**W**HEREAS by an Order in Council, dated the twenty-eighth day of November, nineteen hundred and fourteen, His Majesty was pleased to make regulations (called the "Defence of the Realm Regulations") under the Defence of the Realm Consolidation Act, 1914, for securing the public safety and the defence of the realm:

And whereas the said Act has been amended by the Defence of the Realm (Amendment) Act, 1915, the Defence of the Realm (Amendment) (No. 2) Act, 1915, and the Munitions of War Act, 1915, and other enactments:

And whereas the said regulations have been amended by various subsequent Orders in Council:

And whereas it is expedient further to amend the said regulations in manner hereinafter appearing:

Now, therefore, His Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, that the follow-

ing amendments be made in the said regulations:—

1. In Regulation 2E for the words, "sell or repair any article the sale or repair whereof," there shall be substituted the words, "sell, repair, or deliver any article the sale, repair, or delivery whereof."

2. In paragraph (e) of subsection (1) of Regulation 9AA after the words, "His Majesty's Forces," there shall be inserted the words, "or of the Forces of any of His Majesty's Allies."

3. After Regulation 39c the following Regulation shall be inserted:—

"39gg (1) Notwithstanding anything in the Merchant Shipping Acts, 1894 to 1916, the registry of a British ship registered in the United Kingdom which has been constructively lost shall not be considered as closed unless the Board of Trade so direct.

(2) If the Board of Trade after considering the case of any such ship as aforesaid determine to give no such direction as aforesaid, they shall forthwith give notice of their determination to the registrar of shipping at the ship's port of registry, and the registrar shall thereupon transmit the ship's certificate of registry to the owner of the ship."

4. In Regulation 45EE after the word "eighteen," where that word first occurs, there shall be inserted the words "a clerical or administrative officer," and after the word "serve" there shall be inserted the words "as such an officer."

5. Regulation 51 shall be amended as follows:—

(1) The words "in contravention of Regulation 27 or Regulation 27A" shall be omitted.

(2) For the words "or where a leaflet has been printed in contravention of Regulation 27c," there shall be substituted the words "or a leaflet has been printed in contravention of any of these Regulations."

6. Regulation 51A shall be amended as follows:—

(1) For the words "against Regulation 18 or Regulation 27 or Regulation 27A" there shall be substituted the words "against these Regulations has been or."

(2) After the words "or that preparations" there shall be inserted the words "have been or."

(3) After the words "type or other" there shall be inserted the words "plant or."

(4) For the words "in a condition adapted for use in the production of such copies" there shall be substituted the words "capable of being used in the production of such copies or of the publication in which the information, report or statement has appeared or is about to appear."

(5) After the words "should not be destroyed" there shall be inserted the words "detained or otherwise disposed of."

(6) After the words "to be destroyed" there shall be inserted the words "or detained until further order."

(7) For the words "Summary Jurisdiction (Ireland) Acts" there shall be substituted the words "Summary Jurisdiction Act, 1857."

(8) At the end of the regulation the following paragraph shall be inserted:—

"For the purposes of this regulation a court of summary jurisdiction shall, in the police district of Dublin Metropolis, be constituted of a divisional justice of that district, and elsewhere in Ireland of a resident magistrate sitting alone."

WHEREAS by the Aliens Restriction Order His Majesty in exercise of the powers conferred upon Him by the Aliens Restriction Act, 1914, has been pleased to impose restrictions on aliens and to make various regulations for the carrying of those regulations into effect:

And whereas it is expedient further to extend the provisions of that Order in manner hereinafter appearing:—

Now, therefore, His Majesty is pleased, by

and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

1. The following paragraph shall be substituted for paragraph (b) of sub-section (1) of Article 19 and for paragraph (b) of sub-section (1) of Article 20c:—

"(b) he shall, if he is about to effect a change of residence, whether permanent or temporary, furnish to the registration officer of the registration district in which he is then resident particulars as to the date on which his residence is to be changed and as to his intended place of residence, and if the change of residence, whether permanent or temporary, involves a move from one registration district to another he shall also forthwith report to the registration officer of the registration district into which he moves his arrival in that district."

2. The following sub-section shall be inserted after sub-section (4) of Article 19 and after sub-section (2) of Article 20c:—

"A registration officer may, subject to the general or special instructions of a Secretary of State, exempt any alien resident in his district, so far as temporary changes of residence are concerned, from compliance with the provisions of this Article relating to the furnishing of particulars in case of an intended change of residence and the reporting of arrival on effecting a change of residence."

The sub-section so to be inserted as aforesaid shall be numbered (5) in Article 19 and (3) in Article 20c, and sub-section (5) of Article 19 and sub-section (3) of Article 20c shall be renumbered accordingly.

WHEREAS by an Order in Council, dated the 10th January, 1910, and known generally as the Civil Service (Consolidating) Order in Council, 1910, and hereinafter referred to as the "Principal Order," it is provided that, with certain provisions and exceptions, the qualifications of all such persons as may seek or be proposed for appointment to any situation or employment in any of His Majesty's Civil Establishments shall, before they are so appointed, be tested by or under the directions of the Civil Service Commissioners, and that no person (save as excepted thereby) shall be appointed to any such Establishment until a Certificate of his qualification shall have been issued by the Civil Service Commissioners declaring that he has satisfied them, among other things, that he is free from any physical defect or disease which would be likely to interfere with the proper discharge of his duties:

And whereas it is expedient that the said requirement should be modified with respect to officers, holding pensionable situations, and having been appointed with a certificate of qualification, who may be proposed for promotion or transfer to situations for which a further certificate of qualification is required:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, doth order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

(1) When an officer holding a pensionable situation, and having been appointed with a certificate of qualification, is nominated by the head of a Department for the issue of a further certificate of qualification in respect of his promotion in the same Department, or of his transfer to another Department, the Commissioners may grant their certificate of qualification on being satisfied that he is fully qualified in respect of age, character, knowledge, and ability, without requiring evidence that he fulfils the condition as to freedom from physical defect or disease specified in Clause 3 of the Principal Order, provided they are satisfied that the situation to which he is promoted or transferred does not require a higher degree of physical capacity than the situation which he already holds.

(2) An officer of any of the classes known as Women Clerks, Writing Assistants, Sorting Assistants, Shorthand-writer Typists, and Typists, appointed after examination under rules common to two or more Departments may, with the consent of the Commissioners, be transferred from one Department to a similar situation in another, without a further certificate of qualification.

**W**HEREAS by the Isle of Man (War Legislation) Act, 1914, His Majesty has power to extend to the Isle of Man any Act which, in the opinion of His Majesty, was passed for the purpose of meeting any emergency created by the present War, subject to adaptations for the purpose of making the Act applicable to the Isle of Man:

Now, therefore, His Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, that the Parliament and Local Elections Act, 1918, shall extend to the Isle of Man, adapted as set out in the Schedule hereto.

#### SCHEDULE.

1.—(1) The next statutory elections of Members, as defined by Section 3 of the Elections and Registration (Isle of Man) Act, 1915, shall, subject to the limitations herein-after contained, be postponed, or, in the case of elections already postponed under the Elections and Registration (Isle of Man) Act, 1915, the Local Elections (Isle of Man) Act, 1916, or the Local Elections (Isle of Man) Act, 1917, further postponed, for a year; and the term of office of the existing Members shall accordingly be extended, or further extended, by one year.

This provision shall apply only where the next statutory election (whether a postponed election or not) would take place before the 1st day of November, 1918.

(2) Section 2 of the Elections and Registration (Isle of Man) Act, 1915, and Paragraphs (2) to (7) (inclusive) of the Schedule to the Local Elections (Isle of Man) Act, 1917, subject to the substitution in Paragraph (6) of 4 years for 3 years as the period by which the term of office of an Alderman of a municipal Borough is extended, shall be deemed to be incorporated in this Section as though they were set out therein, and expressly made applicable to the provisions thereof.

2. This Act may be cited as the Local Elections (Isle of Man) Act, 1918.

#### REPRESENTATION OF THE PEOPLE ACT, 1918.

##### REGISTRATION EXPENSES—ENGLAND AND WALES.

In pursuance of the powers conferred upon Us by Section 15 of the Representation of the People Act, 1918, We, being two of the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, hereby prescribe that the scale of registration expenses framed by Us on 7th March, 1918, shall in respect of the first register under the Act be modified as follows, viz.:—

(1) For the purpose of estimating the Registration Officer's fee under paragraphs 1 (a), 2 (a) and 3 (a) of the aforesaid scale the number of Electors included in the Absent Voters' Lists may be counted in addition to the number of Electors appearing in the Registers.

(2) In any case in which the Registration Officer is satisfied that, owing to the expenditure necessarily incurred by an Assistant Overseer for assistance, the amount available for his personal remuneration under 1 (b) or 2 (b), as the case may be, of the aforesaid scale is inadequate, the Registration Officer may, subject to a formal certificate that he is so satisfied, having regard both to the amount of work personally performed by the Assistant Overseer and to the amount which he has been required to expend for assistance, pay to him an additional amount not exceeding 25 per cent. of the amount allowed under the paragraphs above referred to.

(3) Nothing in this Order shall affect the provisions of the Treasury Order of 10th September, 1918.

#### DEFENCE OF THE REALM.

COAL MINES (WAR WAGE PAYMENT) SUPPLEMENTARY DIRECTIONS, 1918, ISSUED BY THE BOARD OF TRADE, PURSUANT TO REGULATION 9G OF THE DEFENCE OF THE REALM REGULATIONS DATED THE TWENTY-SECOND DAY OF OCTOBER, 1918.

Whereas the Board of Trade, on 5th day of July, 1918, issued certain directions intituled "Coal Mines (War Wage Payment) Directions, 1918," respecting the payment of a war wage to Colliery workers and the means of providing for such payment.

And whereas the Board of Trade deem it expedient to issue further directions with regard to the matters aforesaid.

Now, therefore, the Board of Trade pursuant to the powers conferred upon them by Regulation 9G of the Defence of the Realm Regulations direct that:—

1. The Owner of every coal mine to which Regulation 9G applies for the time being shall

pay to the Controller of Coal Mines the sums mentioned in the schedule hereto in addition to that mentioned in paragraph (1) of the said directions of 5th July, 1918, and in preparing and keeping the accounts of the said mine these payments shall be treated as an expense of the business.

2. These Directions shall be read together with the said Directions of 5th July, 1918.

#### THE SCHEDULE.

In respect of Ironstone worked with Coal 4s. per ton of Ironstone.

In respect of all work performed at a Colliery by workers in receipt of the War Wage with the consent of the Controller of Coal Mines on or about the getting of Limestone, Fireclay, Ganister, Silicia and Brick Clay or on or about the making of Bricks or any other work not in respect of Coal or Ironstone as above, such sum as will reimburse the Board of Trade for the amount of the War Wage paid to such workers.

#### THE CENSUS OF HORSES ORDER, 1918.

Whereas it appears expedient to the Board of Trade to exercise the powers vested in them by Regulations 2JJ and 2G and by Regulation 2JJJ of the Defence of the Realm Regulations as respects horses:

Now, therefore, the Board of Trade, in exercise of their said powers and of all other powers them enabling, hereby order as follows:—

1. Any person who on the third day of November, 1918, is the owner of any horse or ass within Great Britain shall, on or before the thirteenth day of November, 1918, make a Return to the Board of Trade in the form set out in the schedule hereto, giving the information specified in such form with regard to every such horse or ass owned by him on the third day of November, whether in his possession on that day or not.

2. Where horses or asses are stabled or kept in more than one place in a county borough or municipal borough or urban district the owner may include in one return all horses and asses owned by him and stabled in the same borough or district.

Where horses or asses are stabled elsewhere than in a county borough or municipal borough or urban district the owner may include in one return all horses or asses owned by him in the same county.

No return shall refer to more than one borough, urban district or county as the case may be.

3. For the purpose of this Order "Horse" shall include mare, gelding, colt, filly, pony and mule.

4. Failure to make a Return, or the making of an untrue Return, or the supplying of false information, are summary offences against the Defence of the Realm Regulations.

5. This Order may be cited as the Census of Horses Order, 1918.

## CENSUS OF HORSES, 3RD NOVEMBER, 1918.

1. All owners of horses, mules and asses are required under the Defence of the Realm Regulations to fill up one of these forms (in duplicate) giving the required particulars in respect of all horses (including foals and yearlings) and of all mules and asses owned by them on November 3rd, 1918.

2. Horses loaned out, or sent for sale but not yet sold, or supplied under contract must be accounted for by the actual owner or his

representative, and not by the person in whose charge they are.

3. If the owner is notified that the Return will be called for he must complete the Return and hand it to the constable or other representative of the Chief Officer of Police who calls for it.

If the owner is not so notified he must complete the Return and forward it within three days of receipt to the Police Station named on back of the form.

## ORDER.

## RETURNS AS TO RUBBER.

The Minister of Munitions, in exercise of the powers conferred upon him by the Defence of the Realm Regulations, and all other powers thereunto enabling him, hereby orders as follows:—

1. All persons shall, on or before the 7th day of November, send in to the Controller of Rubber, Ministry of Munitions, 1, Grosvenor Place, London, S.W. 1, a return in accordance with the schedule hereto of all raw rubber and all waste and reclaimed rubber situated in the United Kingdom in their possession or under their control on the 31st day of October, 1918.

Notwithstanding the above, no return is required from any person whose total stock of rubber in his possession or under his control on the 31st day of October, 1918, shall not exceed one ton.

2. The said return shall be verified by the signature of the person required to furnish the same, or where such person is a firm or corporation, by the signature of a partner, director or other responsible officer.

3. This Order may be cited as the Rubber (Returns) Order, 1918.

THE IMPORTED FLAX SEED  
(CONTROL) NOTICE, 1918.

The Minister of Munitions, in exercise of the powers conferred upon him by the Defence of the Realm Regulations, and of other powers thereunto enabling him, hereby gives notice and orders as follows:—

1. He hereby gives notice of an intention to take possession of all Fibre Sowing Flax Seed imported, or to be imported, into Ireland at any time subsequent to the 28th day of September, 1918.

If after this notice any person, without the consent of the Minister of Munitions, sells, removes, or secretes any seed of the description aforesaid, or deals with it in any way contrary to any conditions imposed in any licence, permit or order that may have been granted in respect thereof he shall be guilty of an offence against the said Regulations.

2. It shall be the duty of the importer of any seed of the description aforesaid to furnish to the Administrator, Flax Supplies Committee, Belfast, full particulars thereof upon the arrival of any such seed in the United Kingdom.

3. This Order may be cited as the Imported Flax Seed (Control) Notice, 1918.

THE RESCUTCHED TOW No. 2 ORDER,  
1918.

The Minister of Munitions, in exercise of the powers conferred upon him by the Defence of the Realm Regulations and all other powers thereunto enabling him, hereby gives notice and orders as follows:—

1. He hereby takes possession as and from the date hereof of all Rescutched Tow off Flax of the 1918 crop grown in Ireland.

2. The Rescutched Tow, of which possession is hereby taken under paragraph 1, will be divided under the directions of the Director General of Aircraft Production into three grades, according to its quality, handling and cleaning, and the Minister will pay therefor the following prices, except as may be determined otherwise in terms of clause 4 hereof:—

First Grade.—£135 per ton delivered at nearest Railway Station to appointed destination.

Second Grade.—£125 per ton delivered at nearest Railway Station to appointed destination.

Third Grade.—£115 per ton delivered at nearest Railway Station to appointed destination.

Fine Tow which is not Rescutched, Pluckings, Dressings, and Rescutched Tow which is inferior in quality to that of the Third Grade hereinbefore mentioned, will be paid for according to their relative values.

3. Any person having in his possession or having under his control any Rug, Rescutched Tow, Pluckings, or Dressings off the Flax of

the 1917 crop or previous years grown in Ireland, should, within two weeks from the date of this Notice and Order, make a return showing his stocks as at the date of this Order, of all such Rug, Rescutched Tow, Pluckings, or Dressings, in his possession or under his control to the Administrator, Flax Supplies Committee, Whitehall Buildings, Ann Street, Belfast, in the form prescribed by him.

4. Any person failing to make a return in the prescribed form in terms of Clause 3 hereof will only be entitled to and will only be paid for his Rescutched Tow, Fine Tow, Pluckings, or Dressings, off the 1918 Flax crop grown in Ireland in terms of the price for such off the 1917 Flax crop or previous years, as set out in Clause 2 of the Rescutched Tow Order, 1918.

5. If after this Notice and Order any person having control of any Rescutched Tow referred to hereunder sells, removes, or secretes such Rescutched Tow, except upon the terms provided in this Order, he will be guilty of an offence against the Defence of the Realm Regulations.

## DEFENCE OF THE REALM REGULATIONS.

### STERN LIGHTS.

#### ADMIRALTY ORDER.

In exercise of the powers conferred upon them by the Defence of the Realm Regulations, and all other powers thereunto enabling them, the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty hereby make the following Order:—

"The last paragraph of the section relating to Stern Lights contained in Admiralty Order dated 23rd May, 1918, and published in the London Gazette dated 28th May, 1918, which reads as follows:—

'Vessels in convoy, when ordered to exhibit a stern light, are to have such light screened so as to show not more than three points from right astern on each quarter,' is hereby cancelled and the following paragraph is to be read in lieu thereof":—

"Ships in Convoy, when ordered to exhibit a stern light, are only to show a blue stern light, screened so as to show not more than three points from right astern on each quarter."

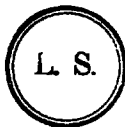
#### HEYSHAM IRISH ANIMALS LANDING PLACE ORDER OF 1918.

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1914, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do hereby revoke the Heysham Irish Animals Landing Place Order of 1914, and do hereby define the following part of the Port of Heysham as a Landing Place for Irish animals; that is to say:

The landing stages situate at Heysham Harbour, in the administrative county of Lancaster, in the occupation of the Midland Railway Company, together with all that space situate at the said Harbour which is coloured pink and green on the plan sealed by the Board of Agriculture and Fisheries for the purposes of this Order, and deposited at the office of the Board.

#### CORNWALL AND DEVON (CONTROL OF DOGS) ORDER OF 1918. (No. 8.)

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1914, the Dogs Act, 1906, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

1.—The Cornwall and Devon (Control of Dogs) Order of 1918 (No. 6), hereinafter referred to as "the principal Order," shall be

read and have effect as if the following Article were there inserted:

*"Notice of Detention in case of Illegal Movement.*

2A.—(1.) Where an Inspector or other Officer of the Board, or of a Local Authority, has reason to believe that a dog has been moved in contravention of the principal Order or of any Order thereby revoked, he may give notice to the owner or person in charge of the dog requiring that the dog shall be detained and isolated in accordance with the provisions of such notice, and that within a time specified in such notice, the dog shall be moved to a place of detention for the purpose of such detention and isolation.

(2.) Such provisions may be inserted in the notice as the Board may think necessary or desirable for any of the following purposes, namely:—

(i.) for prescribing and regulating the detention and isolation of the dog;

(ii.) for prescribing the person by whom and the premises on which the dog shall be detained and isolated;

(iii.) for regulating the movement of the dog to the place of detention;

(iv.) for prescribing the confinement of the dog in a suitable hamper, crate, box, or other receptacle, or the muzzling of the dog, during its movement by railway, or along a highway or thoroughfare;

(v.) for prescribing the mode of isolation of the dog;

(vi.) for prescribing the notice to be given of the death or loss of the dog, or of any matter arising in connection with the movement, detention, or isolation of the dog and the persons by whom and to whom the notice is to be given; and

(vii.) for prescribing the production of the notice for inspection by an officer of the Board, or police constable, or officer of the Local Authority.

(3.) The operation of a notice under this Article may be terminated by notice to that effect given by an Inspector or other Officer of the Board or of the Local Authority to the owner or person in charge of the dog, on proof to the satisfaction of the Inspector or Officer that the dog was not moved in contravention of the said Order.

(4.) If the owner or person in charge of the dog, after receipt of such notice, fails to move the dog as required by the notice, he shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

(5.) If the provisions inserted in any notice under this Article are not complied with, the owner of the dog and the person in charge of the dog and any person who being required to comply with any such provision fails to do so, shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894."

*Short Title, etc.*

2.—This Order may be cited as the Cornwall and Devon (Control of Dogs) Order of

1918 (No. 8), and shall be read with the principal Order.
