

by successive sellers and occupiers; to make provision against the evasion of tolls and charges and the non-payment of rent, to authorize re-entry in premises and to impose penalties.

7. To make provision with regard to the forfeiture of articles and things left in the market after the hour of closing, the sale or destruction thereof by the Corporation, and the recovery of expenses.

8. To enable the Corporation to regulate the leading and driving of cattle through the borough and to enforce penalties for breach of any bye-law or regulation with regard thereto.

9. To enable the Corporation or any officer of the market, inspector of nuisances or other person to be specified in the Bill to remove or exclude from the market and the borough animals diseased or unfit for human food.

10. To authorize the Corporation to provide, maintain and use cold stores and refrigerators and all necessary buildings, works, conveniences and plant in connection therewith and to levy charges and make and enforce bye-laws.

11. To empower the Corporation to acquire any premises used for slaughtering cattle or to agree with the owner of any such premises for the abolition of slaughtering therein; to enable the Corporation to provide and carry on slaughterhouses and to make provision as to the fees to be charged for their use; and to prohibit the slaughtering of animals in private slaughterhouses.

12. To require the registration of slaughtermen; to provide for the cancelling or suspension of such registration in certain cases, and to impose penalties on unregistered persons carrying on the occupation of a slaughterman.

13. To empower the Corporation to make bye-laws for the conduct of fairs held in the borough, including the fixing of hours during which they may remain open, the preservation of order, the regulation of the erection of booths, tents, sheds, and stands, and of shows, exhibitions and vehicles and to impose penalties.

14. To authorize the Corporation by agreement to purchase or lease lands or any interests therein for the purpose of holding fairs; and to appropriate for that purpose lands belonging to them, and to provide that the holding of such fairs in any street within the borough shall be discontinued.

15. To empower the Corporation if they think fit to frame and (subject to such approval, if any, as may be specified in the Bill) to put into operation a scheme of superannuation for their officers, servants and workmen; to provide for the establishment and administration of a fund for those purposes, the payment of contributions thereto by the said officers, servants and workmen (by deduction from their salaries or wages or otherwise) and by the Corporation.

16. To enact all necessary provisions incidental or ancillary to the establishment of the said fund and the payment of allowances, return of contributions and payment of gratuities in certain cases, and payment of expenses out of the funds and rates of the Corporation.

17. To enable the Corporation to establish and maintain a fund for meeting claims under the common law, the Employers Liability Act, 1880, the Workmen's Compensation Act, 1906, or any Act or Acts amending or extending

those Acts or otherwise in respect of accidents occurring in the execution of their powers, and to grant gratuities to officers and servants who may be injured or incapacitated or to the widow or family of any such officer or servant, and to enable the Corporation to apply their funds, rates and revenue to any such purposes.

18. To enable the Corporation to borrow money for any of the purposes of the Bill, and to make applicable to those purposes all or any of the provisions of the Public Health Act with respect to the borrowing of money.

19. To authorize the Council for the purpose of defraying current expenses incurred by them to borrow by way of temporary loan or overdraft on the security of the district fund and general district rates, or the revenue of any undertaking of the Corporation, or any other of their funds, properties, rates or revenue, and to utilise any sinking funds belonging to them.

20. To empower the Corporation to expend their corporate funds in defraying the expenses of or connected with public entertainments on the occasion of public ceremony or rejoicing, or the presentation of the freedom of the borough, in the reception and entertainment of distinguished persons, in paying subscriptions to any association of local authorities, and in providing for the expenses of deputations from the Corporation and their officials in attending conferences and other meetings.

21. To empower the Corporation to acquire land by agreement for any of the purposes of the Bill, and to make applicable for any of those purposes all or any of the provisions of the Public Health Act in respect to the acquisition of land by agreement.

22. To enact all necessary provisions for giving effect to the purposes of the Bill or of the general or local Acts for the time being in force in the borough, including the imposition of penalties for breach of the provisions of the Bill or any bye-laws thereunder; consent of the Corporation to be in writing; evidence of appointments and resolutions and authentication and service of notices; protection of the Corporation and their officers from personal liability; inquiries by Local Government Board; recovery of fines and expenses and other matters.

23. To vary and extinguish all existing rights and privileges which would or might in any way prevent, interfere with or delay the accomplishment of any of the objects of the intended Act, and to confer other rights and privileges.

24. To incorporate, with or without amendment, or to render inapplicable, all or some of the provisions of the following public Acts:—The Public Health Acts; the Municipal Corporations Act, 1882; the Local Loans Act, 1875; the Lands Clauses Acts; the Markets and Fairs Clauses Act, 1847; the Arbitration Act, 1889; and all Acts amending those Acts respectively.
