

*Majesties Loving Subjects, as they tender the Favour of Almighty God, and upon Pain of Suffering such Punishment as his Majesty can justly inflict upon all such who shall Contemn or Neglect the same.*

Given at the Council-Chamber at *Whitehall* the Nine and twentieth Day of *August*, 1695. In the Seventh Year of His Majesties Reign.

*Jamaica*, June 15. Three English Seamen having made their escape in a Canoe from *Petit-Guaves*, where they were Prisoners, are come hither, and report, that the English Men of War and Land Forces commanded by Capt. *Wilmot* and Colonel *Lillingston* (who sailed on the 28th of *March* from *St. Christophers*) were, when they came away, upon that Coast, and had taken and ruined the Cape, which is the Eastermost Settlement the French had upon *Hispaniola*.

*Dublin*, Aug. 25. The *Dover Prize* and *Portsmouth Prize* arrived yesterday in our Bay from *Holyhead*. The *Pearle Frigate* came into *Kinsale* the 20th Instant from *Limerick*, having under her Convoy two English Merchant Ships bound home, one from *Guinea*, and the other from *Jamaica*; the latter called the *Tyger of London* of 26 Guns, commanded by Capt. *Kemishorne*. The *Weymouth Frigate*, Capt. *Jumper* Commander, arrived there the same day, and brought in with him a Ship called the *St. Peter of St. Sebastian*, of 300 Tuns and 6 Guns, laden with Oyl and Whalebone from *Greenland*, upon suspicion of her belonging to the Enemy, most of her Men being French.

*Edinburgh*, Aug. 22. This morning a Fleet of above 80 Sail bound for *Holland* under Convoy of 3 Dutch Men of War, sailed from *Leith Road*, and with them divers Ships for *London*, and a *Zealand Privateer* with 3 Prizes. The Earl of *Seaforth* has made his escape out of the Castle of *Edinburgh*.

*Falmouth*, Aug. 26. This morning came in here the *New-Hampshire*, the *Newcastle*, the *Adventure*, and the *Amity* from *Barbadoes*; They parted from thence on the 3d of the last month, being about 22 Sail, with the *Bristol Man of War*, who convoyed them to the Lat. of 18; after which they were separated in foul weather; and 11 of them being the 23d Instant in company together about 60 Leagues West from *Scilly*, there fell in with them two French Capers of 18 and 20 Guns each, against whom the *Averillia*, Capt. *Maximilian Robinson* Commander, carrying 24 Guns, made a very stout defence for several hours, beating off the French who twice boarded him, and blowing up his Upper Deck and killing many of them, but the Ship being much shattered she was at last taken; In the mean time the rest made the best of their way, and besides the 4 that are come in here, as is above mentioned, 3 are passed by to the Eastward; of the other 3 we have yet no certain account.

*Plimouth*, Aug. 27. Yesterday sailed from hence about 18 Sail of Merchant Ships bound to *London* from *Virginia*, with several Tin-ships and Coasters under Convoy of His Majesties Ships the *Litchfield* and *Smirna-Factor*. The same day came in here the *Eagle of London* from *Barbadoes*.

*Portsmouth*, Aug. 29. Yesterday came to Spithead the *Litchfield* and *Smirna-Factor* with the homeward bound *Virginia Ships*.

*Yarmouth*, Aug. 28. This day came into our Road about 60 laden Colliers bound for the River.

*Yarmouth*, Aug. 30. The *Milford* is come into our Road with about 50 laden Colliers; and here are likewise above 200 Sail of light Ships bound to the Northward.

*Deale*, Aug. 31. Yesterday came into the Downs His Majesties Ship the *Smirna-Factor*, and under her Convoy the *Maryland* and *Virginia Fleet* which put into *Plimouth*, with one Ship from *Cadiz*, and several Coasters.

There are Two Mails due from Holland besides that of Friday last.
