expedient to exercise any of those powers for the purpose of encouraging, maintaining or regulating the supply of any such article which is required by the Public or by any section of the Public or which is otherwise required for the Public Safety or Defence of the Realm, and those Regulations shall apply accordingly."

WHEREAS by an Order in Council dated the 7th day of October, 1899, and made under the provisions of the Burial Act, 1853, it was (amongst other things) ordered that burials in the Parish of Marden, in the County of Hereford, should be discontinued as follows, viz.:-

Forthwith and entirely in the Parish Church of Marden, in the said County of Hereford, and also in the portion of the Churchyard situated to the west of a line drawn across it from North to South at the east wall of the Apse:

And whereas by the Burial Act, 1855, it is, amongst other things, provided that it shall be lawful for His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, from time to time to vary any Order in Council made under (amongst others) the Burial Act, 1853, as to His Majesty, with such advice as aforesaid, may seem fit:

And whereas the Local Government Board, after giving to the Incumbent and the Churchwardens of the said Parish of Marden ten days' previous notice of their intention in that behalf, have made a Representation to His Majesty in Council that, for reasons of public health, so much of the said Order in Council of the 7th day of October, 1899, as relates to burials in the Parish Church and the Churchyard of Marden aforesaid, should be varied so as to provide that burials should be discontinued forthwith and entirely in the said Churchyard as existing at that date. Provided that in any vault or walled grave now existing in the portion of the said Churchyard which was not closed for burials by the said Order in Council burial may be allowed subject to the condition that every coffin buried in such vault or grave be separately enclosed by stonework or brickwork properly cemented:

Now, therefore, His Majesty in Council is pleased hereby to give Notice of such Representation, and to order that the same be taken into consideration by a Committee of the Privy Council, on the 8th day of November

And His Majesty is further pleased to direct that this Order be forthwith published in the London Gazette, and that copies thereof be affixed on the doors of the Churches or Chapels of, or on some conspicuous places within, the Parish affected by such Representation one month before the said 8th day of November.

WHEREAS it is provided by Section 2 of the Customs (Exportation Prohibition) Act, 1914, that any Proclamation or Order in Council made under Section 8 of the Customs and Inland Revenue Act, 1879, as amended by the Act now in recital, may, whilst a state of war exists, be varied or added to by an Order made by the Lords of the Council on the recommendation of the Board of Trade:

And whereas it is provided by Section 2 of the Customs (Exportation Restriction) Act, 1914, that any Proclamation made under Section 1 of the Exportation of Arms Act, 1900, may, whether the Proclamation was made before or after the passing of the Act now in recital, be varied or added to, whilst a state of war exists, by an Order made by the Lords of the Council on the recommendation of the Board of Trade:

And whereas by a Proclamation, dated the 10th day of May, 1917, and made under Section 8 of the Customs and Inland Revenue Act, 1879, and Section 1 of the Exportation of Arms Act, 1900, and Section 1 of the Customs (Exportation Prohibition) Act, 1914. the exportation from the United Kingdom of certain articles to certain or all destinations was prohibited:

And whereas by subsequent Orders of Council the said Proclamation was amended and added to in certain particulars:

And whereas by the said Proclamation as subsequently amended it was provided interalia that the exportation of goods marked "C" in the Schedule to such Proclamation should be prohibited to all destinations in European and Asiatic Russia, and in other foreign countries in Europe and on the Mediterranean, except France and French Possessions, Italy and Italian Possessions and Portugal, and to all ports in any such foreign countries.

And whereas there was this day read at the Board a recommendation from the Board of Trade to the following effect:-

That the Proclamation dated the 10th day of May, 1917, as amended and added to by subsequent Orders of Council, should be further amended by making the following addition to the Schedule to the same:

That there shall be added to the list of goods marked "C" all goods not already appearing in the list of goods prohibited to all or any destinations in the said Proclamation as amended as aforesaid, with the following exceptions:-

Printed matter of all descriptions;
Personal effects accompanied by

Now, therefore, Their Lordships, having taken the said recommendation into consideration, are pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered, that the same be approved.

Whereof the Commissioners of His Majesty's Customs and Excise, the Director of the War Trade Department, and all other persons whom it may concern, are to take notice and govern themselves accordingly.
