PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by the Aliens Restriction Order His Majesty in exercise of the powers conferred upon Him by the Aliens Restriction Act, 1914, has been pleased to impose restrictions on aliens and to make various regulations for the carrying of those regulations into effect:

And whereas it is expedient further to extend the provisions of that Order in manner hereinafter appearing:

Now, therefore, His Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

The following Article shall be substituted for Article 25c:—

25c. As from such date as the Secretary of State may fix, and subject to the directions of the Secretary of State in any particular case, an alien enemy who, being a married woman or a widow, was before her marriage a natural-born British subject,

shall be liable to comply only with such provisions of this Part of this Order as apply to alien friends.

WHEREAS there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the 19th day of November, 1918, in the words following, viz.:—
