The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

HEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the 7th and 8th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 94, of the Act of the 13th and 14th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 94, and of the Act of the 32nd and 33rd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 94, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme or Representation, bearing date the 6th day of February, 1919, in the words and figures following that is to say:

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting under the provisions of the Act of the 7th and 8th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 94, the Act of the 13th and 14th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 94, and the Act of the 32nd and 33rd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 94, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme or Representation for altering the boundaries of the New Parish of All Saints, Monkwearmouth, and of the New Parish of

Saint Andrew, Monkwearmouth, both in the County of Durham, and in the Diocese of Durham:

"Whereas by the authority of an Order of Her said late Majesty in Council, bearing date the 3rd day of September, 1844, and published in the London Gazette on the 18th day of the same month, a portion of the Parish of Monkwearmouth, in the said County and Diocese, was constituted a Separate District for spiritual purposes and such District was named 'The District of All Saints, Monkwearmouth':

"And whereas the said District of All Saints, Monkwearmouth, has become a New Parish of the character contemplated by the Act of the 6th and 7th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 37, by the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 104, and by the above-mentioned Act of the 32nd and 33rd years of Her said late

Majesty, Chapter 94:

"And whereas by the authority of an Order of His late Majesty King Edward the Seventh in Council, bearing date the 7th day of May, 1907, and published in the London Gazette on the 17th day of the same month, a Separate District for spiritual purposes was constituted out of the said New Parish of All Saints, Monkwearmouth, and the said District was named 'The District of Saint Andrew, Monkwearmouth':
