With reference to the announcement of the award of a Bar to the Distinguished Conduct Medal which appears in the London Gazette dated 3rd June, 1918, the following are the acts of gallantry for which the decoration has been awarded:-

959 Pte. H. Blakemore, D.C.M., Hrs. (S. Africa).

For conspicuous gallantry and devotion to duty with a fighting patrol. While the patrol leader's attention was occupied with the enemy in front, he noticed another party about to cut off the patrol on the flank. He at once made a bold bombing attack, killing three of the enemy and putting the rest to

For conspicuous gallantry and devotion to duty. During the period under review the services rendered by this warrant officer

have been of the greatest value. His personal courage and gallant example during one of our attacks inspired his exhausted men and led them to success.
