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at Pilsenais, Nov. 3.

On *Friday* and *Saturday* last the *English, Dutch, and French* Ships which had made several attempts to put to sea but were as often forced back again by contrary Winds, set sail again for the coasts of *France*; and this morning the other ships intended for the *Streights* put out to sea.

Tarmouth, Nov. 4. Several Ships belonging to this Place are lately returned hither from *Roussdam*, and this afternoon a vessel of this place from *Offend*, where on *Friday* last arrived a vessel from *Scotland* with Soldiers, appointed to be designed for the completing the Regiment of that Nation in the Spanish Service in the *Netherlands*.

Genoa, Octob. 24. The 22 inst. arrived here the *Leopard*, one of His Majesty of *Great Britain* Frigats, having on board her His Excellency Sir *Daniel Harvey*, His Majesty's Ambassadour to the *Ottoman* Court, who saluting the Town with 11 Guns; they answered him again with 30. to which he reply'd with 19 more; which ending, the Master of the Ceremonies, with some other Officers of the Republick came aboard him, to complement him in the name of the State, inviting him to shore, offering a *Gilly* and several of their Nobility to conduct him; but the shortness of his stay would not permit him to accept of publick Ceremonies; a little after came also aboard him, Seignior *Giovanna Luca Durazzo*, the last Ambassador into *England* from this Republick, with his Brother *Giovanne Augustino Durazzo*, lately employed under the same Character in *Constantinople*; from whom he received many civilities, and to whom he was incognito conducted to see the Town; at his return to his ship, he was again attended by the Master of the Ceremonies, with a Present from the State of *Wine, Fruits*, and other *Regalio's*, after a days stay more in this Port, in which he received fresh invitations to come ashore, from the old Duke *Durazzo*, he set sail with a fair wind for *Legorn*.

Tangier, Octob. 14. We have not as yet any certain news of the proceeding of Sir *Thomas Allen* with his Squadron before *Algier*. We are confirmed from these parts, of the truth of the report, that some of their ships returning from the *Grand Seigniors* service in the *Levant*, met with 3 or 4 *French* ships, which after some dispute they took and carried into *Algier*, where they sold both ships and men.

Captain *Ruth* with the *Garland* and *Francis* Frigate, two days since arrived here from *Sally*, where he had the fortune to meet with four of their men of war returning homewards with three prizes, all of which he forced to run ashore, where by the violence of the sea, they were soon broke to pieces and destroyed, so that now they have no other ships abroad; and openly one in the Harbor sitting up.

Taffalette still continues successful in his wars, having now taken the *Santas* Countrey; the south part of *Barbary*, made himself sole Emperour of *Fesse* and *Moroco*, killed the King of *Morocco*, taken prisoner *Ben Buker*, chased *Gayland* out of the Countrey, and reduced the whole Countrey to his obedience.

Frankfort, Octob. 25. Madam the Dutchess *Benedicta* with the Princess *Palatine* her Mother, arrived here lately from *France*; having been visited on the way at *Openheim* by the Prince Elector *Palatine*, and by a party of his Cavalry conducted to the Frontiers. At their arrival here, the Magistrates received them with the honour due to persons of their quality; where also attended them several of the Duke of *Branswick's* Officers, and the Countess *Solms-Greifenstein*; who intends to stay on her till her rival at *Hanover*, with the Duke of that Name her Husband.

The Princess *Palatine* having accompanied our of Town and taken leave of the Dutchess her Daughter at *Friberg*, is returned again hither on her way for *France*.

Legorn, Octob. 19. This week arrived here the *Anna* and *Prudence* from *England* and *Cadix* with *Lead*, intended for *Zante*; the *Tobias* from *Penzance*, the *Susan* and *Mary* from *Falmouth*, and the *Katherine* from *Guin*; and *Zangier* considerably laden; by this last we are informed that an *English* Frigate had lately brought into *Zangier* a *Saltee* Man of War of 12 Guns; This Morning arrived at some distance before this Port, the *Leopard* with the *English* Ambassadour for *Constantinople*. The Governour having Orders from the *Great Duke* to provide for his Entertainment and Lodging, if he comes on shore.

The Dutch Convoys are now upon departure for *Smirna*, being said to carry with them to the value of 300 thousand pieces of *Eight* in *Luigni*. A Barque arriving here from *Tripoly* gives us intelligence, that some of the Ships belonging to that place had lately taken the *Golden Flower de Lys*, a *French* Ship of 24 Guns coming from *Constantinople* and bound for *Marsailles*, laden with *Wool*, *Hides*, and other Goods to a very considerable value; and that six Ships were lately put to sea from *Tripoly* with their Ballast intended for *Constantinople*; and that four others of them were abroad sailing.

Brussels, Nov. 4. Don *Estevan de Gamarrilla* Ambassadour from the Court of *Spain* to the States of the *Netherlands*, having during his abode in these parts made several Proposals to the Magistrates of this place in the Name of the Constable of *Castile*; and amongst others, one for the admission of a Garrison of two Regiments of *Spaniards*, consisting of 2000 men; without which additional strength the Constable did not believe the Courts Sovereignty could securely sit here, but must be obliged to withdraw to *Ghent* or some other place of greater safety: thinking also to chuse some other place for his Residence with his Court. The Magistrates upon a long debate at last consented to the admission of the said two Regiments, but on condition they might be entertained and quartered by the appointment of the Magistrates, so that the Citizens might not be prejudiced or inconvenienced by them; and are besides contented to lodge 3 Companies of the Guards.

The Constable is now resolved to make this City his place of Residence, but desires that greater care than formerly may be taken for the clearing of the Streets, and prevention of the farther spreading of the Infection; which is of late very sensibly decreas'd.

On *Monday* last a great Reformation was made amongst the Cavalry, and about 6 weeks hence another is intended amongst the Infantry.

The Conference at *Lille* about the pretensions upon the Dependencies on the late Conquests of His Most Christian Majesty in these Countreys, is put off till the 15th instant.

The Constable has lately sent to the Governour of *Charleroy*, to expatulate with him for his late seizure of *Marimont*; it being a house of pleasure formerly built by *Mary Queen of Hungary*, Sister to *Charles the V.* and believed to have no dependency upon any of the late Conquests.

From *Burgundy* we are advised, that some *French* forces were again marching towards their Countrey, but they are since satisfied, that they were only some assistance marching to the *Lorrainers*.
