are dead or have removed from the parish or township or are otherwise not qualified and liable to be included in the list for the parish or township, and shall then proceed to make out a supplemental jury list in which shall be included the names of all persons qualified and liable to be included in the jury list for the parish or township whose names are not included in the existing list.

The overseers shall make out the supplemental list in the same form as is prescribed with respect to jury lists by section eight of the *Juries Act, 1825*, as amended by any subsequent enactment.

(2) The existing list revised as aforesaid and the supplemental list made out as aforesaid shall be read together as if the names in the supplemental list were inserted in proper alphabetical order in their proper places in the existing list revised as aforesaid, and shall together constitute the jury list for the parish or township.

2. The overseers, instead of fixing a copy of the jury list upon the principal door of every church, chapel and other public place of religious worship in manner required by section nine of the *Juries Act, 1825*, shall before the first Sunday in September deposit or exhibit the jury list at such place in the parish as they think most suitable for the purpose of enabling persons desirous of so doing to inspect the same, and shall on the first three Sundays in the month of September fix upon the principal door of every church, chapel or other public place of religious worship within the parish or township a notice stating that the jury list has been made out and specifying the place at which the list is deposited or exhibited in accordance with the provisions of this Order, and attention shall be called in the notice to the fact that liability for jury service has been extended by section five of the *Juries Act, 1918*, to persons between the ages of sixty and sixty-five.

3. Every inhabitant of the parish or township shall at any time during the three first weeks in September be entitled to inspect the jury list free of charge.

4. The precept to be issued under section four of the *Juries Act, 1862*, shall be in the form set out in the Schedule to this Order instead of in the form set out in the Schedule to that Act.

5. The clerk of the peace shall, as soon as may be after this Order comes into force, issue to all persons to whom he is required to issue a precept by section four of the *Juries Act, 1862*, a precept in the form set out in the Schedule to this Order (subject to the modification of dates and periods of time necessary to give effect to the provisions contained in the next succeeding paragraph of this Order) and shall at the same time give them notice that any precept which has been issued for the current year is to be regarded as cancelled and that they shall accordingly make out the jury list in accordance with the precept in the new form.

6. As regards the year nineteen hundred and eighteen the dates or periods of time specified in the first column of the annexed table shall respectively be substituted for the dates or periods of time specified in the second column of that table, being dates or periods of time mentioned in the enactments or the provisions of this Order specified in the third column of that table.
