WHEREAS it is provided by Section 2 of the Customs (Exportation Prohibition) Act, 1914, that any Proclamation or Order in Council made under Section 8 of the Customs and Inland Revenue Act, 1879, as amended by the Act now in recital, may, whilst a state of war exists, be varied or added to by an Order made by the Lords of the Council on the recommendation of the Board of Trade:

And whereas it is provided by Section 2 of the Customs (Exportation Restriction) Act, 1914, that any Proclamation made under Section 1 of the Exportation of Arms Act, 1900, may, whether the Proclamation was made before or after the passing of the Act now in recital, be varied or added to, whilst a state of war exists, by an Order made by the Lords of the Council on the recommendation of the Board of Trade:

And whereas by a Proclamation, dated the 10th day of May, 1917, and made under Section 8 of the Customs and Inland Revenue Act, 1879, and Section 1 of the Exportation of Arms Act, 1900, and Section 1 of the Customs (Exportation Prohibition) Act, 1914, the exportation from the United Kingdom of certain articles to certain or all destinations was prohibited:

And whereas by subsequent Orders of

Council, and by the Proclamation, dated the 18th day of December, 1918, the said Proclamation was amended and added to in certain particulars:

And whereas there was this day read at the Board a recommendation from the Board of Trade to the following effect:—

That the Proclamation, dated the 10th day of May, 1917, as amended and added to by subsequent Orders of Council, and by the Proclamation, dated the 18th day of December, 1918, should be further amended by making the following amendments in and additions to the Schedule to the same:—

(1) That the following headings should be deleted:—

WORKMEN'S COMPENSATION (SILICOSIS) ACT, 1918.

The Secretary of State for the Home Department hereby gives notice that on the 6th January, 1919, he made a Scheme of Compensation under the Workmen's Compensation (Silicosis) Act, 1918, for the Refractories Industries. The effect of the Scheme is to provide for the payment of compensation in the case of death or disablement of a workman caused by silicosis or by silicosis accompanied by tuberculosis, in all processes in or in connection with the getting, handling, moving, breaking, crushing, grinding and sieving of refractory material containing not less than 80 per cent. of silica (SiO₂), and all processes in the manipulation of such material in the manufacture of bricks or other articles; and it applies to all mines, quarries, factories and workshops at which any of the processes are carried on with a view to manufacture or sale, with the exception of mines or quarries in which such material is only occasionally worked.

THE SALE OF COAL (IRELAND) ORDER, 1919, DATED THE 3RD DAY OF JANUARY, 1919, MADE BY THE BOARD OF TRADE UNDER REGULATIONS 2F, 2G AND 2JJ OF THE DEFENCE OF THE REALM REGULATIONS.

The Board of Trade, deeming it expedient to make further exercise of their powers under the Defence of the Realm Regulations as respects coal, hereby order as follows:—

1. No person shall on any sale or proposed sale of coal for shipment to Ireland or on any sale or proposed sale of coal in Ireland impose or attempt to impose any condition as to the sale of any other coal than that demanded by the purchaser or of any other article whatsoever.

2. Every person who sells coal in Ireland shall keep accurate records showing (a) the person, firm or company from whom he purchased the coal, (b) the description under which the coal was sold to him, (c) the price which he paid for the coal, (d) the price at which he sold the coal, and the person to whom he sold it, and the quantity sold to each person, and (e) unless the coal was sold at the retail price agreed upon with and published by the local authorities under the Retail Coal Prices Order, 1917, the amount added to the cost for cost of handling and delivery.

3. Every person who sells coal in Ireland shall give inspection of such records and of all invoices, contracts and documents relating to any coal referred to therein to any person authorised by the Controller of Coal Mines, and shall make such returns as to his business as the Controller may from time to time require.

4. No person shall offer or agree to sell coal for shipment to Ireland without disclosing to the purchaser before the contract is completed the pit price or the price f.o.b. charged by the owner of the colliery from whom the coal is obtained.

5. Where coal is sold for shipment to Ireland the seller shall deliver to the purchaser an invoice and shall state therein the quantity and precise description of the coal, the name of the colliery from which the coal, or from which each description, if more than one, was supplied, the pit or f.o.b. price of the coal, or of each description thereof, the insurance, transport and shipping charges, and the merchants' or factors' profit, if any. The seller shall also state on the invoice whether the coal is sold for bunkering or for consumption in Ireland.

6. No person shall re-sell for consumption in Ireland coal which has been sold for bunkering or shall re-sell for bunkering coal which has been sold for consumption in Ireland.

7. Infringements of this Order are summary

offences against the Defence of the Realm Regulations.

8. This Order may be cited as The Sale of Coal (Ireland) Order, 1919, and shall have effect from the thirteenth day of January, 1919.

GAS AND ELECTRICITY.

VARIATION IN CONVERSION EQUIVALENTS.

(1) The Controller of Coal Mines, in exercise of the powers conferred upon him under Clause 7 of the above Order, hereby gives notice that the conversion equivalent for gas in terms of fuel shall be increased to 18,750 cubic feet to the ton and for electricity to 1,000 Board of Trade units to the ton as from the meter readings taken for the close of the quarter ending December 31st last (except in those cases in which a higher conversion equivalent has already been specially agreed).

(2) Further, the Controller of Coal Mines determines that the allowances for lighting under Clause 8 or the special assessments for lighting agreed under Clause 12 of the above Order shall from such meter readings be likewise increased by 25 per cent.

(3) Such variation in the conversion equivalent for lighting allowances shall be without prejudice to any action taken or to be taken in connection with excess consumptions of gas or electricity in the quarter just closed.

(4) Further, under the powers conferred upon him by Clause 4 of the above Order, the Controller of Coal Mines agrees to the suspension of Clause 99 referring to the restrictions on gas and electrical fittings as from the date of this notice.

BISMUTH.

Whereas the Minister of Munitions is desirous of modifying the Bismuth Order, 1918, made by him and dated the 12th March, 1918, so as to remove the obligations contained

in Clause 2 (5) thereof upon every person who in any manufacture uses Bismuth Metal or any alloy thereof to make returns to the Controller of Non-Ferrous Material Supply as therein mentioned, and by enlarging the class of persons exempted by Clause 2 (6) from the necessity of making any returns:

Now the Minister of Munitions hereby orders as follows:—

1. On and after the 10th Day of January, 1919, until further notice, the Bismuth Order, 1918, shall take effect as if—

- (a) Clause 2 (5) were omitted therefrom;
- (b) There were substituted for Clause 2 (6)

the following—

(6) "Notwithstanding the above, no return is required from any person whose total stock in hand and not intended to be used in connection with the manufacture or alloy of steel or other metal has not, during the period for which a return would, but for this exception, have been required, exceeded, in the case of Bismuth Metal or any alloy thereof, 56 lbs."

1. Notwithstanding anything in the Wool and Tops (Dealings) Order, 1917, and the Wool and Tops (Dealings) (Amendment) Order, 1917, dealings in Icelandic Wool and in Tops produced therefrom are authorised and permitted without restriction.

2. This Order may be cited as the Icelandic Wool and Tops Permit, 1919.

ARMY COUNCIL ORDER.
DEFENCE OF THE REALM
REGULATIONS.

REGULATION OF THE SALE OF HAY AND STRAW
AND OF CHOPPED HAY AND STRAW IN ENGLAND
AND WALES.

Whereas by Order of the 20th August, 1918, the Army Council, in pursuance of the powers conferred on them by the Defence of the Realm Regulations did regulate the price of hay and straw and of chopped hay and straw in England and Wales:

And whereas by Order of 7th October, 1918, the said Order was amended:

And whereas it is desired to further amend the said Order:

Now therefore the Army Council do hereby cancel the said Order of 7th October, 1918, and substitute the following therefor:—

"5. Distributors may charge for quantities not exceeding 10 cwt. an additional sum of £1 6s. 8d. per ton, provided that where a would-be purchaser gives an order for a quantity exceeding 10 cwt. (such quantity being reasonable according to his normal requirements) and owing to a shortage of supplies, or other reason, the seller does not fulfil such order in one delivery, then the price shall not exceed that laid down in Schedule 3, paras. 2 and 4 hereof, excepting that the seller may charge in addition to the price laid down in Schedule 3, paras. 2 and 4 aforesaid, the actual cost of delivery for each delivery after the first until the full amount of the purchaser's order has been fulfilled; in all such cases an invoice or bill in respect thereof must be delivered to the purchaser indicating the charges made for delivery as separate items from the price of the goods delivered.

"6. (a) No distributor who has purchased from another distributor, such other distributor being entitled to and having charged the 6s. per ton authorised by para. 3 (a) hereof, may charge the said 6s. per ton in respect of quanti-

ties exceeding 10 cwt., but not exceeding 20 cwt. of hay or straw or chopped hay or straw sold unless he shall have obtained a permit so to do.

"(b) Application for such permit must be made to the County Distributing (Forage) Committee of the county in which the business premises of the applicant are situated. When the applicant has more than one business in the same county a separate permit must be obtained for each business.

"(c) The applicant must produce all books of account to the County Distributing (Forage) Committee concerned and give all information required.

"(d) Every permit so obtained must be placed in a conspicuous place in the business premises of the holder thereof and must be produced by him whenever required by persons duly authorised to demand the same or by customers.

"(e) In no case may a distributor charge the 6s. per ton authorised by para. 3 (a) hereof in addition to the £1 6s. 8d. per ton authorised by para. 5 hereof."

ORDER OF THE LOCAL GOVERNMENT BOARD.

Public Health (Regulations as to Food) Act, 1907: Regulations as to Shell-fish.

PORT OF LANCASTER.

To the Mayor, Aldermen, and Burgesses of the BOROUGH OF LANCASTER;—

And to all others whom it may concern.

Whereas the Mayor, Aldermen, and Burgesses of the Borough of Lancaster are the Port Sanitary Authority for the Lancaster Port Sanitary District;

And whereas it appears to Us, the Local Government Board, that danger arises to public health from the consumption of shell-fish derived from within the Port Sanitary District, and for the prevention of danger arising to public health it is expedient that the Regulations hereinafter set forth be made by Us in relation to shell-fish:

Now, therefore, in the exercise of the powers conferred upon Us by the Public Health Act, 1875, the Public Health Act, 1896, and the Public Health (Regulations as to Food) Act, 1907, and of every other power enabling Us in that behalf, We hereby make the following Regulations, that is to say:—

ARTICLE I.—In these Regulations, unless the contrary intention appears,—

(1) The expression "District" means the Lancaster Port Sanitary District;

(2) The expression "Port Sanitary Authority" means the Port Sanitary Authority for the Lancaster Port Sanitary District;

(3) The expression "Port Medical Officer" includes the Medical Officer of Health for the said Port Sanitary District, and any legally qualified medical practitioner appointed or employed by the Port Sanitary Authority to act in the execution of these Regulations.

ARTICLE II.—These Regulations shall be executed and enforced by the Port Sanitary Authority, and the Port Medical Officer shall make all such inquiries and inspections, whether within or without the limits of jurisdiction of the Port Sanitary Authority, as may be necessary to secure that all the provisions of these Regulations are strictly complied with.

ARTICLE III.—A person shall not sell, distribute, or offer for sale for human consumption any mussels or other shell-fish taken from within the District unless and until—

(1) Such shell-fish have been subjected to a process of cleansing which We, on the representation of the Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, or of the Port Sanitary Authority, have approved; or

(2) Such shell-fish have been subjected to a process of sterilization by steaming under pressure in a suitable apparatus for at least six minutes. The sterilization shall be carried out in a manner and at a place in the District approved by the Port Medical Officer.

ARTICLE IV.—(1) The Port Sanitary Authority may with Our consent appoint and pay a legally qualified medical practitioner to act in the execution of these Regulations.

(2) The Port Sanitary Authority may also, with Our consent, appoint or employ and pay a person to act, under the direction of the Port Medical Officer, in the execution of any such powers or in the discharge of any such duties of the Port Medical Officer under these Regulations as the Port Sanitary Authority assign to the person so appointed.

ARTICLE V.—(1) If a difference arises in relation to any subject matter of, or to any-

thing done under, these Regulations, the difference may, on the application of all the parties affected, be referred to Us for determination.

(2) It shall be at Our option to determine any such difference as arbitrators or otherwise; and, if We elect to determine the difference as arbitrators, the provisions of the Regulation of Railways Act, 1868, respecting arbitrations by the Board of Trade, and the enactments amending those provisions shall apply, as if they were re-enacted in these Regulations, and in terms made applicable to Us, and to the determination of the difference.

(3) Where We elect to determine any such difference otherwise than as arbitrators, We may by Our Order determine the difference, and it shall be a condition of the reference of any difference to Us that Our determination shall be final and conclusive.

(4) Every Order made by Us in pursuance of this Article shall have effect as if the Order were enacted in these Regulations.

ARTICLE VI.—Within the period of fourteen days after the date of these Regulations or within such further period as We may allow, the Port Sanitary Authority shall cause a statement of the effect of these Regulations to be published in one or more local newspapers circulating in the District, and may cause warning notices containing a copy of these Regulations or a sufficient statement of their terms to be posted in conspicuous places in the vicinity of any parts of the District where shell-fish are taken.

ARTICLE VII.—These Regulations may be cited as "The Lancaster (Shell-fish) Regulations, 1918."

We further certify in pursuance of Section 2 of the Rules Publication Act, 1893, that on account of urgency the foregoing Regulations shall come into immediate operation and We accordingly order that these Regulations shall come into force forthwith as Provisional Regulations.

ORDER OF THE BOARD OF AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES.

(DATED 9TH JANUARY 1919.)

YORKSHIRE (WEST RIDING) AND DISTRICT (FOOT - AND - MOUTH DISEASE) ORDER OF 1919.

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894 to 1914, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

Movement into, out of, or within Scheduled District.

1.—(1.) No cattle, sheep, goats or swine shall be moved into or out of the District described in the Schedule to this Order, hereinafter referred to as the Scheduled District, or be moved along, over, or across, or be allowed by the owner or person in charge thereof to stray upon a highway or thoroughfare within the Scheduled District; provided that nothing in this Order shall be deemed to apply to the movement of animals into or out of the Scheduled District where they are moved through such District by railway from

a place outside such District to another place outside such District without unnecessary delay and without the animals being untrucked within such District except for the purposes of feeding or watering the animals within the railway station premises where such untrucking takes place.

(2.) If any farm (except any detached part) is partly within and partly without the Scheduled District, the whole shall be deemed to be within the Scheduled District.

Power to restrict Movement of Persons in Certain Cases.

2.—(1.) An Inspector of the Local Authority acting under their direction may serve a notice on the occupier of any field, shed, or other place in the Scheduled District, prohibiting the entry of any person into any such field, shed, or other place, and thereupon, notwithstanding the existence of any footpath or right of way, no person shall enter the field, shed, or other place to which the notice relates while any cattle, sheep, goats or swine are therein, otherwise than in accordance with the following regulations; that is to say:—

(i.) The owner of the field, shed, or other place, or of the animals therein, or the agents or servants of such owner, may enter such field, shed, or other place so far as may be necessary for the feeding or tending of the animals.

(ii.) Any other person may enter such field, shed, or other place with a licence of an Inspector of the Local Authority or of the Board of Agriculture and Fisheries.

(2.) Copies of such notice shall be affixed or exhibited by the Inspector in such manner as he shall think desirable for ensuring notification of the restrictions thereby imposed.

(3.) A copy of every such notice shall forthwith be sent by the Inspector to the Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, Whitehall Place, London, S.W.

Power to restrict Movement of Dogs and Poultry in Certain Cases.

3.—(1.) An Inspector of the Board, or of the Local Authority acting under their direction, may, for the purpose of preventing the spread of Foot-and-Mouth Disease, by a notice served on the occupier of any premises in the Scheduled District, require him:—

- (a) to keep in confinement, or under control, as may be prescribed by the notice, dogs on such premises;
- or (b) to confine live poultry on such premises in a pen or other like enclosure;
- or (c) to prevent the access of live poultry to any specific part of the premises to which cattle, sheep, goats, or swine have, or recently have had, access;

and if any occupier after service of any such notice shall fail to comply with the requirements thereof, he shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

(2.) An Inspector of the Board, or of the Local Authority acting under their direction, may, for the purpose of preventing the spread of Foot-and-Mouth Disease, by notice affixed or exhibited by the Inspector in such manner as he shall think desirable for ensuring notification of the restrictions thereby imposed, require dogs to be kept by the person in charge

thereof under control while passing along any road or footpath specified in such notice, and if any person in charge of a dog while passing along any road or footpath to which any such notice relates fails to keep the dog under control, he shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

(3.) Every notice served on an occupier of premises shall remain in operation until it is withdrawn by a further notice served by an Inspector of the Board or of the Local Authority.

(4.) A copy of every notice served by an Inspector of the Local Authority under this Article shall forthwith be sent by the Inspector to the Secretary, Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, Whitehall Place, London, S.W.

Local Authority to Enforce Order.

4. The provisions of this Order shall be executed and enforced by the Local Authority:

Offences.

5.—(1.) If an animal is moved in contravention of this Order, the owner of the animal, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, and the person causing, directing, or permitting the movement, and the person moving or conveying the animal, and the consignee or other person receiving or keeping it, knowing it to have been moved in contravention as aforesaid, and the occupier of the place from which the animal is moved shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

(2.) If any person enters any field, shed, or other place in contravention of this Order, or of a notice served thereunder, such person shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

Short Title.

6. This Order may be cited as the Yorkshire (West Riding) and District (Foot-and-Mouth Disease) Order of 1919.

Mag.*), from Culver cliff, thence within 3 miles of the coast of the Isle of Wight to a position 3 miles, 180° (*S. 15° W. Mag.*), from St. Catherine point, thence to a position 30 miles, 180° (*S. 15° W. Mag.*), from St. Catherine point, thence to a position 30 miles, 180° (*S. 15° W. Mag.*), from St. Alban's head, thence to St. Alban's head.

By Night.—Inside a line joining Culver cliff and Dunnose. Within 500 yards of the shore between Dunnose and St. Catherine point. The area enclosed by a line drawn from St. Catherine point to a position 30 miles, 180° (*S. 15° W. Mag.*), from St. Catherine point, thence to a position 30 miles, 180° (*S. 15° W. Mag.*), from St. Alban's head, thence to St. Alban's head.

Area C.—By Day and Night.—Enclosed by a line from St. Catherine point to a position 30 miles, 180° (*S. 15° W. Mag.*), from St. Catherine point, thence to a position 30 miles, 180° (*S. 15° W. Mag.*), from St. Alban's head, thence to St. Alban's head.

2. Fishing is carried out entirely at the fishermen's own risk: this includes danger from mines and navigational risks.

3. At night the usual lights are always to be shown.

4. Fishermen are warned that they must not exceed the limits of the areas given above, as there will be increased danger in doing so on account of the heavy transport traffic between Spithead and Havre.

5. *Bonâ fide* trading vessels are now free to move on the south coast of England between Beachy head and St. Alban's head (except within the Portsmouth and Newhaven Defence areas). They must always follow the route and traffic instructions given them, and must always show the usual lights at night.

6. No small craft may anchor or be under way in the area bounded as follows:—

(a) *On the North.*—By the coastline between Seaford head and Crowlink Coastguard Station.

(b) *On the West.*—By a line drawn from Seaford head in a 158° (*S. 7° E. Mag.*) direction for a distance of $1\frac{3}{10}$ miles.

(c) *On the East.*—By a line drawn from Crowlink Coastguard Station in a 197° (*S. 32° W. Mag.*) direction for a distance of $1\frac{3}{10}$ miles.

(d) *On the South.*—By a line joining the southern extremities of limits (b) and (c).

7. All unregistered fishing craft must carry their permit number painted on each bow in figures not less than 12 inches in height. Vessels registered as British sea fishing boats are to comply with the statutory rules as regards lettering and numbering.

8. Owners of motor craft, pleasure craft, and small craft of all descriptions are to supply to

the Coastguard Officer of the district lists of all their boats and vessels which they may place afloat, and they are to obtain from him permits for them. Without such permits these craft are not to be used. The number of the permit is to be painted on each bow in figures not less than 12 inches in height.

9. Motor craft, pleasure craft, and small craft of all descriptions are not to proceed outside of their ports, creeks or rivers, during the hours of official day, unless in possession of a permit which may be obtained from a Customs Official on personal application, or (in places where there is no Customs Official) from the Coastguard Officer of that district.

10. The areas within which pleasure craft with permits may move during daylight are as follows, and, except as provided for in paragraph 11, they are forbidden to move in any other areas:—

Seaford: Within three-quarters of a mile radius from Old Battery, Blatchington.

Newhaven: Within one mile radius from the end of the western breakwater.

Rottingdean: Within one mile radius of the slipway.

Brighton: Within one mile radius from eastern pier.

Hove: Within one mile radius from Coastguard station.

Shoreham: Within one mile radius from the end of western pier.

Worthing: Within one mile radius from the end of town pier.

East Preston: Within one mile radius of Coastguard boathouse.

Littlehampton: Within one mile radius from the end of western pier.

Bognor: Within one mile radius of green fishing light.

Pagham: Within one mile radius from the coast watching hut.

Selsea: Within one mile radius from Coastguard station.

Sandown bay: Inside the line joining Culver cliff and Dunnose head.

Ventnor: Within one mile of Ventnor pier.

Christchurch: Inside line joining Chewton Bunny to Christchurch ledge buoy, and thence to Christchurch head.

Christchurch head to Sandbanks: Within 500 yards of low water mark.

Note.—Boating off Bournemouth is permitted inside a line joining the Martello tower near Sugar Loaf chine and Southbourne provided the boats are supervised and inspected by the Piermaster and Beach Inspectors in conjunction with the Coast-Watching Officer.

Poole harbour: Within line joining North and South havens.

Studland bay: From opposite Studland village to the old breakwater within 400 yards of low water mark.

Swanage bay: To the west of line joining Ballard and Peverill points.

11. At certain ports and places where pleasure cruising is permitted in areas A and C a strictly limited number of permits will be issued to amateur fishermen, who are residents and British born, to fish during daylight only in an extension of the pleasure cruising area. The conditions and regulations under which these permits are issued are printed on the permits and are to be strictly complied with. This relaxation of the rules has been made with the sole purpose of increasing the food supply.

Applications for these permits should be made:—

By residents of Newhaven to the Senior Naval Officer, Newhaven.

By residents of other places and ports in area A to Captain A. B. Purvis, R.N., Divisional Coast-Watching Officer, Lorne House, Broadwater Road, Worthing.

By residents of ports and places in area C to Captain A. L. K. Knaption, R.N., Divisional Coast-Watching Officer, Rope Hall, Lymington.

12. Pleasure permits will be issued at the discretion of the Customs Official and Coastguard Officer subject to the following conditions:—

(a) No person shall receive a pleasure permit in respect of any craft for which he has been granted a Board of Agriculture and Fisheries fishing permit.

(b) Subject to par. (a), pleasure permits may be granted to private owners and to owners of craft for hire, on the strict understanding that no professional fisherman or boatman between the ages of 18 and 60 be employed either on shore or at sea in connection with such craft. Any infringement of this rule will lead to the immediate withdrawal of the permit.

(c) All persons who receive pleasure permits will be expected to do their utmost to increase the food supply by catching fish; but this does not give them authority to go outside the limits of the pleasure area.

(d) The pleasure permit is always to be carried by the person in charge of the craft when the craft is in use, and the owner of the craft is responsible that those using the craft understand the orders relating to pleasure cruising.

13. *Shipping of Amateurs as Crew on Commercial Fishing Vessels.*—Where it is proved that there is a shortage of *bona fide* fishermen to form the crews of fishing craft provided with Board of Agriculture and Fisheries fishing permits, permission may be granted to a limited number of approved amateur fishermen or yachtsmen enabling them to ship as crew on such craft. In cases where this is required application is to be made to the District Inspector of the Board of Agriculture and Fisheries (Mr. E. S. Russell, 80, High Street, Lewes).

14. No excursion traffic is allowed except with the written permission of the Commander-in-Chief, to be obtained for the season in regard to standing excursions, and on each occasion of special excursions.

15. Nothing in these orders shall affect the standing orders relating to the Defence Areas at Portsmouth and Newhaven.

II. NEWHAVEN AND APPROACH—

Entrance into Port.

1. Shipowners and local agents are warned that their vessels should be directed to arrive at the port as a general rule by daylight, and should notify the _____ probable time of arrival to the Senior Naval Officer, Newhaven (Telegraphic address:—Divisional Transports, Newhaven) _____

2. The movements of all vessels, barges, or

boats of any kind are subject to the direction of the Senior Naval Officer, whose orders are to be obeyed immediately.

3. Subject to the above, merchant shipping may move as usual within the port of Newhaven, taking care to keep clear of any H.M. ships which are being navigated in the port.

AREA WITHIN WHICH ANCHORING AND TRAWLING IS PROHIBITED.

All vessels are prohibited from anchoring or trawling or any other forms of bottom fishing with nets in an area formed by lines joining the following positions:—

- (a) Birling gap.
- (b) Lat. $50^{\circ} 38' 00''$ N., long. $0^{\circ} 09' 00''$ E.
- (c) Lat. $50^{\circ} 39' 00''$ N., long. $0^{\circ} 02' 00''$ W.
- (d) Lat. $50^{\circ} 43' 00''$ N., long. $0^{\circ} 02' 00''$ W.
- (e) Seaford head.

III. SPITHEAD APPROACH—TRAFFIC REGULATIONS.

1. Passage of vessels between Noman's fort and the charted position of Warner light-vessel is permitted during the hours of official daylight, but they are not to use this passage during official night or in thick weather.

2. Vessels of all descriptions are prohibited from anchoring in St. Helen's roads to the westward of a line drawn in a 162° (S. 3° E. Mag.) direction from Noman's fort.

3. Until further notice all vessels should keep clear of a circular area of half a mile in radius the centre of which is situated $3\frac{1}{2}$ miles, 270° (N. 75° W. Mag.), from Fishing light on Selsea bill.

IV. PORTLAND HARBOUR APPROACH—REGULATIONS.

1. No vessels or boats of any description are to move in the area north of a line joining Portland bill with St. Alban's head, by day or night, unless proceeding into Weymouth anchorage, or as stated in succeeding paragraphs.

2. Seine and line fishing by night as well as by day may now be carried out in the areas laid down.

3. Fishing (including the use of trawls) may be carried out by night as well as by day within two miles of the shore, between Worbarrow head and Weymouth pier, but vessels must keep clear of the obstruction which extends from a position $1\frac{1}{2}$ miles, 193° (S. 28° W. Mag.), from Whitenose to the southward.

4. Fishing (including the use of trawls) may be carried out in the area enclosed by a straight line drawn from a point 5 miles, 180° (S. 15° W. Mag.), from Portland bill to a point $8\frac{1}{2}$ miles, 180° (S. 15° W. Mag.), from St. Alban's head, thence to a point 30 miles, 180° (S. 15° W. Mag.), from St. Alban's head, thence to a point 30 miles, 180° (S. 15° W. Mag.), from Portland bill, thence to a point 5 miles, 180° (S. 15° W. Mag.), from Portland bill.

5. In entering and leaving Weymouth bay vessels must pass between the two light-buoys about a mile to the south-eastward of the Breakwater lighthouse, and at night time must keep at least 2,000 yards from the Breakwater entrances, otherwise they are liable to be fired

on. Fishing vessels with permits may, however, pass through the gap between Whitenose and the position $1\frac{1}{2}$ miles, 193° (S. 28° W. Mag.), where the obstruction commences.

6. At night the usual lights are always to be shown.

7. Fishermen are cautioned that it is dangerous to fish outside the prescribed areas, owing to the presence of mines, and if caught doing so they are liable to forfeit their special permits.

Variation.— 15° W.

North Foreland to Beachy Head—Regulations respecting Yachts and Pleasure Boats.

Former Notice.—No. 126 of 1917; hereby cancelled.

Mariners are hereby warned that, under the Defence of the Realm (Consolidation) Regulations, 1914, the following Regulations have been made by the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, and are now in force:—

I.—NORTH FORELAND TO SOUTH FORELAND:

1. All Yachts and Pleasure Boats are to keep within two miles of the shore or within two miles of a line joining Ramsgate harbour lighthouse and Sandown Castle.

2. Yachts and Boats plying for hire must be duly licensed, and are not to leave the shore without a competent boatman in charge. In places where licences are not granted by the Local Authorities a permit must be obtained from the Senior Naval Officer, Ramsgate (see paragraph 3).

3. Private Yachts and Boats are not allowed to cruise in these waters without a permit from the Senior Naval Officer, Ramsgate. (When applying for a permit state name and address of owner, and name and description of craft.)

4. No Yachts or Pleasure Boats are to

cruise at night—i.e., between the hours of sunset and sunrise.

5. Yachts and Pleasure Boats are strictly forbidden to go alongside or communicate with any vessel in the Downs or Gull Stream.

6. _____ | _____

When H.M. Vessels are entering or leaving harbour, Yachts and Pleasure Boats are to keep clear of the entrance.

II.—SOUTH FORELAND TO BEACHY HEAD:

1. All Yachts and Pleasure Boats plying for hire between Beachy head and St. Margaret's bay are only allowed to do so by day. They must be supplied with a permit signed by the Chief of the Local Police, and they are to keep within a distance of one mile from the shore. They are to be at their moorings at night—i.e., between the hours of sunset and sunrise.

2. Yachts and Pleasure Boats are not allowed to leave shore, whether for pleasure or fishing, without a competent licensed boatman in charge.

3. Yachts may ply for hire in Dover harbour. Pleasure Boats *under oars*, as well as Yachts, may be allowed near the beach between the hours of sunrise and sunset, subject to the conditions laid down in paragraphs 1 and 2 above, but must obey any special order which the Naval Authorities may find it necessary to issue. _____ | _____

4. All Yachts, Pleasure Boats and Fishing Boats are to keep clear of H.M. Vessels entering, leaving or otherwise navigating in the harbour, and are not to obstruct the entrances or fairway.

5. Yachts and Pleasure Boats are permitted to enter or leave Folkestone Harbour. _____ | _____ but must keep well clear of any Transports entering or leaving.
