WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the 59th year of His late Majesty King George the Third, Chapter 134, of the Act of the 2nd and 3rd years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 49, and of the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 55, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Representation, bearing date the 20th day of February, 1919, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 59th year of His late Majesty King George the Third, Chapter 134, of the Act of the 2nd and 3rd years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 49, and of the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 55, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Representation as to the assignment of a District Chapelry to the Consecrated Church of Saint Barnabas, Epsom, situate in the New Parish (sometime District) of Christ Church, Epsom

Common, in the County of Surrey, and in the Diocese of Winchester:

"Whereas it appears to us to be expedient that a District Chapelry should be assigned to the said Church of Saint Barnabas, Epsom, situate as aforesaid:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Edward Stuart, Bishop of Winchester, (testified by his having signed and sealed this Representation) We, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly represent that it would, in our opinion, be expedient that all that part of the said New Parish of Christ Church, Epsom Common, which is described in the Schedule hereunder written, all which part, together with the boundaries thereof, is delineated and set forth on the *Map or Plan* hereunto annexed, should be assigned as a District Chapelry to the said Church of Saint Barnabas, Epsom, situate as aforesaid, and that the same should be named 'The District Chapelry of Saint Barnabas, Epsom.'

"And with the like consent of the said Edward Stuart, Bishop of Winchester, (testified as aforesaid) We, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, further represent, that it appears to us to be expedient that banns of matrimony should be published, and that marriages, baptisms, churchings, and burials should be solemnized or performed at the said Church of St. Barnabas, Epsom, situate as

aforesaid, and that the fees to be received in respect of the publication of such banns and of the solemnization or performance of the said offices should be paid and belong to the minister of the same church for the time being: Provided always, that nothing herein contained shall be construed as expressing any intention on the part of us the said Commissioners to concur in or approve the taking of any fee for the performance of the said office of baptism or for the registration thereof.

"We, therefore, humbly pray that Your Majesty will be graciously pleased to take the premises into Your Royal Consideration, and to make such Order with respect thereto as to your Majesty, in Your Royal Wisdom, shall seem meet.

"The SCHEDULE to which the foregoing REPRESENTATION has reference.

"The District Chapelry of St. Barnabas, Epsom, being:—

"All that part of the New Parish (sometime District) of Christ Church, Epsom Common, in the County of Surrey, and in the Diocese of Winchester, which is bounded upon the south-east and upon the south by the Parish of Epsom, in the said County and Diocese, and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upon the south-west, upon the north-west, and upon the north, by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said Parish of Epsom from the said New Parish of Christ Church, Epsom Common, at a point in the middle of the Epsom and Leatherhead line of the London Brighton and South Coast and the London and South-Western Joint Railway distant $3\frac{1}{2}$ chains or thereabouts north-east of the centre of the bridge which carries such line of railway across West Street and opposite to the southern end of the fence forming the western boundary of the close numbered 246 on the Ordnance Survey Map of the Civil Parish of Epsom published in the year 1913 on the scale of 25 inches to a mile and also upon the map or plan annexed to this Representation, and extending from the said point in the middle of the said line of railway first north-westward to and along the said fence and then in various directions along the fences forming the north-western boundary of the said close numbered 246 and the western boundaries of the closes numbered 180a, 178b, and 179 upon the said maps for a distance in all of $24\frac{1}{2}$ chains or thereabouts to the point where the last-mentioned fence meets the south-eastern side of Pound Lane, and extending thence north-westward and in a straight line (thereby crossing Pound Lane and the close numbered 144 upon the said maps) for a distance of 19 chains or thereabouts to the southern end of the fence forming the south-western boundary of the close numbered 148 upon the said maps, and extending thence north-westward along the last-mentioned fence for a distance of $4\frac{1}{2}$ chains or thereabouts to its northern end where it meets the fence forming the south-eastern boundary of the close numbered 147 upon the said maps, and continuing thence north-westward in precisely the same direction and in a straight line (thereby crossing the said close numbered 147 and the close numbered 147a upon the said maps) for a distance of $6\frac{3}{4}$ chains or thereabouts to the wall forming the southern boundary of the premises attached to the London County Asylum, and extending thence

north-eastward along the said wall for a distance of $17\frac{1}{2}$ chains or thereabouts to its eastern end on the western side of Long Grove Road, and extending thence first north-eastward to the middle of Long Grove Road and then first eastward, then north-eastward and then again eastward along the middle of Long Grove Road for a distance of $8\frac{1}{2}$ chains or thereabouts to its junction with Hook Road, and extending thence eastward in a straight line (thereby crossing the Sewage Farm of the Epsom Urban District Council) for a distance of 42 chains or thereabouts to the point where the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Christ Church, Epsom Common, from the said Parish of Epsom crosses the middle of the Wimbledon and Epsom Line of the London and South-Western Railway."

And whereas the said Representation has been approved by His Majesty in Council.

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Representation, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Winchester.

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 33rd and 34th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 39, and of the Acts therein mentioned, that is to say, the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 113, the Act of the 4th and 5th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 39, and the Act of the 31st and 32nd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 114, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following scheme for effecting a transfer of the ownership of the Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the Church and Cure (hereinafter called 'the said Benefice') of Wyken, in the County of Warwick and in the Diocese of Coventry:

"Whereas the Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said

Benefice of Wyken is vested for an estate in fee simple free from incumbrances in certain Trustees to the use in the first place of the Right Honourable William George Robert, Earl of Craven (hereinafter called the said Earl of Craven) during his life, and the said Earl of Craven is therefore the Patron or person entitled to present or nominate to the said Benefice in case the same were now vacant:

"And whereas the said Earl of Craven is desirous that the whole Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Wyken should be transferred to and be vested in the Right Reverend Huyshe Wolcott, now Bishop of Coventry, and his Successors in the same Bishopric:

"And whereas the said Huyshe Wolcott, Bishop of Coventry, is willing to accept such transfer, and in token of such willingness and also in token that the same transfer has the consent of the Bishop of the Diocese, which by the Acts in the hereinbefore mentioned Act recited or by some or one of them is made necessary he, the said Huyshe Wolcott, Bishop of Coventry, has executed this Scheme as hereinafter mentioned:

"And whereas the transfer of the Patronage of the said Benefice of Wyken, which is hereinbefore mentioned and hereinafter recommended and proposed, will render the same Benefice more eligible for augmentation out of funds under our control, and this circumstance will, in our opinion, tend to make better provision for the Cure of Souls in the parish or District in or in respect of which the right of Patronage or Advowson so recommended and proposed to be transferred as aforesaid arises or exists, that is to say, in the Parish of Wyken.

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the said Earl of Craven, being the person whose consent as Patron is required by the provisions of the hereinbefore mentioned Acts and of the Act of the 1st and 2nd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 106, (in testimony of which consent he has signed and sealed this Scheme) and with the consent of the said Huyshe Wolcott, Bishop of Coventry, (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme and sealed the same with his Episcopal Seal) We, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly recommend and propose that upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme, and without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order the whole Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Wyken shall be transferred to the said Huyshe Wolcott, Bishop of Coventry, and his Successors in the same Bishopric, and shall thereupon and thenceforth become and be absolutely vested in, and shall and may from time to time be exercised by, the said Huyshe Wolcott, Bishop of Coventry, and by his Successors in the same Bishopric for ever.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any further or other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts, or of any of them, or of any other Act of Parliament."

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with

the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Coventry.

The County Court of Somersetshire held at Axbridge shall cease to be held at Axbridge, and a County Court of Somersetshire shall be established at Yatton under the name of the County Court of Somersetshire held at Yatton, having the jurisdiction now appertaining to the said County Court of Somersetshire held at Axbridge save as hereinbefore mentioned.

3. This Order shall come into operation on the 1st day of May, 1919.

under "The Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1877," 40 and 41 Victoria, cap. 48, and approved by the Queen in Council on the third day of May, one thousand eight hundred and eighty-two, in relation to Jesus College in the University of Oxford, such amending Statutes being duly made at a general meeting of the Governing Body of the said College specially summoned for this purpose, held on the third day of March, one thousand nine hundred and nineteen, and passed by the unanimous vote of those present and voting, in accordance with Section 54 of "The Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1877."

Clause 6, line 13.—Omit from "Provided as follows" to "on the next vacancy be made under this Clause." inclusive.

Clause 17, line 23.—For "£3 per centum" read "£2 10s. per centum."

Clause 22, line 2.—Omit the words "and so long as the whole number of Fellowships reckoned as in Clause 1 of this Statute shall not be greater than eight not exceeding 4."

Line 8.—After "Lecturer" insert "Chaplain."

Clause 23, line 8.—Omit the words "and there shall always be at least two Official Fellows unmarried and resident in the College during the usual College terms." and insert "and during the usual College terms there shall always be resident in the College at least two persons charged with the maintenance of discipline, of whom one shall always be an Official Fellow and the other may be either a Fellow, Lecturer or Chaplain of the College."

"At such other times during the University terms as there are undergraduates resident in the College, the Principal and Fellows shall make such arrangements as they may deem necessary for the residence of one or more such disciplinary officers."

Clause 36, line 4.—Omit the whole of the Clause after the words "to dispense with such vacancy."

STATUTE V.

Clause 2, line 13.—Before "school or schools in Wales" insert "college or."

STATUTE VII.

Clause 1, line 8.—After "during the usual College terms," insert "unless the Principal and Fellows shall otherwise determine."

Clause 5, line 14.—Omit "£5" and insert "£10."

STATUTE IX.

Clause 7.—Omit the existing clause and read:—"Annual payments for benefit of Cowbridge School."

Provided that the scheme made in the year one thousand nine hundred and nineteen by the Board of Education under the Endowed Schools Acts; 1869, 1873 and 1874 in the matter of the Cowbridge Grammar School and Endowment shall have received the approval of His Majesty in Council, the Principal and

Fellows shall pay to the Governors of the Cowbridge Grammar School the following sums (and shall be under no further liability in respect of the Cowbridge Grammar School):—

(a) The annual sum of fifty pounds at present payable under the provisions of the will of Sir Leoline Jenkins;

(b) The further annual sum of four hundred and fifty pounds, provided that the Principal and Fellows may, if they think fit, elect for such period as they may determine the headmaster of the Cowbridge Grammar School to a Fellowship, tenable so long only as he shall hold the office of headmaster of the Cowbridge Grammar School, and any sums paid to the headmaster as the emoluments of such Fellowship shall be reckoned as part payment of his salary as headmaster and as part payment by the Principal and Fellows of the above-mentioned annual sum of four hundred and fifty pounds.

The Principal and Fellows may cease the payment of the whole or part of the above-mentioned annual sum of four hundred and fifty pounds—

(1) If the Glamorgan County Council ceases to pay annually for the general purposes of the Cowbridge Grammar School the sum of at least £500, and to provide a further annual sum of £250 for Scholarships, Bursaries and Exhibitions; or (2) if the Principal and Fellows, after holding an inspection of the Cowbridge Grammar School, declare by resolution that the school is not being maintained efficiently as a secondary school preparing pupils for Universities."

His Majesty the KING has been pleased, on the recommendation of the President of the Board of Trade, to award the Silver Medal for gallantry in saving life at sea to Lieutenant Edward Stephen Fogarty Fegen, R.N.; and Chief Petty Officer Patrick Driscoll, R.N.

On the 24th March, 1918, while the British s.s. "War Knight" was proceeding up the English Channel in convoy, she collided with the United States oil carrier "O. B. Jennings." It appears that the naphtha, which was on board the latter vessel, ignited, and the two ships and surrounding water were soon enveloped in flames.

The Master of the "O. B. Jennings" gave orders that all the ship's available boats should be lowered; those on the starboard side were burnt, and the crew abandoned the ship in the port boats, whilst the Master, Chief Engineer, Chief Officer and three others remained on board.

H.M.S. "Garland," under the command of Lieutenant Fegen, with other destroyers, were proceeding to the spot to render assist-

ance, when it was seen that one boat which had been lowered from the "O. B. Jennings" had been swamped. The "Garland" closed the "O. B. Jennings," rescued the men from the swamped boat, and then proceeded alongside the ship, which was still blazing, and rescued those who were still on board. She afterwards proceeded to pick up the others who had left the ship in boats, rescuing in all four officers and twenty-two men.

Lieutenant Fegen handled his ship in a very able manner under difficult conditions during the rescue of the survivors, while Driscoll worked the helm and saw that all orders to the engine-room were correctly carried out.

The KING has been graciously pleased to confer the Decoration of the Albert Medal upon Christopher Feetham, fireman of the steamship "Hornsey," of London.

On the 10th November last, while the s.s. "Hornsey" was lying at Sunderland, a fire broke out in the mess-room and adjoining saloon. A quantity of ammunition was on board, and there was accordingly a great risk, if it exploded, of loss of life and property, as the effects of the explosion would probably not have been confined to the shipping in the harbour, but would have spread to the quay.

The whole of the ship's company behaved admirably in the emergency; and the Master, Chief Engineer, Second Mate, Steward and one of the Gunners did exceptionally well in their efforts to get the fire under. The decisive factor, however, in extinguishing it and saving life and property was the heroism of Feetham. He volunteered to be let down into the cabin, and there, waist-high in water, he was able to direct his hose on to that part of the fire which would have exploded the ammunition in a very short time. As it was, some of the ammunition cases were already scorched.

It was at the greatest risk of his own life that, after a long series of attempts, in conjunction with other members of the crew, at extinguishing the outbreak, he went down alone to make a last effort, which happily was successful, and he undoubtedly saved a very large number of lives by his exceptional courage.

SEEDS, OILS AND FATS.

GENERAL LICENCE.

With reference to the Order made by the Minister of Munitions on the 1st May, 1917, relating to seeds, oils and fats, which, amongst other things, prohibited, with certain exceptions, all purchases and sales of and dealings in the seeds, oils and fats specified in the first schedule to such Order, except under and in accordance with the terms of licences issued by or under the authority of the Minister of Munitions the Minister of Munitions hereby gives

notice that as from the 18th March, 1919, until further notice, he hereby licenses all persons to sell, purchase and deal in all or any of the seeds, oils and fats specified in the first schedule to the said Order as they may think fit, irrespective of quantity, subject only to the following condition, namely:—

No such sale, purchase or dealing shall be effected at a price in excess of that fixed as the maximum price for such sale, purchase or dealing by the said Order of the 1st May, 1917, as extended and modified by the subsequent Orders relating to seeds, oils and fats made by the Minister of Munitions on the 9th May and the 19th June, 1917.

This general licence may be cited as the "Seeds, Oils and Fats General Licence, 1919."

DEFENCE OF THE REALM (LIQUOR CONTROL).

ORDER (FURTHER AMENDMENT) OF THE CENTRAL CONTROL BOARD (LIQUOR TRAFFIC) FOR THE SHORNCLIFFE AREA.

The Civil Service Commissioners hereby give notice that the following Regulations are published with the consent of the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, viz. :—

REGULATIONS RESPECTING OPEN COMPETITIVE EXAMINATIONS FOR THE SITUATION OF FEMALE SORTING ASSISTANT IN THE GENERAL POST OFFICE, LONDON, AND IN THE GENERAL REGISTER OFFICE, LONDON.

These Regulations are liable to alteration for future examinations.

1. The limits of age for these situations are 15 and 18. If an Examination begins in one of the first six months of any year, Candidates must be of the prescribed age on the first day of April in that year. If an Examination begins in one of the last six months of any year, Candidates must be of the prescribed age on the first day of October in that year.

In reckoning age for competition, persons who have served for two full consecutive years in any Civil situation to which they were admitted with the Certificate of the Civil Service Commissioners may deduct from their actual age any time not exceeding five years which they may have spent in such service.

Persons transferred to situations in the Post Office from a Telephone Company or Municipal Telephone Undertaking, on the absorption of such Company or Undertaking by the Post Office, may reckon as if it were service in a situation to which they were admitted with the Certificate of the Civil Service Commissioners, their continuous service in the Post Office, as well as so much of their previous continuous service in the Telephone Company or Undertaking (or in any Telephone Company or Muni-

cipal Telephone Undertaking previously absorbed by it) as was rendered in situations for which a Civil Service Certificate is ordinarily required.

2. Candidates will be required to satisfy the Civil Service Commissioners—

- (a) That they are unmarried or widows.
- (b) That they are duly qualified in respect of health and character.

(No. 2).

The Board of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in them under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1914, the Dogs Act, 1906, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

PART I

Revocation.

1. The Monmouthshire and District (Control of Dogs) Order of 1919 is hereby revoked from and after the commencement of this Order.

Prohibition of Movement of Dogs out of certain District.

2. No dog shall be moved out of the Scheduled District described in the Schedule hereto, hereinafter referred to as "the Scheduled District," unless it is accompanied by a licence of the Board authorising such movement signed by an Officer of the Board, and any such licence may be subject to such conditions as to the detention and isolation of the dog or otherwise as the Board may think necessary or desirable and shall be specified in the licence: Provided that this Article shall not apply to the movement of a dog through the Scheduled District by railway from a place outside the District to another place outside the District without unnecessary delay and without being re-booked within the District.

Seizure of Dogs in case of Default.

3.—(1) If a dog has been moved in contravention of this Order or any Order hereby re-

voked or having been moved with a licence under this Order is not detained and isolated as required by the conditions of the licence, an Inspector of the Board may seize the dog, and thereupon the Board shall detain and isolate it at the place of detention specified in the licence (if any) or any other place of detention selected by them for such time as the Board think necessary or expedient.

(2) If the owner of the dog does not, within ten days after the expiration of the period of detention specified in the licence (if any) or such other period as the Board may think necessary or expedient and notify to the owner, claim the said dog from the Board and pay to them their expenses of detaining and isolating the dog, the Board may destroy or otherwise dispose of the dog as they think expedient.

Notice of Detention in case of Illegal Movement.

4.—(1.) Where an Inspector or other Officer of the Board, or of a Local Authority, has reason to believe that a dog has been moved in contravention of this Order or of any Order hereby revoked, he may give notice to the owner or person in charge of the dog requiring that the dog shall be detained and isolated in accordance with the provisions of such notice, and that within a time specified in such notice, the dog shall be moved to a place of detention for the purpose of such detention and isolation.

(2.) Such provisions may be inserted in the notice as the Board may think necessary or desirable for any of the following purposes, namely:—

(i.) for prescribing and regulating the detention and isolation of the dog;

(ii.) for prescribing the person by whom and the premises on which the dog shall be detained and isolated;

(iii.) for regulating the movement of the dog to the place of detention;

(iv.) for prescribing the confinement of the dog in a suitable hamper, crate, box, or other receptacle, or the muzzling of the dog, during its movement by railway, or along a highway or thoroughfare;

(v.) for prescribing the mode of isolation of the dog;

(vi.) for prescribing the notice to be given of the death or loss of the dog, or of any matter arising in connection with the movement, detention, or isolation of the dog and the persons by whom and to whom the notice is to be given; and

(vii.) for prescribing the production of the notice for inspection by an officer of the Board, or police constable, or officer of the Local Authority.

(3.) The operation of a notice under this Article may be terminated by notice to that effect given by an Inspector or other Officer of the Board or of the Local Authority to the owner or person in charge of the dog, on proof to the satisfaction of the Inspector or Officer that the dog was not moved in contravention of the said Order.

(4.) If the owner or person in charge of the dog, after receipt of such notice, fails to move the dog as required by the notice, he shall be

deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

(5.) If the provisions inserted in any notice under this Article are not complied with, the owner of the dog and the person in charge of the dog and any person who being required to comply with any such provision fails to do so, shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

PART II.

Control of Dogs in Scheduled District.

5.—(1.) A dog in the Scheduled District shall at all times—

(a) whilst in or on any public place be efficiently muzzled with an effective wire cage muzzle: Provided that until the twenty-fourth day of March, nineteen hundred and nineteen, a dog in or on any such place need not be muzzled if it is led by a person with a collar and chain or other attachment;

(b) whilst in or on any other place, be kept under control by being—

(i) confined in a kennel or other enclosure from which the dog cannot escape; or

(ii) secured to some premises by a collar and chain; or

(iii) efficiently muzzled with an effective wire cage muzzle; or

(iv) accompanied by the owner or some person deputed by him and under effectual control.

(2) The provisions of this Article shall not apply to—

(a) any pack of hounds while being exercised under the supervision of two or more competent attendants; or

(b) any dog in charge of a competent person while being used for sporting purposes, or for the capture or destruction of vermin, or for the driving or tending of cattle or sheep; or

(c) any dog confined in a suitable hamper, crate, box, or other receptacle, so constructed as to render it impossible for such dog while so confined to bite any person or animal.

Seizure, Detention, and Disposal of Uncontrolled Dogs.

6.—(1) Any dog in the Scheduled District which is not muzzled, or kept under control, as prescribed by this Order, may be seized by the Local Authority or by the police, and any dog so seized shall be dealt with by the Local Authority as follows:

(i) If the dog is diseased or suspected, or has been bitten by a diseased or suspected dog, it shall be forthwith slaughtered.

(ii) If the dog has been exposed to the infection of rabies it shall be detained, slaughtered, or otherwise dealt with as the Local Authority think expedient, but so that the dog shall not, while detained by the Local Authority, be allowed to come in contact with any other animal.

(iii) In any other case the dog shall be treated as a stray dog seized under the powers conferred by section three of the Dogs Act, 1906.

(2) No dog so seized shall be given or sold for the purposes of vivisection.

(3) Every dog shall, for the purposes of this Article, be deemed to have been exposed to the infection of rabies which has been in the same shed, stable, building, kennel, field, or other place, or otherwise in contact with any diseased or suspected dog, or which has in any other way been exposed to the infection of rabies.

PART III.

GENERAL.

Offences.

7.—(1) If a dog is moved in contravention of Article 2 of this Order, the owner of the dog, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, and the person causing, directing, or permitting the movement, and the person moving or conveying the dog, and the consignee or other person receiving or keeping it, knowing it to have been moved in contravention as aforesaid, and the occupier of the place from which the dog is moved, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

(2) If any dog in the Scheduled District is not muzzled, or kept under control, as prescribed by this Order, the owner of the dog, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

(3) If a dog which is being moved or has been moved with a licence under this Order is not muzzled or confined or is not detained and isolated as required by the conditions of the licence, the owner of the dog, and the person for the time being in charge thereof, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

(4) If a person with a view unlawfully to evade or defeat the operation of this Order or of the conditions of a licence under this Order, allows a dog to stray, he shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

(5) If the owner or person in charge of a dog fails to give, produce, or do any notice, licence, or thing which by this Order, or by the conditions of a licence thereunder, he is required to give, produce, or do, he shall be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

Interpretation.

8. In this Order—

“The Act of 1894” means the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

“Diseases” means rabies, “diseased” means affected with rabies, and “suspected” means suspected of rabies.

“Public place” includes any street, highway, thoroughfare, public bridge, royal park, public park, garden or pleasure ground, common, unenclosed land, or other place to which the public have for the time being access.

Other terms have the same meaning as in the Rabies Order of 1897.

Local Authority to Enforce Order.

(3.) 10d. shall be substituted for 9d. in Clause 4 (2) (a) as the differential rate for overtime on weekdays.

(4.) 1s. shall be substituted for 11d. in Clause 4 (2) (b) as the differential rate for overtime on a Sunday.
