BRITISH NATIONALITY AND STATUS OF ALIENS ACTS, 1914 AND 1918.

In the Matter of Hans Wilhelm Gerhard Singelmann.

Revocation of Certificate of Naturalization.

Whereas I am satisfied that Hans Wilhelm Gerhard Singelmann, to whom a Certificate of Naturalization, numbered 15,327, was granted on the 23rd May, 1905, pursuant to the provisions of the Naturalization Act, 1870, has since the date of the grant of the certificate been for a period not less than seven years

ordinarily resident out of H.M. Dominions otherwise than as a representative of a British subject, firm or company carrying on business or an institution established in H.M. Dominions or in the service of the Crown, and has not maintained substantial connection with H.M. Dominions, and, further, that the continuance of the said certificate is not conducive to the public good.

Now, therefore, by this Order made in pursuance of the powers conferred on me by Section seven of the British Nationality and Status of Aliens Act, 1914, I revoke the said certificate, and I direct such revocation to have effect from the date hereof, and I further order the said certificate to be given up and to be cancelled.

In the Matter of Mathias Urban.

Revocation of Certificate of Naturalization.

Whereas I am satisfied that Mathias Urban, to whom a Certificate of Naturalization numbered A4040 was granted on 23rd January, 1884, pursuant to the provisions of the Naturalization Act, 1870, has since the date of the grant of the certificate been for a period not less than 7 years ordinarily resident out of H.M. Dominions otherwise than as a representative of a British subject firm or company carrying on business or an institution established in H.M. Dominions or in the service of the Crown, and has not maintained substantial connection with H.M. Dominions, and further that the continuance of the said certificate is not conducive to the public good.

Now, therefore, by this Order, made in pursuance of the powers conferred on me by Section seven of the British Nationality and Status of Aliens Act, 1914, I revoke the said certificate, and I direct such revocation to have effect from the date hereof, and I further order the said certificate to be given up and to be cancelled.
