The KING has been pleased to award the Albert Medal to Lance-Corporal (acting Second Corporal) Walter Richard Beard, 1st Reserve Battalion, Royal Engineers, in recognition of his gallantry in saving life at bombing practice in August last.

On the 16th August, 1918, Lance-Corporal Beard was instructing recruits in throwing live bombs, when one of the men under instruction, as he was about to throw a bomb, dropped it in the trench. Beard at once ran out from cover, picked up the bomb, and threw it over the parapet, thereby undoubtedly saving the recruit from death or serious injury. The bomb exploded in the air before reaching the ground.

In almost exactly similar circumstances Beard repeated this gallant action on the 23rd August, thereby again saving the life of a man who had dropped a bomb in the trench.

The Home Grown Timber Prices (Amendment) Order, 1918, dated the 5th day of December, 1918, made by the Board of Trade pursuant to Regulations 2F and 2JJ of the Defence of the Realm Regulations.

The Board of Trade, deeming it expedient to make further exercise of the powers conferred upon them by the Defence of the Realm Regulations as respects timber, hereby order as follows:—

1. Paragraph 1 of the Home Grown Timber Prices Order, 1918, is hereby amended by the addition thereto of the words following:—
 "E." For sleepers delivered free on rail or barge at loading station the prices set forth in Schedule E hereto annexed.

2. Schedule D of the Home Grown Timber Prices Order, 1918, is hereby amended by the deletion therefrom of the last seven lines relating to the price of sleepers, and the following new Schedule is added to the said Order.

THE MOTOR SPIRIT AND GAS RESTRICTION ORDERS SUSPENSION ORDER, 1918.

ORDER OF THE REGISTRAR-GENERAL
IN ENGLAND.

(Dated 7th December, 1918.)

Whereas by the 21st Section of the Births and Deaths Registration Act, 1874, it is enacted that the Registrar-General, with the sanction of the Local Government Board, may from time to time alter Registration Sub-districts:—
