The KING has been pleased to award the Albert Medal in each of the undermentioned cases in recognition of gallantry in saving life:—

*Corporal George Thomas Rowlands, 4th
 Reserve Battalion, The Duke of Cornwall's
 Light Infantry.*

At Clonmany, County Donegal, on the 21st October, 1918, Corporal Rowlands was instructing a party in the firing of live rifle grenades when a grenade, the fuze of which had been started, fell into the firing bay. Rowlands shouted to the party to take cover, and ran out of the trench, but the man from whose rifle the grenade had fallen did not move, and Rowlands thereupon returned to the trench, picked up the grenade, and threw it over the parapet, when it immediately exploded. He undoubtedly saved the man's life at the risk of his own.

*Lance-Corporal William Herbert Meredith,
 late of the Grenadier Guards.*

On the 5th November, 1916, Lance-Corporal Meredith was instructing a class in the firing of live rifle grenades. One of the party fired a grenade, but the charge was insufficient to project the grenade, which fell back, with ignited fuze, into the barrel of the rifle. The man held on to the rifle, instead of throwing it down, whereupon Meredith threw himself forward in front of the man and attempted to remove the grenade, but it exploded, blowing off three fingers of his right hand and wounding him in other places.

Meredith received the full force of the explosion, and undoubtedly saved the other man, who was only slightly wounded, from severe injury or death.

INSURANCE OF ENEMY MERCHANT SHIPS.

Whereas by Royal Proclamation relating to Trading with the Enemy, dated the 9th day of September, 1914, and issued with reference to the state of war with the German Empire and the Dual Monarchy of Austria-Hungary, it was declared that from and after the date of the said Proclamation the persons therein referred to were prohibited from doing certain acts therein more specifically mentioned:

And whereas it was further declared by the said Proclamation as follows:—

“Nothing in this Proclamation shall be taken to prohibit anything which shall be expressly permitted by Our Licence, or by the licence given on Our behalf by a Secretary of State, or the Board of Trade, whether such licences be especially granted to individuals or be announced as applying to classes of persons”:

And whereas by Proclamation, dated the 5th day of November, 1914, it was declared that the provisions of the Proclamations and Orders in Council then in force issued with reference to the state of war with the Emperor of Germany and the Emperor of Austria, King of Hungary, should be extended to the war with Turkey, subject to the exception in such Proclamation mentioned:

And whereas by Proclamation, dated the 16th day of October, 1915, it was declared that the Proclamations and Orders in Council then in force, issued with reference to the state of war with the German Emperor, or with reference to the state of war with the German Emperor and the Emperor of Austria, King of Hungary, or with reference to the state of war with the German Emperor and the Emperor of Austria, King of Hungary, and the Sultan of Turkey, should be extended to the war with Bulgaria, subject to the exception in such Proclamation mentioned:

And whereas certain enemy merchant ships are or may be under the control of the Allied Maritime Transport Council:

Now, therefore, the Board of Trade, on behalf of His Majesty, and in pursuance of the powers reserved in the said Proclamations, and all other powers thereunto them enabling, do hereby give and grant licence to all persons residing, carrying on business or being in the United Kingdom to insure the hull, machinery and cargo of any enemy merchant ship that is for the time being under the control of the Allied Maritime Transport Council, provided that any such insurance is made subject to the following warranties, namely:—

1. Warranted trading under the control of the Allied Maritime Transport Council;
2. Warranted that no claim shall be paid under this policy unless and until the name

of the payee shall have been submitted to and approved by the Board of Trade.

THE PETROLEUM PRODUCTS (WHOLESALE PRICES) ORDER, 1919, DATED JANUARY 31, 1919, MADE BY THE BOARD OF TRADE UNDER REGULATIONS 2F AND 2JJ OF THE DEFENCE OF THE REALM REGULATIONS.

The Board of Trade, deeming it expedient to make further exercise of the powers conferred upon them by Regulations 2F and 2JJ of the Defence of the Realm Regulations as respects Petroleum Products, hereby order as follows:—

(1) In this Order the expression “Wholesale Dealer” means any person, firm or Company whose business or a part of whose business it is to sell to retailers for resale any of the petroleum products mentioned in the schedule hereto.

(2) No wholesale dealer shall sell, deliver or supply any of the petroleum products mentioned in the schedule to this Order at prices exceeding those shown against such products.

(3) Infringements of this Order are summary offences against the Defence of the Realm Regulations.

(4) The Petroleum Products (Wholesale Prices) No. 2 Order, 1918, The Petroleum Products (Contracts) Order, 1918, The Petroleum Products (Wholesale Prices) No. 3 Order, 1918, The Petroleum Products (Wholesale Prices) No. 4 Order, 1918, and the Notice dated the 18th December, 1918, issued under the Petroleum Products (Wholesale Prices) Amendment Order, 1918, of 13th December, 1918, are hereby revoked.

(5) This Order may be cited as the Petroleum Products (Wholesale Prices) Order, 1919, and comes into effect on 1st February, 1919.

DEFENCE OF THE REALM (LIQUOR CONTROL).

ORDER (FURTHER AMENDMENT) OF THE CENTRAL CONTROL BOARD (LIQUOR TRAFFIC) FOR THE WESTERN BORDER AREA.

1. The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1914, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

The restrictions on movement of swine imposed by the Swine-Fever (Regulation of Movement) Order of 1908 and the Essex (Swine-Fever) Order of 1915 shall not apply to the movement of swine from the sale mentioned in the Schedule hereto to any premises in Great Britain not being in a swine-fever infected place, if the swine are accompanied by a licence in the Form F set forth in the First Schedule to the said Order of 1908 granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the District in which the place of destination is situate and subject to the following conditions:—

(i.) The swine shall be moved to the place of destination specified in the licence and not elsewhere and shall be there detained and isolated from other swine for twenty-eight days, unless they are slaughtered on such premises before the expiration of that period, or are moved under and in accordance with the conditions of a licence in the Form C set forth in the said First Schedule to a bacon-factory or slaughter-house in the same Scheduled Area.

(ii.) The swine shall be moved by the

nearest available route and without unnecessary delay, and during the movement shall, so far as is practicable, be kept separate from all swine not being moved with a licence under this Order.

(iii.) After completion of the movement the licence shall forthwith be delivered up at, or sent by post to, the nearest police-station in the same District by the person in charge of the swine at the time of completing such movement.

A licence under this Order shall for the purposes of the above-mentioned Order of 1908 be treated as a licence under that Order.

MINIMUM RATES OF WAGES FIXED FOR MALE WORKERS UNDER THE AGE OF 18 YEARS IN BRECON AND RADNOR, TO COME INTO OPERA- TION ON THE 10TH FEBRUARY, 1919.

The Agricultural Wages Board (England and Wales) hereby give Notice, as required by the above Act and the Regulations made thereunder, that they have fixed the following minimum rates of wages and the following differential rates for overtime employment, as hereinafter defined, for male workmen under the age of 18 years employed in agriculture for time work in the area comprising the administrative counties of Brecknock and Radnor, and have defined for the purpose of the application of such differential rates for overtime the employment which is to be treated as overtime employment as follows, that is to say:—

1. The wages payable for employment of any male workman under the age of 18 years who is wholly or partially boarded and lodged by his employer, and whose duties include attending to horses or other stock,

for a week consisting of the hours of employment whether on weekdays or on Sunday customary in the above area in the case of workmen under the said age, and so employed, shall be not less than wages at the following minimum rates, that is to say:—

(1) For workmen of 17 and under 18 years of age, 30s. per week.

(2) For workmen of 16 and under 17 years of age, 25s. per week.

(3) For workmen of 15 and under 16 years of age, 23s. per week.

(4) For workmen of 14 and under 15 years of age, 19s. per week.

(5) For workmen under 14 years of age, 15s. per week.

2. The wages payable for employment of all other male workmen in agriculture under the age of 18 years shall be not less than wages at the following minimum rates, that is to say:—

(a) In respect of employment in summer (as hereinafter defined):—

(1) For workmen of 17 and under 18 years of age, 25s. for 54 hours.

(2) For workmen of 16 and under 17 years of age, 20s. for 54 hours.

(3) For workmen of 15 and under 16 years of age, 18s. for 54 hours.

(4) For workmen of 14 and under 15 years of age, 14s. for 54 hours.

(5) For workmen under 14 years of age, 10s. for 54 hours.

(b) In respect of employment in winter (as hereinafter defined):—

(1) For workmen of 17 and under 18 years of age, 25s. for 48 hours.

(2) For workmen of 16 and under 17 years of age, 20s. for 48 hours.

(3) For workmen of 15 and under 16 years of age, 18s. for 48 hours.

(4) For workmen of 14 and under 15 years of age, 14s. for 48 hours.

(5) For workmen under 14 years of age, 10s. for 48 hours.

3. Provided that where a whole-time workman (other than a workman to whom Clause 1 of this Order applies) is employed by the week or any longer period, the wages payable to him for the hours of work agreed between him and the employer in any week (excluding hours of overtime employment) shall not be less than the respective amounts set out in Clause 2 (a) and (b) above, notwithstanding that those hours are less than 54 in summer or 48 in winter.

4. The differential rates for overtime employment shall be as follows, that is to say:—

(a) In respect of overtime employment on weekdays:—

(1) For workmen of 17 and under 18 years of age, 7d. an hour.

(2) For workmen of 16 and under 17 years of age, 5½d. an hour.

(3) For workmen of 15 and under 16 years of age, 5d. an hour.

(4) For workmen of 14 and under 15 years of age, 4d. an hour.

(5) For workmen under 14 years of age, 3d. an hour.

(b) In respect of overtime employment on a Sunday:—

(1) For workmen of 17 and under 18 years of age, 8½d. an hour.

(2) For workmen of 16 and under 17 years of age, 6½d. an hour.

(3) For workmen of 15 and under 16 years of age, 6d. an hour.

(4) For workmen of 14 and under 15 years of age, 4½d. an hour.

(5) For workmen under 14 years of age, 3½d. an hour.

5. Provided that in the case of a workman to whom this Order applies the minimum rates and overtime rates shall during the first two months of his employment in agriculture be 20 per cent. less than the rates which but for this provision would be applicable to him under the preceding clauses of this Order.

6. For the purpose of the above rates the following employment is defined as overtime employment, that is to say:—

(a) In respect of a workman to whom Clause 1 of this Order applies, all employment in excess of the customary hours of employment referred to in that Clause.

(b) In respect of other workmen:—

(1) All employment in excess of 54 hours in any week (excluding Sunday) in summer.

(2) All employment in excess of 48 hours in any week (excluding Sunday) in winter.

(3) All employment on a Sunday.

7. For the purpose of the above rates employment in summer shall be deemed to be employment during the period commencing on the first Monday in March and terminating on the last Sunday in October; and employment in winter shall be deemed to be employment during the rest of the year.

8. The above rates shall apply (according to the terms above set forth) to all male workmen under 18 years of age who are wholly or partly employed in agriculture within the meaning of Section 17 (1) of the Corn Production Act, 1917, in the above-mentioned area during such times as they are so employed.

9. For the purpose of the above rates the hours of work shall not include meal times, but shall include any time during which by reason of weather conditions an employer has prevented from working a workman who was present at the place of employment and ready to work.

10. The above rates shall come into operation on the tenth day of February, 1919.
