

Cologne, Nov. 9. The Lorrainers having withdrawn their lives from *Alsace*, and joyned with the succors which they expected, intend suddenly to enter upon some considerable action for the enlargement of their Winter Quarters. 'Tis also said that the Duke of *Lorraine* is summoning in all his subjects that are able to bear arms, for the carrying on of the War against the Elector *Palatine*; and that the Duke of *Elbeuf* and the Chevalier *d'Harcourt* being ally'd to the House of *Lorraine*, have obtained leave of His Most Christian Majesty to assist the said Duke with their Persons and Regiments.

In the mean time a party of 1200 of the *Palatine* Horse and some Companies of Dragoons have been ranging about the Country beyond *Creutznach*, but without any considerable adventure. 'Tis hoped both parties may be inclinable to concur with the Mediation set on foot by the Emperor; who for that purpose has given out his Commission to the Electors of *Saxe* and *Brandenburgh*, with the Bishops of *Salzburgh* and *Munster*, and the Margraves of *Durlach* and *Baden*.

Hambourg, Nov. 6. Letters of the 18th past from *Cadix* inform us of the safe arrival there of our Convoy of Merchant ships, to the great satisfaction of our Traders, who before were in much fear lest some disaster might have befallen them in their passage.

The Queen *Christina* is upon her way for *Rome*: she arrived at *Ausbourg* the 1 instant about noon, and from thence the same day departed, pursuing her voyage towards *Inspruck*; the Master of her Horse falling sick upon his journey, after some few days distemper died, and was buried at *Esford*.

From *Vienna* we are told, that a Courier is lately arrived there from *Silesia* with advice, that the Assembly of the States of that Province is concluded, to the Emperours satisfaction, they having resolved to raise 100 thousand Ducats of Gold to be disposed of as he pleases; giving him also assurance of the continuation of the other Subsidies in the same method as was formerly used. The Count *de Montecuculi*, President of the Council of War is lately returned from *Hungary*, having at *Raab* conferred with the Count *de Souches*, General of the Artillery, and Governour of *Comorria*, about the present concerns of that Kingdom in order to the future preservation of the peace. The Turks had lately a design of surprizing and demolishing a Fort upon the *Waag*, but finding the Garrison in good Order and upon their Guard, they were forced to retreat without making any attempt upon it.

Letters of the 30th past from *Copenhagen*, inform us, that the Dukes of *Lunembourg* were suddenly expected in that City, and that the Prince of *Denmark* was returned from *Holstein*, where he had presided in the room of the King his Father in the Assembly of the States of that Province; and that Commissioners were appointed to treat with the Resident from the States of the *United Provinces*, for the settling of all affairs in dispute between them.

Paris, Nov. 14. The Sieur *Sobiesky*, Grand Marshal of *Poland*, has (its said) written hither, that the Bishop of *Besiers* should not by any means proceed on his intended voyage to *Poland*, things being in that condition here, that his presence would but exasperate matters, and that other ways might be taken, which would more conduce to the advantage of the French interest; upon which, a Consultation is now held here, and 'tis believed the Bishop will have speedy Orders to put a stop to his voyage.

From *Houlon* we are told, that a Felouque lately arriving there from *Candia*, reported that he met our Volunteers within two days sail on this side the Island.

The 12th instant, the Abbot *Zeller* was solemnly consecrated Bishop of *Naziance* by the Cardinal *Anthony*, as a qualification to render him capable of being Coadjutor to the Arch-Bishoprick of *Rheims*. The Ceremony was performed in the Church of the *Sorbonne*, and graced with the presence of the Queen, attended by the Prince of *Conde*, the Duke of *Enguyen*, and the Duke of *Arbres*, who was placed at the head of all the Doctors of that faculty.

Whitehall, Novemb. 6. This day His Majesty in Council having the Roll for Sheriffs presented to him according to the usual Custom, picked these persons for lowering to be Sheriffs for the succeeding year in their respective Counties of *England* and *Wales*.
