Greeting!

Whereas We have deemed it expedient that a Commission should forthwith issue to consider and report whether it is advisable to make

any changes in the denominations of the currency and money account of the United Kingdom with a view to placing them on a decimal basis, and whether, if an alteration of the present system is recommended, it is desirable to adopt with or without modification the proposals embodied in the Bill recently introduced into the House of Lords by Lord Southwark or some other Scheme, and in the latter alternative to make specific recommendations for consideration by Parliament:

Now know ye, that We, reposing great trust and confidence in your knowledge and ability, have authorized and appointed, and do by these Presents authorize and appoint you, the said Alfred, Baron Emmott (Chairman); Richard Knight, Baron Southwark; Edmund Beckett, Baron Faber; Thomas Gair, Baron Ashton of Hyde; William Hesketh, Baron Leverhulme; Sir Richard Vassar Vassar-Smith; Sir Joseph Larmor; Sir George Croydon Marks; Sir Alfred William Watson; John Westerman Cawston; Sydney Armitage Smith; Charles Godfrey; James Bell; Joseph Burn; Harold Cox; George Hayhurst; Theodore McKenna; Geoffrey Marks; James Francis Mason; Albert Smith; George Murray Smith; and Gilbert Christopher Vyle to be Our Commissioners for the purpose of the said inquiry.

And for the better effecting the purpose of this Our Commission, We do by these Presents give and grant unto you, or any five or more of you, full power to call before you such persons as you shall judge likely to afford you any information upon the subject of this Our Commission; and also to call for, have access to and examine all such books, documents, registers and records as may afford you the fullest information on the subject, and to inquire of and concerning the premises by all other lawful ways and means whatsoever.

And We do by these Presents authorize and empower you, or any of you, to visit and personally inspect such places as you may deem it expedient so to inspect for the more effectual carrying out of the purpose aforesaid.

And We do by these Presents will and ordain that this Our Commission shall continue in full force and virtue, and that you, Our said Commissioners, or any five or more of you, may from time to time proceed in the execution thereof, and of every matter and thing therein contained, although the same be not continued from time to time by adjournment.

And We do further ordain that you, or any five or more of you, have liberty to report your proceedings under this Our Commission from time to time, if you shall judge it expedient so to do.

And Our further will and pleasure is that you do, with as little delay as possible, report to Us under your hands and seals, or under the hands and seals of any five or more of you, your opinion upon the matter herein submitted for your consideration.

Given at Our Court at *Saint James's*, the Twenty-sixth day of *August*, one thousand nine hundred and eighteen, in the ninth year of Our Reign.

The KING has been pleased to award the Albert Medal in each of the following cases in recognition of gallantry displayed in saving or endeavouring to save life:—

Lieutenant Richard Walker Buswell, Cheshire Yeomanry (temporary Captain, Royal Air Force).

On the 31st May, 1918, Captain Buswell was flying at Yatesbury, when he saw another machine sideslip to the ground and burst into flames. He flew to the spot and landed; and seeing that the pilot, who was enveloped in flames, was still living, he dashed into the fire and endeavoured to rescue him. Several attempts had already been made to reach the pilot, but owing to the very intense heat they were unsuccessful. Captain Buswell, however, managed to get hold of the pilot's clothes, which, being in flames, came away in his hand. He then procured a belt and succeeded in extricating the pilot, but was too late to save his life.

Lieutenant Arthur Richard Waddams, Indian Army Reserve of Officers.

In Mesopotamia, in November last, Lieutenant Waddams was instructing a class in firing rifle grenades. While a private of the 85th Burmans was under instruction, the rifle missed fire and the detonator of the grenade started working without the grenade leaving the rifle. Lieutenant Waddams, realising the danger, rushed forward, and, pushing back the soldier, seized his rifle with one hand and the grenade with the other, and tried to throw it over the wall before it exploded. Unfortunately, the grenade exploded in his hand and he received fatal injuries. The soldier whose life Lieutenant Waddams saved was only slightly injured.

Lance-Corporal John Edward Bigland and *Sapper Thomas Henry Woodman*, of the Royal Engineers; and *Sapper (acting Company Sergeant-Major) Alfred Henry Furlonger*, D.C.M., *Sapper Joseph Collington Farren*, and *Sapper George Edward Johnston*, late of the Royal Engineers.

In Flanders, on the 30th April, 1918, a train of ammunition had been placed at an ammunition refilling point, and after the engine had been detached, and was being run off the train, the second truck suddenly burst into flames. Furlonger immediately ordered Bigland, the driver, to move the engine back on to the train for the purpose of pulling away the two trucks nearest the engine. Bigland did so without hesitation, and the engine was coupled up by Furlonger, assisted by Farren, while the burning truck was uncoupled from the remainder of the train by Woodman. The two trucks were then drawn away clear of the ammunition dump, it being the intention to uncouple the burning wagon from the engine and the first wagon, and so isolate it, with the object of localising the fire as far as possible. The uncoupling was about to be done when the ammunition exploded, completely wrecking the engine and both trucks, killing Furlonger, Farren and Johnston (a member of the train crew), and seriously wounding Bigland. Had it not been for the prompt and courageous action of these men, whereby three of them lost their lives and one was seriously injured, there

is not the slightest doubt that the whole dump would have been destroyed and many lives lost.

Lance-Corporal Sidney Williams, 1/6th Battalion, London Regiment.

In France, on the 4th January last, a soldier dropped a lighted match in a dug-out which had been used as a store for gunpowder. Although most of the gunpowder had been removed, there was a considerable amount scattered on the floor, which caught fire. The soldier was overcome by the fumes, and in spite of the volumes of smoke issuing from the dug-out, Lance-Corporal Williams entered the dug-out and rescued the soldier, who was then badly burned and unconscious. Williams, who was severely burned, had to carry the man up twenty steps, and, if it had not been for his prompt action, the man would have lost his life.

Private James Dunn, Coldstream Guards.

At a railhead in France, on the evening of the 12th June, 1918, several trucks loaded with heavy ammunition caught fire, causing an explosion. Several men were wounded, and some lay underneath the burning trucks. Dunn at once rushed forward, regardless of his own safety, and carried two of the wounded men to a shelter trench close by, where he rendered them first aid. He then returned to the assistance of the other wounded men, when a second explosion took place. Notwithstanding this, and also the very grave danger of further explosions, he continued to assist the wounded and to help to rescue those who were lying helpless under the burning trucks. His bravery, coolness and prompt action undoubtedly saved several men from being burned to death.

The KING has been graciously pleased to award the Decoration of the Albert Medal upon Mr. Charles McKenzie, a chief officer in the Mercantile Marine.

A violent explosion, followed by a fire, occurred in one of the holds of the steamship in which Mr. McKenzie was serving, which had a cargo of petroleum and case oil. Four men were in the hold at the time, and received serious injuries.

Mr. McKenzie, who was on duty at the top of the hold, immediately rushed down, regardless of the possibility of further explosions, found the ship's carpenter, and assisted him to a sling, by means of which the man was hauled up on deck. Mr. McKenzie then searched the hold again and rescued a seaman in the same way. Both men, however, subsequently died of their injuries.

Mr. McKenzie also found the third man, who was badly burnt, and assisted him to mount the ladder. The fourth man managed to escape by his own exertions.

ARMY COUNCIL ORDER.

THE HOSIERY (RESTRICTION OF MANUFACTURE) ORDER, 1918.

In pursuance of the powers conferred upon them by the Defence of the Realm Regulations, the Army Council hereby order as follows:—

1. No person shall without a permit issued by or on behalf of the Director of Wool Textile Production, at any time after the 31st day of August, 1918, use for the Manufacture of any Hosiery or Fabric, any machinery of the description indicated in the Schedule annexed.

2. This Order may be cited as the Hosiery (Restriction of Manufacture) Order, 1918.

SCHEDULE.

All Cottons Patent machines up to and including 26 gauge having a needle bed, each division of 16 inches and wider.

All plain circular fabric machines, of a wider diameter than 8 inches, up to and including 14 needles to the inch.

All ribbed circular fabric machines, of a wider diameter than 8 inches, up to and including 10 needles to the inch (the cylinder needles only should be included).

All hand flat knitting machines or power-driven or Lamb frames of any width needled, up to and including 14 needles to the inch.

All plain circular machines, power and hand, for the manufacture of hose, half hose and gloves of a diameter of $3\frac{3}{4}$ inches and over, and up to and including 176 needles in the circumference.

All X.L. Ribbed machines of a diameter of $3\frac{3}{4}$ inches up to and including 144 needles.

ARMY COUNCIL ORDER.

DEFENCE OF THE REALM REGULATIONS.

REGULATION OF THE SALE OF HAY AND STRAW, AND CHOPPED HAY AND STRAW IN ENGLAND AND WALES.

Whereas by Order of the 20th August, 1918, the Army Council, in pursuance of the powers conferred on them by the Defence of the Realm Regulations, did regulate the price of Hay and Straw and Chopped Hay and Straw in England and Wales.

And whereas it is desired to amend the said Order of the 20th August, 1918.

Now, therefore, in pursuance of the powers conferred on them by the Defence of the Realm Regulations, and all other powers thereunto enabling them, the Army Council hereby cancel sections (e) and (g) of paragraph 2, Schedule 3, of the said Order of 20th August, 1918, and substitute the following two sections (e) and (g) in lieu thereof:—

(e) In the case of Straw tied by hand in bundles with two strings or bands, instead of the sum mentioned in paragraph 2 (b), the sum of 14s. per ton.

(g) In the case of Straw baled or bundled with two or more wires or strings behind the threshing drum, instead of the sum mentioned in paragraph 2 (b), the sum of 10s. per ton.

And the Army Council do hereby Order that after section (b) in paragraph 3, Schedule 3, of the said Order of the 20th August, 1918, the following two sections (c) and (d) shall be added:—

(c) All costs of storage by County Distributing (Forage) Committee.

(d) All costs of storage on premises occupied by Dealers at rates approved by the County Distributing (Forage) Committee of the County in which such premises are situate.

And the Army Council do further Order that the price of Rye Straw shall be the same as the price of Oat Straw as laid down in the said Order of 20th August, 1918.

Save as aforesaid nothing in this Order shall affect the said Army Council Order of the 20th August, 1918.

CORN PRODUCTION ACT, 1917.**AGRICULTURAL WAGES BOARD (ENGLAND AND WALES).****MINIMUM RATES OF WAGES FIXED FOR MALE WORKMEN IN SUSSEX TO COME INTO FORCE ON THE 2ND SEPTEMBER, 1918.**

The Agricultural Wages Board (England and Wales), duly established and constituted under Section 5 (1) of the above Act and the Regulations made by the Board of Agriculture and Fisheries dated the 8th November, 1917, having given the Notice prescribed by the said Act, and having considered all objections duly lodged with them, and having had regard to the provisions of sub-sections (6) and (7) of the said Section, hereby give Notice, as required by sub-section (4) of the said Section and by paragraph 4 of the Agricultural Wages Regulations, 1918, that they have fixed the following minimum rates of wages and the following differential rates for overtime employment, as hereinafter defined, for male workmen employed in agriculture for time-work in the area comprising the administrative counties of East Sussex and West Sussex, and the county boroughs of Brighton, Eastbourne and Hastings, and have defined, for the purpose of the application of such differential rates for overtime, the employment which is to be treated as overtime employment as follows, that is to say:—

1. The wages payable for employment in summer (as hereinafter defined) of male workmen in agriculture shall be not less than wages at the following minimum rates, that is to say:—

For male workmen of 21 years of age and over, 32s. for 54 hours.

For male workmen of 18 and under 21 years of age, 30s. for 54 hours.

2. The wages payable for employment in winter (as hereinafter defined) of male workmen in agriculture shall be not less than wages at the following minimum rates, that is to say:—

For male workmen of 21 years of age and over, 32s. for 48 hours.

For male workmen of 18 and under 21 years of age, 30s. for 48 hours.

3. Provided that where a whole-time workman is employed by the week or any longer period the wages payable to him for the hours of work agreed between him and the employer in any week (excluding hours of overtime employment) shall not be less than the respective amounts set out in Clauses 1 and 2 above, notwithstanding that those hours are less than 54 in summer or 48 in winter.

4. The differential rates for overtime employment shall be as follows:—

A. In respect of overtime employment on week-days:—

For male workmen of 21 years of age and over, 9d. per hour.

For male workmen of 18 and under 21 years of age, 8½d. per hour.

B. In respect of overtime employment on a Sunday:—

For male workmen of 21 years of age and over, 11d. per hour.

For male workmen of 18 and under 21 years of age, 10d. per hour.

5. For the purpose of the above rates the following employment is defined as overtime employment, that is to say:—

(a) All employment in summer in excess of 54 hours in any week (excluding Sunday).

(b) All employment in winter in excess of 48 hours in any week (excluding Sunday).

(c) All employment on a Sunday.

6. For the purpose of the above rates employment in summer shall be deemed to be employment during the period commencing on the first Monday in March and terminating on the last Sunday in October, and employment in winter shall be deemed to be employment during the rest of the year.

7. The above rates shall apply to all male workmen of 18 years of age and over who are wholly or partly employed in agriculture within the meaning of Section 17 (1) of the Corn Production Act, 1917, in the above-mentioned area during such time as they are so employed.

8. For the purpose of the above rates the hours of work shall not include meal times, but shall include any time during which, by reason of weather conditions, an employer has prevented from working a workman who was present at the place of employment and ready to work.

9. The above rates shall come into operation on the second day of September, 1918.
