visions, as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

“And whereas we are of opinion that Officers employed as Shipping Intelligence Officers, or in charge of the Defensive Arming of Merchant Ships, should be paid at consolidated rates in the same manner, and on the same scale, as Officers of Your Majesty's Naval Transport Service:

“We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council, to sanction the Regulations for the payment of these Officers set forth in the annexed Schedule, with effect as from the 1st June, 1918.

“The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in these proposals.

If provided with quarters or victualled, a deduction to be made equivalent to the regulated allowances for lodging and provisions.

"2. These consolidated rates to cover every allowance except:—

(a) Outfit allowance for Retired, Emergency, and Temporary Officers.

(b) Bonus of 25 per cent. for Retired and Emergency Officers which is to be assessed on the rate of full pay they would receive under ordinary conditions.

"3. The consolidated rates to be subject to the usual deduction for commuted retired pay and for gratuity on discharge from Active List.

"4. The above rates of pay to apply only to Commissioned Officers of the Military Branch. Other Officers, including Engineers, to retain their present rates of pay and allowances.

"5. Officers granted a higher relative rank

under the above table to enjoy the status and wear the uniform of that higher rank, but not to be entitled to use the higher naval title.

"6. Officers now serving to retain their present rates of pay until the termination of their present appointments in cases where it is to their advantage to do so.

"7. The Officer in Charge of Defensive Arming of Merchant Ships at Dakar, and the Assistant Officer in Charge, to receive Colonial Allowance of £50 a year."

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed.

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

WHEREAS by the Isle of Man (War Legislation) Act, 1914, His Majesty has power to extend to the Isle of Man any Act which, in the opinion of His Majesty, was passed for the purpose of meeting any emergency created by the present War, subject nevertheless to adaptations for the purpose of making the Act applicable to the Isle of Man:

And whereas by Order in Council dated the 17th day of December, 1914, His Majesty was pleased to order that the Defence of the Realm

Consolidation Act, 1914, and the Defence of the Realm (Consolidation) Regulations, 1914, should extend to the Isle of Man, subject to the adaptations therein contained:

And whereas the said Regulations have been amended by an Order in Council of the 4th June, 1918:

Now, therefore, His Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, that Article 2 of the Regulations amending the Defence of the Realm (Consolidation) Regulations, 1914, made by an Order of His Majesty in Council dated the 4th June, 1918, shall extend to the Isle of Man adapted so as to read as follows:—

"2. After Regulation 14f the following Regulation shall be inserted:—

"14g. The Lieutenant-Governor may, by order, from time to time, prescribe the Ports at which persons proceeding as passengers from the Isle of Man to Ireland may embark, the routes by which they may travel, and the condi-

tions subject to which they may embark, and where such an order is made then, subject to any exceptions provided by or under the order, no person other than as aforesaid shall, when proceeding as a passenger from the Isle of Man to Ireland, embark at any Port other than a Port so prescribed, or under any conditions other than those so prescribed, or travel by a route other than a route so prescribed.

"If any person acts in contravention of this Regulation he shall be guilty of a summary offence against these Regulations, and where a person embarks at a Port in contravention of this Regulation the Master of the Vessel on which he embarks shall, unless he proves to the contrary, be deemed to have aided and abetted the offence."

WHEREAS by Section 21 of the Pluralities Act, 1838, after reciting that, "Whereas from the increase of population, or from other circumstances, it may be expedient that two or more Benefices which have been heretofore united, or which may be hereafter united, under the provisions of this Act should be disunited," it is, amongst other things, enacted "that when two or more Benefices shall have been united, or may be hereafter united into one Benefice, and with respect to his own Diocese it shall appear to the Archbishop of the Province, or the Bishop of any Diocese shall represent to the said Archbishop of the Province, that one or more of the Benefices within his Diocese, of which such United Benefice shall consist, may be separated therefrom with advantage to the interests of religion, the said Archbishop shall inquire into the circumstances of the case, and, if on such Inquiry, it shall appear to him that such Union may be usefully dissolved, so far as respects such Benefice or Benefices, he shall, 6 weeks at least before certifying such Inquiry to His Majesty as hereinafter directed, cause, with respect to his own Diocese a Statement in writing of the facts, and in all other cases a Copy in writing of the aforesaid Representation to be affixed on or near the Principal Outer Door of the Church, or in some public and conspicuous place, in each of the Benefices forming part of the United Benefice, with notice to any person or persons interested that he, she, or they may, within such 6 weeks, show cause in writing under his, her, or their hands to the said Archbishop against any such Disunion, and, if no sufficient cause be shown within such time, the Archbishop shall certify the Inquiry and Consent, when the Patron's consent is necessary, to His Majesty in Council, and thereupon it shall be lawful for His Majesty to issue an Order for separating such last-mentioned Benefice or Benefices from such United Benefice, and for declaring the rights of Patronage of the several Patrons, if there be more than one Patron, and such Order shall be registered in the Registry of the Diocese to which such United Benefice shall belong, which Order the Registrar of such Diocese, immediately on the receipt thereof, is hereby required to register accordingly, and thereupon immediately, if such United Benefice shall be then vacant, otherwise on the first avoidance thereof, such Union shall be *ipso facto* dissolved, so far only as regards such Benefice or Benefices so proposed to be separated from such United Benefice, but in all other respects shall remain in full force and effect, and thenceforward such

last-mentioned Benefice or Benefices shall be and be deemed and taken to be a separate and distinct Benefice or Benefices to all intents and purposes whatever as if no such Union had taken place, and the Patron or Patrons thereof shall and may according to the terms of such Order present or nominate thereto respectively, and so, from time to time, upon each and every avoidance of the same: Provided always, that no Benefices which have been united for more than 60 years before the passing of this Act shall be disunited without the consent in writing of the Patron or Patrons thereof":

And whereas by Section 23 of the said Act it is further enacted that "whenever two or more Benefices which have at any time been united into one Benefice shall be disunited and become separate Benefices under the provisions of this Act, whether the Order for disunion shall extend to the whole number of Benefices of which such United Benefice consisted or to one or more of such Benefices only, it shall be lawful for His Majesty in Council, on the recommendation of the Archbishop of the Province, with the Consent of the Patron or Patrons of such Benefices respectively, (such Consent to be signified in writing under the hands of such Patron or Patrons) to assign and attach such portion of the Glebe Lands, Tithes, Moduses, Rent-charges, or other Endowments or Emoluments, belonging to or arising or accruing within the limits of such United Benefice to each of such Benefices respectively as to His Majesty in Council shall seem fit notwithstanding such proportion of Glebe Lands, Tithes, Rent-charges, Moduses, or other Endowments or Emoluments, or any part thereof, may not arise or accrue within the limits of the Benefice to which the same shall be so assigned and attached as aforesaid, or may not have belonged thereto, and also to divide and apportion between such Benefices all such Charges and Outgoings as before the Disunion thereof were imposed upon the whole United Benefice":

And whereas the Right Reverend Bertram, Lord Bishop of Norwich, hath made a Representation in writing, dated the 26th day of June, 1917, to the Right Honourable and Most Reverend Randall Thomas, Lord Archbishop of Canterbury, as follows:—

"I, Bertram, Lord Bishop of Norwich, do hereby represent to your Grace that the Disunion of the United Benefice of Burnham Westgate with Burnham Norton and Mediety of Burnham Ulph, in the County of Norfolk, and my Diocese of Norwich, by the separation of the said Mediety of Burnham Ulph from the said Benefice of Burnham Westgate with Burnham Norton and Mediety of Burnham Ulph, may be made with advantage to the interests of religion, with a view to an Order being obtained from the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England for the consolidation of the said Mediety of Burnham Ulph with the other Mediety now united to Burnham Sutton with Overly under Section 72 of 3 and 4 Victoria, cap. 113.

"B. NORWIC."

And whereas on the 3rd day of July, 1917, the said Archbishop inquired into the circumstances of the case:

And whereas the said Bishop did, by a further Representation in writing dated the 23rd day of November, 1917, furnish to the

said Archbishop a Statement of Circumstances as follows:—

"Whereas your Grace having inquired of me, Bertram, Lord Bishop of Norwich, what are the circumstances of the case on which I found my opinion that the Disunion of the United Benefice of Burnham Westgate with Burnham Norton and Mediety of Burnham Ulph, in the County of Norfolk, and my Diocese of Norwich, by the separation of the said Mediety of Burnham Ulph from the said Benefice of Burnham Westgate with Burnham Norton and Mediety of Burnham Ulph, may be made with advantage to the interests of religion, I do hereby represent to your Grace that the circumstances of the case are as follows:—

"That the Benefice of Burnham Westgate is a Rectory with Burnham Norton and a Mediety of Burnham Ulph annexed:

"That the population of Burnham Westgate with Burnham Norton and Mediety of Burnham Ulph is 791 exclusive of any of the reputed population of Burnham Ulph:

"That the boundaries of the Parish of Burnham Ulph are unknown, but the Parish is reputed to include the site of the Church of Burnham Ulph, which by an ancient arrangement is also the Parish Church of Burnham Sutton, and the precincts of the same Church:

"That the population of Burnham Ulph according to the return of the last Census is reputed to be 249:

"That the Endowment of Burnham Westgate with Burnham Norton is as follows:—Apportioned Tithe Rent-charge £650 10s. 0d., Rent of 122 acres of Glebe £116 1s. 4d.:

"That there is a House of Residence belonging to the Benefice of Burnham Westgate with Burnham Norton and Mediety of Burnham Ulph:

"That there is no Endowment whatever belonging to the Mediety of Burnham Ulph:

"That when disunited Burnham Westgate with Burnham Norton shall retain all the Endowments of the United Benefice of Burnham Westgate with Burnham Norton and Mediety of Burnham Ulph, and bear all the Outgoings in respect thereof:

"That it is expedient that the Mediety of Burnham Ulph aforesaid should be disunited from the Rectory of Burnham Westgate with Burnham Norton and Mediety of Burnham Ulph with a view to an Order being obtained from the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England for the consolidation of the said Mediety of Burnham Ulph with the other Mediety now annexed to Burnham Sutton with Overy and Mediety of Burnham Ulph under Section 72 of 3 and 4 Victoria, cap. 113, the system of Medieties which has divided between two Clergymen the responsibility for the Cure of Souls in one Parish being against the interests of religion:

"That the Patrons of the said Rectory of Burnham Westgate with Burnham Norton and Mediety of Burnham Ulph are The Master, Fellows, and Scholars, of Christ's College, in the University of Cambridge, and the Incumbent is The Rev. Thomas Felton Falkner, D.S.O.:

"That the said Patrons have by writing, under their seal, bearing date the 2nd day of August, 1917, signified their Consent to the proposed Disunion, which Consent is hereto annexed."

"We, The Master, Fellows, and Scholars, of Christ's College, in the University of Cambridge, being the Patrons or Persons entitled to present to the Rectory or United Benefice of Burnham Westgate with Burnham Norton and a Mediety of Burnham Ulph annexed, in the County of Norfolk, and Diocese of Norwich, if the same were now vacant, do by this Writing, under our seal, signify to your Grace our consent to the Disunion of the said Benefice by the separation of the said Mediety of Burnham Ulph from the said Benefice of Burnham Westgate with Burnham Norton and a Mediety of Burnham Ulph with a view to an Order under Section 72 of 3 and 4 Victoria, cap. 113, being obtained from the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England for the consolidation of the said Mediety of Burnham Ulph with the other Mediety now annexed to Burnham Sutton with Overy, and that the Union of the said Mediety of Burnham Ulph with the Rectory of Burnham Westgate with Burnham Norton shall be dissolved.

"That the Right Reverend Bertram, Lord Bishop of Norwich, as Bishop of the Diocese in which is situate the United Benefice of Burnham Westgate with Burnham Norton and Mediety of Burnham Ulph, in the County of Norfolk, having represented unto us that the Disunion of the said United Benefice by the separation of the Mediety of Burnham Ulph from the said Benefice of Burnham Westgate with Burnham Norton and Mediety of Burnham Ulph may be made with advantage to the interests of religion, we inquired into the circumstances of the case:

"That on such Inquiry it appeared to us that such Union might be usefully dissolved, and that the Master, Fellows, and Scholars of Christ's College, in the University of Cambridge, being the Patrons or persons entitled to present to the said United Benefice, if the same were now vacant, consent to the proposed Disunion:

"That 6 weeks and upwards before certifying such Inquiry and Consent to Your Majesty in Council we caused a Copy in writing of the aforesaid Representation of the said Lord Bishop to be affixed on the Principal Outer Door of each of the Parish Churches of the said United Benefice, with notice to any person or persons interested that he, she, or they might, within such 6 weeks, show cause in writing under his, her, and their hand or hands, to us, the said Archbishop, against such Disunion, and no such cause has been shown:

"And we recommend that when disunited Burnham Westgate with Burnham Norton shall retain all the Endowments of the United Benefice of Burnham Westgate with Burnham Norton and Mediety of Burnham Ulph, and bear all the Outgoings in respect thereof.

Now, therefore, His Majesty in Council, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased to order, as it is hereby ordered, that the said United Benefice, consisting of Burnham Westgate with Burnham Norton and Mediety of Burnham Ulph, situate in the County of Norfolk, and Diocese of Norwich, shall be disunited by separating the said Mediety of Burnham Ulph from the said Benefice of Burnham Westgate with Burnham Norton and Mediety of Burnham Ulph.

And His Majesty in Council, by and with the advice of His said Council, is further pleased, on the recommendation of the said Archbishop, with the consent of the Patrons, to direct that, when disunited, Burnham Westgate with Burnham Norton shall retain all the Endowments of the said United Benefice of Burnham Westgate with Burnham Norton and Mediety of Burnham Ulph, and bear all the Outgoings in respect thereof.

WHEREAS His Majesty has been pleased, in exercise of the power in that behalf conferred on Him by Section one, sub-section one, of the Trading with the Enemy (Extension of Powers) Act, 1915, by divers Proclamations, and in particular by a Proclamation dated the 23rd day of May, 1916, and amended on the 16th day of January, 1918, entitled "The Trading with the Enemy (Statutory List) Proclamation," to prohibit all persons or bodies of persons, incorporated or unincorporated, resident, carrying on business, or being in the United Kingdom from trading with any of the persons or bodies of persons mentioned in the List contained in the last-mentioned Proclamation, such List being therein referred to as the Statutory List:

And whereas by Section one, sub-section two, of the said Act, it is provided that any List of persons and bodies of persons, incorporated or unincorporated, with whom such trading is prohibited by a Proclamation under the said Act may be varied or added to by an Order made by the Lords of the Council on the recommendation of a Secretary of State:

And whereas the Statutory List contained in the last-mentioned Proclamation, has been varied and added to by subsequent Orders of Council:

And whereas there was this day read at the Board a recommendation from the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs to the effect that the Statutory List should be further varied and added to as set forth in the Schedule hereto.

Now, therefore, Their Lordships, having taken the said recommendation into consideration, are pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered,

That the Statutory List be varied and added to as set forth in the Schedule hereto.

Whereof the Right Honourable Arthur James Balfour, one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, the Controller of the Foreign Trade Department, and all other persons whom it may concern, are to take notice and govern themselves accordingly.

NOTE (1).—All persons or firms resident, carrying on business or being in the United Kingdom are prohibited from having, with any person or firm mentioned in this List, or in any List issued under the Trading with the Enemy (Statutory List) Proclamation, any dealings other than such as are expressly authorised by paragraph 5 of the Proclamation. A List (The Consolidated List, No. 61A) consolidating all previous Lists, up to and including that of the 9th August, 1918, together with List No. 62 of 23rd August, List No. 63 of 6th September, List No. 64 of 20th September, List No. 65 of 4th October, List No. 66 of 18th October, List No. 67 of 1st November, and the List herewith annexed, contain all the names which up to this date are included in the Statutory List.

Additions to and variations in these Lists will be published at intervals approximately of two weeks.

The Lists are published in the London Gazette and reproduced in the Board of Trade Journal, and separate copies of all Lists may be obtained at a small cost from the Superintendent of Publications, His Majesty's Stationery Office, Imperial House, Kingsway, W.C.

NOTE (2).—Where a firm is mentioned in the List, every partner in the firm is also included in the List, and all dealings with any partner in the firm, as well as all dealings with the firm, are prohibited: and conversely, all dealings with a firm, any partner in which is mentioned in the List, are also prohibited.

NOTE (3).—Where a person or firm mentioned in the List has more than one address in the country, or group of countries under which the name of the person or firm appears, all dealings in that country, or in any country in the group, with such person or firm are prohibited, even in cases where one only of the addresses or one only of the countries is specially mentioned.

NOTE (4).—Trading is prohibited under the Trading with the Enemy Proclamations of 25th June, and 10th November, 1915, with any person or firm of enemy nationality resident or carrying on business in China, Siâm, Persia, Morocco, Liberia, or Portuguese East Africa. Persons or firms in the United Kingdom are therefore prohibited from trading with any person or firm of enemy nationality in any of those countries, even though such person or firm is not mentioned by name in the Statutory List.

NOTE (5).—In order to minimise as far as possible any inconvenience which may be caused to British traders by the dislocation of export trade owing to the inclusion in the Statutory List of a former connection, the Foreign Trade Department is collecting and classifying the names of non-enemy firms who may be able to act as substitutes for firms mentioned in the Statutory List. A considerable amount of information is already available at the Foreign Trade Department, and it is in many cases possible to suggest the names of satisfactory substitutes for individual firms on the Lists, without the necessity of referring the matter abroad. The Department

is, however, prepared on application to enquire of His Majesty's Representatives abroad for the names of suitable substitutes. When the applicant wishes this done by telegraph he is required to undertake to pay the cost of telegraphic correspondence. It would greatly facilitate the work of the Foreign Trade Department if applicants in making enquiries would specify the particular trade or trades for which substitutes are required. *General enquiries for new connections abroad should be addressed to The Comptroller General, Department of Overseas Trade (Development and Intelligence), 73, Basinghall Street, London, E.C. 2.*

NOTE (6).—The Statutory List for each country is telegraphed, on the day of issue, to His Majesty's Representative in that country, who is instructed to notify accordingly British Consular Officers, to whom persons abroad should apply for information as to names on the List. Persons and firms in the United Kingdom with agencies or branches abroad would, however, be well advised to furnish such agencies or branches with issues of the List as they appear. The names on the Lists for all countries in Central or South America are also notified to His Majesty's Ambassador at Washington, who transmits them to H.M. Consul-General at New York and to other centres in the United States likely to be interested.

NOTE (7).—It is not unusual for firms in Holland and the Netherland East Indies to be registered under names commencing with descriptive terms such as "Handel Maatschappij" (Trading Company) or "Naamlooze Venootschap" (Limited Liability Company). In such cases it has been found more convenient to publish the firm under its proper name followed by the general descriptive term "Handel Maatschappij" or "Naamlooze Venootschap" (N.V.) as in the case of an English company. For instance, Handel Maatschappij van den Berg & Company, and Naamlooze Venootschap de Komeet v/h Dumonceau Frères will be found under "Berg" and "Komeet" respectively, and not under "Handel" or "Naamlooze."

CHARGES OF RETURNING OFFICERS AT PARLIAMENTARY ELECTIONS IN ENGLAND AND WALES.

In pursuance of the powers conferred upon Us by Section 29 of the Representation of the People Act, 1918, We, being Two of the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, hereby prescribe that the Returning Officer shall be entitled in respect of the conduct of Parliamentary Elections other than University Elections in England and Wales to his reasonable charges not exceeding the sums hereinafter set forth, provided that the charges for disbursements are in no case to exceed the sums actually and necessarily paid or payable.

For the purposes of Section 2 of the Munitions of War Act, 1917, the Minister hereby consents to the employment on work which is not work on or in connection with munitions work of the following class of workmen, that is to say, workmen who have since the passing of the Munitions of War Act, 1917, been employed on or in connection with munitions work of a class specified in paragraph (a) of sub-section 1 of section 9 of the Munitions of War (Amendment) Act, 1916.

THE SOLE LEATHER (CONDITIONS OF SALE)
ORDER, 1918.

Whereas by the Leather (Control) No. 3 Notice, 1917, and the Leather (Control) No. 4 Notice, 1917, the Army Council gave notice of their intention to take possession of certain Sole and Upper Leather:

And whereas certain of the said Sole and Upper Leather has been or may be released for sale and manufacture for Naval and Military purposes under certain conditions imposed by or on behalf of the Director of Raw Materials:

And whereas it is expedient that certain of the said Leather should be released for sale and manufacture for purposes other than Naval and Military purposes:

And whereas by Regulation 2J of the Defence of the Realm Regulations it is provided that the Board of Trade shall have the like powers as are given to the Food Controller under Regulations 2B, 2F to 2J inclusive and 7, as respects any article of commerce not being an article of food where it appears to the Board necessary or expedient to exercise any of those powers for the purpose of encouraging, maintaining or regulating the supply of any such article which is required by the public or by any section of the public:

And whereas such powers include the power to make arrangements with any Government Department for the exercise by that Department of the powers of the Board of Trade:

And whereas it appears to the Board of Trade necessary and expedient for the purpose of encouraging, maintaining and regulating the supply of Sole Leather which may be required

by the public or by any section of the public that the sale of so much of the said Leather as may be released for sale and manufacture for purposes other than Naval and Military purposes should be permitted upon certain conditions:

And whereas the Board of Trade have made arrangements with the Army Council for the exercise by the Council on behalf of the Board of Trade of the powers of the Board of Trade under the said Regulations with respect to Sole Leather:

And whereas by the Sole Leather (Conditions of Sale) Order, 1917, the Army Council authorised upon certain conditions the sale and delivery of and payment for certain Sole Leather:

Now, therefore, in pursuance of the powers conferred upon them by the Defence of the Realm Regulations, and of every other power enabling them in that behalf, the Army Council hereby authorise and permit as from the date hereof until further notice the sale and delivery of and payment for such Sole Leather of the description indicated in the Schedule "A" hereto annexed as may be or may have been released for sale and manufacture for other than Naval or Military purposes, subject to the following conditions, that is to say:—

1. The provisions of the Sole Leather (Conditions of Sale) Order, 1917, shall be deemed to apply to the sale and delivery of and payment for any Leather of the description indicated in the Schedule hereto annexed in substitution for the Schedule annexed to the said Order.

2. This Order may be cited as the Sole Leather (Conditions of Sale) Order, 1918.

DEFENCE OF THE REALM REGULATIONS.

SALE OF STRAW FOR THATCHING IN GREAT BRITAIN.

In pursuance of the powers conferred on them by the Defence of the Realm Regulations and of all other powers thereunto enabling them, notwithstanding anything contained in the Army Council Order of the 30th July, 1918, prohibiting the lifting of hay and straw in England and Wales, or the Army Council Order of the 21st August, 1918, prohibiting the lifting of hay and straw in Scotland, the Army Council do hereby order:—

That where a farmer is desirous of purchasing straw (other than oat straw) from a producer for the purpose of thatching ricks of corn or hay, he may do so, subject to the following conditions:—

1. The purchaser must deliver to the seller a Certificate stating—

(a) The quantity of straw required, which must not exceed three tons in any one instance.

(b) That the straw is required for thatching ricks of hay or corn and for no other purpose.

2. The Certificate must be signed by the purchaser and must give his address together with the name and address of the seller.

3. When the whole of the straw for which the Certificate is given has been removed, the seller must forward the Certificate to the D.P.O.S. of the county concerned, whose address is given in the said Army Council Orders of the 30th July, 1918, and the 21st August, 1918.

4. The price paid for such straw shall not exceed the maximum stack price laid down by any Army Council Order that may for the time being be in force, together with any actual cost incurred for tying, or carting a distance further than the nearest railway station.
