- (A) Kapoc;
- (A) Spirits, potable, of a strength less than 43 degrees above proof, except gin, brandy and liqueurs;
- (A) Wool grease.

Now, therefore, their Lordships, having taken the said recommendation into consideration, are pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered, that the same be approved.

Whereof the Commissioners of His Majesty's Customs and Excise, the Director of the War Trade Department, and all other persons whom it may concern, are to take notice and govern themselves accordingly.

ORDER OF THE TREASURY FIXING A MAXIMUM  
PRICE FOR SILVER BULLION SOLD IN THE  
UNITED KINGDOM.**

The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, in pursuance of the powers conferred on them by Regulation 30EEE of the Defence of the Realm Regulations, hereby make the following Order:—

As from the date of this Order the maximum price for silver bullion in the United Kingdom shall be 47½d. per standard ounce.

The Order of the 13th December fixing a maximum price at 48 7/16d. per standard ounce is hereby revoked.
