WHEREAS it is provided by Section 2 of
the Customs (Exportation Prohibition)
Act, 1914, that any Proclamation or Order in
Council made under Section 8 of the Customs
and Inland Revenue Act, 1879, as amended by
the Act now in recital, may, whilst a state of
war exists, be varied or added to by an Order
made by the Lords of the Council on the recom-
mendation of the Board of Trade:

And whereas it is provided by Section 2 of
the Customs (Exportation Restriction) Act,
1914, that any Proclamation made under
Section 1 of the Exportation of Arms Act,
1900, may, whether the Proclamation was made
before or after the passing of the Act now in
recital, be varied or added to, whilst a state of
war exists, by an Order made by the Lords of
the Council on the recommendation of the
Board of Trade:

And whereas by a Proclamation, dated the
10th day of May, 1917, and made under Section
8 of the Customs and Inland Revenue Act,
1879, and Section 1 of the Exportation of Arms
Act, 1900, and Section 1 of the Customs
(Exportation Prohibition) Act, 1914, the
exportation from the United Kingdom of
certain articles to certain or all destinations was
prohibited:

And whereas by subsequent Orders of
Council, and by the Proclamations, dated
respectively the 18th day of December, 1918,
and the 12th day of March, 1919, the said
Proclamation was amended and added to in
certain particulars:

And whereas there was this day read at the
Board a recommendation from the Board of
Trade to the following effect:—

That the Proclamation, dated the 10th day
of May, 1917, as amended and added to by
subsequent Orders of Council, and by the
Proclamations, dated respectively the 18th
day of December, 1918, and the 12th day of
March, 1919, should be further amended by
making the following amendments in and
additions to the Schedule to the same:—

(1) That the following headings should be
deleted:—

- (A) Binder twine;
- (A) Boilers (not including portable boilers)
and their component parts;
- (A) Chestnut extract, liquid;
- (A) Flax shakings;
- (A) Flax tow;
- (A) Fuel economisers constructed of cast-
iron pipes, used as auxiliary heating
apparatus in connexion with land or marine
steam boilers;
- (A) Gluestock of all kinds, including
animal hoofs, untanned hides and pelts, not
otherwise specifically prohibited;
- (A) Guttering, cast iron, and cast iron
gutter fittings and connexions;
- (A) Hides and pelts, clippings of;
- Provisions and victuals which may be used
as food for man, the following:—
- (A) Invert sugar;
- (A) Sugar, cane and beet, and articles,
mixtures and preparations containing
sugar, cane or beet;
- (A) Lead coated sheets;
