PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

**W**HEREAS by Section 26 of the Pluralities Act, 1838, after reciting that "Whereas in some instances Tithings, Hamlets, Chapelries, and other Places or Districts, may be separated from the Parishes or Mother Churches to which they belong, with great advantage, and Places altogether extra-parochial may, in some instances, with advantage be annexed to Parishes or Districts to which they are contiguous, or be constituted Separate Parishes for ecclesiastical purposes," it is, amongst other things, enacted, "That when with respect to his own Diocese it shall appear to the Archbishop of the Province, or when the Bishop of any Diocese shall represent to the said Archbishop, that any such Tithing, Hamlet, Chapelry, Place or District, within the Diocese of such Archbishop, or the Diocese of such Bishop, as the case may be, may be advantageously separated from any Parish or Mother Church, and either be constituted a Separate Benefice by itself or be united to any other Parish to which it may be more conve-

niently annexed, or to any other adjoining Tithing, Hamlet, Chapelry, Place or District, parochial or extra-parochial, so as to form a Separate Parish or Benefice, or that any Extra-Parochial Place may, with advantage, be annexed to any Parish to which it is contiguous, or be constituted a Separate Parish for ecclesiastical purposes, and the said Archbishop, or Bishop, shall draw up a Scheme in writing (the Scheme of such Bishop to be transmitted to the said Archbishop for his consideration) describing the mode in which it appears to him that the alteration may best be effected, and how the changes consequent on such alteration in respect to Ecclesiastical Jurisdiction, Glebe Lands, Tithes, Rent-Charges, and other Ecclesiastical Dues, Rates, and Payments, and in respect to Patronage and Rights to Pews, may be made with justice to all parties interested, and if the Patron or Patrons of the Benefice or Benefices to be affected by such alteration shall consent in writing under his or their hands to such Scheme, or to such modification thereof as the said Archbishop may approve, and the said Archbishop shall, on full consideration and inquiry, be satisfied with any such Scheme, or modification thereof, and shall certify the same and such Consent as aforesaid, by his Report to His Majesty in Council, it shall be lawful for

His Majesty in Council to make an Order for carrying such Scheme or modification thereof, as the case may be, into effect":

And whereas by Section 8 of the Church Building Act, 1839, it is, amongst other things, further enacted, "That when by any Order of His Majesty in Council, as aforesaid, a Separate Parish for ecclesiastical purposes is constituted, the same shall, on registration thereof, and with the Consent in writing of the Incumbent or Incumbents of the Benefice or Benefices to be thereby affected, become a Perpetual Curacy and Benefice, and the Minister thereof, duly nominated and licensed thereto, and his successors, shall be a body politic and corporate, with perpetual succession, and may receive and take to himself and his successors all such Lands, Tenements, Tithes, Rent-Charges, and Hereditaments as shall be granted unto him or them, and such Perpetual Curate shall thenceforth have, within the limits of the District Parish formed under the Church Building Acts for the Church of such Perpetual Curacy, sole and exclusive Cure of Souls, and shall not in anywise be subject to the control or interference of the Incumbent or Incumbents of the Benefice or Benefices to be affected by such Order, if he or they shall have consented to such Order as aforesaid":

And whereas the Right Reverend Edwyn, Lord Bishop of Southwell, hath made a Representation in writing, dated the 11th May, 1918, to the Right Honourable and Most Reverend Randall Thomas, Lord Archbishop of Canterbury, as follows:—

"I, Edwyn, by Divine permission Bishop of Southwell, do hereby, pursuant to the provisions of Section 26 of the Pluralities Act, 1838, represent to your Grace:—

"1. That to the Benefice (being a Vicarage) and Parish Church of Sutton-upon-Lound with Scrooby, in the County of Nottingham, and my Diocese of Southwell, belongs the ancient detached Parochial Chapelry of Scrooby, the limits and boundaries whereof are well known and ascertained, and are delineated and set forth on the *Map or Plan* annexed hereto, and thereon coloured *pink*:

"2. That the Ecclesiastical Parish and Vicarage of Sutton-upon-Lound, exclusive of the Parochial Chapelry of Scrooby, contains an area of 4,523 acres, with a population according to the last Census of 731:

"3. That the detached Parochial Chapelry of Scrooby contains an area of 1,607.833 acres, and a population according to the last Census of 243:

"4. That there is within the limits of the said detached Parochial Chapelry of Scrooby the Church of St. Wilfrid affording church accommodation for 210 persons, distant 6 miles from the Parish Church of Sutton-upon-Lound, and separated therefrom by the Ecclesiastical Parishes of Blyth and Mattersey:

"5. That Baptisms, Marriages, and Churchings, have been for the last 200 years at least and are now solemnised and performed in the said Church or Chapel of St. Wilfrid, Scrooby, and the said Chapelry is for all civil purposes a separate and distinct Parish from Sutton-upon-Lound:

"6. The gross annual value of the said Benefice of Sutton-upon-Lound with Scrooby, arising from the Glebe Lands, Tithe, Rent-

Charges, Invested Funds, and Fees, is £307 11s. 6d. or thereabouts:

"7. The Patronage of the said Benefice of Sutton-upon-Lound with Scrooby belongs to His Grace the Most Noble William John Arthur Charles James, Duke of Portland, K.G., and the Reverend Cyril Northcote Hatfield, Clerk, Master of Arts, is the present Vicar thereof:

"8. That having regard to the distance separating the Chapelry and Church of St. Wilfrid, Scrooby, from the Vicarage and Parish Church of St. Bartholomew, Sutton-upon-Lound, and to the consequent difficulty of making adequate provision for the Cure of Souls in the said Chapelry, it appears to me that the said Parochial Chapelry of St. Wilfrid, Scrooby, may, under the provisions of the Pluralities Act, 1838, with advantage to the interests of religion, be separated from the said Vicarage and Parish Church of St. Bartholomew, Sutton-upon-Lound, to the intent that the said Chapelry, together with a contiguous portion of the Parish of Harworth, hereinafter more particularly described, may be constituted one separate Parish for ecclesiastical purposes, and a Perpetual Curacy and Benefice:

"9. That there is at the extremities of the Ecclesiastical Parish and Vicarage of All Saints, Harworth, in the County of Nottingham, and my Diocese of Southwell, a District contiguous to the Parochial Chapelry of St. Wilfrid, Scrooby, and distant from the Parish Church of All Saints, Harworth. The said District, which includes within its boundaries the Mansion House and Park of Serlby and Estates belonging to the Right Honourable George Edmund Milnes, Viscount Galway, C.B., contains an area of 880 acres or thereabouts, and the limits and boundaries thereof are delineated and set forth on the *Map or Plan* annexed hereto, and thereon coloured *brown*:

"10. The said District contains a population of approximately 100, and the Inhabitants thereof by reason of their distance from the Parish Church of Harworth are accustomed to resort for Divine Service on Sundays to the Private Chapel attached to the Mansion House at Serlby Park belonging to and maintained by the said Viscount Galway:

"11. The said Ecclesiastical Parish of Harworth comprises the Township of Harworth and parts of the Townships of Styrrup and Oldcotes, and contains an area of 7,349 acres, with a population of 939:

"12. The Patronage of the said Vicarage of All Saints, Harworth, belongs to Benjamin Ingham Whitaker, of Hesley Hall, in the Parish of Harworth, Esquire, and the Reverend Frederic d'Arblay Burney, Clerk, Master of Arts, is the present Vicar thereof:

"13. That having regard to the distance separating the said outlying portion of the said Parish of Harworth from the Parish Church of All Saints, Harworth, and to the extent and area of the said Parish and consequent difficulty in making adequate provision for the Cure of Souls in the said outlying portion, and to the contiguity of such District to the Parochial Chapelry and Church of St. Wilfrid, Scrooby, it appears to me that such contiguous District may, under the provisions of the Pluralities Act, 1838, with advantage to the interests of religion, be separated from the said

Vicarage and Parish Church of All Saints, Harworth, and annexed to the said Parochial Chapelry of Scrooby, and with the said Parochial Chapelry of Scrooby be constituted a separate Parish for ecclesiastical purposes, and a Perpetual Curacy and Benefice:

" 14. That with a view to making better provision for the endowment of the said Perpetual Curacy and Benefice of Scrooby, when constituted, the said Viscount Galway has agreed to offer to the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England such benefaction or benefactions as will, when met by the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners by equivalent grants, suffice to provide an income for the Incumbent of such Benefice which, when added to the existing endowments attached or belonging to the said Benefice, will produce a gross total income of £150 per annum, and also to convey and assure as a benefaction, to be met by an equivalent grant, to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners a piece of land suitable for a site on which to erect a Vicarage House for the residence of the Incumbent of the said Benefice of Scrooby, and by way of a further benefaction to offer to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners such sum or sums of money, not exceeding in the whole the sum of £500, as will, when met by equivalent grants by the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, provide a Fund for the erection of a house of moderate dimensions suitable for the occupation of the Incumbent of the said Benefice:

" 15. That pursuant to the directions contained in the 26th Section of the Pluralities Act, 1838, I have prepared the following Scheme, which, together with the consents thereto of the Most Noble William John Arthur Charles James, Duke of Portland, K.G., as Patron of the Benefice of Sutton-upon-Lound with Scrooby, of the Reverend Cyril Northcote Hatfield, the Incumbent of such Benefice, of the said Benjamin Ingham Whitaker as Patron of the said Benefice of Harworth, and of the said Reverend Frederic d'Arblay Burney, the Incumbent of such last-mentioned Benefice, I do submit to your Grace, to the intent that your Grace may, if on full consideration and inquiry you shall be satisfied with such Scheme, certify the same and such consents as aforesaid by your Report to His Majesty in Council."

And whereas the said Scheme drawn up by the said Bishop and the Consents referred to in the said Representation are as follows:—

#### " SCHEME.

" That all that portion of the Parish of Harworth, in the County of Nottingham, and Diocese of Southwell, which lies to the east and south-east of an imaginary line commencing from a point where the boundary which divides the Parish of Harworth from the Parish of Blyth meets the High Road leading from Blyth to Bawtry, and extending thence along the centre of such High Road in a north-eastward direction for a distance of 164½ chains or thereabouts to its junction with Gibbet Hill Lane, and thence in a south-eastward direction from the centre of Gibbet Hill Lane for a distance of 1 chain 90 links or thereabouts to the point where the boundary which divides the Parochial Chapelry of Scrooby from the said Parish of Harworth crosses Gibbet Hill Lane, shall be separated from the said Benefice and Parish Church of Harworth, and annexed to the de-

tached Parochial Chapelry of Scrooby, to the intent that such contiguous portion of the Parish of Harworth may be united to and formed with the said Parochial Chapelry of Scrooby into a separate Parish for ecclesiastical purposes, of which the said Church or Chapel of St. Wilfrid, Scrooby, shall be the Parish Church.

" That the said detached Parochial Chapelry of St. Wilfrid, Scrooby, shall be separated from the said Benefice and Parish Church of Sutton-upon-Lound, and together with the aforesaid contiguous portion of the Parish of Harworth constituted a separate Parish for ecclesiastical purposes, and a Perpetual Curacy and Benefice, by the name and style of the Perpetual Curacy of Scrooby, of which the said Church or Chapel of St. Wilfrid, Scrooby, shall be the Parish Church.

" That the proposed separate Parish and Benefice of Scrooby shall be subject to the same Ecclesiastical Jurisdiction as the said Benefices of Sutton-upon-Lound and Harworth, and the Incumbent of such separate Parish and Benefice shall have exclusive Cure of Souls within the limits of the same.

" That all the Vicarial Glebe Lands as set forth in Part 1 of the Schedule hereunder written, all the Tithe Commutation Charges arising in the Township of Scrooby as set forth in Part 2 of the said Schedule, and all the Invested Funds and Income arising therefrom as set forth in Part 3 of the said Schedule, shall henceforth belong to and be attached to the said proposed separate Benefice of Scrooby forever, and that all such Glebe Lands, Tithe Commutation Rent Charges, and Invested Funds shall be held and enjoyed by the Incumbent thereof for the time being freed and discharged from all liability to contribute or pay any portion of the pension of £50 per annum charged upon the Revenues of the Vicarage of Sutton-upon-Lound with Scrooby in favour of a former Incumbent by a Declaration made pursuant to the Incumbents' Resignation Act, 1871, on the 12th day of October, 1917.

" That all fees and other ecclesiastical dues and payments for Marriages and Burials and other ecclesiastical offices solemnised and performed within the proposed separate Parish and Benefice of Scrooby, and all such other ecclesiastical dues, offerings, and emoluments, annually payable to the Incumbent of a Parish or Benefice as shall arise within the said proposed separate Parish or Benefice shall belong to the Incumbent thereof.

" That the right of Patronage and Nomination of, in, and to the said proposed Perpetual Curacy and Parish Church of St. Wilfrid, Scrooby, when constituted, with all the rights members and appurtenances thereto belonging or in anywise appertaining, shall belong to and be vested in the Right Honourable George Edmund Milnes, Viscount Galway, his heirs and assigns.

" That the Parishioners of the said proposed separate Parish shall not be entitled to church accommodation in any other Church than in the Church of St. Wilfrid, Scrooby, nor shall the Parishioners of Harworth or any other Chapelries belonging thereto or the Parishioners of Sutton-upon-Lound or any other Chapelries belonging thereto be entitled to any accommodation in the Church of St. Wilfrid, Scrooby, except nevertheless such

person or persons (if any) as may possess a legal right by faculty or otherwise to the exclusive use of any pews or sittings in any of the said Churches of Harworth, Sutton-upon-Lound, or Scrooby, who may not be willing to relinquish and give up the same."

" We, the undersigned, Randall Thomas, Archbishop of the Province of Canterbury, do hereby report to Your Majesty in Council:—

" That the Right Reverend Edwyn, Lord Bishop of Southwell, has represented unto us amongst other things:—

" That to the Benefice of Sutton-upon-Lound with Scrooby, in the County of Nottingham, and his Diocese of Southwell, belongs the ancient detached Parochial Chapelry of Scrooby, the limits and boundaries whereof are well known and ascertained:

" That there is within the limits of the said Chapelry the Church of Saint Wilfrid, affording accommodation for 210 persons, distant 6 miles from the Parish Church of Sutton-upon-Lound, and separated therefrom by the Parishes of Blyth and Mattersey:

" That there is also in the same County and Diocese the Parish and Vicarage of All Saints, Harworth, at the extremities of which is a District contiguous to the said Chapelry of Saint

Wilfrid, Scrooby, and distant from the Parish Church of All Saints, Harworth:

" That it appears to the said Lord Bishop that the said Parochial Chapelry of Saint Wilfrid, Scrooby, and also the said District of the Parish of All Saints, Harworth, (contiguous to the said Chapelry) may, under the provisions of the Pluralities Act, 1838, with advantage to the interests of religion, be separated from the said Benefice of Sutton-upon-Lound and from the said Parish of All Saints, Harworth, respectively, and be constituted a Separate Parish for ecclesiastical purposes, and a Perpetual Curacy and Benefice:

" That pursuant to the directions contained in the said Pluralities Act the said Lord Bishop has drawn up a Scheme in writing describing the mode in which it appears to him that the proposed alterations may best be effected, and how the changes consequent upon such alterations in respect of Ecclesiastical Jurisdiction, Glebe Lands, Tithes, Rent Charges, and other Ecclesiastical Dues, Rates, and Payments, and in respect to Patronage and Rights to Pews, may be made with justice to all parties interested, which Scheme, together with the consents in writing of the Most Noble William John Arthur Charles James, Duke of Portland, K.G., the Patron or person entitled to present to the Benefice of Sutton-upon-Lound with Scrooby (if the same were now vacant), the Reverend Cyril Northcote Hatfield, the Incumbent of the same Benefice, Benjamin Ingham Whitaker, the Patron or person entitled to present to the Benefice of Harworth (if the same were now vacant), and the Reverend Frederic d'Arblay Burney, the Incumbent of the same Benefice, has been transmitted to us for our consideration:

" The Representation and Scheme of the said Lord Bishop, and the Consents above referred to, are hereunto annexed:

" And we, the said Archbishop, being on full consideration and inquiry satisfied with the said Scheme, do hereby pursuant to the said Pluralities Act certify the same and such Consents as aforesaid to Your Majesty in Council, to the intent that Your Majesty in Council may, in case Your Majesty in Council shall think fit so to do, make and issue an Order for carrying the said Scheme into effect.

WHEREAS His Majesty has been pleased, in exercise of the power in that behalf conferred on Him by Section one, sub-section one, of the Trading with the Enemy (Extension of Powers) Act, 1915, by divers Proclamations, and in particular by a Proclamation dated the 23rd day of May, 1916, and amended on the 16th day of January, 1918, entitled "The Trading with the Enemy (Statutory List) Proclamation," to prohibit all persons

or bodies of persons, incorporated or unincorporated, resident, carrying on business, or being in the United Kingdom from trading with any of the persons or bodies of persons mentioned in the List contained in the last-mentioned Proclamation, such List being therein referred to as the Statutory List:

And whereas by Section one, sub-section two, of the said Act, it is provided that any List of persons and bodies of persons, incorporated or unincorporated, with whom such trading is prohibited by a Proclamation under the said Act may be varied or added to by an Order made by the Lords of the Council on the recommendation of a Secretary of State:

And whereas the Statutory List contained in the last-mentioned Proclamation has been varied and added to by subsequent Orders of Council:

And whereas there was this day read at the Board a recommendation from the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs to the effect that the Statutory List should be further varied and added to as set forth in the Schedule hereto.

Now, therefore, Their Lordships, having taken the said recommendation into consideration, are pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered,

That the Statutory List be varied and added to as set forth in the Schedule hereto.

Whereof the Right Honourable Arthur James Balfour, one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, the Controller of the Foreign Trade Department, and all other persons whom it may concern, are to take notice and govern themselves accordingly.

NOTE (1).—All persons or firms resident, carrying on business or being in the United Kingdom are prohibited from having, with any person or firm mentioned in this List, or in any List issued under the Trading with the Enemy (Statutory List) Proclamation, any dealings other than such as are expressly authorised by paragraph 5 of the Proclamation. A List (The Consolidated List, No. 61A) consolidating all previous Lists, up to and including that of the 9th August, 1918, together with List No. 62 of 23rd August, List No. 63 of 6th September, List No. 64 of 20th September, List No. 65 of 4th October, and List No. 66 of 18th October, and the List herewith annexed, contain all the names which up to this date are included in the Statutory List.

Additions to and variations in these Lists will be published at intervals approximately of two weeks.

The Lists are published in the London Gazette and reproduced in the Board of Trade Journal, and separate copies of all Lists may be obtained at a small cost from the Superintendent of Publications, His Majesty's Stationery Office, Imperial House, Kingsway, W.C.

NOTE (2).—Where a firm is mentioned in the List, every partner in the firm is also included in the List, and all dealings with any partner in the firm, as well as all dealings with the firm, are prohibited: and conversely, all dealings with a firm, any partner in which is mentioned in the List, are also prohibited.

NOTE (3).—Where a person or firm mentioned in the List has more than one address in the country, or group of countries under which

the name of the person or firm appears, all dealings in that country, or in any country in the group, with such person or firm are prohibited, even in cases where one only of the addresses or one only of the countries is specially mentioned.

NOTE (4).—Trading is prohibited under the Trading with the Enemy Proclamations of 25th June and 10th November, 1915, with any person or firm of enemy nationality resident or carrying on business in China, Siam, Persia, Morocco, Liberia or Portuguese East Africa. Persons or firms in the United Kingdom are therefore prohibited from trading with any person or firm of enemy nationality in any of those countries, even though such person or firm is not mentioned by name in the Statutory List.

NOTE (5).—In order to minimise as far as possible any inconvenience which may be caused to British traders by the dislocation of export trade owing to the inclusion in the Statutory List of a former connection, the Foreign Trade Department is collecting and classifying the names of non-enemy firms who may be able to act as substitutes for firms mentioned in the Statutory List. A considerable amount of information is already available at the Foreign Trade Department, and it is in many cases possible to suggest the names of satisfactory substitutes for individual firms on the Lists, without the necessity of referring the matter abroad. The Department is, however, prepared on application to enquire of His Majesty's Representatives abroad for the names of suitable substitutes. When the applicant wishes this done by telegraph he is required to undertake to pay the cost of telegraphic correspondence. It would greatly facilitate the work of the Foreign Trade Department if applicants in making enquiries would specify the particular trade or trades for which substitutes are required. *General enquiries for new connections abroad should be addressed to The Comptroller General, Department of Overseas Trade (Development and Intelligence), 73, Basinghall Street, London, E.C. 2.*

NOTE (6).—The Statutory List for each country is telegraphed, on the day of issue, to His Majesty's Representative in that country, who is instructed to notify accordingly British Consular Officers, to whom persons abroad should apply for information as to names on the List. Persons and firms in the United Kingdom with agencies or branches abroad would, however, be well advised to furnish such agencies or branches with issues of the List as they appear. The names on the Lists for all countries in Central or South America are also notified to His Majesty's Ambassador at Washington, who transmits them to H.M. Consul-General at New York and to other centres in the United States likely to be interested.

NOTE (7).—It is not unusual for firms in Holland and the Netherland East Indies to be registered under names commencing with descriptive terms such as "Handel Maatschappij" (Trading Company) or "Naamlooze Venootschap" (Limited Liability Company). In such cases it has been found more convenient to publish the firm under its proper name followed by the general descriptive term "Handel Maatschappij" or "Naamlooze Venootschap" (N.V.) as in the case of an English company.

For instance Handel Maatschappij van den Berg & Company, and Naamlooze Venootschap de Komeet v/h Dumonceau Frères will be found under "Berg" and "Komeet" respectively, and not under "Handel" or "Naamlooze."

And it is further ordained that the Members of this Order shall take rank among each other according to the dates of their respective nominations in the Classes of this Order to which they severally belong.
