The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the 7th and 8th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 94, of the Act of the 13th and 14th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 94, and of the Act of the 32nd and 33rd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 94, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme or Representation, bearing date the 6th day of February, 1919, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

“We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting under the provisions of the Act of the 7th and 8th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 94, the Act of the 13th and 14th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 94, and the Act of the 32nd and 33rd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 94, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme or Representation for altering the boundaries of the New Parish of All Saints, Monkwearmouth, and of the New Parish of

Saint Andrew, Monkwearmouth, both in the County of Durham, and in the Diocese of Durham:

“Whereas by the authority of an Order of Her said late Majesty in Council, bearing date the 3rd day of September, 1844, and published in the London Gazette on the 18th day of the same month, a portion of the Parish of Monkwearmouth, in the said County and Diocese, was constituted a Separate District for spiritual purposes and such District was named ‘The District of All Saints, Monkwearmouth’:

“And whereas the said District of All Saints, Monkwearmouth, has become a New Parish of the character contemplated by the Act of the 6th and 7th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 37, by the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 104, and by the above-mentioned Act of the 32nd and 33rd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 94:

“And whereas by the authority of an Order of His late Majesty King Edward the Seventh in Council, bearing date the 7th day of May, 1907, and published in the London Gazette on the 17th day of the same month, a Separate District for spiritual purposes was constituted out of the said New Parish of All Saints, Monkwearmouth, and the said District was named ‘The District of Saint Andrew, Monkwearmouth’:

"And whereas the said District of Saint Andrew, Monkwearmouth, has also become a New Parish of the character contemplated by the above-mentioned Act of the 6th and 7th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 37, by the above mentioned Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 104, and by the above-mentioned Act of the 32nd and 33rd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 94:

"And whereas it has been represented to us, and it appears to us to be expedient, that the boundaries of the said New Parish of All Saints, Monkwearmouth, and of the said New Parish of Saint Andrew, Monkwearmouth, should be altered in the manner which is hereinafter mentioned:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Handley Carr Glyn, Bishop of Durham, (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this Scheme or Representation) We, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly represent, recommend, and propose, that from and after the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme or Representation, and without any assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order, the boundaries of the said New Parish of All Saints, Monkwearmouth, and of the said New Parish of Saint Andrew, Monkwearmouth, shall be altered so that all that portion of the said New Parish of All Saints, Monkwearmouth, which is described in the Schedule hereunder written, and is delineated and set forth upon the *Map* or *Plan* hereunto annexed, and is thereon coloured *pink*, shall be dis severed from such New Parish, and shall be annexed to and shall in future form part of the said New Parish of Saint Andrew, Monkwearmouth.

"And we further represent, recommend, and propose, that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from representing, recommending, and proposing, any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the hereinbefore mentioned Acts, or of any of them, or of any other Act of Parliament.

"The **SCHEDULE** to which the foregoing **SCHEME** or **REPRESENTATION** has reference.

"The territory to be dis severed from the New Parish of All Saints, Monkwearmouth, in the County of Durham and in the Diocese of Durham, and to be annexed to the New Parish of Saint Andrew, Monkwearmouth, in the same County and Diocese, being:—

"All that portion of the said New Parish of All Saints, Monkwearmouth, which is bounded upon the south-east by the New Parish of Saint Cuthbert, Monkwearmouth, in the said County and Diocese, upon the east, upon the north and upon the north-west by the said New Parish of Saint Andrew, Monkwearmouth, and upon the remaining side, that is to say, upon the south-east, by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Saint Andrew, Monkwearmouth, from the said New Parish of All Saints, Monkwearmouth, at the centre of the bridge which carries the North Dock Branch Line of the North-Eastern Railway across Roker Baths Road, and extending thence south-eastward along the middle of the said line of railway for a distance of 15 chains or

thereabouts to the centre of the bridge which carries the road called Harbour View across such line of railway upon the boundary which divides the said New Parish of All Saints, Monkwearmouth, from the said New Parish of Saint Cuthbert, Monkwearmouth."

And whereas Drafts of the said Scheme or Representation have been transmitted to the Patrons and to the Incumbents of the Cures affected by the arrangements which are contemplated by such Scheme or Representation, and such Patrons and Incumbents have respectively signified their assent thereto:

And whereas the said Scheme or Representation has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme or Representation, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Durham.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the 8th and 9th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 70, of the Act of the 14th and 15th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 97, and of the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 55, duly prepared and laid before His Majesty in Council a Representation, bearing date the 23rd day of January, 1919, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 8th and 9th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 70, of the Act of the 14th and 15th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 97, and of the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 55, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Representation as to the assignment of a Consolidated Chapelry to the Consecrated Church of Saint Andrew, Bournemouth, situate within the New Parish (sometime District) of the Holy Trinity, Bournemouth, in the County of Southampton, and in the Diocese of Winchester:

"Whereas at certain extremities of the said New Parish of the Holy Trinity, Bournemouth, and of the New Parish (sometime District Chapelry) of Saint John the Evangelist, Holdenhurst, which said extremities lie contiguous one to another, and are described in the Schedule hereunder written, there is collected together a population which is situate at a distance from the several Churches of such New Parishes:

"And whereas it appears to us to be expedient that certain contiguous portions (being the portions containing the population aforesaid) of the said New Parish of the Holy Trinity, Bournemouth, and of the said New Parish of Saint John the Evangelist, Holdenhurst, should be formed into a Consolidated Chapelry for all ecclesiastical purposes, and that the same should be assigned to the said Church of Saint Andrew, Bournemouth, situate as aforesaid:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Edward Stuart, Bishop of Winchester, as such Bishop and also as the Patron, in right of his See, of the Vicarage of the said New Parish of Saint John the Evangelist, Holdenhurst, and as one of the Patrons of the Vicarage of the said New Parish of the Holy Trinity, Bournemouth, and with the consents of the Right Honourable Sir John Henry Kennaway, Baronet, of Escot, Ottery Saint Mary, in the County of Devon, the Honourable and Right Reverend Edward Carr Glynn, late Bishop of Peterborough, the Right Honourable James Edward, Earl of Malmesbury, and William Willes, of Ringstead, Milton Road, Bournemouth, a Member of the Royal College of Surgeons, as the remaining Patrons of the said Vicarage of the New Parish of the Holy Trinity, Bournemouth, (in testimony whereof they the said consenting parties have respectively signed and sealed this Representation), We, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly represent that it would, in our opinion, be expedient that all those contiguous portions of the said New Parish of the Holy Trinity, Bournemouth, and of the said New Parish of Saint John the Evangelist, Holdenhurst, which are described in the Schedule hereunder written, all which portions, together with the boundaries thereof, are delineated and set forth on the *Map or Plan* hereunto annexed, should be united and formed into one Consolidated Chapelry for the said Church of Saint Andrew, Bournemouth, situate as aforesaid, and that the same should be named 'The Consolidated Chapelry of Saint Andrew, Bournemouth.'

"We, therefore, humbly pray that Your Majesty will be graciously pleased to take the premises into Your Royal Consideration, and to make such Order in respect thereto as to Your Majesty in Your Royal Wisdom shall seem meet.

"The SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Representation has reference.

"The Consolidated Chapelry of Saint Andrew, Bournemouth, comprising:—

"1. All that detached portion of the New Parish (sometime District) of the Holy Trinity, Bournemouth, in the County of Southampton and in the Diocese of Winchester, which is bounded upon all sides as follows, that is to say, upon the north-east by the New Parish (sometime District Chapelry) of Saint John the Evangelist, Holdenhurst, upon the south-east by the New Parish of Saint Clement, Bournemouth, upon the south-west by the New Parish of Saint Paul, Bournemouth, and upon the west partly by the New Parish of Saint Augustin, Bournemouth, and partly by the Consolidated Chapelry of Saint Alban, Bournemouth, all in the said County and Diocese.

"2. And also all that contiguous portion of the said New Parish of Saint John the Evan-

gelist, Holdenhurst, which is bounded upon the south-west by the above described portion of the said New Parish of the Holy Trinity, Bournemouth, upon part of the south-east by a detached portion of the New Parish of Saint Peter, Bournemouth, in the said County and Diocese, and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upon the remaining part of the south-east, upon the north, and upon the north-west by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said detached portion of the New Parish of Saint Peter, Bournemouth, from the said New Parish of Saint John the Evangelist, Holdenhurst, at a point in the middle of Holdenhurst Road opposite to the wall or fence on the south-western side of the roadway leading into King's Park, and extending thence north-eastward along the middle of Holdenhurst Road for a distance of 62 chains or thereabouts to its junction with the road called Queen's Park North Drive, and extending thence south-westward along the middle of Queen's Park North Drive for a distance of 63 chains or thereabouts to its junction with the roads called Queen's Park West Drive and Queen's Park Avenue, and extending thence first south-westward and then north-westward along the middle of Queen's Park Avenue for a distance of 22 chains or thereabouts to its junction with Howard Road, and extending thence south-westward along the middle of Howard Road for a distance of 10 chains or thereabouts to the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Saint John the Evangelist, Holdenhurst, from the said detached portion of the New Parish of the Holy Trinity, Bournemouth."

And whereas the said Representation has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Representation, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Winchester.

And whereas by subsequent Orders of Council, and by the Proclamation, dated the 18th day of December, 1918, the said Proclamation was amended and added to in certain particulars:

And whereas there was this day read at the Board a recommendation from the Board of Trade to the following effect:—

That the Proclamation, dated the 10th day of May, 1917, as amended and added to by subsequent Orders of Council, and by the Proclamation, dated the 18th day of December, 1918, should be further amended by making the following amendments in and additions to the Schedule to the same:—

(1) That the following headings should be deleted:—

- (B) Boiler tubes;
- (A) Candles;
- (A) Flax waste;
- (A) Hides of cattle, buffaloes and horses;
- (B) Iron tubes;
- (B) Molybdenum filament;
- (A) Plywood;

Provisions and victuals which may be used as food for man, the following:—

- (A) Coffee essence, including coffee essence containing chicory;
- (A) Honey and articles, mixtures and preparations containing honey;
- (A) Invert sugar and articles, mixtures and preparations containing invert sugar;
- (A) Tea, other than green tea, including tea waste, sweepings, dust and fluff, whether denatured or not;
- (A) Yeast and articles, mixtures and preparations containing yeast;

Shipbuilding materials, the following:—

- (B) Condenser tubes;
 - (B) Steel tubes;
 - (A) Steel wire rope;
 - (B) Tungsten filaments for electric lamps;
- Wool and wool manufactures, the following:—

- (A) Woollen rags, shoddy and mungo applicable to use otherwise than as manure, or as roofing felt rags.

(2) That the following headings should be added:—

- (A) Hides, wet salted cattle;
- Provisions and victuals which may be used as food for man, the following:—
- (A) Honey;
 - (A) Invert sugar;
 - (A) Tea, other than green tea;
 - (A) Yeast;
 - (A) Woollen rags (other than pulled rags) applicable to use otherwise than as manure, or as roofing felt rags.

Now, therefore, their Lordships, having taken the said recommendation into consideration, are pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered, that the same be approved.

That the articles indicated in the Proclamation of the 10th day of May, 1917, as amended and added to by subsequent Orders of Council, and by the Proclamation of the 18th day of December, 1918, as being prohibited to be exported to all destinations in European and Asiatic Russia and in other foreign countries in Europe and on the Mediterranean, except France and French Possessions, Italy and Italian Possessions, Belgium, Portugal, Greece, Serbia, Roumania, Spain, Morocco, and Palestine and Syria as far north as a line from Alexandria to Aleppo inclusive, and as far east as the Hejaz railway inclusive, Czechoslovakia, Alsace-Lorraine, and the portions of Austria-Hungary and territories on the left bank of the Rhine in the occupation of the Armies of the Associated Governments, and to all ports in any such foreign countries, should be prohibited to be exported to all destinations in European and Asiatic Russia and in other foreign countries in Europe and on the Mediterranean, except France and French Possessions, Italy and Italian Possessions, Belgium, Portugal, Greece, Serbia, Roumania, Iceland and the Faroe Islands,

Spain, Morocco, Palestine and Syria as far north as a line from Alexandretta to Aleppo inclusive, and as far east as the Hejaz railway inclusive, Czecho-Slovakia, Alsace-Lorraine, and the portions of Austria-Hungary and territories on the left bank of the Rhine in the occupation of the Armies of the Associated Governments, and to all ports in any such foreign countries.

Now, therefore, their Lordships, having taken the said recommendation into consideration, are pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered, that the same be approved.

The KING has been pleased to award the Albert Medal to Lieutenant Edward Arthur Simmons, Middlesex Regiment, in recognition of his gallantry in saving life in November last.

On the 1st November, 1918, at Wouldham, a platoon was engaged in attack practice, in the course of which the rifle sections advanced under cover of a rifle bomb barrage. The riflemen had reached a point some twenty yards in advance of the bombers, when, owing to a defective cartridge one of the bombs fired from the right flank, where Lieutenant Simmons was stationed as bombing officer, fell about four yards in rear of the riflemen. Lieutenant Simmons, who was behind the bombers, at once rushed forward, and, as there was no time to pick up the bomb and throw it away, he kicked it away. It exploded immediately, and he received severe wounds.

Lieutenant Simmons undoubtedly saved some of the men from injury or death at the cost of injury to himself and at the risk of his own life.

ORDER OF THE BOARD OF AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES.

(DATED 24TH FEBRUARY 1919.)

YORKSHIRE (WEST RIDING) (LEEDS DISTRICT) (FOOT - AND - MOUTH DISEASE) ORDER OF 1919.

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1914, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered as follows:—

Movement into, out of, or within Scheduled District.

1.—(1.) No cattle, sheep, goats or swine shall be moved into or out of the District described in the Schedule to this Order, hereinafter referred to as the Scheduled District, or be moved along, over, or across, or be allowed by the owner or person in charge thereof to stray upon a highway or thoroughfare within the Scheduled District; provided that nothing in this Order shall be deemed to apply to the movement of animals into or out of the Scheduled District where they are moved through such District by railway from a place outside such District to another place outside such District without unnecessary delay and without the animals being untrucked within such District except for the purposes of feeding or watering the animals within the railway station premises where such untrucking takes place.

(2.) If any farm (except any detached part) is partly within and partly without the Scheduled District, the whole shall be deemed to be within the Scheduled District.

Power to restrict Movement of Persons in Certain Cases.

2.—(1.) An Inspector of the Local Authority acting under their direction may serve a notice on the occupier of any field, shed, or other place in the Scheduled District, prohibiting the entry of any person into any such field, shed, or other place, and thereupon, notwithstanding the existence of any footpath or right of way, no person shall enter the field, shed, or other place to which the notice relates while any cattle, sheep, goats or swine are therein, otherwise than in accordance with the following regulations, that is to say:—

(i.) The owner of the field, shed, or other place, or of the animals therein, or the agent or servants of such owner, may enter such field, shed, or other place so far as may be necessary for the feeding or tending of the animals.

(ii.) Any other person may enter such field, shed, or other place with a licence of an Inspector of the Local Authority or of the Board of Agriculture and Fisheries.

(2.) Copies of such notice shall be affixed or exhibited by the Inspector in such manner as he shall think desirable for ensuring notification of the restrictions thereby imposed.

(3.) A copy of every such notice shall forthwith be sent by the Inspector to the Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, Whitehall Place, London, S.W.

Power to restrict Movement of Dogs and Poultry in Certain Cases.

3.—(1.) An Inspector of the Board, or of the Local Authority acting under their direction, may, for the purpose of preventing the spread of Foot-and-Mouth Disease, by a notice served on the occupier of any premises in the Scheduled District, require him:—

(a) to keep in confinement, or under control, as may be prescribed by the notice, dogs on such premises; or

(b) to confine live poultry on such premises in a pen or other like enclosure; or

(c) to prevent the access of live poultry to any specific part of the premises to which cattle, sheep, goats, or swine have, or recently have had, access;

and if any occupier after service of any such notice shall fail to comply with the requirements thereof, he shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

(2.) An Inspector of the Board, or of the Local Authority acting under their direction, may, for the purpose of preventing the spread of Foot-and-Mouth Disease, by notice affixed or exhibited by the Inspector in such manner as he shall think desirable for ensuring notification of the restrictions thereby imposed, require dogs to be kept by the person in charge thereof under control while passing along any road or footpath specified in such notice, and if any person in charge of a dog while passing along any road or footpath to which any such notice relates fails to keep the dog under control, he shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

(3.) Every notice served on an occupier of premises shall remain in operation until it is withdrawn by a further notice served by an Inspector of the Board or of the Local Authority.

(4.) A copy of every notice served by an Inspector of the Local Authority under this Article shall forthwith be sent by the Inspector to the Secretary, Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, Whitehall Place, London, S.W.

Local Authority to Enforce Order.

4. The provisions of this Order shall be executed and enforced by the Local Authority.

Offences.

5.—(1.) If an animal is moved in contravention of this Order, the owner of the animal, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, and the person causing, directing, or permitting the movement, and the person moving or conveying the animal, and the consignee or other person receiving or keeping it, knowing it to have been moved in contravention as aforesaid, and the occupier of the place from which the animal is moved shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

(2.) If any person enters any field, shed, or other place in contravention of this Order, or

of a notice served thereunder, such person shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

Short Title.

6. This Order may be cited as the Yorkshire (West Riding) (Leeds District) (Foot-and-Mouth Disease) Order of 1919.

ORDER OF THE BOARD OF
AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES.

(DATED 24TH FEBRUARY 1919.)

YORKSHIRE (WEST RIDING AND DISTRICT) (FOOT - AND - MOUTH DISEASE) ORDER OF 1919 (No. 5).

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1914, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

Revocation of Orders.

1. The Yorkshire (West Riding and District) (Foot-and-Mouth Disease) Orders of 1919 (Nos. 2, 3 and 4) are revoked as from the date of the commencement of this Order.

Modification of Existing Order.

2. The Yorkshire (West Riding and District) (Foot-and-Mouth Disease) Order of 1919, hereinafter referred to as "the Principal Order," is modified in the manner hereinafter appearing, and shall apply only to the Scheduled District described in the Second Schedule hereto.

Continued Prohibition of Movement in certain Prohibited Areas.

3. The prohibition of movement of animals contained in the principal Order shall apply without modification to the Areas described in the First Schedule hereto (hereinafter referred to as the Prohibited Areas).

Movement into the Scheduled District for Immediate Slaughter.

4.—(1.) An animal may, subject as hereinafter provided, be moved by railway without a licence from premises not situate within the Scheduled District to a railway station situate within the Scheduled District described in the Second Schedule hereto; and an animal so moved may be moved from the railway station to any slaughterhouse situate within the Scheduled District if accompanied by a Movement Licence granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the District in which the railway station is situate.

(2.) An animal may, subject as hereinafter provided, be moved by road from any premises not situate within the Scheduled District to any slaughterhouse in the Scheduled District if accompanied by a Movement Licence granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the District in which the slaughterhouse is situate.

Movement within the Scheduled District.

5. Where an Inspector of the Local Authority considers it necessary or expedient that an animal in his district should be permitted to be moved from premises in the Scheduled

District to any other premises in the Scheduled District, he may authorise such movement by a Movement Licence.

Exception of certain Animals from Provisions as to Movement.

6. Nothing in Articles 4 and 5 shall be construed as authorising movements into, out of, or within the Prohibited Areas.

Prohibition of Markets, &c., of Animals.

7. No market, fair, sale, or exhibition of animals shall be held in the Scheduled District.

Provisions as to Movement Licences.

8.—(1.) Where the movement authorised by a Movement Licence granted under this Order is movement to a slaughterhouse from premises other than a railway station an animal shall not be moved with the Licence unless before the movement is commenced it is marked by and at the expense of the owner in manner following:—

Cattle.—By the clipping of a broad arrow ↑ about six inches long on the left hind-quarter of each of the cattle and by the clipping of the hair off the end of the tail.

Sheep.—By the clipping of a broad arrow ↑ on the forehead of each of the sheep; and also by the painting or stamping of the letter M, about six inches long, on both sides of each of the sheep with the following composition, namely: Rosin, five parts; oil of turpentine, two parts; and blue or red ochre, one part; melted and used warm; or with some other adhesive composition of a blue or red colour.

Swine.—By the painting or stamping of the letter M, about six inches long, on both sides of each of the swine with the composition above mentioned.

(2) A Movement Licence under this Order shall not be granted by an Inspector of a Local Authority unless he is satisfied that the proposed movement will not involve movement on a road in the Prohibited Areas.

(3.) Where the movement authorised by a Movement Licence is movement as often as occasion may require, either between different parts of the same farm or between different farms, the Licence shall be marked with the words "Occupation Licence," and shall be in force until it is revoked by an Inspector of the Local Authority or of the Board by a Notice served on the occupier of the farm on which the animals then are.

(4.) Every Licence shall specify the name and address of the person to whom the Licence is granted, the number and description of the animals authorised to be moved, and the name or description of the several premises to and from which the animals are authorised to be moved.

(5.) Where animals are moved with a Licence under this Order, unless the Licence is an Occupation Licence, the Licence shall forthwith after completion of the movement be delivered up to an officer of the Local Authority or be delivered up at, or sent by post to, the nearest Police Station in the same District by the person in charge of the animals at the time of completing the movement.

(6.) A Movement Licence granted under this Order, except where it is otherwise

expressly authorised by this Order, shall be in force for four days, inclusive of the day of issue, and shall be in the form set forth in the Third Schedule to this Order or to the like effect.

(7.) A Movement Licence granted under this Order shall not be available if granted by the owner of the animal to be moved, or by his agent, or by the consignee of the animal, or by the occupier of the farm or premises or slaughterhouse from or to which the animal is to be moved, or by any individual member of an Executive Committee or Sub-Committee of a Local Authority.

(8.) A copy of a Licence which authorises movement to premises in a District other than the District for which the person granting the Licence acts as Inspector shall forthwith be sent by the Inspector to the Local Authority of the District in which the place of destination is situate.

General Provisions as to Movement.

9. Animals while being moved under this Order shall, so far as is practicable, be kept separate from all animals which are not being so moved, and shall be moved by the nearest available route and without unnecessary delay to the place of destination specified in the Licence, and where the place of destination is a slaughterhouse they shall be there detained until they are slaughtered.

Exception of certain Animals from Provisions as to Movement.

10. Nothing in this Order shall be construed as authorising—

(i) movement of an animal which is affected with foot-and-mouth disease, or which has during the preceding twenty-eight days been in any way exposed to the infection of such disease; or

(ii) movement into or out of a foot-and-mouth disease infected place; or

(iii) movement of an animal the movement of which is prohibited by notice of an Inspector of the Local Authority or of the Board given under any Order of the Board.

Saving for Orders and Regulations.

11. Movement of animals under this Order is subject to any other Order of the Board, and also subject to any Regulation made by a Local Authority under any Order of the Board for prohibiting or regulating the movement of animals.

Production of Licences; Names and Addresses.

12.—(1.) Any person in charge of an animal being moved, where under this Order a Movement Licence is necessary, shall, on demand of a Justice, or of a constable, or of an Inspector or other officer of the Board or of a Local Authority, produce and show to him the Licence, if any, necessary for the movement, and shall allow it to be read, and a copy of or extract from it to be taken by the person to whom it is produced.

(2.) Any person so in charge shall, on demand as aforesaid, give his name and address to the Justice, or constable, or Inspector or other officer.

Offences.

13.—(1.) If a person in charge of an animal being moved, where under this Order a Movement Licence is necessary, on demand made under this Order, fails to give his true name and address, or gives a false name or address, he shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

(2.) If any person, with a view unlawfully to evade or defeat the operation of this Order, by washing, or in any other manner, takes out, effaces, or obliterates, or attempts to take out, efface, or obliterate, any mark painted on any animal as required by this Order, the person doing the same, and the person causing, directing, or permitting the same to be done, and the owner of the animal, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

Interpretation.

14.—In this Order—

“The Act of 1894” means the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

“The Board” means the Board of Agriculture and Fisheries.

“Animals” means cattle, sheep, goats and swine.

“Slaughterhouse” means any premises where animals are habitually slaughtered, and includes a bacon factory.

Other terms have the same meaning as in the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

Commencement.

15. This Order shall come into operation on the twenty-eighth day of February, nineteen hundred and nineteen.

Short Title, &c.

16. This Order may be cited as the YORKSHIRE (WEST RIDING) AND DISTRICT (FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE) ORDER OF 1919 (No. 5), and shall be read with the Principal Order.

FIRST SCHEDULE.

Prohibited Areas.

1. An Area in the administrative county of the West Riding of Yorkshire, comprising such portions of the parishes of Hartwith-cum-Winsley, Bishop Thornton, Ripley, and Clint, as lie within the following boundary, namely:—

Commencing at the junction of the roads leading to Ripon and Pately Bridge at Ripley Village and proceeding in south-westerly and westerly directions along the road via Ripley Village, Ripley Castle and Clint Village to the

northern side of the North-Eastern Railway near Birstwith Railway Station; thence in a north-westerly direction along the northern side of that railway to Tinkler Lane; thence in a north-easterly direction along Tinkler Lane and the road in continuation thereof, crossing the Summer Bridge, to Burnt Yates Road, to its junction with the road from Burnt Yates to Lurk Beck; thence in a north-westerly direction along that road via Lawns Farm to a point where it crosses Lurk Beck; thence in easterly and northerly directions along the Beck to where it meets the western boundary of the parish of Bishop Thornton at Woodfield Mill Dam; thence in north-westerly and north-easterly directions, following the parish boundary to the point where it is crossed by the road leading from Rabbit Hill Wood to Haddockstones; thence in an easterly direction along that road, via Careless House Lane, to the eastern boundary of the Parish of Bishop Thornton; thence in a south-easterly direction, following the eastern boundaries of the Parishes of Bishop Thornton and Ripley to the main road from Ripon to Ripley; thence in a south-westerly direction along that road to the point of commencement.

(Any parts of roads forming part of such boundary to be excluded from the Area.)

2. An Area in the administrative counties of the North and West Ridings of Yorkshire, comprising such portions of the borough of Ripon and of the parishes of Littlethorpe, Bridge Hewick, Givendale, Skelton, Newby with Mulwith, Westwick, Bishop Monkton, Copgrove, Burton Leonard, South Stainley with Cayton, Ingerthorpe, Markingfield Hall, Lindrick with Studley Royal and Fountains, Studley Roger, Clotharholme, and Marton le Moor, as lie within the following boundary, namely:—

Commencing at the confluence of the River Skell with the River Ure and proceeding in a south-easterly direction along the south-western bank of the River Ure to a point where it is crossed by the Ripon to Bridge Hewick Road; thence in an easterly direction to the junction of that road with one leading to Morrells Wood; thence along the road in a south-easterly direction through Morrells Wood to Skelton Lane; thence in a south-easterly direction along Skelton Lane, through Skelton Village to Mulwith Lane; thence in south-westerly and southerly directions along Mulwith Lane to the southern boundary fence of Mulwith Wood; thence in a south-westerly direction along the farm road on the south side of Mulwith Wood to a point where it meets Bragget Wood; thence in south-westerly, north-westerly and south-westerly directions along the boundary of Bragget Wood to the River Ure; thence in a westerly direction across the river and the Island near the Ford to the western bank of Westwick Out; thence in northerly and westerly directions along the western and southern banks of Westwick Cut and River Ure to the Holbeck near Rockery Bridge; thence in south-westerly and southerly directions along the Holbeck to a point where it joins Copgrove Hall Fishpond; thence along the western bank of the Fishpond and Robert Beck, through Dark Walk Wood to the Ford; thence in a north-westerly direction along the western boundary of Dark Walk Wood and the road leading from the Ford to the Copgrove

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1914, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

Application of Order.

1. The diseases to which this Order applies are cattle plague, contagious pleuro-pneumonia of cattle, foot-and-mouth disease, sheep-pox, sheep-scab, swine-fever, anthrax, epizootic lymphangitis, rabies, glanders and farcy, and sarcoptic and psoroptic mange of horses, asses, or mules, and the definitions of "disease" and "diseased" in the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894, are extended for the purposes of this Order accordingly.

Notification of Disease.

2.—(1.) A veterinary surgeon or veterinary practitioner who in his private practice is employed to examine any head of cattle, or any sheep, goat, swine, horse, ass, mule, dog, or cat, or the carcase of any such animal, and is of opinion that the animal is diseased, or was diseased when it died or was slaughtered, or suspects the existence of disease therein, shall with all practicable speed give notice of the existence or suspected existence of disease to an Inspector of the Local Authority, and also, except where the disease is anthrax, sheep-scab, glanders or farcy, or sarcoptic or psorop-

tic mange of horses, asses, or mules, to a constable of the police force for the police area in which the animal or carcase is, or was at the time of its death, who shall transmit the information to the Board of Agriculture and Fisheries by telegram addressed "Agrifi London."

(2.) An Inspector of the Local Authority on receipt of notice under this Order shall forthwith report the existence or suspected existence of disease to the Local Authority, and if the disease is anthrax, glanders or farcy, or rabies, also to the Medical Officer of Health of the Sanitary District in which the animal or carcase is, or was at the time of its death.

(3.) The notification of disease hereby prescribed shall be in addition to any notification prescribed by any other Order relating to the disease.

Communication of Information of Disease by one Local Authority to another.

3. Where a Local Authority receives under this Order or otherwise information of the existence or suspected existence of disease in relation to a carcase of any of the above-mentioned animals that has died or been slaughtered in the District of another Local Authority, the Local Authority shall forthwith transmit the information to the other Local Authority.

Fee for Notification.

4.—(1.) A veterinary surgeon or veterinary practitioner who under and in accordance with this Order gives notice of the existence or suspected existence of disease to an Inspector of the Local Authority shall be entitled to receive from the Local Authority a fee of two shillings and sixpence for each notification.

(2.) Where two or more animals or carcasses are examined by a veterinary surgeon or

veterinary practitioner on the same premises and at the same time and are found to be diseased, or are suspected of being diseased, one fee only shall be payable to him in respect of the notification of the existence or suspected existence of disease in such animals or carcasses.

Revocation.

5. The Animals (Notification of Disease) Order of 1910 is hereby revoked.

Commencement.

6. This order shall come into operation on the twenty-eighth day of February, nineteen hundred and nineteen.

*Movement of Animals into Certain Boroughs
for Immediate Slaughter.*

1—(1.) Notwithstanding anything in the Yorkshire (West Riding) (Leeds District) (Foot-and-Mouth Disease) Order of 1919, an animal may, subject as hereinafter provided, be moved without a licence by railway from premises, not situate within any district which is for the time being a Scheduled District for the purposes of an Order of the Board relating to Foot-and-Mouth Disease, to a railway station situate within any borough mentioned in the First Schedule to this Order; and an animal so moved may be moved from the railway station to any slaughter-house, or bacon factory, situate within the same borough if accompanied by a Movement Licence granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the borough.

Provisions as to Movement Licences.

2.—(1.) The movement of an animal with a Movement Licence under this Order shall be subject to the following conditions:—

(i.) The animal shall be moved to the slaughter-house or bacon factory specified in

the licence and not elsewhere, and shall be there detained, and shall be slaughtered within four days of its arrival thereat.

(ii.) The animal during the movement to the slaughter-house or bacon factory shall, so far as is practicable, be kept separate from all animals not being moved with a licence under this Order.

(iii.) After completion of the movement the licence shall forthwith be delivered up at, or sent by post to, the nearest police-station in the same district by the person in charge of the animal at the time of completing such movement.

(2.) A Movement Licence granted under this Order shall be in force for not more than four days, inclusive of the day of issue, and shall be in the form set forth in the Second Schedule hereto or to the like effect.

*Exception of Certain Animals from Provisions
as to Movement.*

3. Nothing in this Order shall be construed as authorising movement of an animal the movement of which is prohibited by Regulation of a Local Authority or by notice of an Inspector of the Local Authority or of the Board given under any Order of the Board.

Production of Licences; Names and Addresses.

4.—(1.) Any person in charge of an animal being moved, where under this Order a Movement Licence is necessary, shall, on demand of a Justice, or of a constable, or of an Inspector or other officer of the Board or of a Local Authority, produce and show to him the Licence, if any, necessary for the movement, and shall allow it to be read, and a copy of or extract from it to be taken by the person to whom it is produced.

(2.) Any person so in charge shall, on demand as aforesaid, give his name and address to the Justice, or constable, or Inspector or other officer.
