Tangier, Octob. 14. We have not as yet any certain news of the proceeding of Sir Thomas Allen with his foundron before Algier. We are confirmed from these parts, of the truth of thereport, that some of their ships returning from the Grand Seigniors service in the Levant, met with 3 or 4 French ships, which after fore dispue they took and carried into Algien, where they fold both ships and men.
