A PROCLAMATION

REVOKING A PROCLAMATION, DATED THE TWENTY-FIFTH DAY OF JUNE, 1918, PROHIBITING THE EXPORTATION FROM THE UNITED KINGDOM TO SWITZERLAND OF CERTAIN ARTICLES, AND AMENDING A PROCLAMATION DATED THE TENTH DAY OF MAY, 1917, AS AMENDED BY SUBSEQUENT ORDERS OF COUNCIL, AND BY A PROCLAMATION DATED THE NINETEENTH DAY OF DECEMBER, 1918.

WHEREAS by a Proclamation, dated the twenty-fifth day of June, 1918, made in pursuance of Section 1 of "The Exportation of Arms Act, 1900," and of Section 1 of "The Customs (Exportation Restriction) Act, 1914," We thought fit, by and with the advice of Our Privy Council, to prohibit the Exportation from the United Kingdom to Switzerland of certain articles:

And whereas it is provided by Section 2 of "The Customs (Exportation Prohibition) Act, 1914," that any Proclamation or Order in Council made under Section 8 of "The Customs

and Inland Revenue Act, 1879," as amended by the Act now in recital, may, whilst a state of war exists, be varied or added to by an Order made by the Lords of the Council on the recommendation of the Board of Trade:

And whereas it is provided by Section 2 of "The Customs (Exportation Restriction) Act, 1914," that any Proclamation made under Section 1 of "The Exportation of Arms Act, 1900," may, whether the Proclamation was made before or after the passing of the Act now in recital, be varied or added to, whilst a state of war exists, by an Order made by the Lords of the Council on the recommendation of the Board of Trade:

And whereas by a Proclamation dated the tenth day of May, 1917, and made under Section 8 of "The Customs and Inland Revenue Act, 1879," and Section 1 of "The Exportation of Arms Act, 1900," and Section 1 of "The Customs (Exportation Prohibition) Act, 1914," the exportation from the United Kingdom of certain articles to certain or all destinations was prohibited:

And whereas by subsequent Orders of Council, and by a Proclamation dated the eighteenth day of December, 1918, the said Proclamation was amended and added to in certain particulars:

And whereas it appears expedient to Us that the said Proclamation, dated the twenty-fifth day of June, 1918, should be revoked, and that the Proclamation, dated the tenth day of May, 1917, as amended and added to by subsequent Orders of Council, and by the Proclamation of the eighteenth day of December, 1918, should be further amended:

Now, therefore, We, by and with the advice of Our Privy Council, hereby proclaim, direct and ordain that the said Proclamation of the twenty-fifth day of June, 1918, shall be and the same is hereby, revoked, and that the Proclamation of the tenth day of May, 1917, as amended and added to by subsequent Orders of Council, and by the Proclamation of the eighteenth day of December, 1918, shall be, and the same is hereby, further amended by the withdrawal from the operation of any prohibition to export imposed by the aforesaid Proclamation of the tenth day of May, 1917, as amended by any subsequent Orders of Council and by the Proclamation of the eighteenth day of December, 1918, of the articles mentioned below in place of the articles mentioned in the aforesaid Proclamation of the eighteenth day of December, 1918, and by the inclusion of Switzerland as one of the countries to which such withdrawals of prohibitions to export apply:—

And whereas the said Act has been amended by the Defence of the Realm (Amendment) Act, 1915, the Defence of the Realm (Amendment) (No. 2) Act, 1915, and the Munitions of War Act, 1915, and other enactments:

And whereas the said regulations have been amended by various subsequent Orders in Council:

And whereas it is expedient further to amend the said regulations in manner herein-after appearing:

Now, therefore, His Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, that the fol-

lowing amendments be made in the said regulations:—

1. The following regulation shall be inserted after Regulation 37c:—

"37d. A person shall not, unless specially authorised for the time being by the Admiralty or Board of Trade, act in the capacity of master or person in charge of a British merchant ship unless he is a natural born British subject and the son of parents both of whom were at the time of his birth either natural born British subjects or British subjects by naturalisation, and if any person acts in contravention of this regulation he shall be guilty of a summary offence against these regulations."

2. Regulation 39a is hereby revoked and shall be omitted.

"And whereas we consider that in view of his important position as head of the Engineering Department of Your Majesty's Navy the Engineer-in-Chief should, in the same manner as other Heads of Departments, be granted on retirement a higher rate of retired pay than that allotted to his rank:

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council, to approve of the Engineer-in-Chief, on retirement, being granted the retired pay of his rank with an addition of £50 for each complete year of service in the appointment up to a maximum of £950, discretion, however, being reserved to the Admiralty to grant the maximum after 3 years' service as Engineer-in-Chief, provided that the conduct of his duties has been satisfactory and that he has completed 30 years' service counting towards retired pay.

"The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in this proposal."

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed.

And whereas by Order in Council dated the

14th day of September, 1915, His Majesty was pleased to order that no steps should be taken to put the Government of Ireland Act, 1914, into operation until the expiration of eighteen months from the date of the passing of that Act, unless the present War had previously ended, nor, if at the expiration of those eighteen months the present War had not ended, until such later date, not being later than the end of the present War, as might thereafter be fixed by Order in Council:

And whereas His Majesty was pleased, by Order in Council dated the 29th day of February, 1916, to extend by six months the time mentioned in the said Order of the 14th day of September, 1915, and by Order in Council dated the 7th day of September, 1916, to extend that time by a further period of six months, and by Order in Council dated the 13th day of March, 1917, to extend that time by a further period of six months, and by Order in Council dated the 22nd day of August, 1917, to extend that time by a further period of six months, and by Order in Council dated the 27th day of February, 1918, to extend that time by a further period of six months, and by Order in Council of the 4th day of September, 1918, to extend that time by a further period of six months:

And whereas it is expedient to extend further the time mentioned in the said Orders:

Now, therefore, His Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, that:—

No steps shall be taken to put the Government of Ireland Act, 1914, into operation until the expiration of a period of six months after the termination of the eighteen months and six periods of six months mentioned in the recited Orders, unless the present War has previously ended, nor, if at the expiration of that period the present War has not ended, until such later date, not being later than the end of the present War, as may hereafter be fixed by Order in Council.

WHEREAS by Section 659 of the Merchant Shipping Act, 1894, (which is a Section in Part XI. of that Act and which re-enacts similar provisions, by the said Act repealed, of the Merchant Shipping Act, 1854), it is (among other things) enacted that His Majesty may by Order in Council fix the establishments to be maintained by each of the General Lighthouse Authorities an account of the services of lighthouses, buoys and beacons, and that an increase of any establishment or part of an establishment so fixed shall not be made without the consent of the Board of Trade:

And whereas Her late Majesty by Order in Council, dated the 16th day of August, 1886, made under the Merchant Shipping Act, 1854, was pleased to fix the establishment which might be maintained by the Corporation of Trinity House, Deptford Strond, and to make certain provisions in respect of appointments to the said establishment:

And whereas it is expedient that the said Order in Council should be varied in manner herein-after appearing:

And whereas it has been made to appear to His Majesty that the Board of Trade have consented to such variation:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by virtue of the power vested in Him by the Merchant Shipping Act, 1894, and of any other powers Him thereunto enabling, and by and with the advice of His Majesty's Privy Council, is pleased to direct that the age limit of 35 years provided by the said Order in Council of the 16th August, 1886, in respect of appointments to Second Class Clerkships made from the body of Lower Grade Clerks shall be and is hereby revoked as from the 1st September, 1918.

And His Majesty is further pleased to direct that Mr. Charles Ward, one of the Extra Clerks on the said establishment, shall be eligible for promotion to the Lower Grade as from the 1st September, 1918, and that his prior service as an Extra Clerk may count towards his subsequent superannuation notwithstanding the provisions in the said Order in Council respecting age on appointment and the counting towards superannuation of such service as an Extra Clerk.

And whereas by Order in Council, dated the 17th December, 1914, His Majesty was pleased to order that the Defence of the Realm Consolidation Act, 1914, and the Defence of the Realm (Consolidation) Regulations, should extend to the Isle of Man, subject to the adaptations therein contained:

And whereas the said Act and Regulations have been amended by certain other Acts and Regulations, which said Acts and Regulations have been extended to the Isle of Man by various subsequent Orders in Council, subject to the adaptations therein contained:

And whereas the said Regulations have been further amended by Order in Council of the 14th January, 1919:

Now, therefore, His Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, that the Regulations contained in paragraph 6 of the Order in Council of the 14th January, 1919, shall extend to the Isle of Man in so far as the Regulations referred to in such paragraph have been extended to the Isle of Man either in their original or in any modified form.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter

113, and of the Act of the 17th and 18th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 84, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme, bearing date the 23rd day of January, 1919, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 113, and of the Act of the 17th and 18th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 84, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for apportioning the Income of the Benefice (being a Rectory) of Breadsall, in the County of Derby and in the Diocese of Southwell, between that Benefice and a certain other Benefice, namely, the Benefice (being a Vicarage) of Tickenhall, otherwise Ticknall (hereinafter called Tickenhall), which said last named Benefice is also situate in the said County of Derby and in the said Diocese of Southwell:

"Whereas the patronage of the said Benefice of Breadsall and also of the said Benefice of Tickenhall is vested in Sir Vauncey Harpur Crewe, Baronet:

"And whereas it has been made to appear to us that the said Benefice of Tickenhall is at present insufficiently endowed; and that the said Benefice of Breadsall has endowments of such an amount as that after the charge hereinafter recommended and proposed to be made shall have been placed upon the same endowments, the said Benefice of Breadsall will still be sufficiently endowed:

"And whereas it has been represented to us, and we are of opinion, that it is desirable that additional provision should be made for the cure of souls within the Parish of Tickenhall, by means of that apportionment of the income of the said Benefice of Breadsall, which is hereinafter recommended and proposed:

"And whereas the said Benefice of Breadsall is now full, the Reverend John Ayton Whitaker being the Rector or Incumbent thereof:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Edwyn, Bishop of the said Diocese of Southwell, acting as such Bishop of the Diocese within which each of the said two Benefices is situate, (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme and sealed the same with his Episcopal Seal) and with the consent of the said Vauncey Harpur Crewe, acting as such Patron as aforesaid, (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this Scheme) We, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly recommend and propose that without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than this Scheme and any duly gazetted Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying the same and as from the day of the date at which the said Benefice of Breadsall shall from whatsoever cause be next voided, all the tithe rent charges glebe lands and all (if any) other the endowments which shall at the date of the next avoidance of the said Benefice of Breadsall or which may thereafter belong to the same Benefice shall be charged and for ever thereafter chargeable in favour of the Incumbent for the time being of the said Benefice of Tickenhall with the annual sum or yearly charge hereinafter mentioned that is to say a clear annual sum or yearly charge of One hundred pounds, the same

annual sum or yearly charge of One hundred pounds to be as from the day aforesaid due and payable to the Incumbent of the said Benefice of Tickenhall and the same annual sum or yearly charge to be apportionable between any outgoing Incumbent of the Benefice of Tickenhall or his representatives on the one hand and his successors in the same incumbency on the other hand; and to be receivable by the Incumbent in whose favour it is charged as aforesaid by equal quarterly payments on the usual quarter days in every year.

"And we further recommend and propose that the Incumbent for the time being of the said Benefice of Tickenhall shall have the following powers for recovering the said rent charge of One hundred pounds per annum hereby proposed to be created in favour of the Benefice of which he is Incumbent as aforesaid (that is to say) power, if and whenever any part of the said rent charge shall at any time be unpaid for twenty-one days after any of the times appointed for the payment thereof (although there shall not have been any legal demand made thereof), to enter into the receipt of the endowments charged therewith or any part thereof and to receive and take the same until he shall thereby or otherwise be paid and satisfied the same rent charge and the arrears thereof due at the time of such entry or afterwards to become due during his being in possession of the same premises together with all costs and expenses occasioned by the non-payment thereof and for the purpose of collecting receiving and recovering such endowments or any of them to use exercise and enjoy all such powers and remedies for collecting recovering and enforcing payment thereof and of the annual sums payable for or towards the raising or making up the same as may be statutorily exercised or exercisable by him under the law then in force.

"Provided always that if at any time the Incumbent for the time being of the said Benefice of Breadsall shall by any deed duly executed by him under his hand and seal in accordance with the provisions of any Statute in that behalf enabling him, grant convey and annex to the said Benefice of Tickenhall any part or parts of the Rectorial endowments belonging to the said Benefice of Breadsall which shall in the opinion of the Bishop of Southwell for the time being be a just and fair equivalent or not less than an equivalent for the said yearly charge of One hundred pounds hereby proposed to be created as aforesaid then the same annual sum or yearly charge of One hundred pounds shall thereupon and thenceforth cease and determine and be no longer payable as hereinbefore recommended and proposed.

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

YORKSHIRE (WEST RIDING) (LEEDS DISTRICT) (FOOT - AND - MOUTH DISEASE) ORDER OF 1919 (No. 5).

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in

them under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1914, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered as follows:—

Revocation.

1. The Yorkshire (West Riding) (Leeds District) (Foot-and-Mouth Disease) Order of 1919 (No. 4) is hereby revoked.

Modification of Orders (Nos. 1-3).

2. The Yorkshire (West Riding) (Leeds District) (Foot-and-Mouth Disease) Order of 1919, hereinafter referred to as "the principal Order," the Yorkshire (West Riding) (Leeds District) (Foot-and-Mouth Disease) Orders of 1919 (Nos. 2 and 3), hereinafter referred to as "Order (No. 2)" and "Order (No. 3)," respectively, are modified in manner hereinafter appearing.

Extension of Scheduled District.

3. The Scheduled District to which the above-mentioned Orders apply shall be extended to include the area described in the First Schedule hereto.

Prohibition of Movement in certain Prohibited Areas.

4. The prohibition of movement of animals contained in the principal Order shall apply without modification to the Areas described in the Second Schedule hereto (hereinafter referred to as the Prohibited Areas).

Movement into and within extended Scheduled District (except the Prohibited Areas).

Holding of Licensed Fat Stock Markets.

5. The provisions of Order No. 3 applicable to the Zones described in the First Schedule thereto shall apply to the Scheduled District as extended by this Order (except the Prohibited Areas).

Short Title, &c.

6. This Order may be cited as the YORKSHIRE (WEST RIDING) (LEEDS DISTRICT) (FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE) ORDER OF 1919 (No. 5), and shall be read with the Orders referred to in Article 2.

ENGLISH CHANNEL, NORTH SEA, SOUTHERN PORTION, WITH RIVERS THAMES AND MEDWAY AND APPROACHES.

Pilotage and Traffic Regulations.

Former Notice.—No. 240 of 1919; hereby cancelled.

Mariners are hereby warned that, under the Defence of the Realm (Consolidation) Regulations, 1914, the following Regulations have

been made by the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty and are now in force:—

I. ENGLISH CHANNEL AND NORTH SEA SOUTHERN PORTION—PILOTAGE REGULATIONS.

1. All ships (other than British ships when trading coastwise or to or from the Channel islands, or to or from the Port of Brest, or any French Channel Port north and east of Brest, or any Netherlands Continental Port, and not carrying passengers) whilst bound from, and whilst navigating in the waters from, the Downs Pilot Station to Gravesend or *vice versa*, must be conducted by Pilots licensed by the London Trinity House.

2. All ships (other than British ships when trading coastwise or to or from the Channel islands, or to or from the Port of Brest, or any French Channel Port north and east of Brest, or any Netherlands Continental Port, and not carrying passengers) whilst bound from, and whilst navigating in the waters from, Gravesend to Great Yarmouth or *vice versa*, must be conducted by Pilots licensed by the London Trinity House.

3. Clauses 1 and 2 above do not apply to British ships whilst navigating in the waters between the Downs Pilot Station and Gravesend or between Gravesend and Great Yarmouth or between Great Yarmouth and the Downs Pilot Station, provided that they do not make use of any port in the London Pilotage District within these limits.

4. All ships (other than British ships of less than 3,500 tons gross tonnage, when trading coastwise or to or from the Channel islands, or to or from the Port of Brest or any French Channel Port north and east of Brest, or any Netherlands Continental Port, and not carrying passengers) whilst navigating in the waters from Gravesend to London Bridge or *vice versa*, must be conducted by Pilots licensed by the London Trinity House.

5. All ships (other than British ships) whilst navigating in the waters between the Downs Pilot Station and Great Yarmouth, or between those places and any intermediate pilot station that may hereafter be established must be conducted by Pilots licensed by the London Trinity House.

6. The Trinity House Pilot Station at Dungeness having been discontinued, pilotage is therefore not compulsory between the Downs Pilot Station and Dungeness, except for ships bound into or out of the harbours of Dover and Folkestone.

7. Trinity House Pilot Stations have been established at the undermentioned places, and merchant vessels not under compulsion of pilotage are very strongly advised to take pilots:—

(a) | .

(b) The Downs, where ships can obtain Pilots capable of piloting as far as Great Yarmouth, and also Pilots for the River Thames, and Folkestone and Dover harbours. The Pilot Steamer attached to the Downs Station will cruise in the vicinity of a position two miles south-east of Deal pier.

(c) ORFORDNESS.—The Pilot Steamer will cruise in the vicinity and south of Orfordness.

(d) GREAT YARMOUTH, where ships from the North Sea bound for the River Thames

or the English Channel can obtain Pilots capable of piloting as far as Downs.

The Pilot Steamer attached to the Great Yarmouth Station will cruise in the vicinity of St. Nicholas light-vessel.

(e) Pilots can also be obtained at LONDON for the Downs, _____ and Great Yarmouth (including the River Thames and approaches).

8. The Trinity House Pilot Stations at Dungeness and the Sunk have been temporarily discontinued.

Note.—The Pilots referred to in this Notice are the Pilots licensed by the London Trinity House and no others.

II. RIVERS THAMES AND MEDWAY, &c.—TRAFFIC REGULATIONS.

1. All traffic into and out of the River Thames must pass through the Edinburgh Channels, or through the Black Deep south of the Knock John and Knob Light-Buoys, and through the Oaze Deep until further notice.

No merchant or other private vessel is to be at anchor in the Black Deep, and the Main Channel of the Thames, to the Southward of a line joining a position in lat. $51^{\circ} 39' N.$, long. $1^{\circ} 23' E.$, D3 Buoy, a position in lat. $51^{\circ} 33' 08'' N.$, long. $1^{\circ} 13' 03'' E.$, Knob Light-Buoy, a position in lat. $51^{\circ} 31' 45'' N.$, long. $1^{\circ} 04' 48'' E.$, South Shoebury Light-Buoy, a position in lat. $51^{\circ} 29' 15'' N.$, long. $0^{\circ} 49' 45'' E.$, and Nos. 1, 2 and 3 Sea Reach Buoys, except when obliged to anchor on account of fog.

No vessel is to anchor in the Black Deep between the parallel of lat. $51^{\circ} 39' N.$ and the Sunk Light-Vessel without special orders, except such Southbound vessels as are unable to proceed further south owing to darkness or thick weather; vessels anchoring under such circumstances are only to anchor to the westward of a line joining positions in lat. $51^{\circ} 45' 00'' N.$, long. $1^{\circ} 30' 15'' E.$, lat. $51^{\circ} 42' 00'' N.$, long. $1^{\circ} 27' 30'' E.$, and lat. $51^{\circ} 39' N.$, long. $1^{\circ} 23' E.$, and well clear of the fairway.

All other Channels are closed to navigation.

Note.—This Notice is a revision of the former Notice quoted above.

River Humber and Approaches—Pilotage, Traffic and Fishing Regulations.

Former Notice.—No. 445 of 1919; hereby cancelled.

Mariners are hereby warned that, under the Defence of the Realm (Consolidation) Regulations, 1914, the following Regulations have been made by the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, and are now in force.

1. That portion of the Humber which lies between two straight lines, drawn from shore to shore, as follows:—(1) a line drawn 225° (S. $61^{\circ} W.$ Mag.) through Spurn lighthouse; (2) drawn 344° (North Mag.) from the east side of Barrow haven, will be referred to as the "port" in these regulations.

2. _____

3. All pilotage certificates granted to masters and mates for the whole or any part of the Humber Pilotage district are suspended, and further, all vessels (irrespective of draught, size, or nationality, but with the exception of those provided for in paragraph 4) bound to or from any place on the Humber must be conducted by licensed pilots over the whole or any part of the waters between Hull and the Outer Pilotage station of the Humber Pilotage district, which, until further notice, will be situated in the neighbourhood of the Bull light-vessel.

4. In the case of lighter inter-dock traffic and of small British vessels engaged in local traffic above Grimsby, pilotage by licensed pilots is not compulsory; nor for fishing vessels belonging to Humber ports for the limits between Hull and the sea.

5. During fog with visibility of less than half a mile, no traffic is permitted to move on the Humber below Paull point.

6. _____

7. The pilot lobbies will be notified when the existence of fog outside the river is known.

8. All vessels proceeding into or out of the Humber must be navigated—

(a) By way of a passage which has been cleared through the East Boom for about seven cables in a north-easterly direction: and marked on its southern side by Cleve Ness float showing a *flashing white* light, and on its northern side by a black conical buoy showing a *double flashing red* light.

(b) By way of a passage which has been cleared through the Middle Boom extending from the southern gate-vessel (moored 13 cables 60° from the Grimsby Hydraulic Tower) for about six cables 19° (N. 35° E. Mag.) to the northern gate-vessel.

By day: Gate-vessels will each show a cone apex upwards at the yard-arm on the passage side.

By night: Gate-vessels will each show two white lights six feet apart on the yard-arm nearest the passage side, and one white light on the yard-arm farthest from the passage side.

9. _____

10. All vessels entering or leaving Grimsby Docks must pass to the southward of the No. 4. Lower Burcom light float, except those making

use of the channel southward of the Burcom shoal (hereinafter called the Burcom channel), which are exempted from this condition, but no vessel may cross the Burcom shoal between the No. 5 Middle Burcom B.W.V.S. buoy and No. 4 Lower Burcom light-float. Vessels using the Burcom channel must pass into and out of its western end to the eastward of No. 6 Upper Burcom B.W.V.S. buoy, and of its eastern end by a passage of 220 feet wide, each side of which is marked by a dolphin surmounted by a black triangle supported on a white pole. No sailing vessel or dumb craft may use this passage unless towed, and no vessel is permitted to tow more than two craft at one time through the passage.

Vessels making use of this passage are cautioned to keep well in the middle of the opening and are subject to the following regulations:

(1.) Vessels navigating against the tide must in all cases give way to those navigating with the tide.

(2.) No vessel must approach the defences in this part of the river nearer than a quarter of a mile except to pass through the before-mentioned passage or to enter or leave the docks or old outfall at Grimsby.

(3.) No vessel may tow more vessels at one time than she can safely navigate through the passage, and under no circumstances is the tow to comprise more than two craft.

(4.) Distant signals controlling the small gateway will be shown from the flagstaff on the West Pier at the Grimsby Dock entrance as follows:—

(a) Two black balls will denote that the passage is open.

(b) Three black balls will denote that the passage is closed.

(c) No signal being hoisted denotes that traffic is suspended.

When signal (b), three black balls, is hoisted, no vessel may approach the passage, and when traffic is suspended no vessels, other than H.M. Ships on special duty, may use the passage.

11. Anchorages.—All vessels, including trawlers, must anchor in one of the following anchorages:—

(1.) The Southern Anchorage, which comprises the area bounded as follows:—

(a) On the North by the Bull sand.

(b) On the South by the Lincolnshire shore.

(c) On the East by the bearing Bull light-vessel 344° (*North Mag.*).

(d) On the West by the line joining Bull light-vessel and Spurn high light produced to the Lincolnshire shore.

(2.) Between the East and Middle Booms northward of a line joining the Middle light-vessel and Spurn high light.

(3.) Between No. 4 Lower Burcom light-float and No. 6 Upper Burcom B.W.V.S. buoy, but not northward of a line drawn parallel to the line of the Killingholme leading lights and distant two cables to the southward of it, nor westward of No. 6 Upper Burcom buoy.

12. Prohibited areas:—

(I.) No vessel shall anchor within four cables of any of the Booms.

(II.) Anchorage for merchant vessels and fishing craft is prohibited in any other part of the river below No. 6 Upper Burcom buoy except in the areas defined in paragraph 11.

(III.) No vessel of any description may anchor in the area defined by the following lines:—

On the East.—By a line joining Spurn lighthouse and Bull light-vessel produced to the Lincolnshire shore.

On the South.—By the dry contour line of Haile sand.

On the West.—By the line of bearing Cleethorpes sewer outfall beacon (on which a red light is exhibited) in a 240° (*S. 76° W. Mag.*) direction.

On the North.—By Wyke bight.

(IV.) No merchant vessel of any description may enter, pass through or remain in the area bounded as follows, without special permission:—

(1) On the North by the bearing Skitter Haven No. 8 B.W.V.S. buoy 55° (*N. 71° E. Mag.*).

(2) On the South by the bearing Killingholme Oil Fuel jetty, 235° (*S. 71° W. Mag.*).

(3) On the East by a line joining the before-mentioned No. 8 buoy and Killingholme No. 7 light-float.

(4) On the West by the Lincolnshire River bank.

13. No neutral vessel may lie alongside any of the piers or jetties in the Humber at night without special permission.

14. No merchant vessels or boats, etc., will be allowed to approach within a quarter of a mile of any defence work (except to pass through the Boom gateways or to enter or leave the old outfall or docks at Grimsby) or to go alongside any Government ship, vessel, lighter, or any other Government craft, or any Government establishment, without special permission.

15. No vessel is permitted to tow more than three craft at one time through a gateway of the Boom defence or more than two through the passage in the Burcom channel described in paragraph 10. The number of craft towed will be restricted according to the power of the tug.

16. Humber Rule No. 18 is to be strictly enforced. No sound signals other than navigation signals authorised by the Regulations for Preventing Collisions at Sea, and by Humber Rules Nos. 14 to 16 (inclusive) at all times of the day or night, and No. 17 during the day only, are on any account to be used by vessels in any part of the Humber, the Old Harbour at Hull, or within any of the docks at Hull, Immingham or Grimsby.

17. Fishing in the Humber.—No vessel is allowed to fish, shrimp, trawl or whelk in the Humber within the areas defined by the following lines:—

No. 1 Area.—(a) A line joining Stone Creek coastguard flagstaff and the eastern extremity of the eastern jetty at Immingham.

(b) A line joining the riverward beacon of the two upper measured mile beacons on Sunk Island and the flagstaff near Stallingborough haven.

No. 2 Area.—(a) A line joining Bull light-vessel and Spurn lighthouse produced to the Lincolnshire shore.

(b) A line of bearing of Cleethorpes sewer outfall in a 240° ($S. 76^{\circ} W. Mag.$) direction, which passes at a distance of six cables from Spurn lighthouse.

18. Patrol of Internal Waterways.—The internal waterways of the port will be policed by Naval patrol vessels and by the Humber Conservancy Board under the direction of the Naval authorities.

Captains and Masters of Merchant Vessels and persons in charge of barges or boats of any kind are hereby warned to observe any orders which may be given to them by the Naval Patrol vessels or the duly authorised officers of the Humber Conservancy Board.

19. All instructions given by Officers in command of H.M. ships, Patrol vessels or the duly authorised officers of the Humber Conservancy Board are to be implicitly and promptly obeyed even should they conflict with these orders.

Variation.— $16^{\circ} W.$
