His Majesty the KING has been pleased to approve of the award of the Military Medal to the undermentioned Ladies for distinguished services in the Field as recorded:—

Nursing Sister Helen Elizabeth Hansen, C.A.M.C.

For gallantry during an enemy air raid at Etaples, May 19/20th, 1918. She worked devotedly in the operating room throughout the period of the severe bombardment, which

lasted for two hours. Sister Hansen was ready for any duty, and exhibited qualities of coolness and courage.

Nursing Sister Beatrice McNair, C.A.M.C.

For gallantry during an enemy air raid at Etaples, May 19/20th, 1918. She carried on her duties throughout the night without interruption, and throughout the period of the severe bombardment, which lasted for two hours, Sister McNair showed great solicitude for the patients in her wards, and was wholly unmindful of her personal safety.
