

104450 2nd Cpl. (A./Cpl.) F. Green, R.E. (Barnsley).

For conspicuous gallantry and devotion to duty. During a continuous period of two and a-half year's service with a field company he has invariably set a fine example of coolness and courage under fire to his men, and his devotion to duty in resolutely completing the work of which he was in charge, often under heavy fire, has been worthy of high praise.

15420 C.S.M. H. Green, R.W. Fus. (Chorley).

For conspicuous gallantry and devotion to duty in action, when his influence on the men has been of great service. On one occasion, when badly wounded, he struggled forward to the objective, cheering and encouraging his men, until he fell from loss of blood. In many heavy engagements, he has always performed his duty with courage and distinction.

840309 Sjt. T. W. Green, R.F.A. (Manchester).

For conspicuous gallantry and devotion to duty at all times, and notably on one occasion, when he took a prominent part in getting the guns of his battery to a forward position, and working for over six hours in the most difficult conditions, and under heavy and continuous shell fire. His courage and resource were most marked.

8779 Sjt. W. Greenleaf, R. Lanc. R. (Colchester "E").

For conspicuous gallantry and devotion to duty. He led his platoon in action throughout operations with great courage under most trying conditions, and always volunteered for any dangerous enterprise. He set a fine example by his utter disregard for his own comfort or safety.

673 C.S.M. G. H. Gridley, R. War. R. (Homerton).

For conspicuous gallantry and devotion to duty for over three and a-half years in the field. He always displayed the greatest courage and energy, and on one occasion took command of his company after all his officers had become casualties, and reorganised the men. At a later date, when with a party of stretcher-bearers under very heavy shell fire, it was entirely due to his coolness and determination that the wounded were successfully removed.

11123 Sjt. S. P. Griffen, R.E. (Southam).

For conspicuous gallantry and devotion to duty in carrying out many dangerous experiments with utter fearlessness. Most painstaking, his ingenuity has been invaluable, and the results of his work have been of the greatest importance.

810723 Bdr. E. Griffiths, R.F.A. (Cradley Heath).

For conspicuous gallantry and devotion to duty. Whilst forming one of a detachment engaged in carrying out an important shoot on the enemy's wire, the position was heavily shelled. In spite of hits on the parapet and in the gun pit, the detachment stuck to its work and successfully completed the shoot.

22631 Sjt. J. E. Grinham, R. Lanc. R. (S. Croydon).

For conspicuous gallantry and devotion to duty in the trenches, on patrol, and with wiring parties. He was a persistent volunteer for all enterprises of a dangerous nature, and has saved many casualties in his platoon during heavy bombardments by his intelligent leadership and initiative.

6688 Sjt. (now 2nd Lieut.) W. H. Grover, R.G.A. (N. Ormsby).

For conspicuous gallantry and devotion to duty. As section officer during operations lasting for a considerable period, he displayed conspicuous gallantry and ability, and his services and splendid example have at all times been of the greatest value.

68031 A./Bdr. C. Groves, R.F.A. (Slough).

For conspicuous gallantry and devotion to duty, especially during some months' heavy fighting, when as gun-layer he did most excellent work, often under trying circumstances. On one occasion he helped to put out burning ammunition in his gun pit, and later on to remove the wounded.

37089 Sjt. H. F. Gwyer, R.F.A. (Coulsdon).

For conspicuous gallantry and devotion to duty on many occasions. He has set a magnificent example to the men, and often kept his gun in action under very harassing circumstances.

99646 Sjt. W. Hale, R.E. (Parkhurst).

For conspicuous gallantry and devotion to duty when in charge of a repair party. He completed the work under heavy shell fire, and withdrew his party safely. He has conscientiously done good service.

200305 Sjt. A. Hall, Lin. R. (Lincoln).

For conspicuous gallantry and devotion to duty. This N.C.O. has performed the duties of transport serjeant for two years, and on no single occasion has he failed to get the battalion's rations up to the line, although several times subjected to heavy shell and gas bombardments.

253737 Spr. (A./L./Cpl.) E. M. Hall, R.E. (Stoke-on-Trent).

For conspicuous gallantry and devotion to duty whilst N.C.O. in charge of signal personnel. He repeatedly showed great coolness and contempt of danger in repairing telephone lines under fire. He did excellent service.

23/613 Sjt. T. Halligan, North'd Fus. (Chopington).

For conspicuous gallantry and devotion to duty as C.S.M. He rendered invaluable assistance, and under intense shell fire his coolness and courage did much to instil confidence into his men at times of great danger.

12/17822 Sjt. J. Hamilton, R. Ir. Rif. (Carrickfergus).

For conspicuous gallantry and devotion to duty in action. During the last three years he has served continuously, and taken part in four offensives, and shown marked courage and excellent command of his men on each occasion. He has also done good work on many patrols.
