PRESENT.

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the 8th and 9th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 70, of the Act of the 14th and 15th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 97, and of the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 55, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Representation, bearing date the 10th day of January, 1918, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

is to say:—
"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 8th and 9th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 70, of the Act of the 14th and 15th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 97, and of the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 55, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Representa-

tion as to the assignment of a Consolidated Chapelry to the Consecrated Church of All Saints, Streetly, situate within the Parish of Great Barr, in the County of Stafford, and in the Diocese of Lichfield:

"Whereas at certain extremities of the said Parish of Great Barr, and of the New Parish (sometime Consolidated Chapelry) of Saint Peter, Little Aston, in the said County and Diocese, which said extremities lie contiguous one to another, and are described in the Schedule hereunder written, there is collected together a population which is situate at a distance from the several Churches of such Parish and New Parish respectively:

"And whereas it appears to us to be expedient that certain contiguous portions (being the portions containing the population aforesaid) of the said Parish of Great Barr, and of the said New Parish of Saint Peter, Little Aston, should be formed into a Consolidated Chapelry for all ecclesiastical purposes, and that the same should be assigned to the said Church of All Saints, Streetly, situate as aforesaid.

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend John Augustine, Bishop of the said Diocese of Lichfield, as such Bishop, with the consents of the Most Honourable James Edward Hubert Gascoyne, Marquess of Salisbury, and the Right Honourable George Nathaniel, Earl Curzon of Kedleston, as the Patrons of the Vicarage of the said Parish of Great Barr, and with the consents of William Robert Parker-Jervis, of Meaford Hall, Stone, in the said County of Stafford, Esquire, of the Reverend Percy Edward Mainwaring, of the Rectory, Whitmore, in the said County of Stafford, Clerk in Holy Orders, of William Swynfen Whitehall Parker-Jervis, of Meaford Hall aforesaid, a Major in Your Majesty's Army, and of Edward Mainwaring Parker-Jervis, of Whiston Grange, Albrighton, Wolverhampton, a Major in Your Majesty's Army, as the Patrons of the Vicarage of the said New Parish of Saint Peter, Little Aston, (in testimony whereof they the said consenting parties have respectively signed and sealed this Representation), We, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly represent that it would, in our opinion, be expedient that all those contiguous portions of the said Parish of Great Barr, and of the said New Parish of Saint Peter, Little Aston, which are described in the Schedule hereunder written, all which portions, together with the boundaries thereof, are delineated and set forth on the Map or Plan hereunto annexed, should be united and formed into one Consolidated Chapelry for the said Church of All Saints, Streetly, situate as aforesaid, and that the same should be named 'The Consolidated Chapelry of All Saints, Streetly.

"We, therefore, humbly pray that Your Majesty will be graciously pleased to take the premises into Your Royal Consideration, and to make such Order in respect thereto as to Your Majesty in Your Royal Wisdom

shall seem meet.

"The SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Representation has reference.

"The Consolidated Chapelry of All Sainte, Streetly, comprising:—

"1. All that portion of the Parish of Great Barr, in the County of Stafford, and in the Diocese of Lichfield, which is bounded upon the north by the Parish of Aldridge, in the said County and Diocese, upon the east partly by New Parish (sometime Consolidated Chapelry) of Saint Peter, Little Aston, in the said County and Diocese, and partly by the Parish of Sutton Coldfield, in the County of Warwick, and in the Diocese of Birmingham, upon the south-east by the New Parish of Saint John, Perry Barr, in the said County of Stafford, and in the said Diocese of Birmingham, and upon the remaining side, that is to say, upon the south-west, by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Saint John, Perry Barr, from the said Parish of Great Barr at the junction of the road leading from Sutton Park to Queslet with the road leading from Kingstanding Road to Aldridge, and extending thence north-westward along the middle of the last-described road for a distance of 1 mile and 64 chains or thereabouts to its junction with the road leading across Barr Common to Harborough Lane, and extending thence northwestward along the middle of the lastmentioned road for a distance of 49 chains or thereabouts to the point where it is crossed by the boundary which divides the said Parish of Great Barr from the said Parish of Aldridge.

"2. And also all that contiguous portion of the said New Parish of Saint Peter, Little-Aston, which is bounded upon the south-east by the said Parish of Sutton Coldfield, upon the south-west by the above described portion of the Parish of Great Barr, and upon the remaining side, that is to say, upon the north, by an imaginary line commencing at the point where the boundary which divides the said Parish of Great Barr from the said New Parish of Saint Peter, Little Aston, crosses the middle of the road leading from Five Ways Inn to-Four Oaks, and extending thence eastward along the middle of such road for a distance of 38 chains or thereabouts to its junction with the road leading from Streetly Railway Station to Little Aston, and extending thence in a straight line due south-east for a distance of 20° yards or thereabouts to a point on the southeastern side of the last mentioned road upon the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Saint Peter, Little Aston, from the said Parish of Sutton Coldfield."

And whereas the said Representation has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Representation, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the likeadvice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar

of the said Diocese of Lichfield.

WHEREAS His Majesty has been pleased, in exercise of the power in that behalf conferred on Him by Section one, sub-section one, of the Trading with the Enemy (Extension of Powers) Act, 1915, by divers Proclamations; and in particular by a Proclamation dated the 23rd day of May, 1916, and amended on the 16th day of January, 1918, entitled "The Trading with the Enemy (Statutory List) Proclamation," to prohibit all persons or bodies of persons, incorporated or unincorporated, resident, carrying on business, or being in the United Kingdom from trading with any of the persons or bodies of persons mentioned in the List contained in the last-mentioned Proclamation, such List being therein referred to as the Statutory List:

And whereas by Section one, sub-section two, of the said Act, it is provided that any List of persons and bodies of persons, incorporated or unincorporated, with whom such trading is prohibited by a Proclamation under the said Act may be varied or added to by an Order made by the Lords of the Council on the recommendation of a Secretary of State:

And whereas the Statutcry List contained in the last-mentioned Proclamation, has been

varied and added to by subsequent Orders of Council:

And whereas there was this day read at the Board a recommendation from the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs to the effect that the Statutory List should be further varied and added to as set forth in the Schedule hereto.

Now, therefore, Their Lordships, having taken the said recommendation into consideration, are pleased to order, and it is hereby

ordered,

That the Statutory List be varied and added to as set forth in the Schedule hereto.

Whereof the Right Honourable Arthur James Balfour, one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, the Controller of the Foreign Trade Department, and all other persons whom it may concern, are to take notice and govern themselves accordingly.

NOTE (1).—All persons or firms resident, carrying on business or being in the United Kingdom are prohibited from having, with any person or firm mentioned in this List, or in any List issued under the Trading with the Enemy (Statutory List) Proclamation, any dealings other than such as are expressly authorised by paragraph 5 of the Proclamation. A List (The Consolidated List, No. 61A) consolidating all previous Lists, revised to date and including the amendments in the Schedule annexed hereto is issued concurrently with this Order. This Consolidated List contains all the names which up to this date are included in the Statutory List.

Additions to and variations in these Lists will be published at intervals approximately of two weeks.

The Lists are published in the London Gazette and reproduced in the Board of Trade Journal, and separate copies of all Lists may be obtained at a small cost from the Superintendent of Publications, His Majesty's Stationery Office, Imperial House, Kingsway, w.c.

Note (2).-Where a person or firm mentioned in the List has more than one address in the country, or group of countries under which the name of the person or firm appears, all dealings in that country, or in any country in the group, with such person or firm are prohibited, even in cases where one only of the addresses or one only of the countries is specifically mentioned.

Note (3).—Trading is prohibited under the Trading with the Enemy Proclamations of 25 June, and 10th November, 1915, with any person or firm of enemy nationality resident or carrying on business in China, Siam, Persia, Morocco, Liberia or Portuguese East Africa. Persons or firms in the United Kingdom are therefore prohibited from trading with any person or firm of enemy nationality in any of those countries, even though such person or firm is not mentioned by name in the Statutory List.

Note (4).—In order to minimise as far as possible any inconvenience which may be caused to British traders by the dislocation of export trade owing to the inclusion in the Statutory List of a former connection, the Foreign Trade Department is collecting and classifying the names of non-enemy firms who may be able to act as substitutes for firms mentioned in the Statutory List. A considerable amount of information is already available at the Foreign Trade Department, and it is in many cases possible to suggest the names of satisfactory substitutes for individual firms on the Lists, without the necessity of referring the matter abroad. The Department is, however, prepared on application to enquire of His Majesty's Representatives abroad for the names of suitable substitutes. When the applicant wishes this done by telegraph he is required to undertake to pay the cost of telegraphic correspondence. It would greatly facilitate the work of the Foreign Trade Department if applicants in making enquiries would specify the particular trade or trades for which substitutes are required. General enquiries for new connections abroad should be addressed to The Comptroller-General, Department of Overseas Trade (Development and Intelligence), 73, Basinghall Street, London, E.C. 2.

NOTE (5).—The Statutory List for each country is telegraphed, on the day of issue, to His Majesty's Representative in that country who is instructed to notify accordingly British Consular Officers, to whom persons abroad should apply for information as to names on the List. Persons and firms in the United Kingdom with agencies or branches abroad would, however, be well advised to furnish such agencies or branches with issues of the List as they appear. The names on the Lists for all countries in Central or South America are also notified to His Majesty's Ambassador at Washington, who transmits them to H.M. Consul-General at New York and to other centres in the United States likely to be interested.

Note (6).-It is not unusual for firms in Holland and the Netherland East Indies to be

registered under names commencing with descriptive terms such as "Handel Maatschappy '' (Trading Company) or "Naamlooze Venootschap " (Limited Liability Company). In such cases it has been found more convenient to publish the firm under its proper name followed by the general descriptive term "Handel Maatschappy" or "Naamlooze Venootschap" (N.V.) as in the case of an English company. For instance, Handel Maatschappy van der Berg & Company, and Naamlooze Venootschap de Komet v/h Dumonceau Frères will be found under "Berg" and "Komeet" respectively, and not under "Handel" or "Naamlooze.

DOCKYARD PORTS REGULATION ACT, 1865.

Notice is hereby given that, after the expiration of 40 days from the date hereof, it is proposed to submit to His Majesty in Council, in pursuance of the above-mentioned Act, the Drafts of 2 Orders in Council (1) amending the Regulations made by Order in Council of the 29th February, 1868, with reference to the Dockyard Port of Deptford; and (2) repealing the Regulations made by Order in Council of the 29th February, 1868, with reference to the Dockyard Port of Woolwich.

The KING has been pleased by Letters Patent under the Great Seal to present The Rev. Arthur Godolphin Pentreath, D.D., to the vicarage of Saint Bartholomew, Stamford Hill, in the County of Middlesex and Diocese of London, void by the resignation of the last Incumbent, and in His Majesty's Gift in full right belonging.

Whitehall, 3rd August, 1918.

His Majesty has been graciously pleased to award the Edward Medal to Thomas Jones under the following circumstances:

On the 19th November, 1917, a fall of roof occurred at the Cwm Cynon Colliery, Glamorganshire, as a result of which a boy was pinned down by a stone weighing 12 cwt. It was obvious that another fall was imminent; but notwithstanding this Jones at once stood over the boy, and with his back supported a stone which was about to fall on the boy, and would have killed him. A further fall would have killed him. A further fall occurred, fortunately without injuring Jones. Jones supported the stone as long as possible; but as he weakened, it fell, seriously injuring him, but missing the boy.

Unfortunately, the boy, after being extri-cated, died of his injuries.

Jones undoubtedly risked his life in attempting to save that of the boy, and his courage and initiative prevented the fall upon the boy of a stone which would have instantly killed him.

Also to Robert Farrington, Henry Foster, and Thomas Pickering for gallantry in endeavouring to save the life of a fireman who was overcome by gas at the Deep Pit, St. Helen's Collieries:

On the 26th February, 1918, a fireman, Peter Anders, was inspecting a place where a level was being driven to cut off a brow, and he went round the brow to test the progress of the work by knocking on the coal. Unfortunately, gas had accumulated in the brow owing to the brattice cloth by which it was ventilated being broken down by a fall of coal. Anders was overcome by the gas, and his groanings brought several men to the place where he lay, which was in complete darkness, as it was dangerous to use any light. Pickering, a jigger, first tried to rescue the fireman, but, though he succeeded in getting hold of Anders, he could not release the fireman's legs, which were fastened round a prop, and he was overcome with gas, though he managed to roll clear. Henry Foster, a collier, then tried to rescue Anders, but was in turn overcome by the gas and fell senseless. Pickering made a second attempt, without success. In the meantime, Robert Farrington, the under-manager, arrived and immediately went into the gas, but fell unconscious after two attempts, though he managed to grasp Foster's legs. Pickering then succeeded in grasping Farrington, who had kept his hold on Foster, with the result that both were rescued. Foster was brought round by artificial respiration. The position of Anders was ascertained with the help of an electric lamp, and, as soon as the ventilation was restored, Anders was also brought out, but life was, unfortunately, extinct.

Also to John Morris and Peter Cummings under the following circumstances:—

On the 10th December, 1917, while engaged on repair work at the Giffnock Collieries, a fireman entered a place which was known to be dangerous owing to firedamp, and was overcome. Three men attempted, without taking any precautions, to rescue him, and were themselves rendered unconscious. Morris and ·Cummings then crawled on hands and knees into the dangerous space, and succeeded in rescuing three of the unconscious men in three They then entered a ·separate journeys. fourth time, followed by two others; but on reaching the body of the fourth victim they found that the two who had followed them were themselves partly overcome, and had to They then entered a fifth time, be removed. and recovered the body of the remaining man, who, however, was dead.

THE RAW COTTON (PRICES AND RETURNS)
ORDER, 1918, DATED 29TH JULY, 1918, MADE
BY THE BOARD OF TRADE UNDER REGULATIONS
2F, 2G AND 2JJ OF THE DEFENCE OF THE REALM
REGULATIONS.

The Board of Trade deeming it expedient to make further exercise of the powers conferred upon them by Regulations 2F, 2c and 2JJ of the Defence of the Realm Regulations as respects raw cotton, hereby order as follows:—

1. For the purpose of this Order there shall be appointed by or under the authority of the Board of Trade, Official Values Committees.

2. The Official Values Committees shall fix and notify daily or at such other intervals as may be determined by the Board of Trade the official value of such classes of raw cotton as the Board of Trade may require them respec-

tively so to do.

3. The spot prices ruling in the Southern States of America in the case of American Cotton, and in Alexandria in the case of Egyptian Cotton, shall be taken as the basis of official value, and to this shall be added approximate cost of transportation, insurance, placing in warehouse in Liverpool or Manchester, and such profit and other charges, if any, as the Board of Trade may from time to time allow.

4. The official value for other growths of cotton shall be fixed either by reference to the cost in the country of origin with the additions aforesaid, or if the Board of Trade so direct, by reference to the official value of the nearest grade of cotton, either American or Egyptian, for which an official value has been fixed.

5. Where any person desires to buy or sell raw cotton of a grade and growth for which no official value is published on the Liverpool Cotton Exchange, he shall apply to the competent Committee, who shall thereupon fix an official value for that grade and growth.

6. The maximum price at which raw cotton may be bought or sold shall not exceed by more than 5 per cent. the official value last fixed for

the cotton.

7. If any seller on application to the Competent Official Values Committee proves to their satisfaction that the cost to him of the cotton he proposes to sell, together with the charges mentioned in paragraph 3 of this Order, exceeds the maximum price hereby authorised, the Committee may authorise such increase in price as they deem reasonable, but save as aforesaid, no person shall buy or sell raw cotton at a price exceeding the maximum

price as herein provided.

8. All persons who buy or sell raw cotton of any growth either at spot prices or for forward delivery shall make a return of every such purchase or sale under such conditions and at such time and in such form and giving such particulars as the Official Values Committees may require. The Official Values Committees may issue instructions, which shall be posted in the Liverpool Cotton Exchange, and communicated to the Manchester Cotton Association, and of which notice may be given in any other manner that the said Committee think fit as to the making of such returns and as to the preservation of samples upon which sales are made, and redraws, and may vary such instructions from time to time, and may call for further returns or information and require the

production of such samples or redraws, either generally or in any particular case, and all persons shall obey such instructions. The Manchester Cotton Association shall post such instructions in the Manchester Royal Exchange.

9. No person shall pay for cotton imported or to be imported into the United Kingdom for his own use or consumption or for purposes other than for sale by him in the United Kingdom a price which, with the addition of the charges (including the sum allowed to a seller for profit) mentioned in paragraph 3 of this Order, would exceed the maximum price allowed to be charged for a sale of such cotton in the United Kingdom under this Order, provided that such person may apply under paragraph 7 hereof for leave to pay a higher price. A person so importing cotton other than for sale into the United Kingdom shall apply to the Competent Official Values Committee under paragraph 5 to fix its official value when an official value has not been published on the Liverpool Cotton Exchange, and shall make a return of any purchase made by him in accordance with paragraph 8 hereof, and shall otherwise be subject to the provisions of and regulations under this Order as if the cotton were imported for sale.

10. The Official Values Committees shall obey any instructions which the Board of Trade may give as to the fixing notification and return of official values, and as to any other duties which the Board may require them to perform

relating to the sales of raw cotton.

11. The Official Values Committees may make their own rules of procedure for hearing any application or matter under paragraphs 5, 7, 8, and 13 of this Order, and may charge fees to be approved by the Board of Trade on any hearing other than a hearing under paragraph 13. The Arbitration Act, 1889, shall not apply to proceedings before or hearings by the Committees. No person shall wilfully make any false statement or representation or put forward any false document at the hearing of any such application or matter.

12. The provisions of this Order apply only to dealings in actual raw cotton and not to dealings which are commonly known on the Liverpool Cotton Exchange as dealings in futures.

- 13. Proceedings for infringements of this Order shall not be taken against any person the direction of the Attorneyby General) except by the direction of the Board of Trade upon a report from the Competent Official Values Committee. Before reporting any person to the Board of Trade the said Committee shall hear such person if he so In any proceedings under this Order a certificate of the Competent Official Values Committee, under the hand of the Chairman, as to the grade and growth of any particular cotton referred to in such proceedings, and as to the official value for such cotton, shall be conclusive as to the matters stated in such certificate.
- 14. Infringements of this Order are Summary offences under the Defence of the Realm Regulations.
- 15. The Raw Cotton (Prices) Order, 1917, and the Raw Cotton (Return of Sales) Order, 1918. are hereby revoked.
- 16. This Order may be cited as the Raw Cotton (Prices and Returns) Order, 1918.

THE WOOLLEN AND WORSTED (CONSOLIDATION) AMENDMENT No. 2 ORDER, 1918.

Whereas by the Woollen and Worsted (Consolidation) Order, 1917, as amended by the Woollen and Worsted (Consolidation) Amendment Order, 1918, the Army Council regulated upon certain conditions the production of goods of which Wool or any derivative thereof, or Mohair, Alpaca, Cashmere or Camel Hair is a constituent part:

And whereas it is expedient that the said

Order should be amended:

Now therefore the Army Council, in pursuance of the powers conferred upon them by the Defence of the Realm Regulations, do

hereby order as follows:

(1) No person shall at any time subsequent to the tenth day of August, 1918, without a permit issued by or on behalf of the Director of Wool Textile Production, sell or deliver to any Woollen Manufacturer any Woollen Spinner's or Woollen Manufacturer's Thread Waste or Hosiery Waste, or any Woollen Manufacturer's Thrums, Clippings or Cleaning Waste, or Fud Waste, or any Woollen or Worsted Blanket Ends, or any Worsted Spinner's Scotch Laps, Spinning Waste or Brush Waste, or any Worsted Manufacturer's Sweeping Waste, or Fly Waste, or any Wool Comber's Roller Lappings, or any Persian Laps, Spinning Waste or Brush Waste, or any Angola Waste, or any Worsted Spinning or Manufacturer Waste, or any Worsted Spinning or Waste, or any Worsted Spinning or Waste, or any Wast Hosiery Waste containing any Wool, or any Blends or Material wholly or partly composed of any Waste of any of the foregoing descriptions, or at prices other than prices relative to the prices set out in Schedule "C" annexed

to the Woollen and Worsted (Consolidation) Order, 1917, or such other prices as in any particular case may be determined by or on behalf of the Director of Wool Textile Production; provided that no provision herein contained as to price shall be deemed to refer to any sale authorised by or on behalf of the Director of Wool Textile Production to be made for Civil purposes.

(2) No person shall at any time subsequent to the tenth day of August, 1918, without a permit issued by or on behalf of the Director of Wool Textile Production, make a blend of any Waste of the foregoing descriptions or of any description indicated in Schedule "C" annexed to the Woollen and Worsted (Con-

solidation) Order, 1917.
(3) Upon any application for a permit under the last preceding Clause it shall be the duty of the applicant to submit to the Director of Wool Textile Production a sample containing 8 ounces of the material in question.

(4) All persons having in their custody or control any Waste of the description referred to in Clause 1 shall furnish such particulars as to their business as may be required by or on behalf of the Director of Wool Textile Production

(5) No person shall, without a permit issued by or on behalf of the Director of Wool Textile Production, sell for export any Waste of the description indicated in Clause 1, or any Blends or material wholly or partly composed thereof.

(6) The said Order may be printed with the foregoing Clauses numbered consecutively from Clause 16 to Clause 20, and with Clauses 16 and 17 of the said Order, numbered as Clauses 21 and 22 respectively.

(7) This Order may be cited as the Woollen and Worsted (Consolidation) Amendment

PROHIBITION OF THE LIFTING OF HAY AND STRAW IN THE ISLE OF MAN.

1. In pursuance of the powers conferred on them by the Defence of the Realm Regulations, the Army Council hereby give notice that all hay, oat straw and wheat straw, now standing in bulk in the Isle of Man or as and when harvested, is taken possession of by the Army Council, and shall from the date of this Order, or as and when harvested, be held at the disposal of the duly authorised officers of the War Department.

2. Applications to enable hay, oat straw or wheat straw to be sold, used or consumed by Producers, and applications for licences by Dealers to resell, must be made to the District Purchaing Officer, Edinburgh House, Loch

Promenade, Douglas.

3. All Licences or Authorities issued under this Order will be issued subject to the restrictions and conditions contained in such Licences or Authorities; any departure from these conditions or other act in contravention of the provisions of this Order will be an offence "under the Defence of the Realm Regulations and render the offender liable to the penalties

.attaching thereto.

4. Detailed instructions regarding necessary procedure to be adopted by all desiring to use, sell, purchase or remove hay or oat straw or wheat straw must be made to the District Purchasing Officer mentioned in paragraph 2 hereof.

5. The Army Council Order, dated 17th July, 1917, prohibiting the lifting of hay in Great Britain, Ireland and the Isle of Man, is hereby cancelled, in so far as it relates to the
