BRITISH NATIONALITY AND STATUS OF ALIENS ACTS, 1914 AND 1918.

In the Matter of Hermann Bushe.

Revocation of Certificate of Naturalization.

Whereas I am satisfied that Hermann Bushe, to whom a Certificate of Naturalization numbered 16997 was granted on the 28th August, 1907, has shown himself by act to be disaffected to His Majesty:

Now, therefore, by this Order made in pursuance of the powers conferred upon me by Section 7 of the British Nationality and Status of Aliens Act, 1914, I revoke the said Certificate, and I direct such revocation to have effect from the date hereof, and I further order the said Certificate to be given up and to be cancelled.

And I further direct that Augusta Bushe the wife, and Hermann Bushe the child, of the said Hermann Bushe, shall cease to be British subjects.
