WHEREAS by the Isle of Man (War Legislation) Act, 1914, His Majesty has power to extend to the Isle of Man any Act which, in the opinion of His Majesty, was passed for the purpose of meeting any emergency created by the present War, subject to adaptations for the purpose of making the Act applicable to the Isle of Man:

And whereas by Order in Council, dated the

17th December 1914, His Majesty was pleased to order that the Defence of the Realm Consolidation Act, 1914, and the Defence of the Realm (Consolidation) Regulations, should extend to the Isle of Man, subject to the adaptations therein contained:

And whereas the said Act and Regulations have been amended by certain other Acts and Regulations, which said Acts and Regulations have been extended to the Isle of Man by various subsequent Orders in Council, subject to the adaptations therein contained:

And whereas the said Regulations have been further amended by Order in Council of the 25th November, 1918:

Now, therefore, His Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, that the Regulations amending the Defence of the Realm Regulations, contained in paragraph 2 of the Order in Council of the 25th November, 1918, and the Schedule thereto, shall extend to the Isle of Man in so far as the Regulations referred to in such paragraph and Schedule have been extended to the Isle of Man either in their original or in any modified form.

TRADE BOARDS ACTS, 1909 AND 1918.

In accordance with Regulations made under Section 18 of the Trade Boards Act, 1909, by the Minister of Labour, and dated 31st October, 1918, the Lace Finishing Trade Board established under that Act for that branch of the Lace trade in Great Britain as defined in the Regulations made by the Board of Trade and dated 16th March, 1914, having given due notice on the 28th September, 1918, of Proposal to Vary, as therein shown, certain General Minimum Piece Rates of Wages as set out in the Notice varying minimum rates dated 17th June, 1918, have given notice that they have varied these General Minimum Piece Rates of Wages so previously varied by them on the 17th June, 1918.

The Trade Board have given similar notice that they have varied, in accordance with their Proposal of 10th August, 1918, the General Minimum Time Rates, fixed by them for workers other than learners, from 4d. to 4½d. per hour, with corresponding variations for learners.

The KING has been graciously pleased to approve of the posthumous award of the Albert Medal for gallantry in saving life at sea to:—
Mr. Albert Charles Mattison, late Acting Boatswain, Royal Canadian Navy, and
Stoker Petty Officer Edward S. Beard, late Royal Naval Canadian Volunteer Reserve.

The following is the account of the services in respect of which these decorations have been conferred:—

On the 6th December, 1917, the French Steamer "Mont Blanc," with a cargo of high explosives, and the Norwegian Steamer "Imo" were in collision in Halifax Harbour. Fire broke out on the "Mont Blanc" immediately after the collision, and the flames very quickly rose to a height of over 100 feet. The crew abandoned their ship and pulled towards the shore. The commanding officer of H.M.C.S. "Niobe," which was lying in the harbour, on perceiving what had happened, sent away a steam boat to see what could be done. Mr. Mattison and six men of the Royal Naval Canadian Volunteer Reserve volunteered to form the crew of this boat; but just as the boat got alongside the "Mont Blanc" the ship blew up, and Mr. Mattison and the whole boat's crew lost their lives. The boat's crew were fully aware of the desperate nature of the work they were engaged on, and by their gallantry and devotion to duty they sacrificed their lives in the endeavour to save the lives of others.
